Halting Speed Related Crashes through Speed Limiter



Speed Violations have been identified as the major probable cause of road crashes in Nigeria. This violation accounted for 32% of all road crashes in year 2013. The tide did not dwindle much in 2014 standing at 30.9% of all probable if not the main factor for road crashes that year. This, after obtaining stakeholders endorsement, informed aovernment's decision to

commence the installation of speed limiters in all commercial vehicles as from June, 2015.

This is in recognition of the Corps alignment to international traffic data standards and data collection methodology. As a clear testament to this, Nigeria's crash data are now published in the annual reports of IRTAD and also hosted on IRTAD's international database for universal online access
