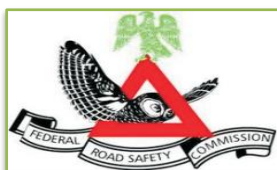

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FIRST QUARTER 2016 EDITORIAL “TYRE AND ROAD SAFETY”

A tyre consists of a rubber ring around the rim of an automobile wheel. It is reinforced rubber filled with compressed air. As important as this component of the motor vehicle is, it is one of the often neglected aspects of vehicle maintenance. The failure to attend to tyre safety is a vital factor in thousands of road traffic crashes on Nigerian roads. Recent crashes that drew the attention of most Nigerians such as those that claimed the lives of the late Minister of State for Labour and Employment, Barrister James Ocholi (SAN) and Ekiti State delegation to this year's NMA annual meeting were tyre related.

When braking, the idea is to have sufficient friction between the road surface and tyre to bring the vehicle to a standstill. If the tyre is worn there will not be enough friction and the tyre will slide over the road surface not stopping the vehicle. Due to its importance, and considering the poor state of our roads couple with the raining season, this edition of FRSC Digest wishes to draw attention of motorists to this component of the vehicle. You are therefore enjoined to pay attention to the following:

Always ensure you buy new tyres. Guard against used and worn tyres many of which are retreaded and sold illicitly as new ones. This usually leads to blow outs on the slightest impact.

Use the size of tyre recommended for your vehicle by the manufacturer.

Make time to know the correct tyre pressure for your vehicle type.

Do not under inflate or over inflate the tyres of your vehicle. This reduces tyre control to road surface and shortens tyre lifespan.

Do not use expired tyres. The lifespan of tyres vary from 4 to 6 to 10 years depending on the climate. In Nigeria, it is recommended that a tyre should not last more than 3 to 4 years because of our weather and state of our roads. Therefore check the date of manufacture and calculate the number of recommended years there from. The manufacture date is usually indicated by the week and year. For example (0214) means the tyre was manufactured in the second week of the year 2014. The life of this tyre is therefore expected to expire in 2017 or 2018.

Above all, check your tyre regularly against wear, tear, cuts, etc.

We wish you safe drive to your various destinations as you do the needful in respect to your vehicle's tyres.

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Overloading

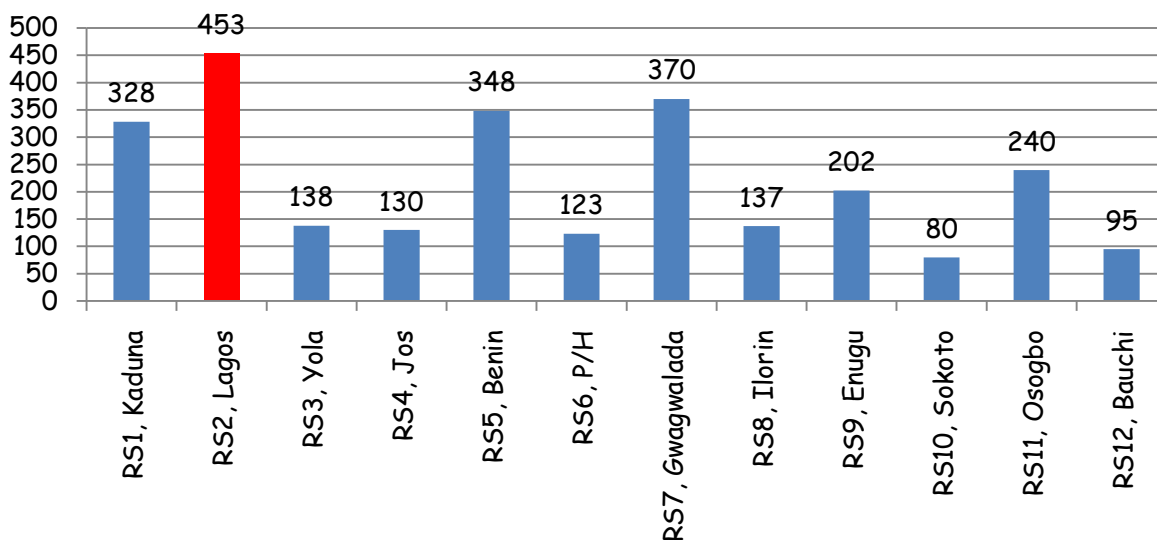

Chart 2: Chart Illustrating Offenders/Offences

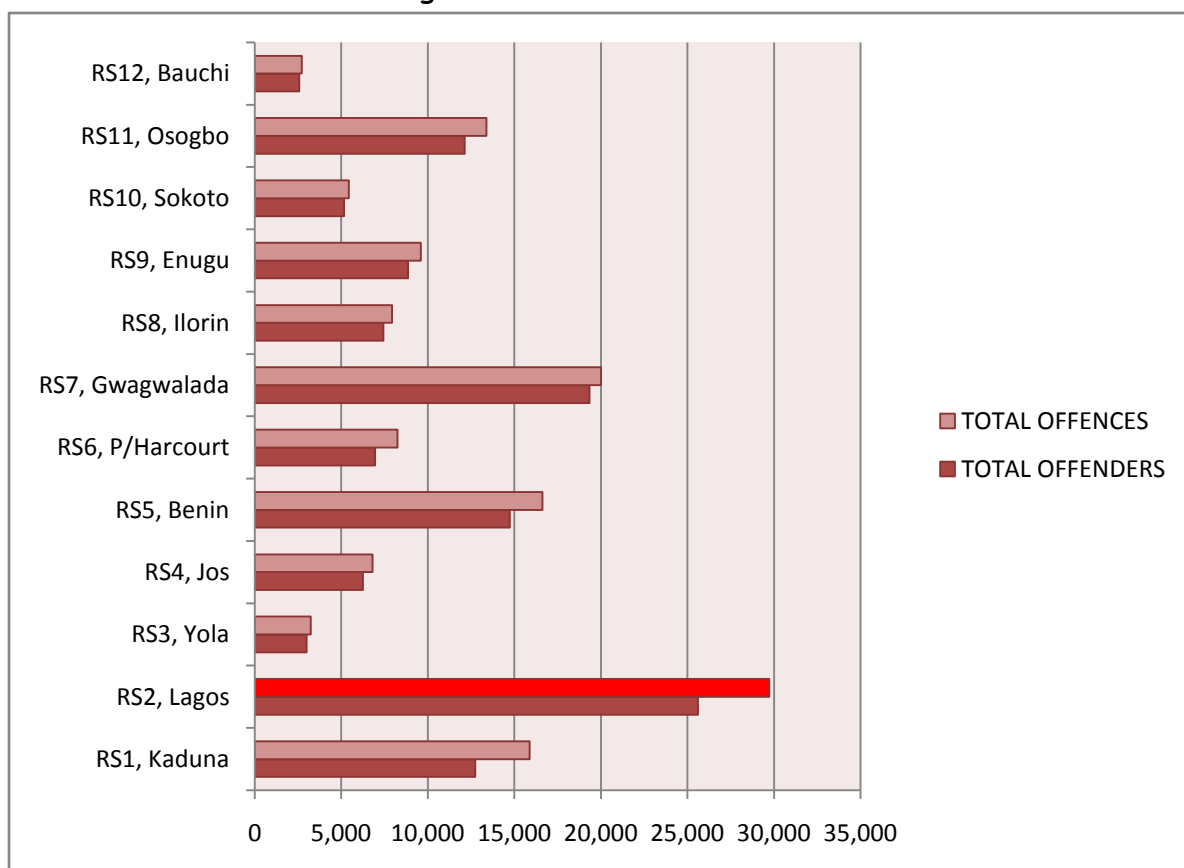
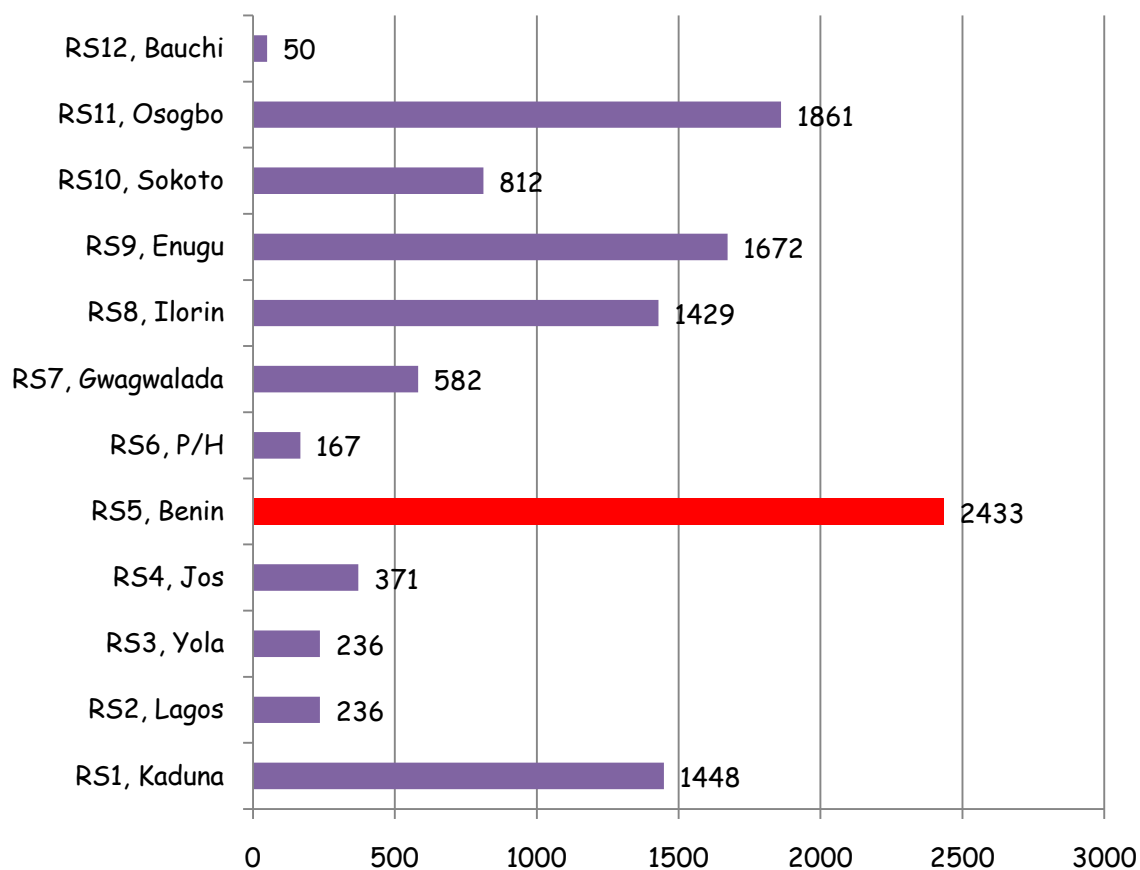

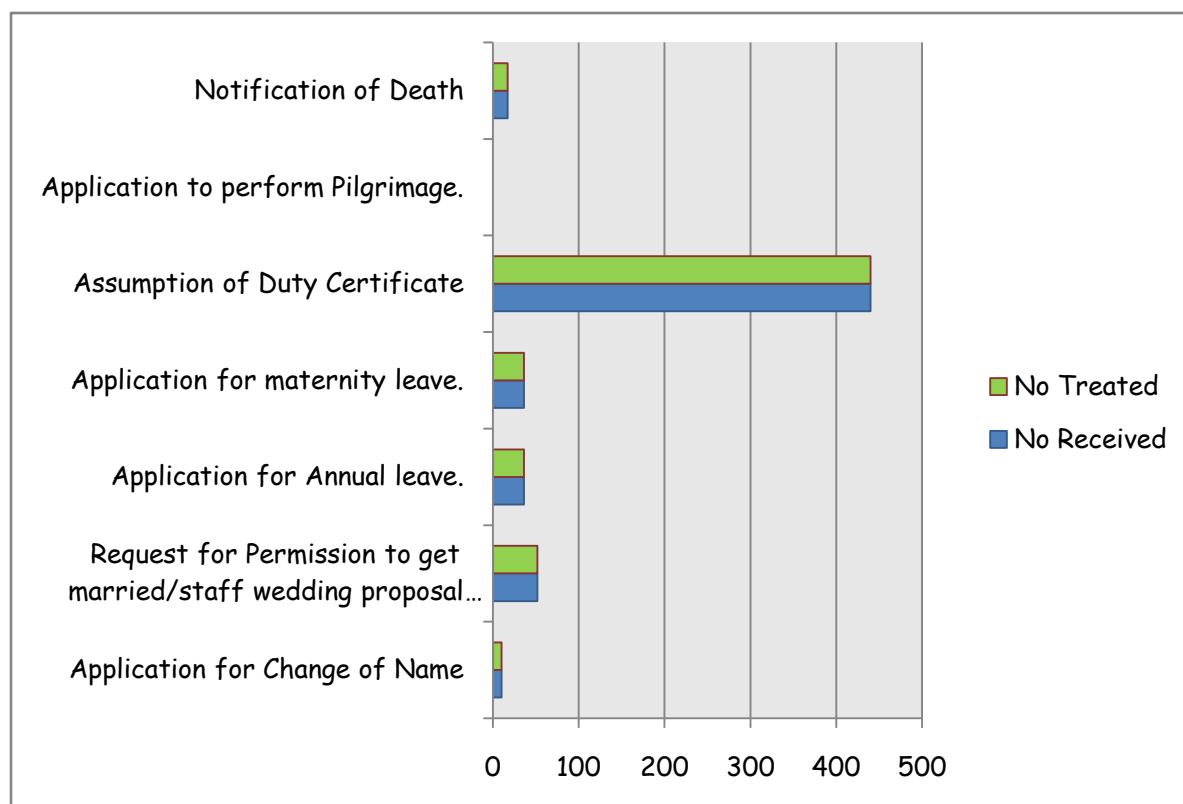
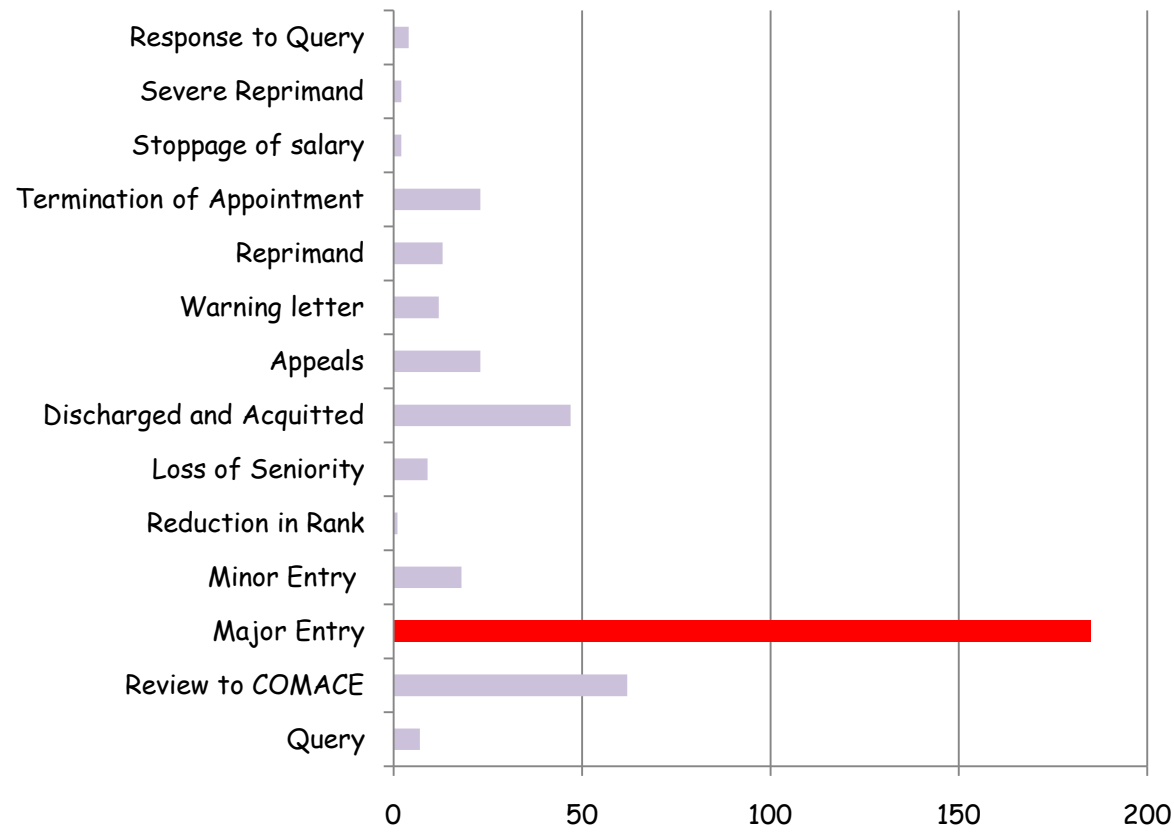

Chart 6: Chart Illustrating Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Officers)

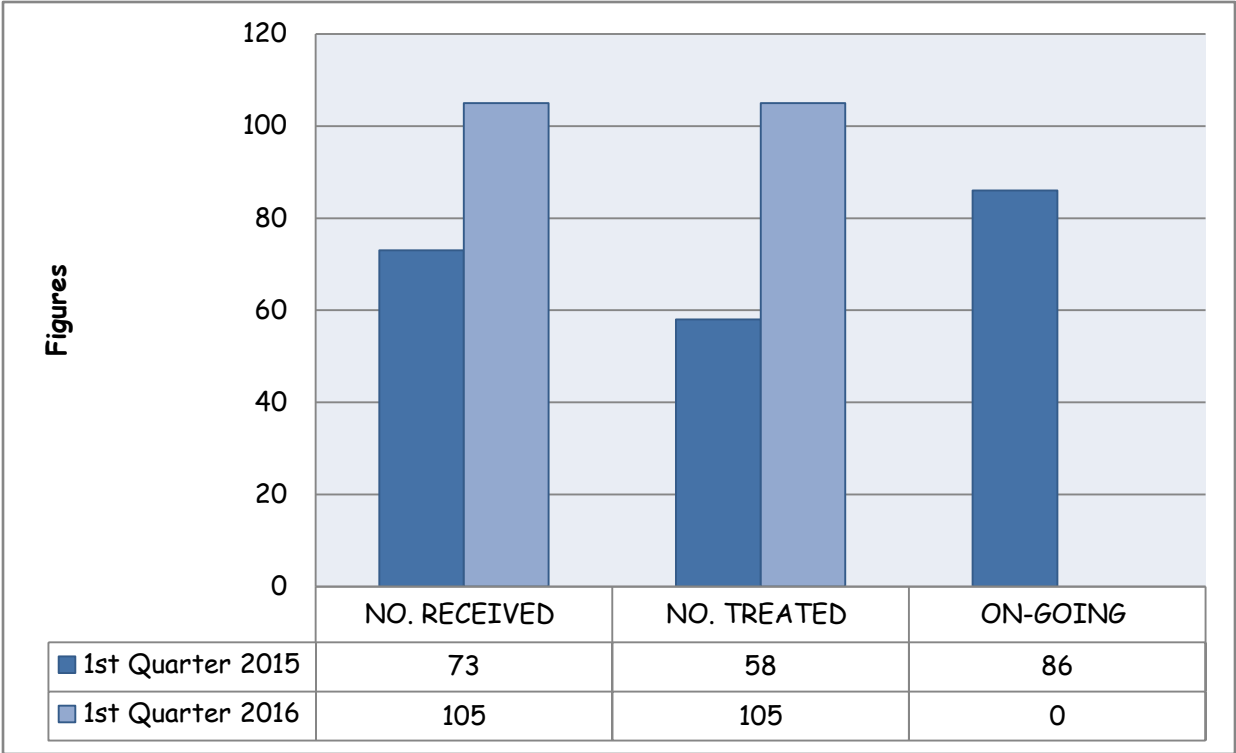

Chart 7: Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

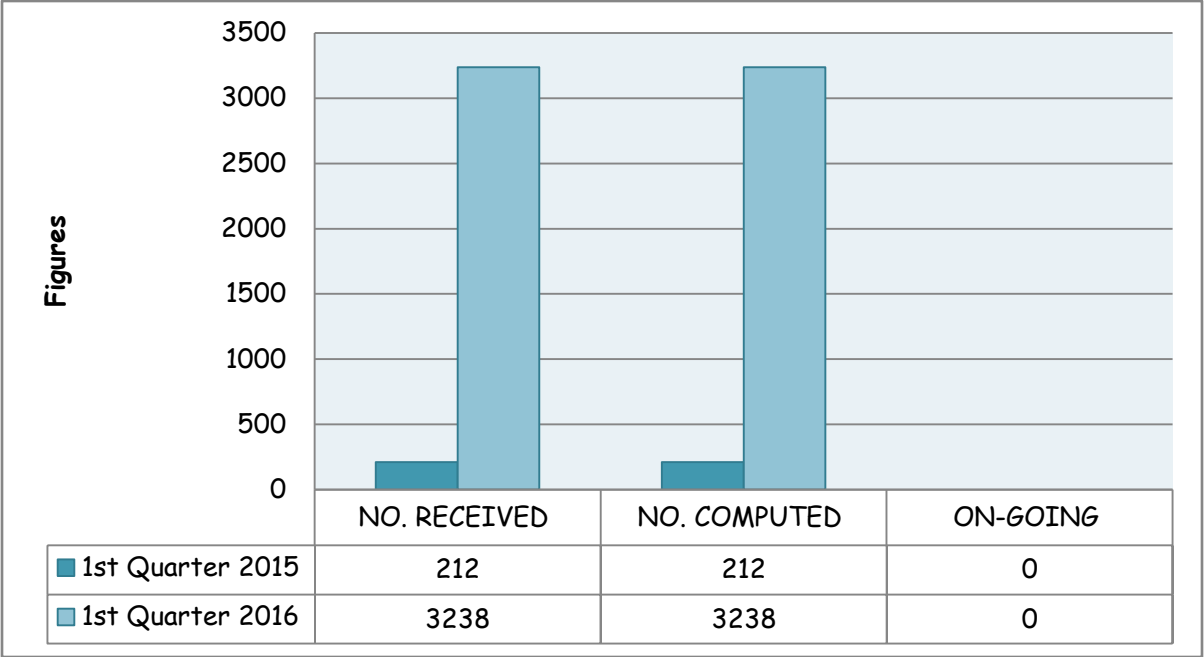

Chart 9: National Driver License production

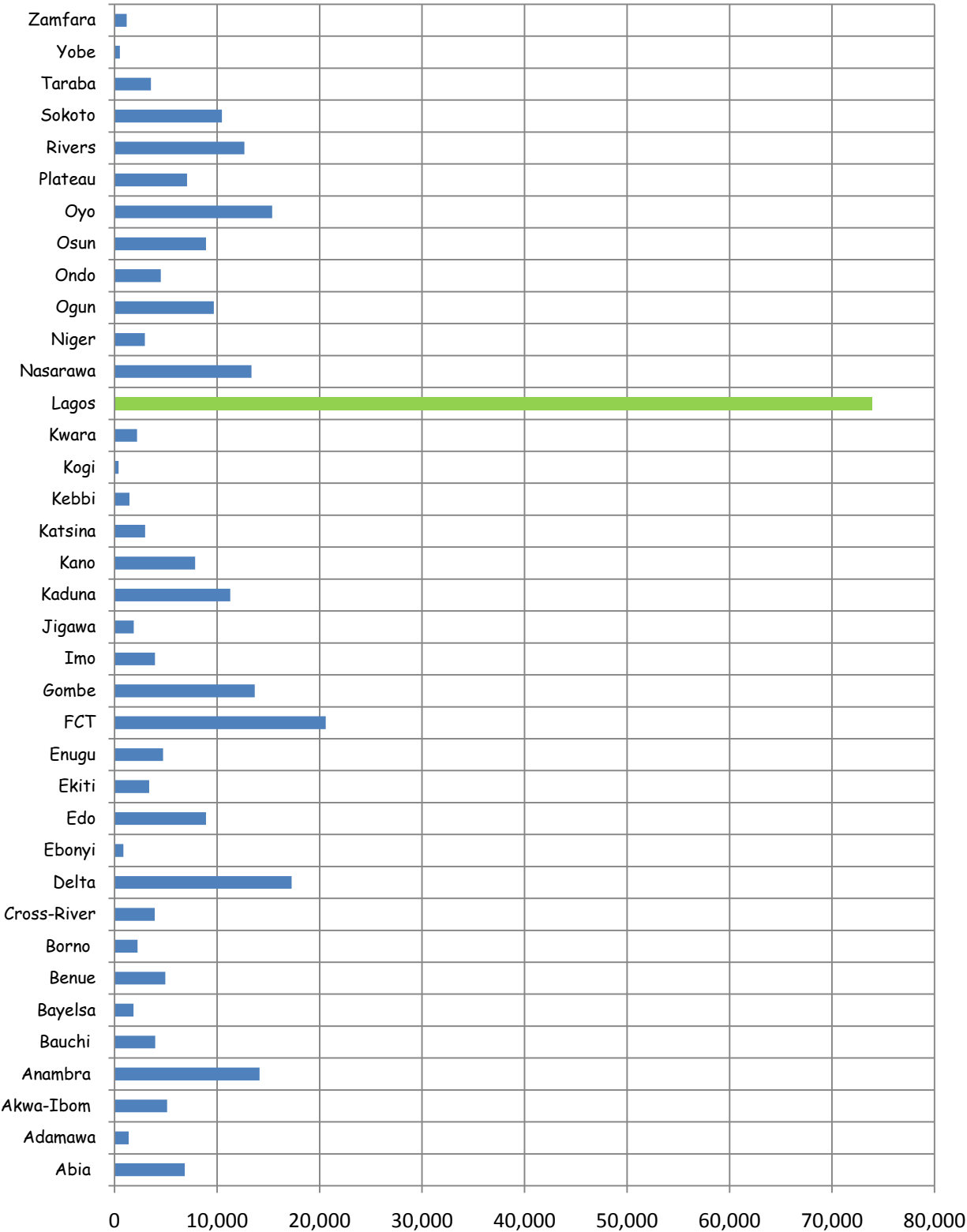

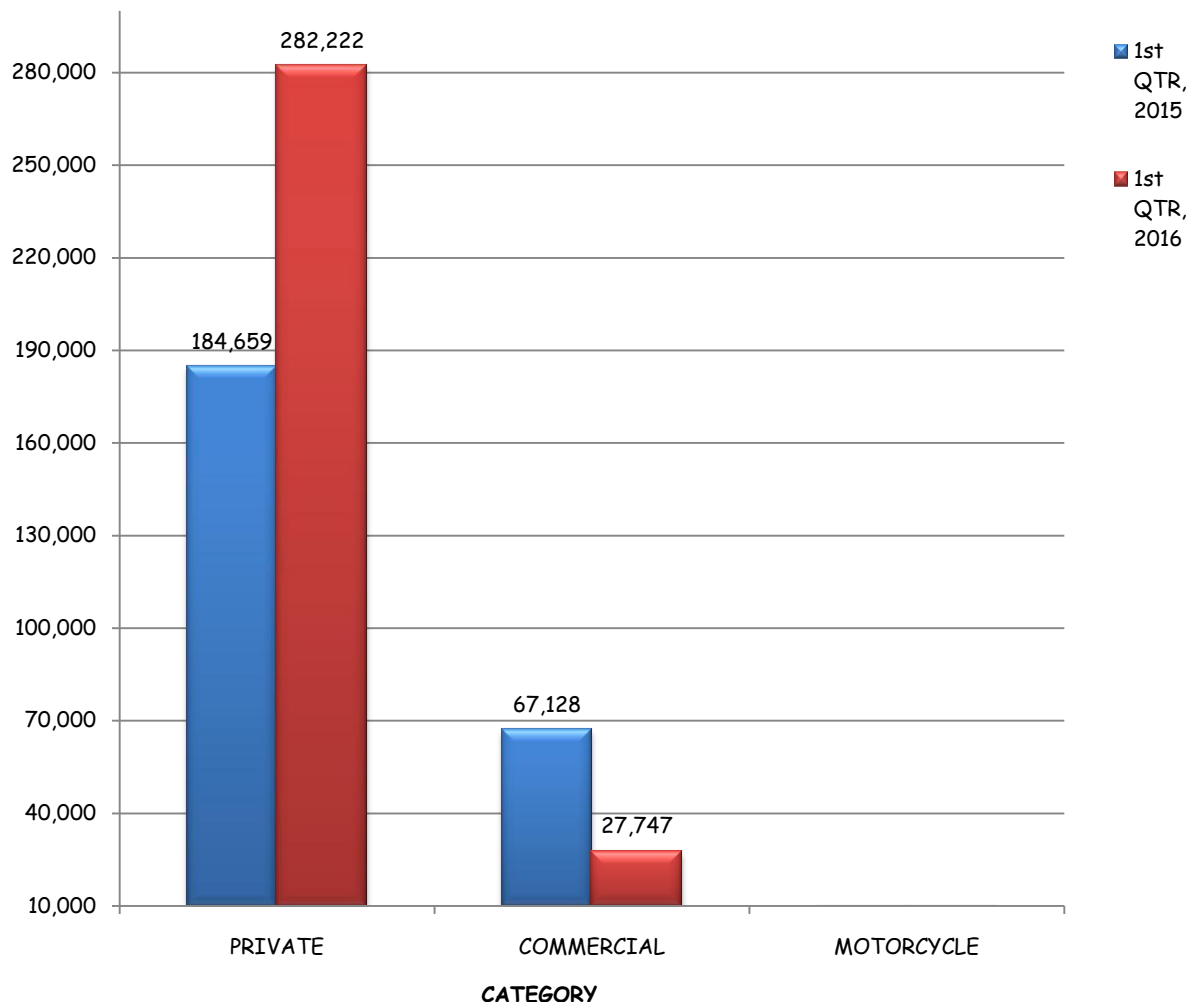




Chart 11: Showing Comparative Analysis of NDL production between 1st Qtr 2015 and 1st Qtr 2016

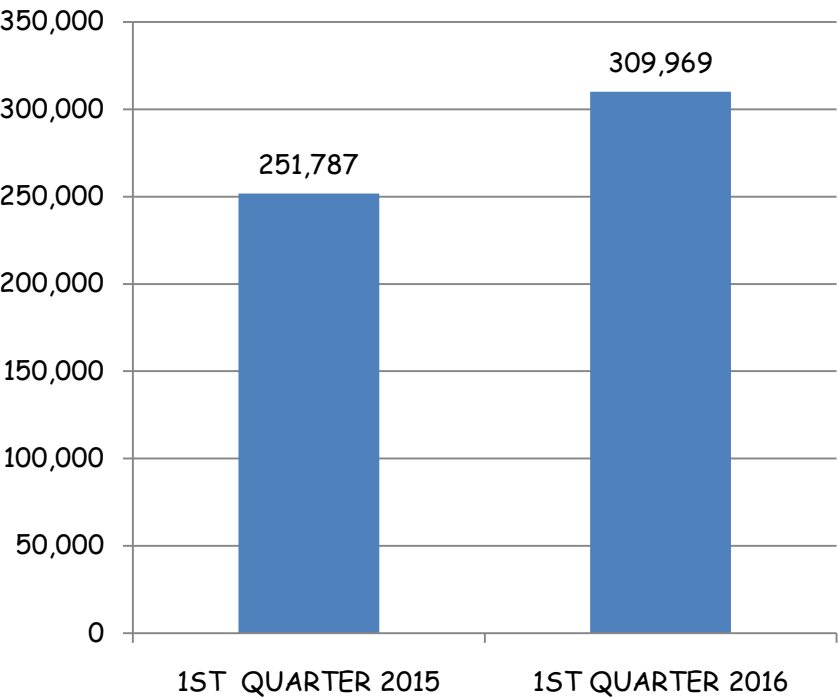


Chart 12: Showing Comparative Analysis of NDL production between 1st Qtr 2015 and 1st Qtr 2016

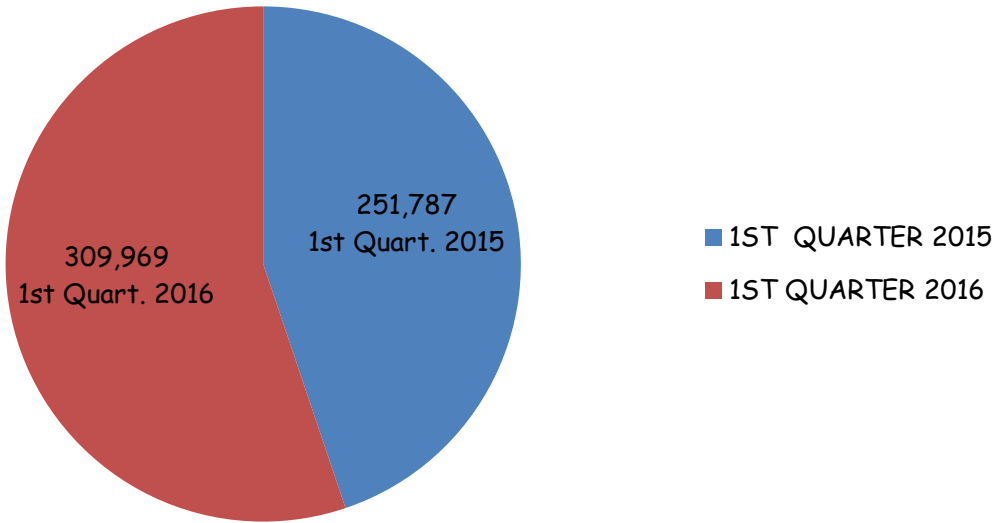

Chart 13: Number plates Produced

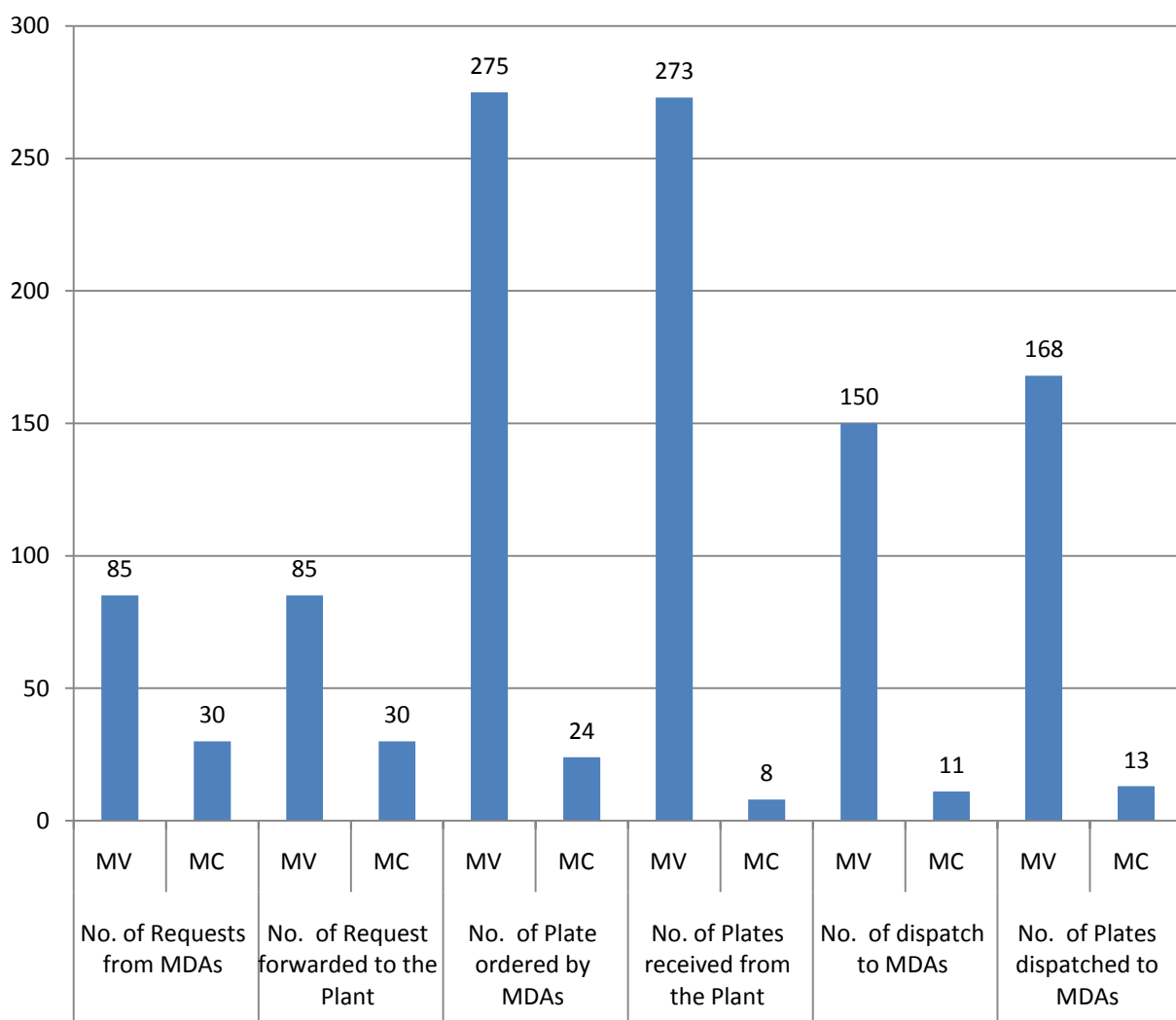

Chart 14: Number of Vehicle Registered

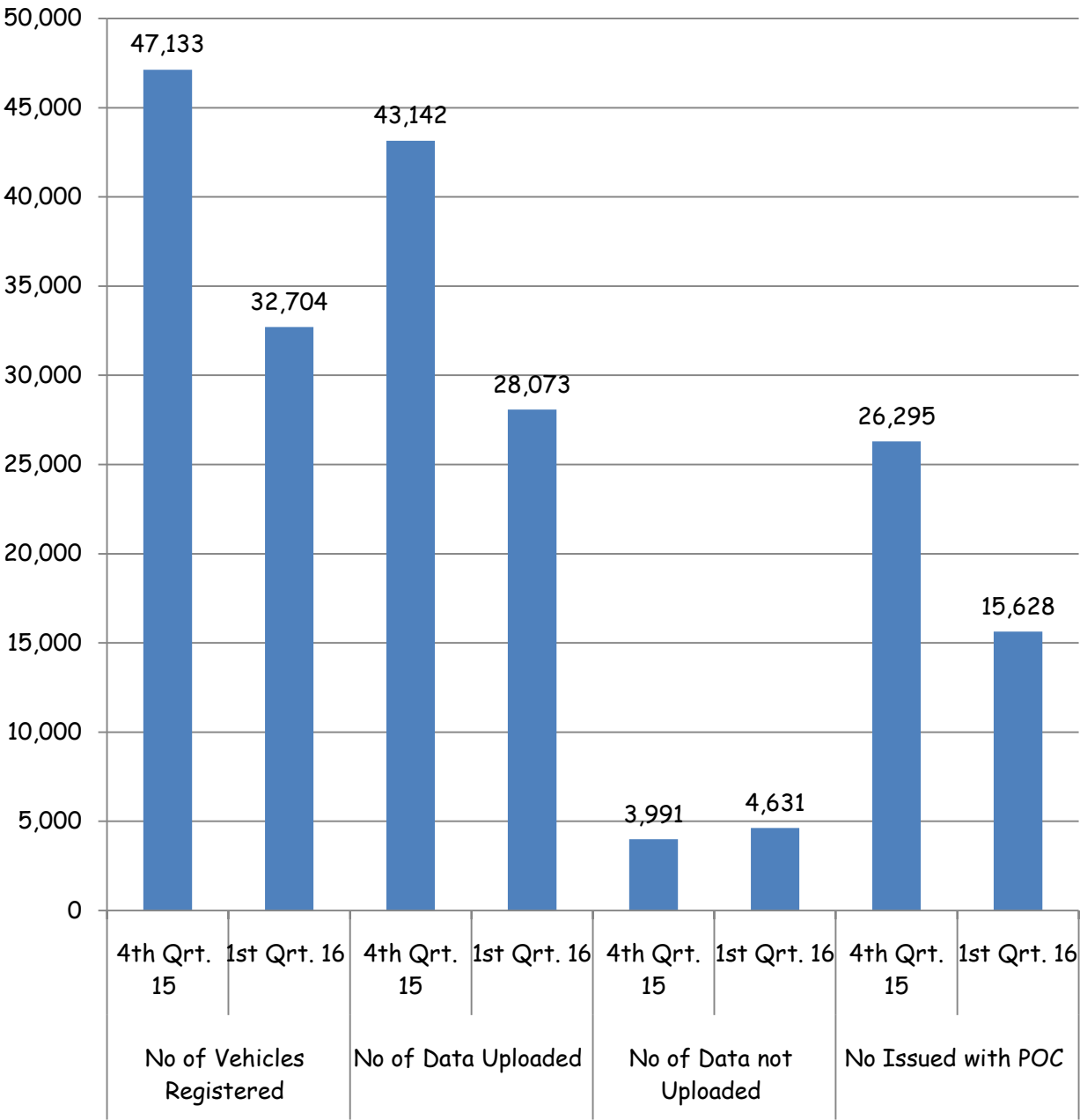

Chart 15: Number Plates Produced by Class

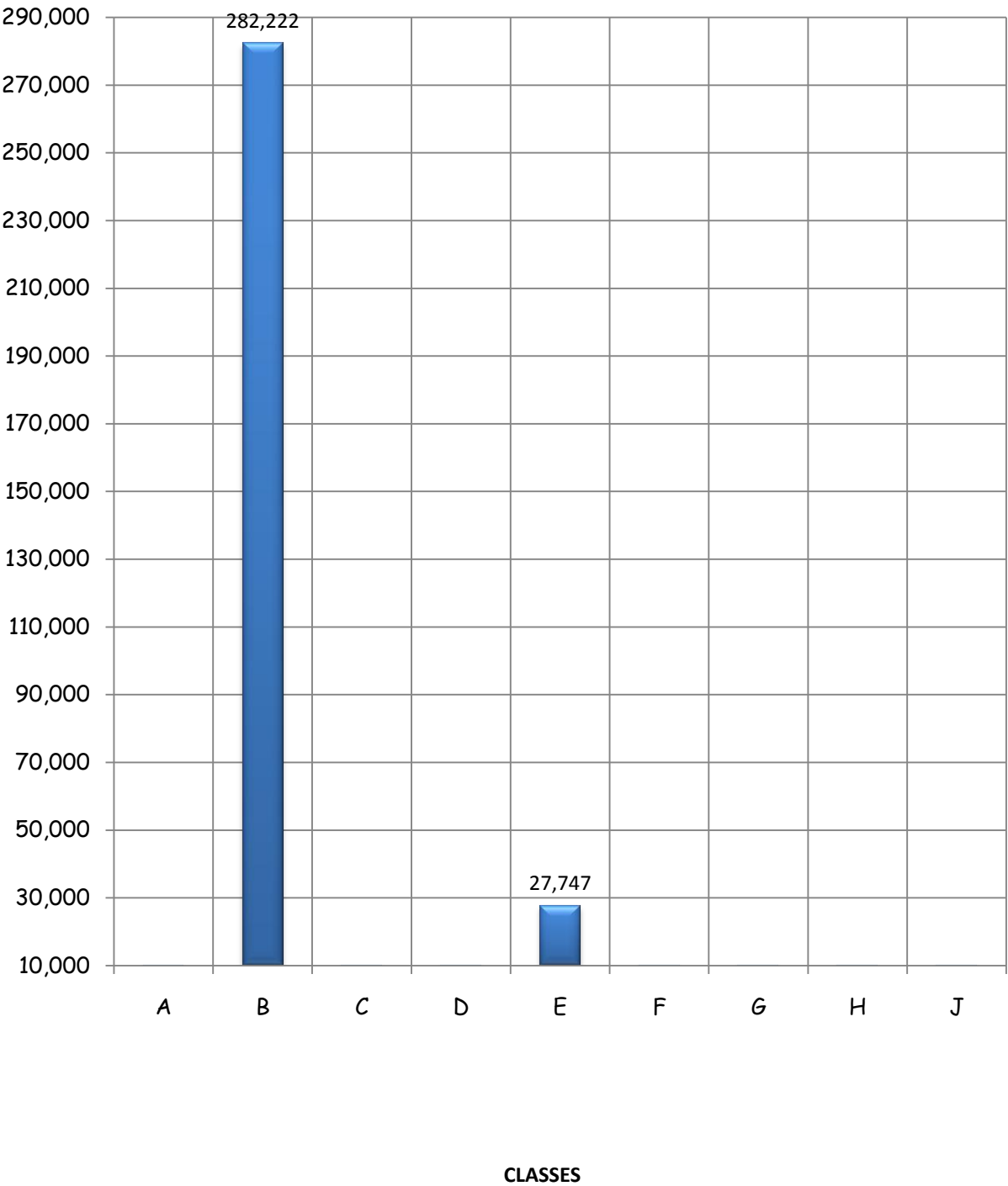


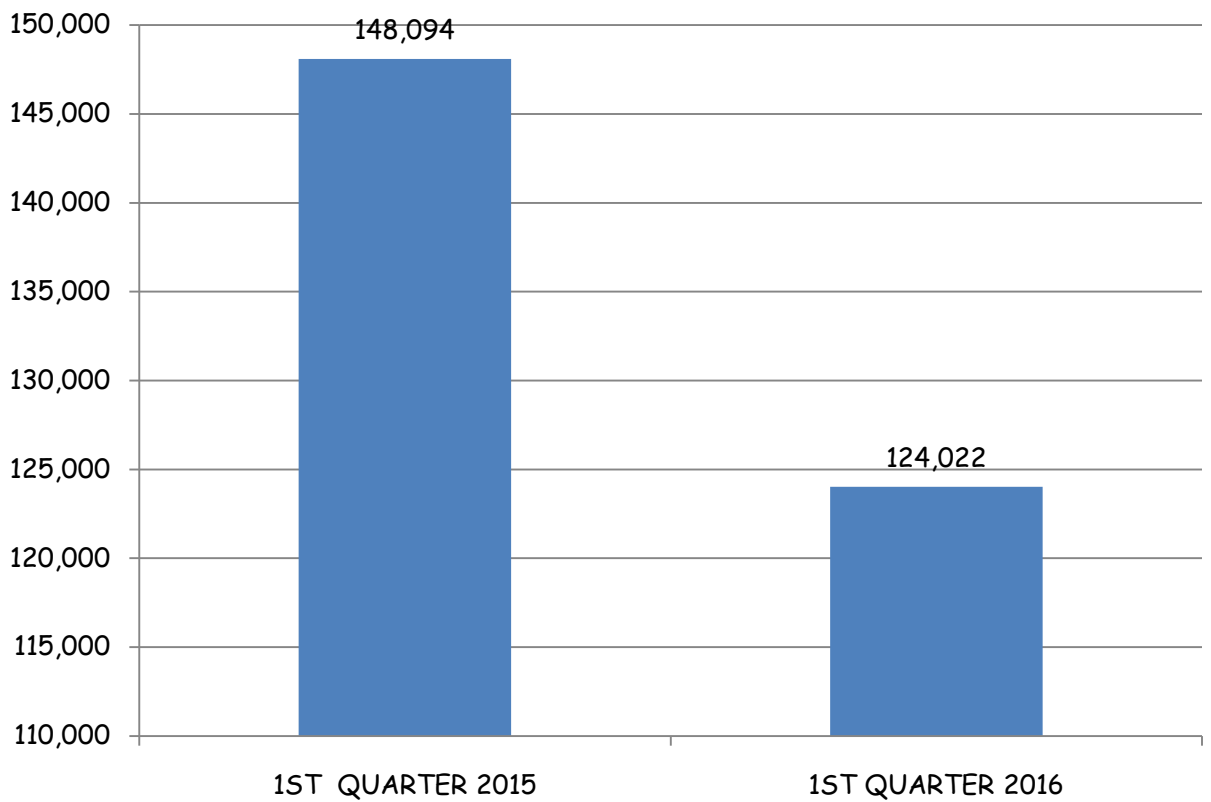

Chart 17: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to

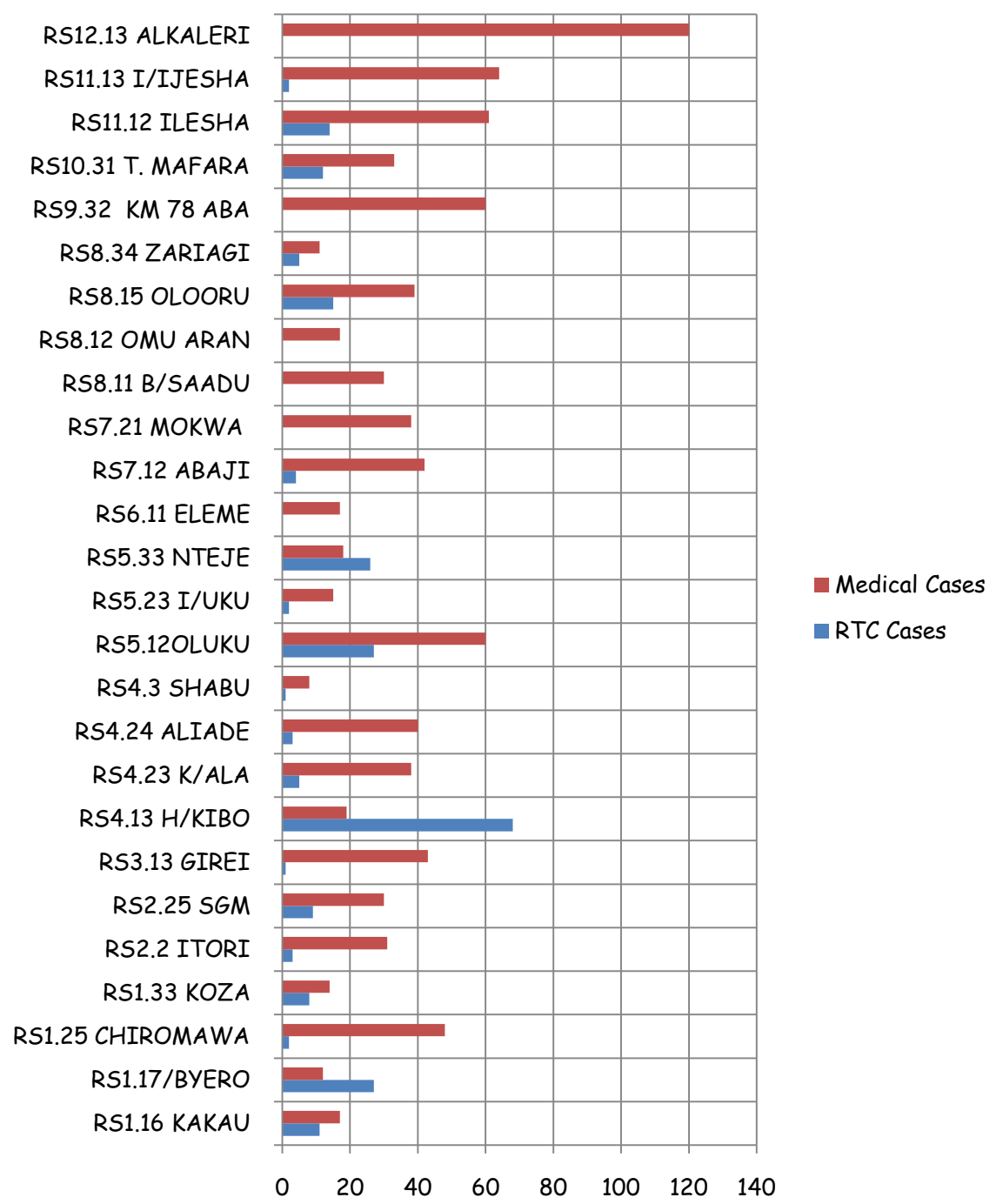

Chart 18: Injury Types Treated

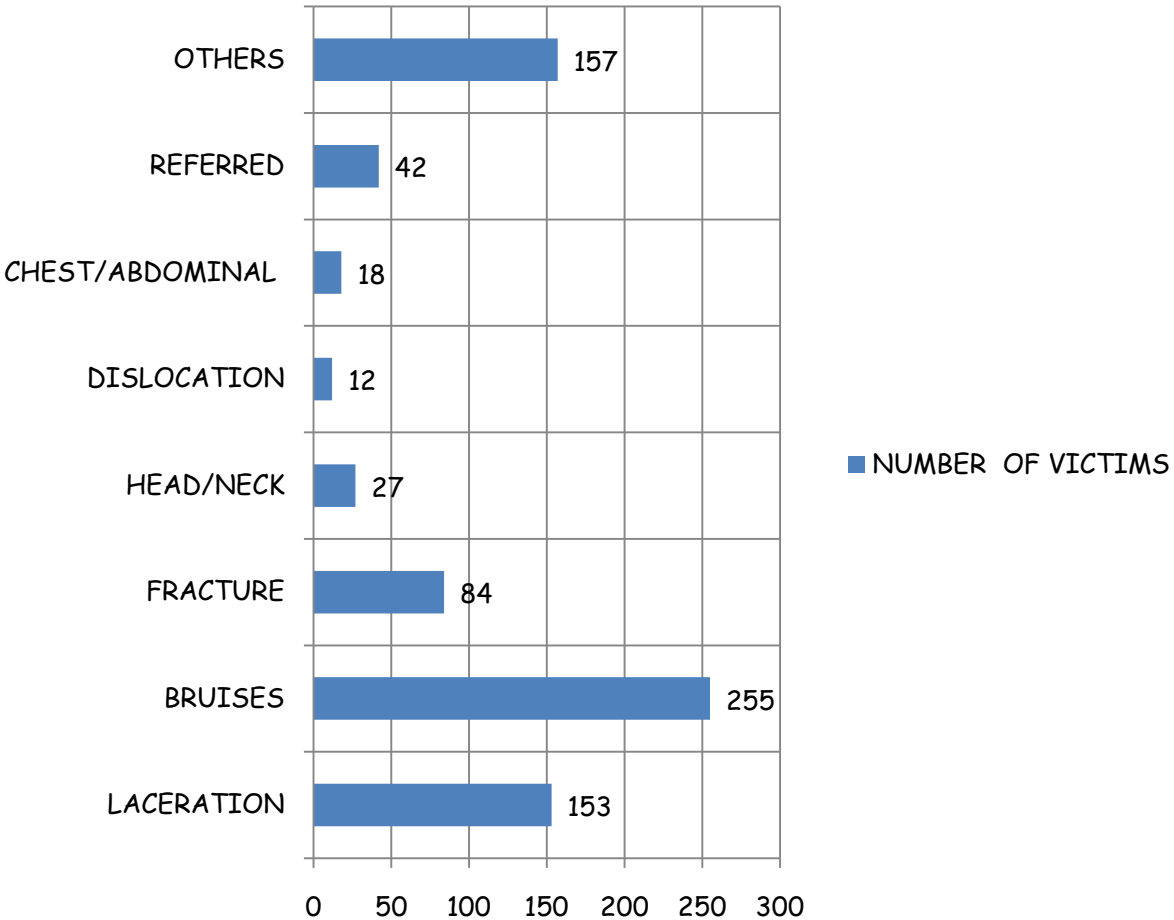

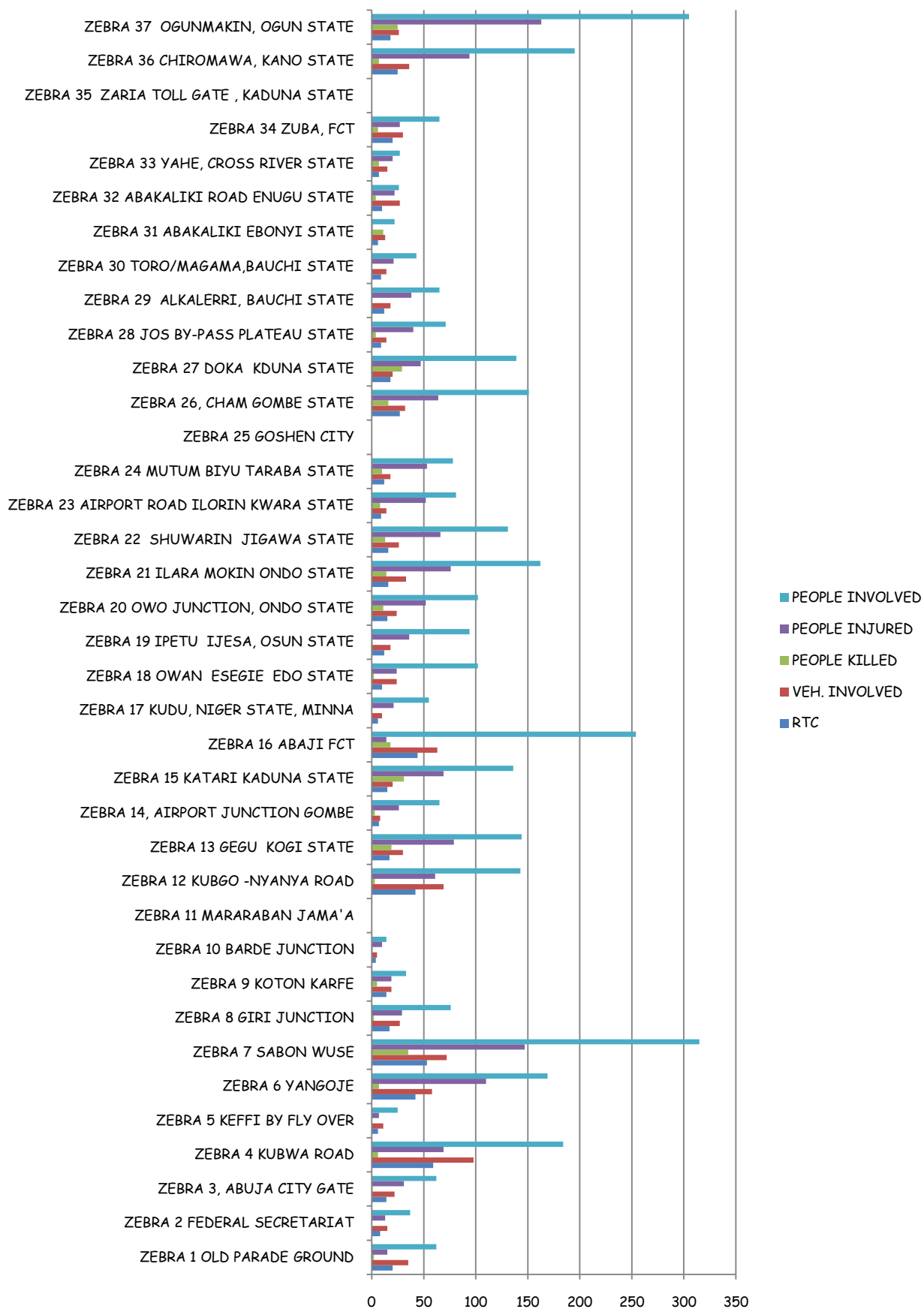

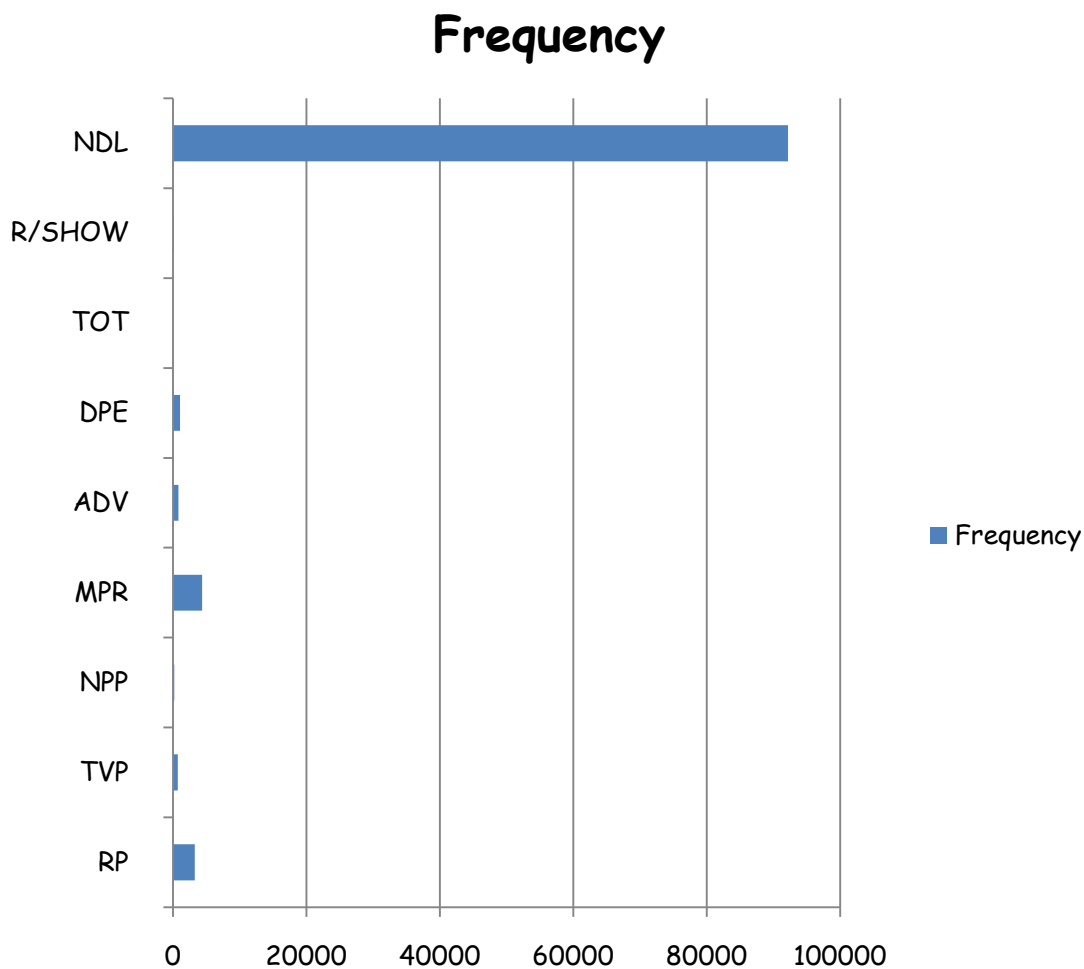

Chart 21: Comparative Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators

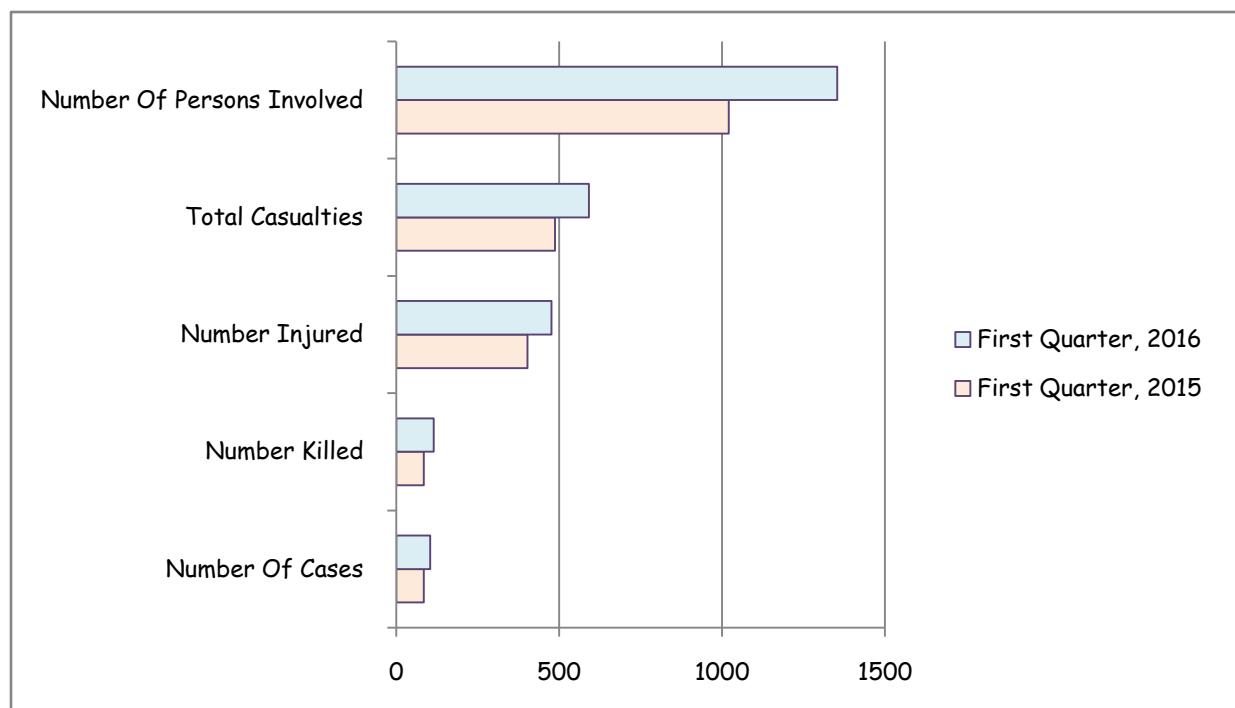
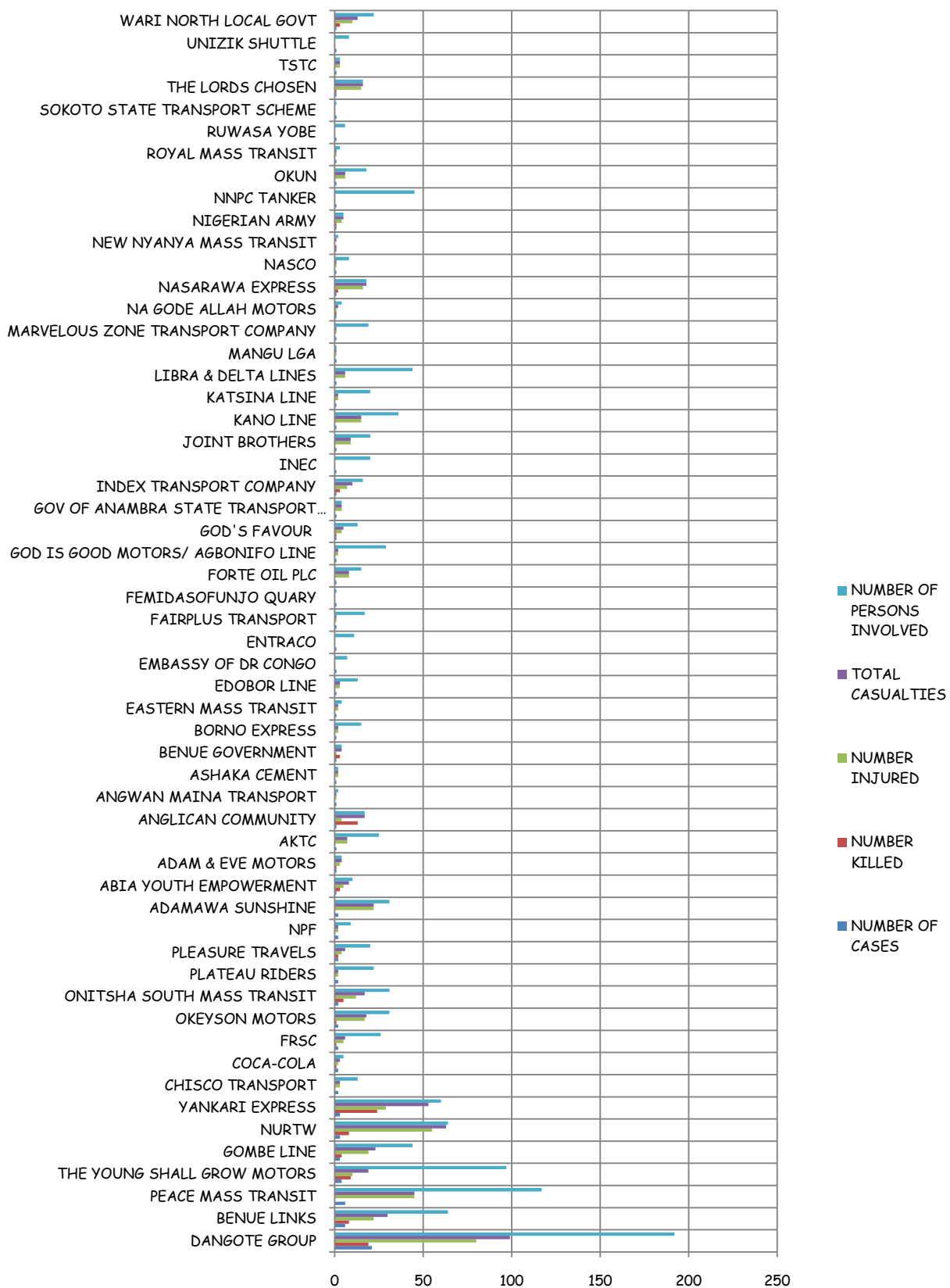

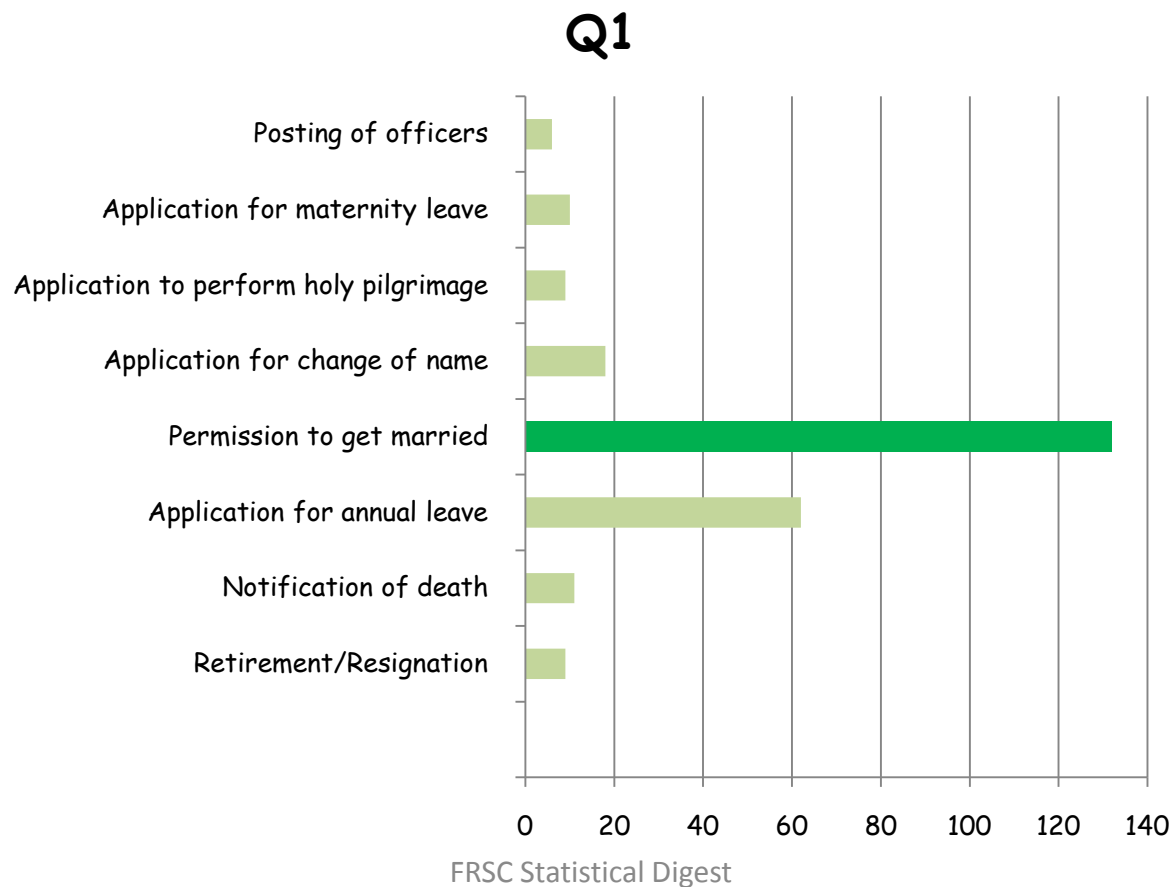

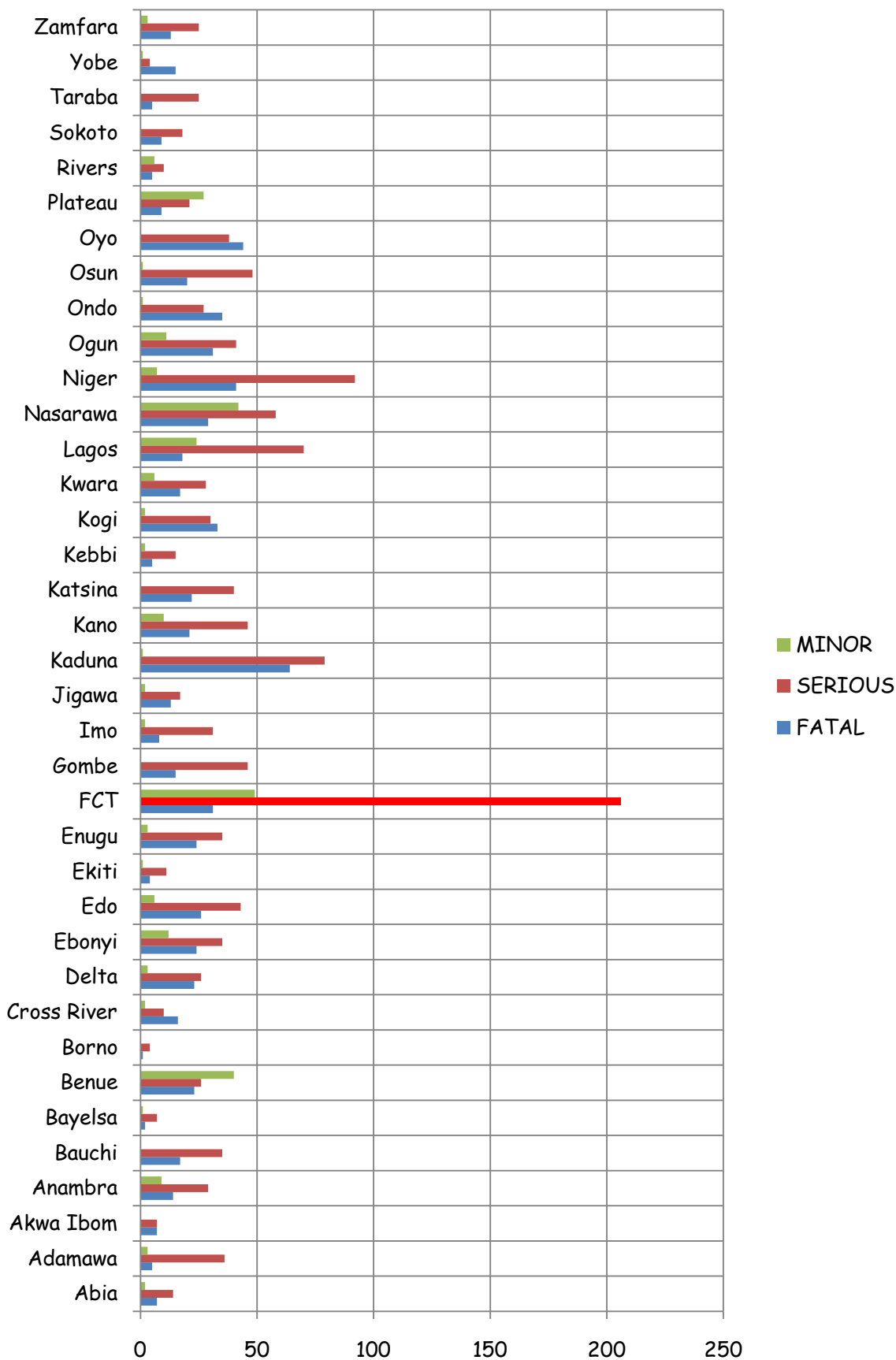

Chart 27: Number Injured

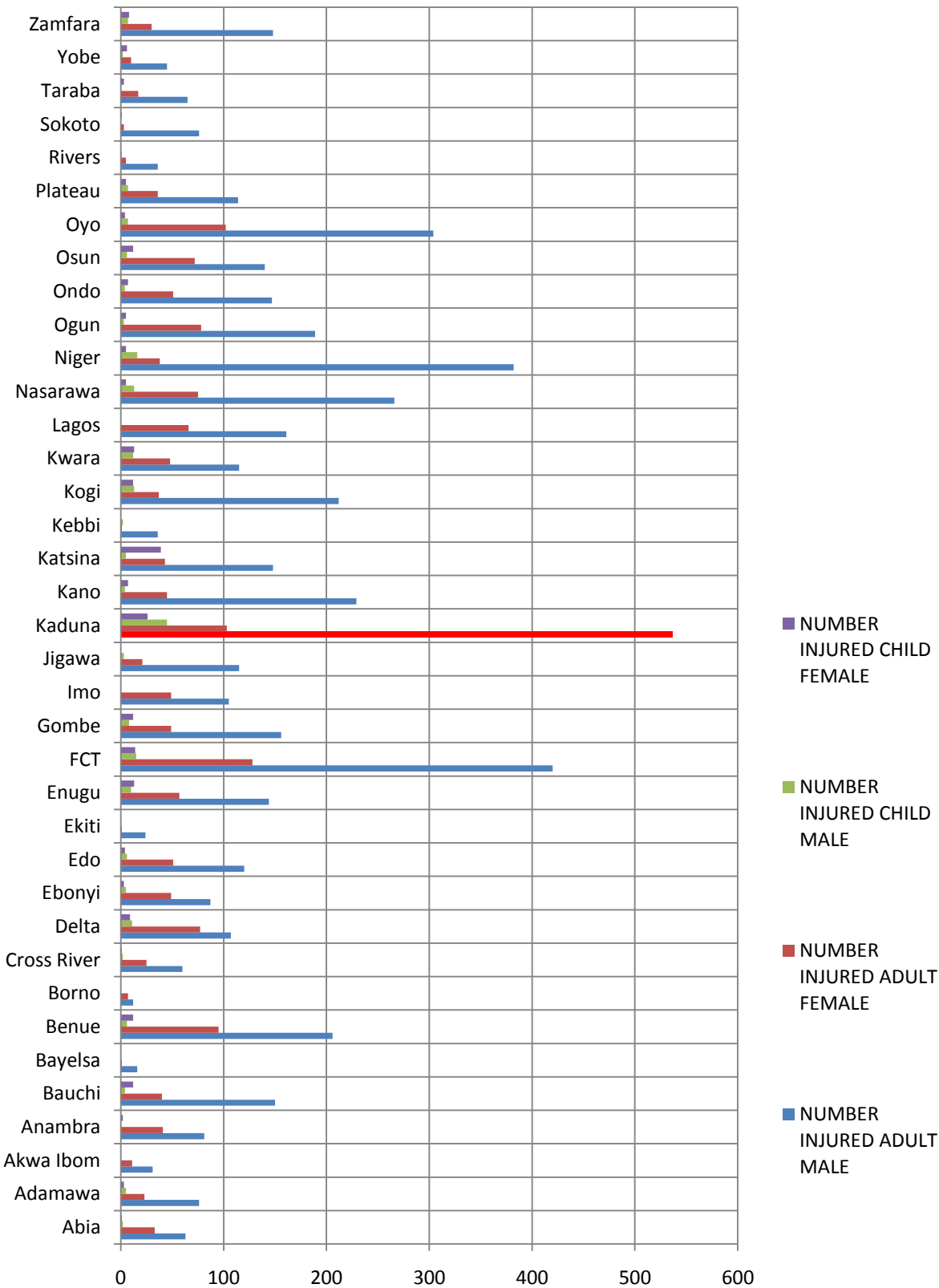

Chart 28: Number Killed on State Basis

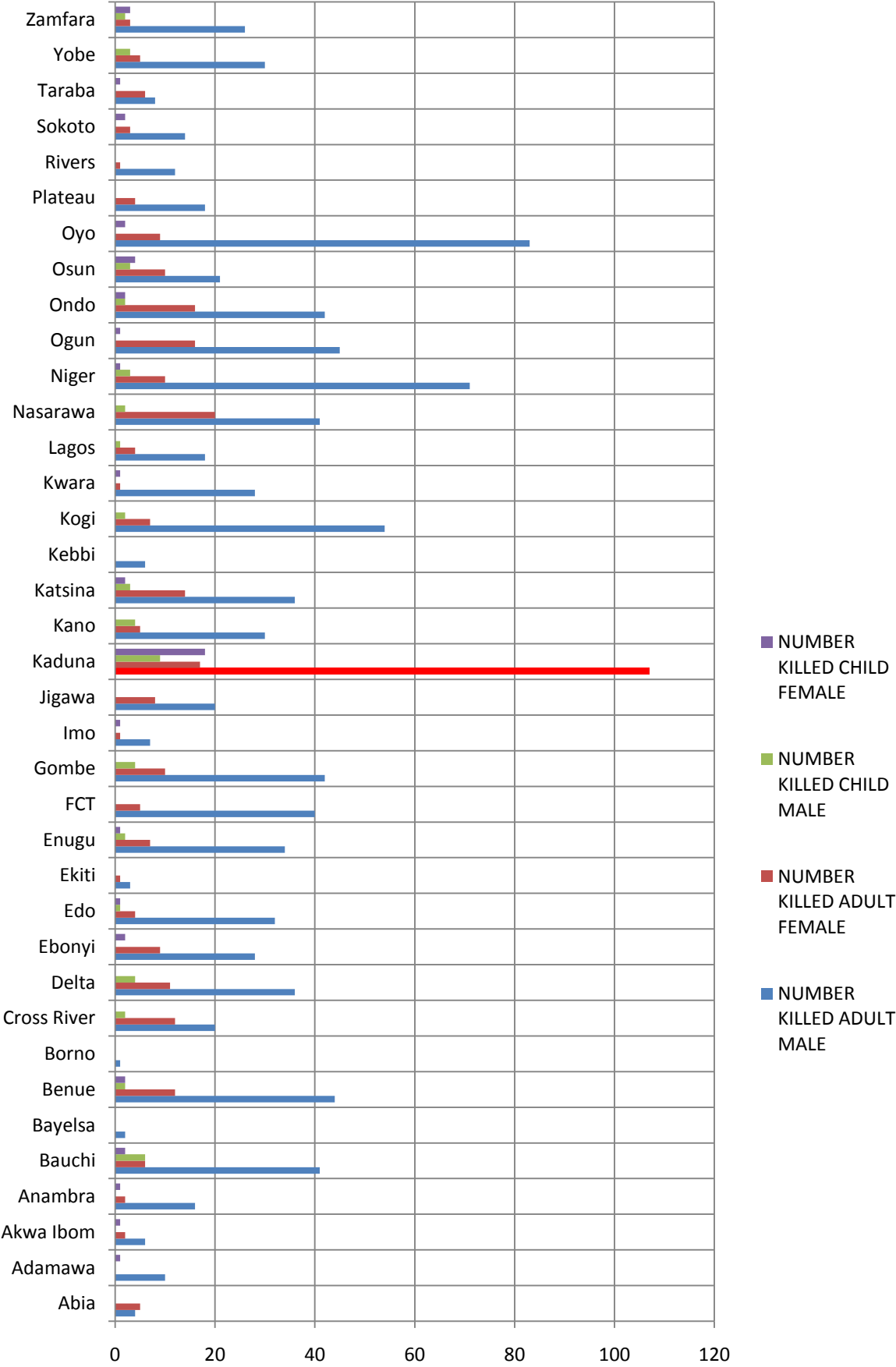

Chart 29: People Involved on State Basis

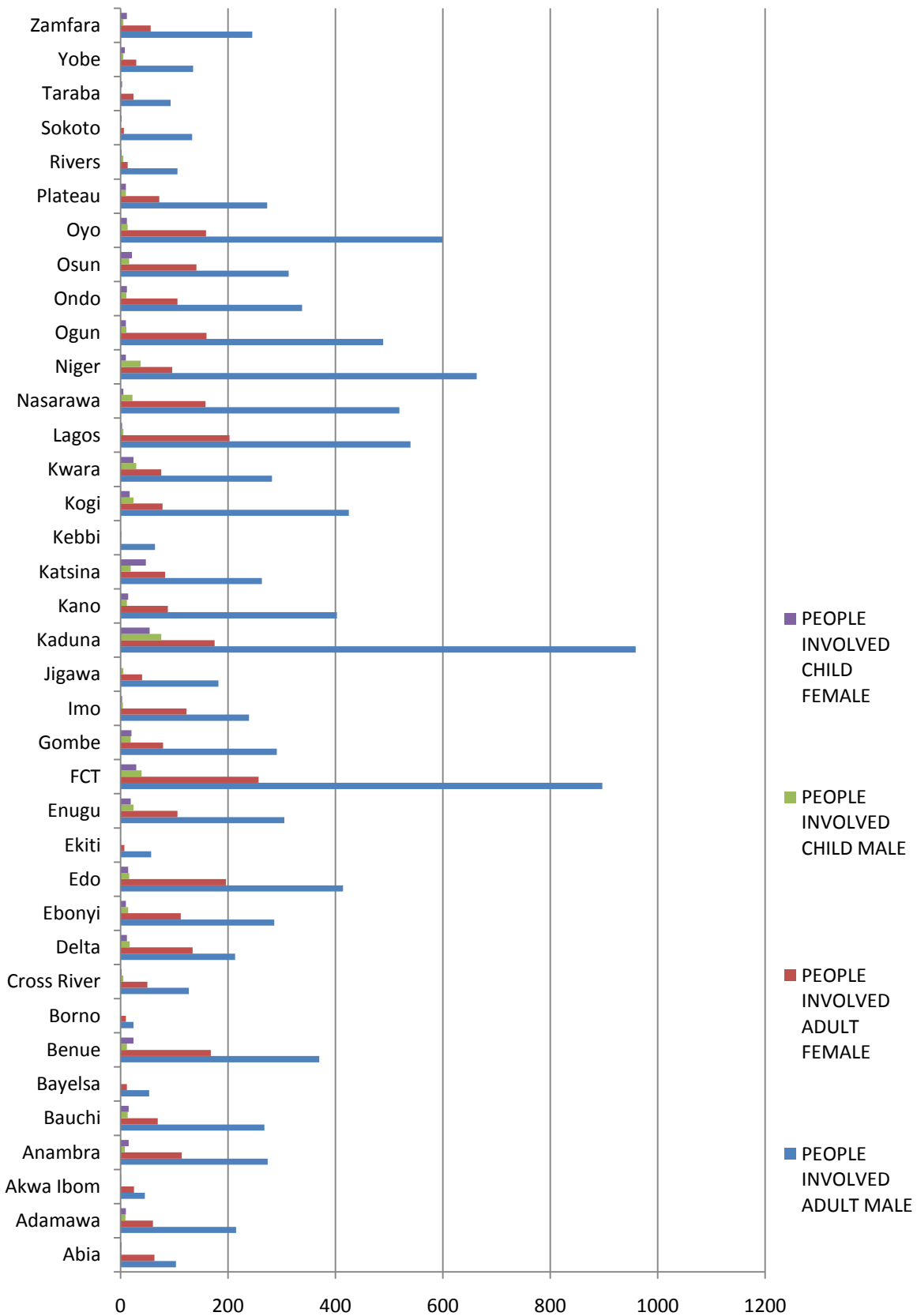
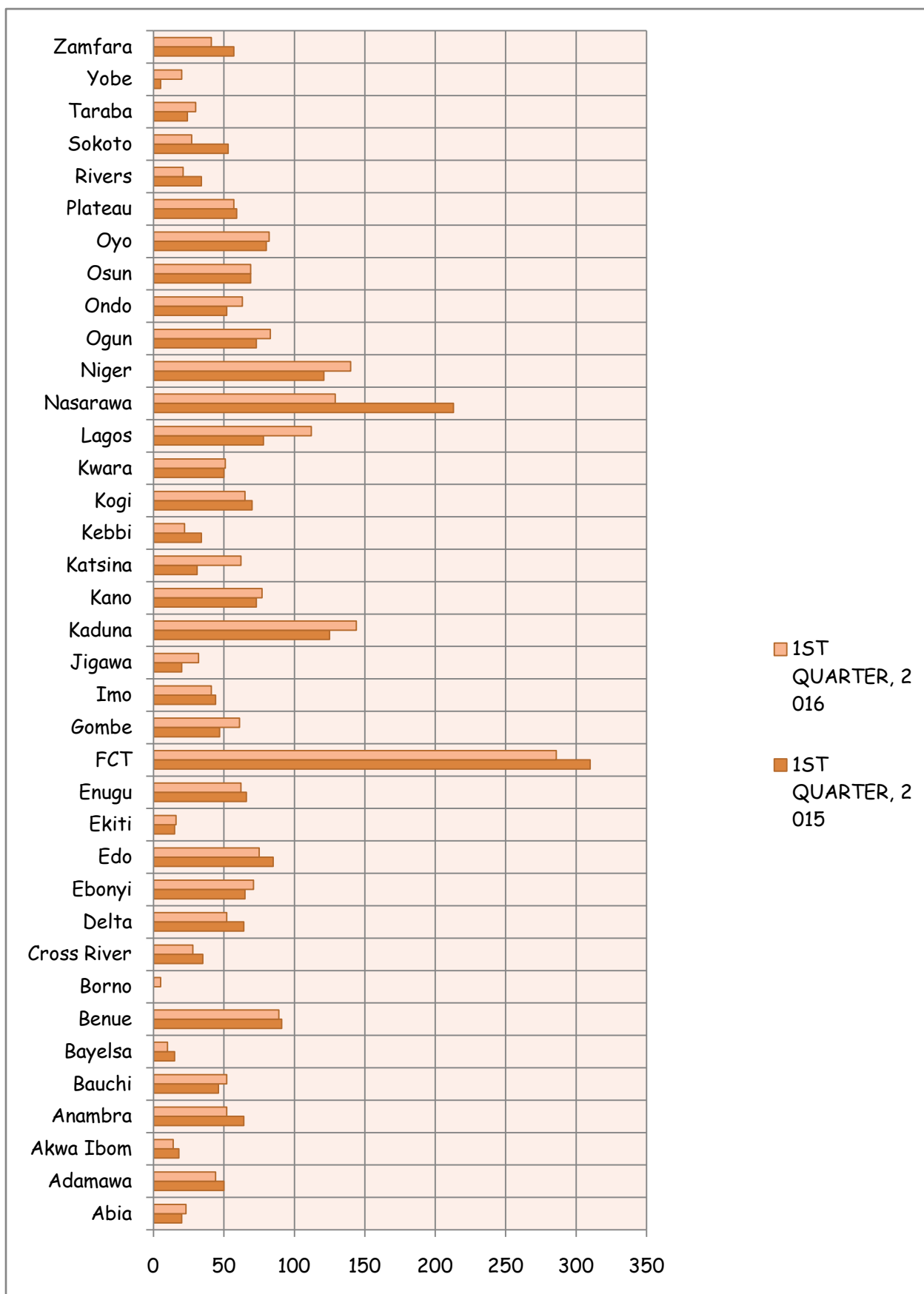


Chart 48: Comparison of Q1 2015 & Q1 2016 RTC Cases on State Basis

Chart 31: Partnership Analysis of Government Agencies and NGO

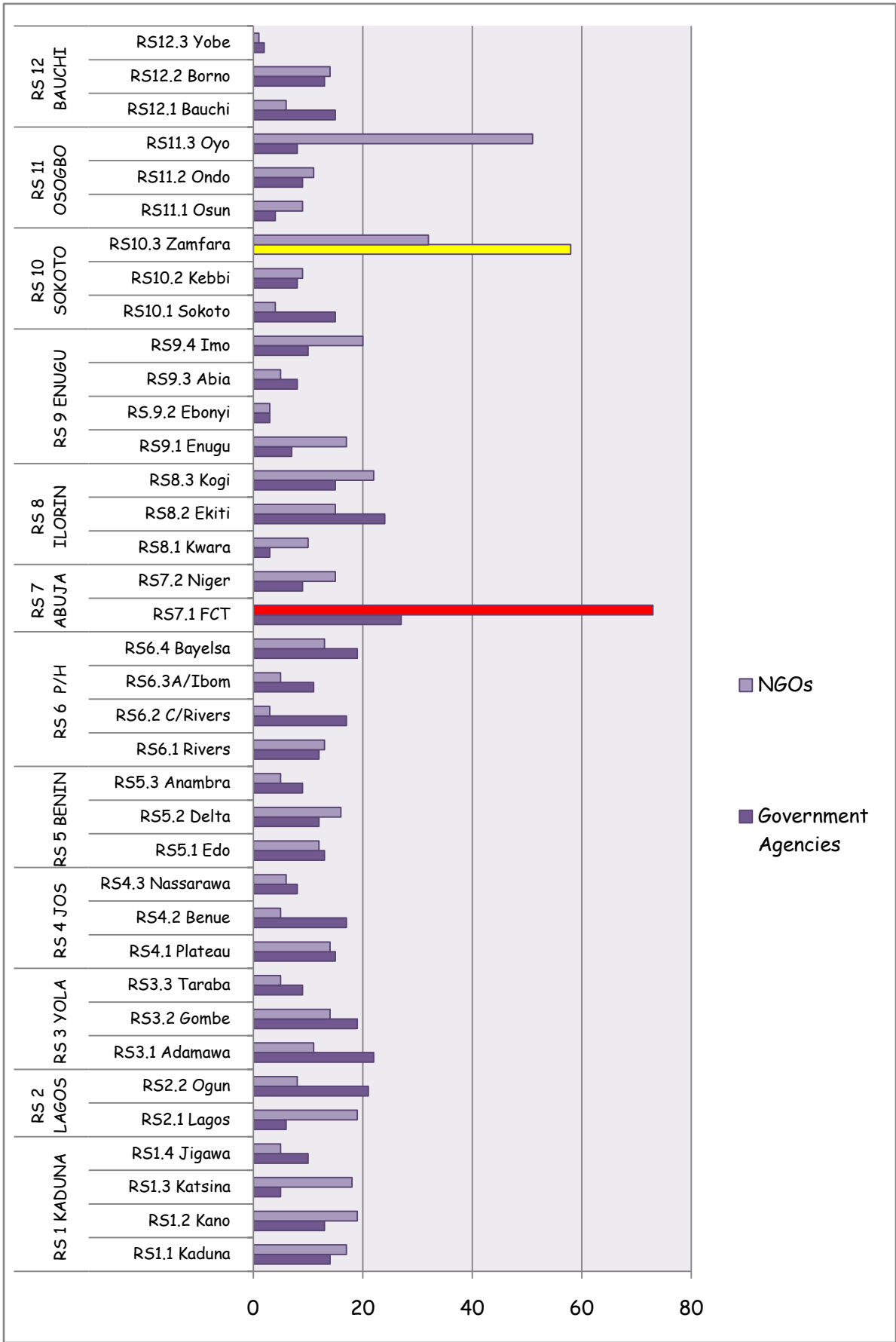

Chart 32: Special Marshals Activities

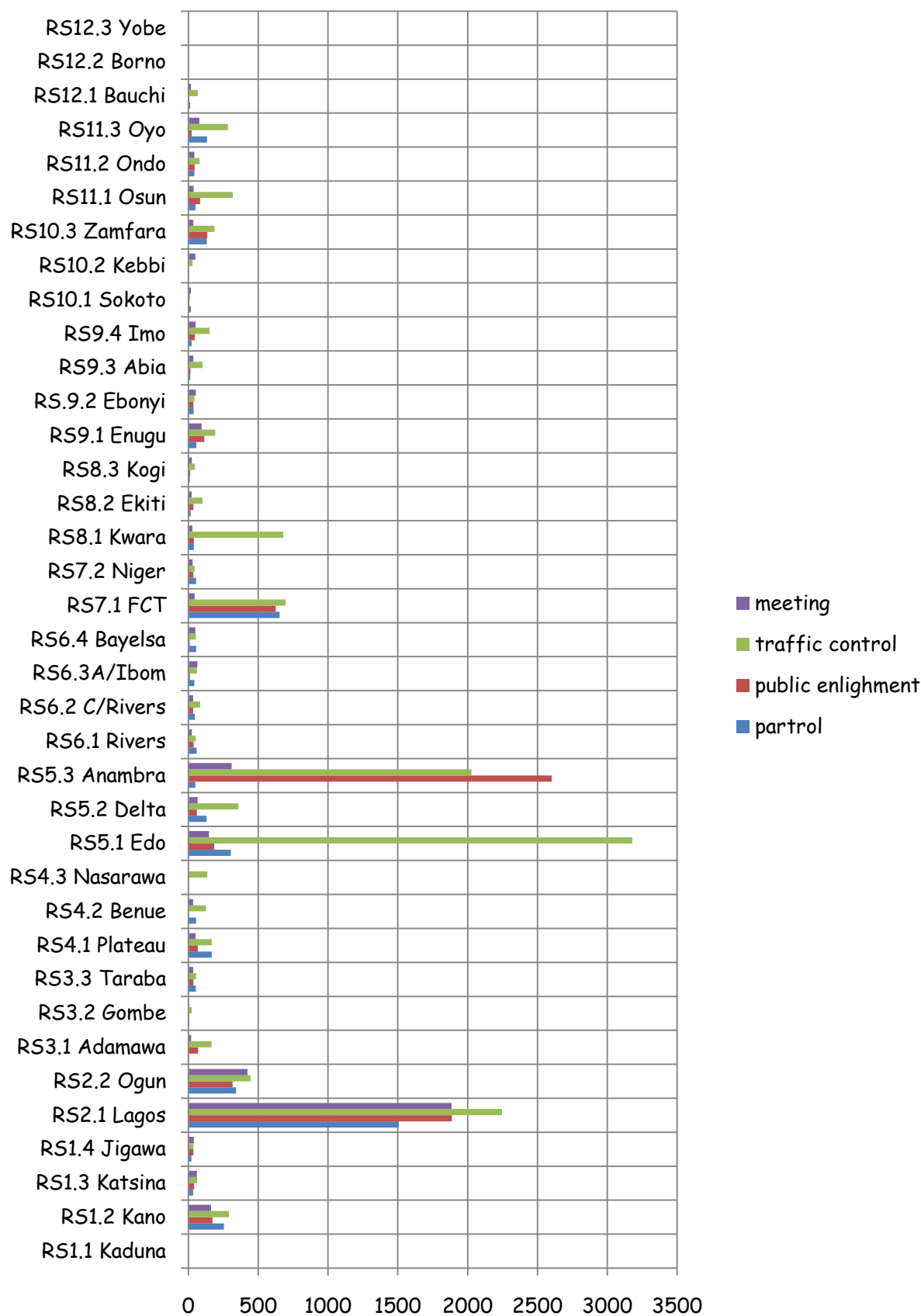

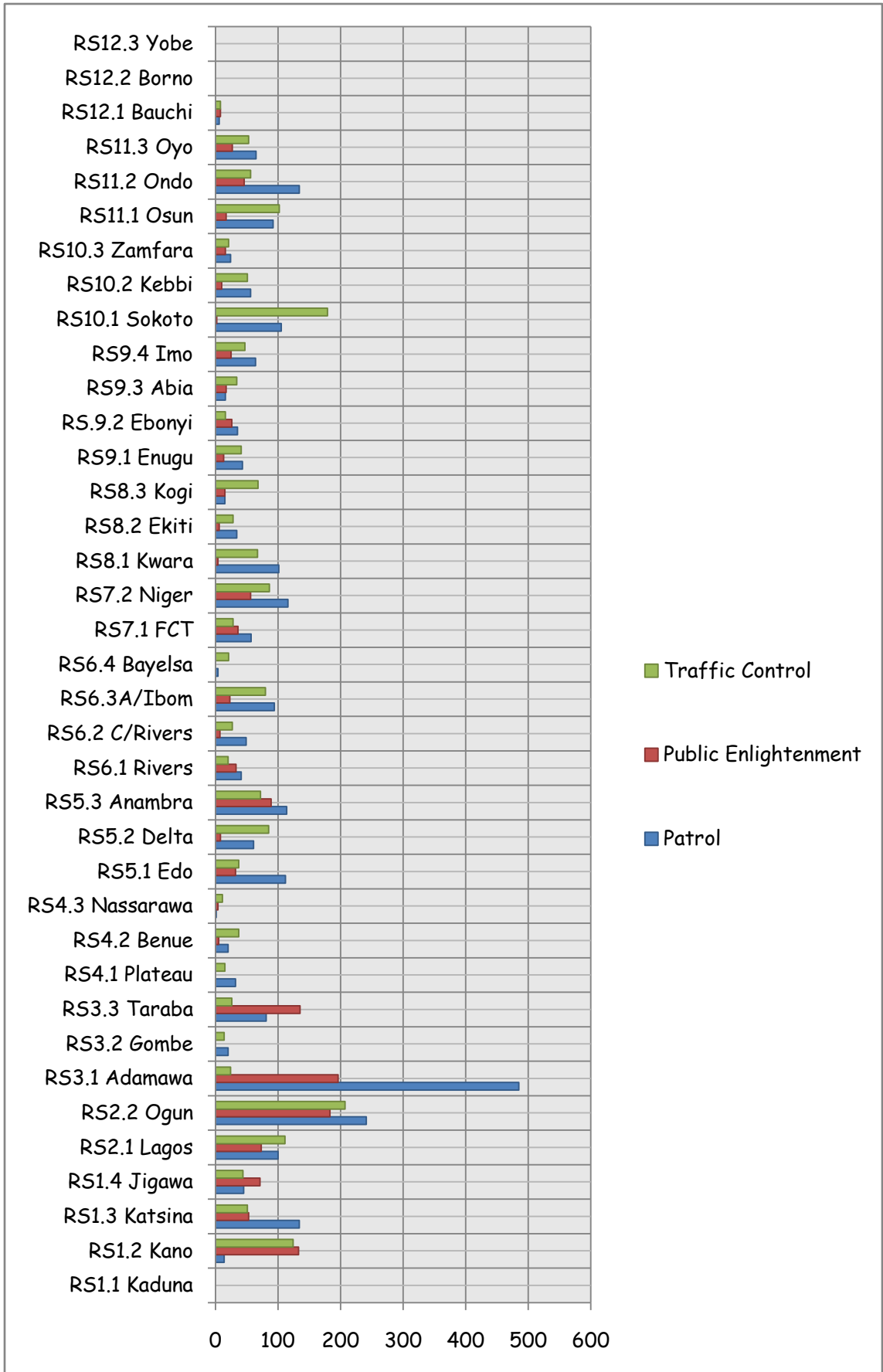
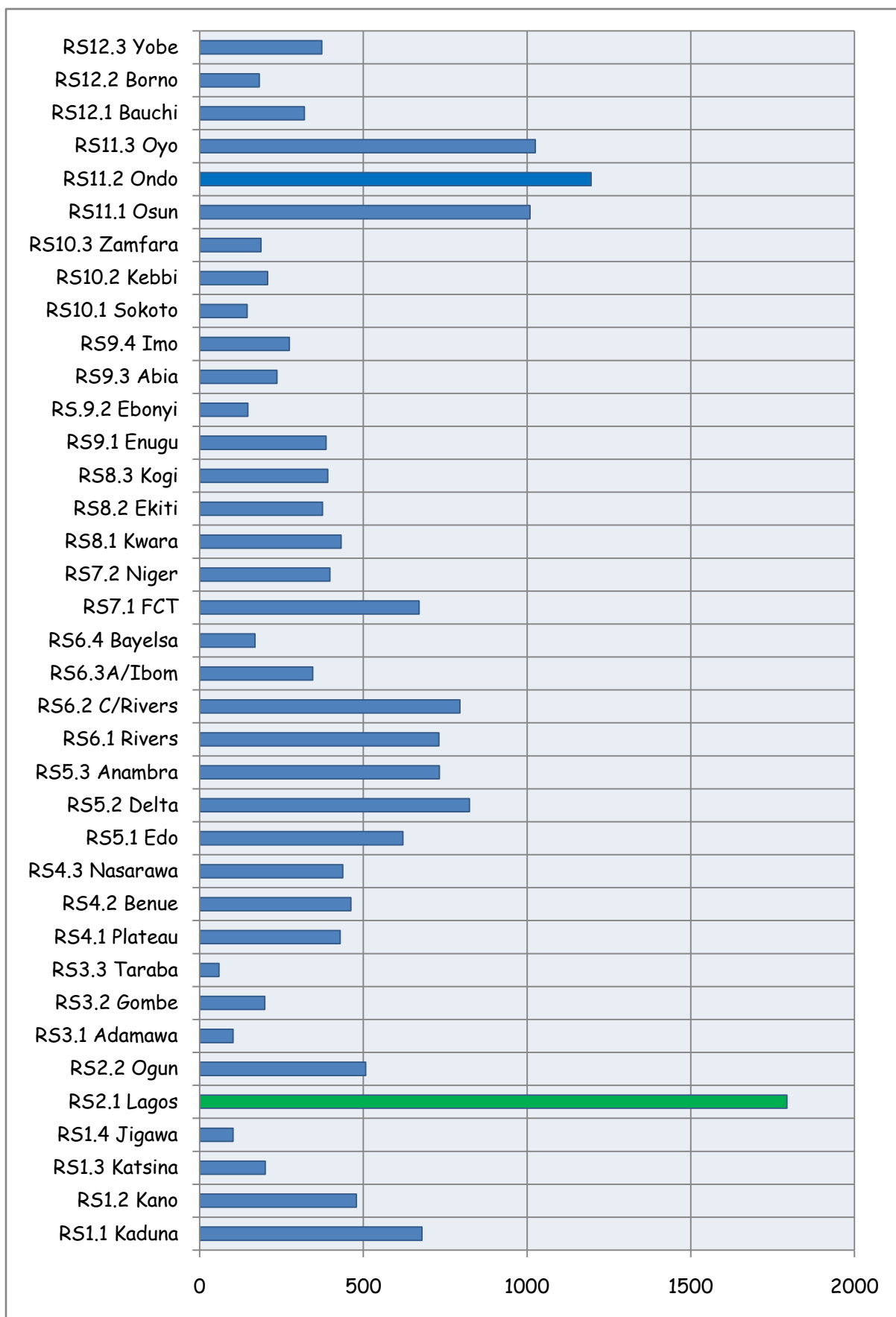
