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The Need for Speed Limiting Device in Vehicles

The 2016 yuletide period is fast approaching. It is a period usually characterized by increased volume of vehicular traffic. Most Nigerians travel by road which accounts for about 90% of movement of passengers and goods. In addition to the pressure on the roads, drivers attitude to speed lead to the high number of crashes usually recorded at this period. Cognizant of this, Federal Road Safety Corps has commenced enforcement on speed limiting devices in vehicles to help regulate speed.

The speed limiter is an electro-mechanical device that is installed in vehicles and calibrated to prevent them from going above preset limit. It is an efficient and powerful tool for speed management. Speed limiters directly control speed by applying counter force on the accelerator or through the engine fuel injection system.

Some of the benefits of installing speed limiting device in vehicles are:

- Reduction of the top speed of vehicles to a pre-set limit thereby reducing overall crash risk and more likely to lessen the severity of crash
- Reduction of speed variability thus reducing lane changing and deceleration manoeuvres
- Lowering fuel consumption and reduction in greenhouse gas emissions
- Lowering maintenance cost (tyres, brakes, engines)
- Increasing road safety (fewer casualty)
- More relaxed driving and lower insurance premiums as a consequence of less crashes

The success of this laudable step taken by the Corps would be achieved through stakeholders' collaboration so that road traffic crash can be reduced to the barest minimum.

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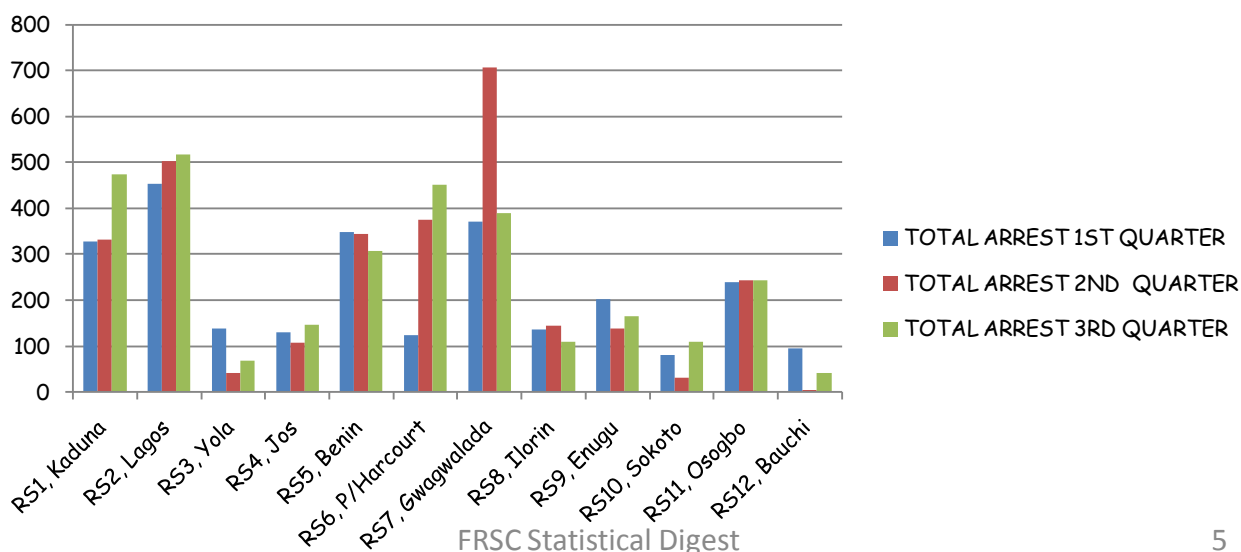

Chart 2:Pie Chart Illustrating War on Overloading

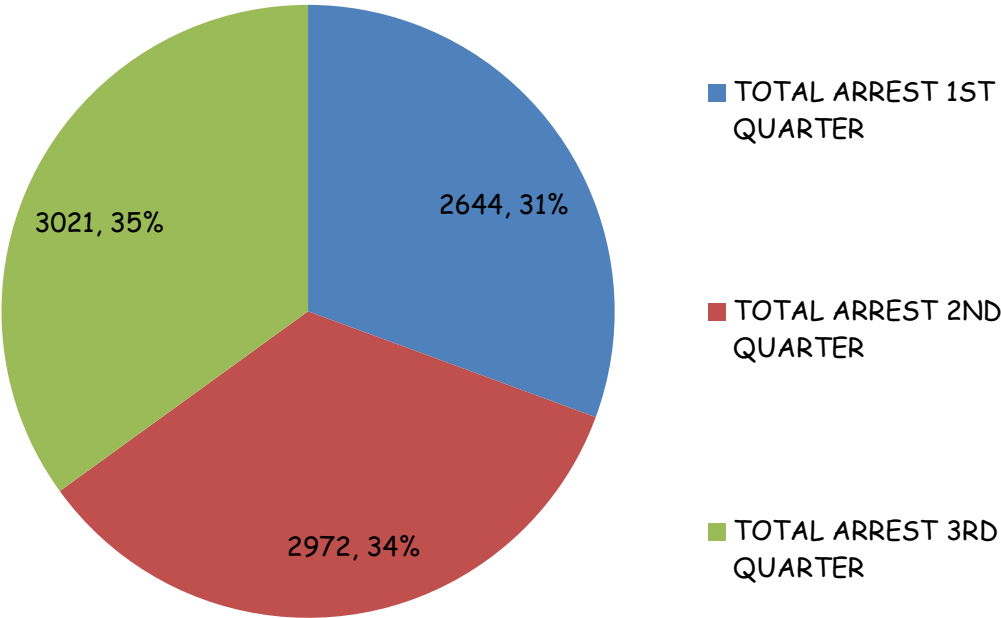

Chart 3: Chart Illustrating Offenders/Offences

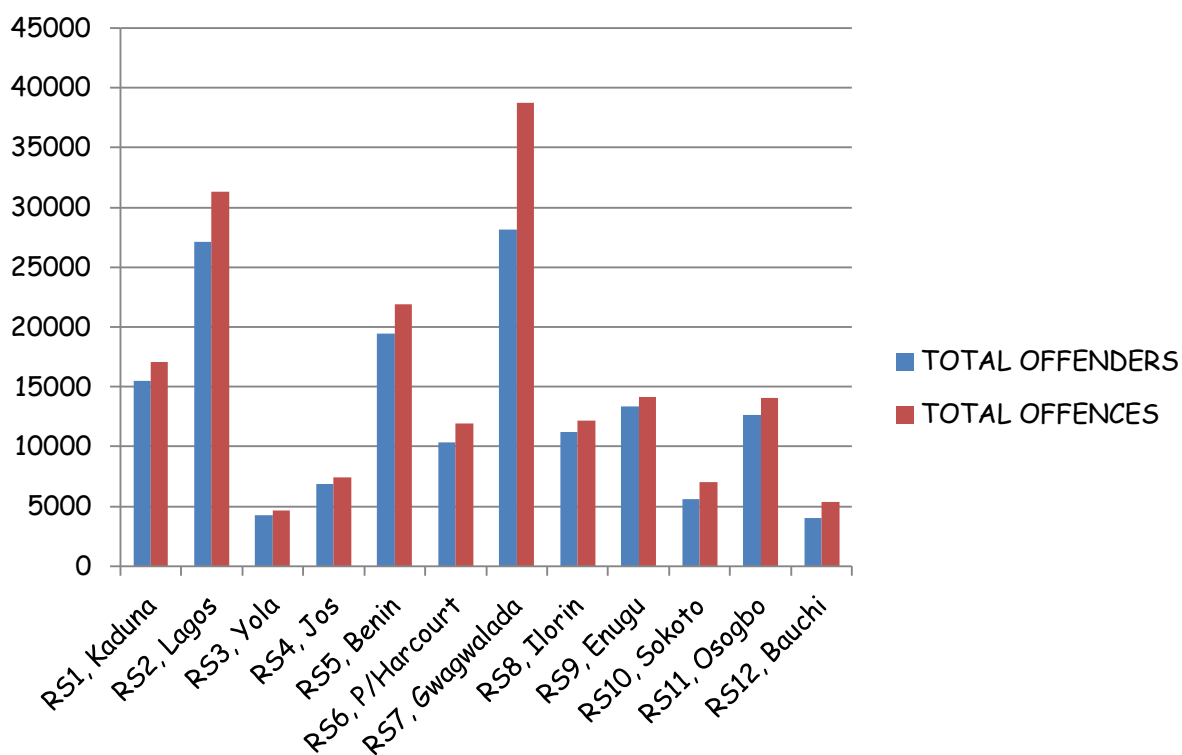
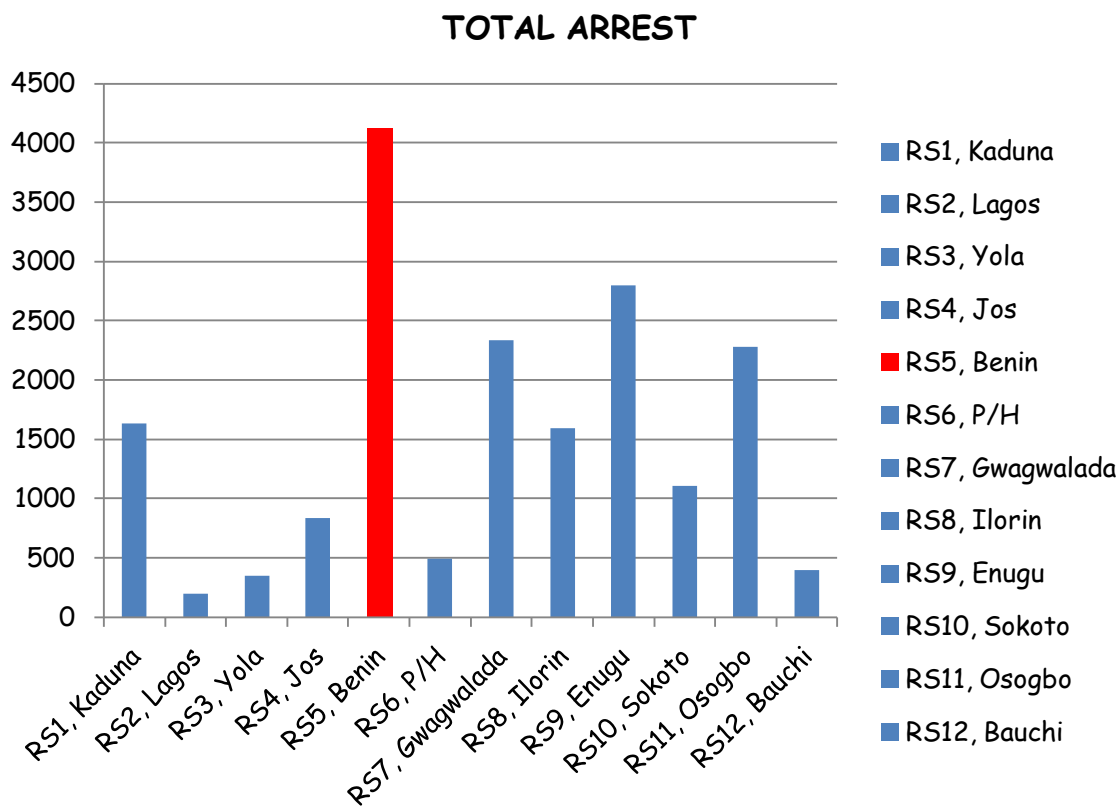

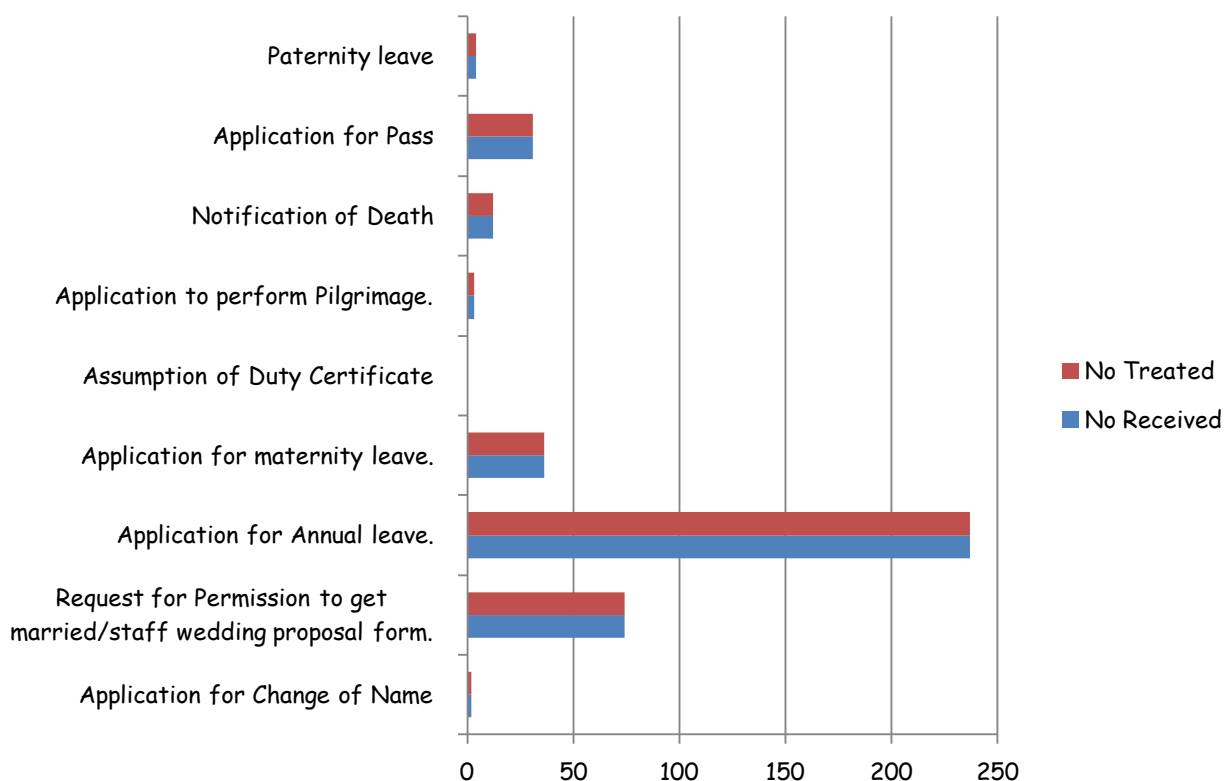
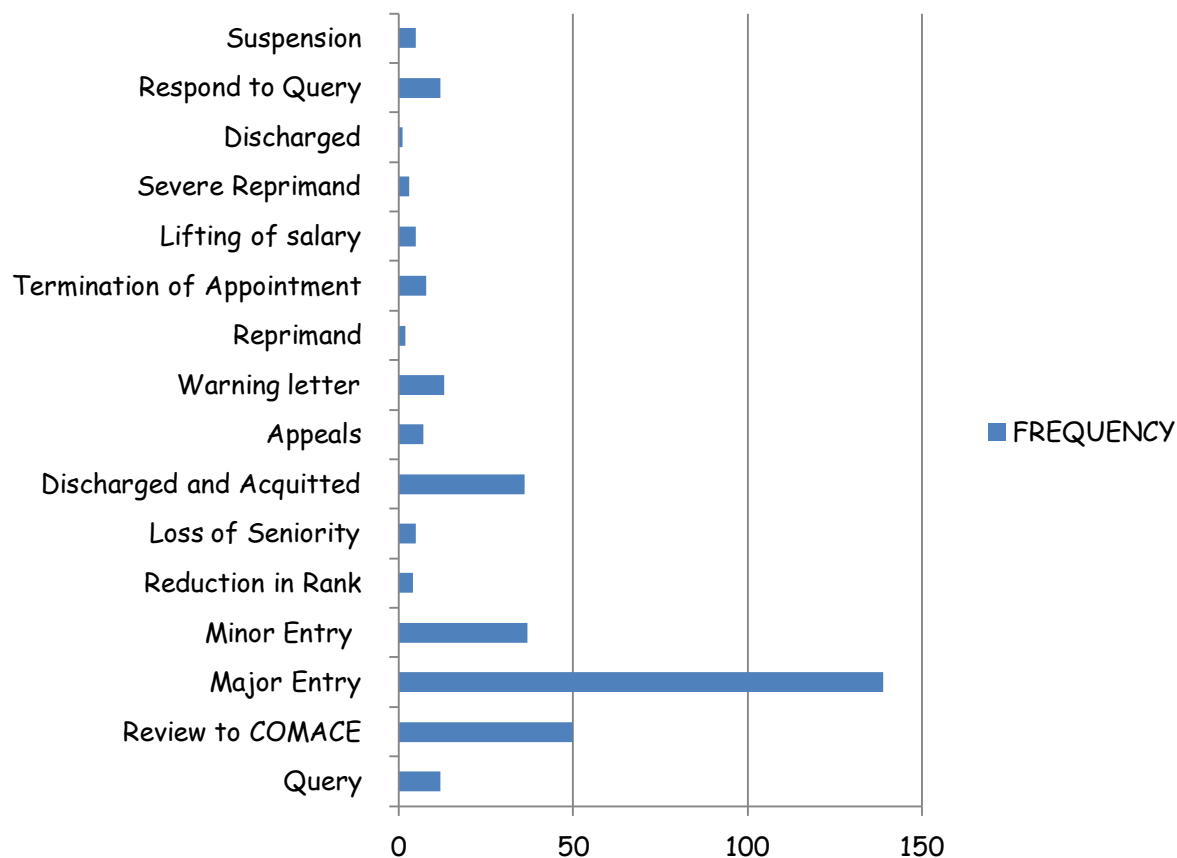

Chart 7: Chart Illustrating Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Officers)

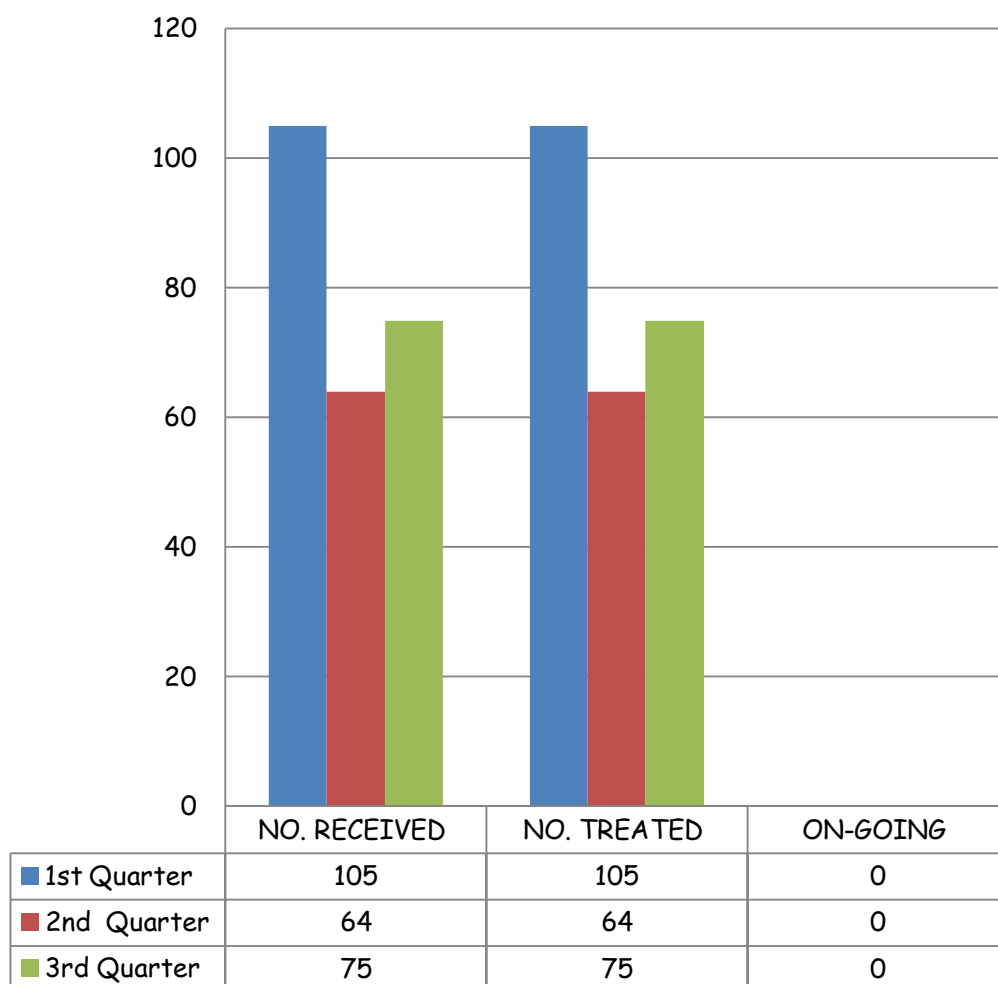

Chart 8: Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

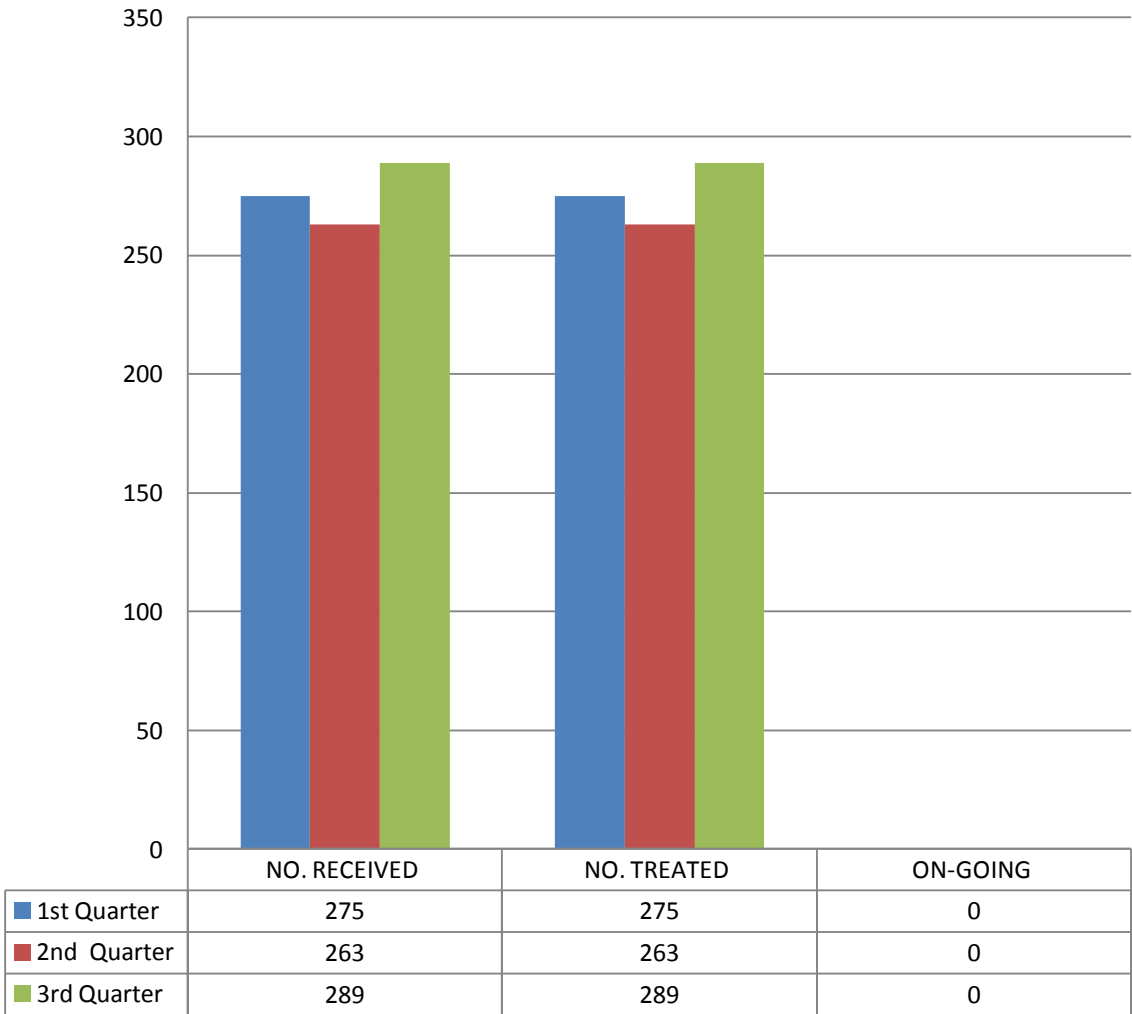
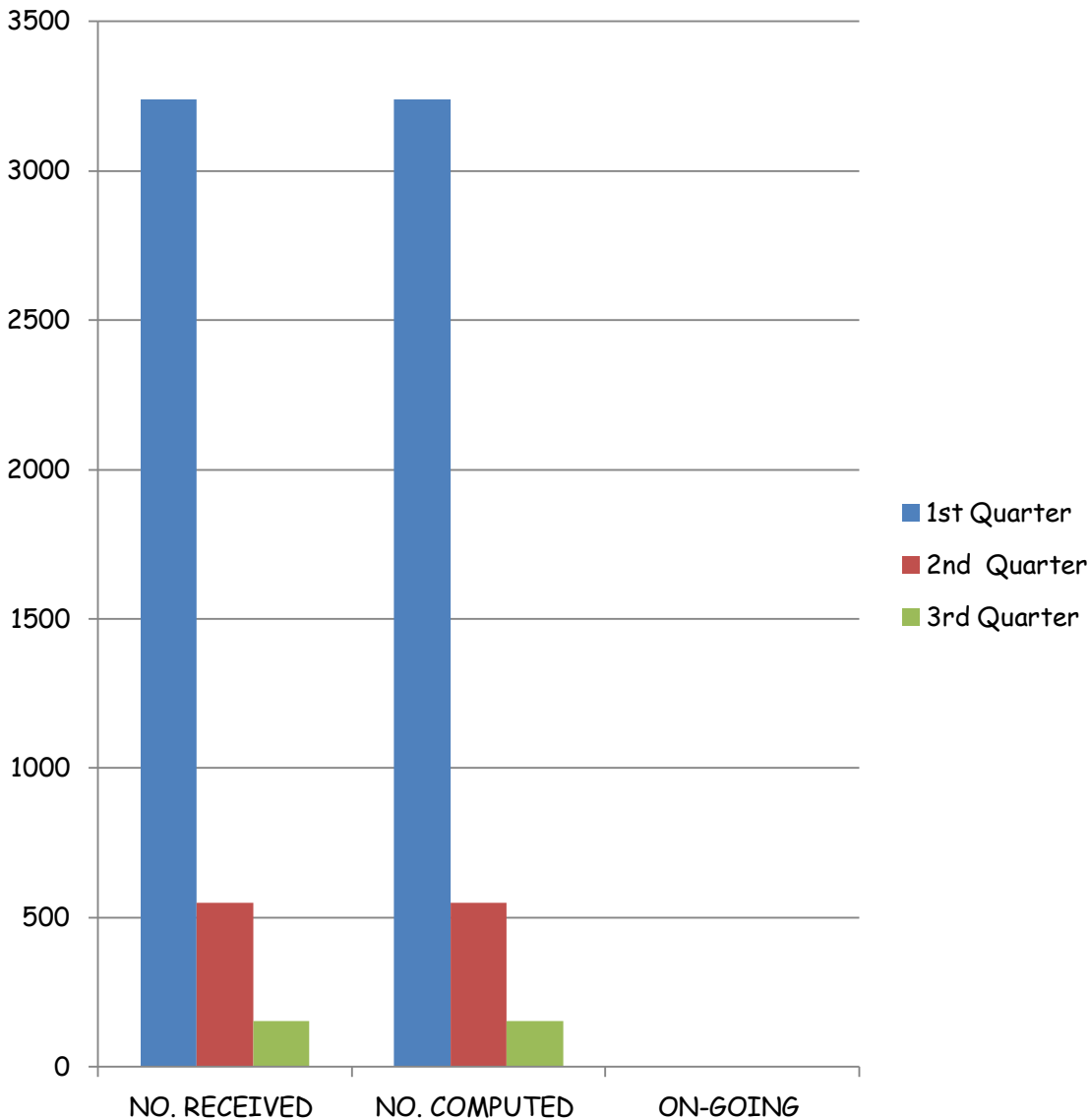

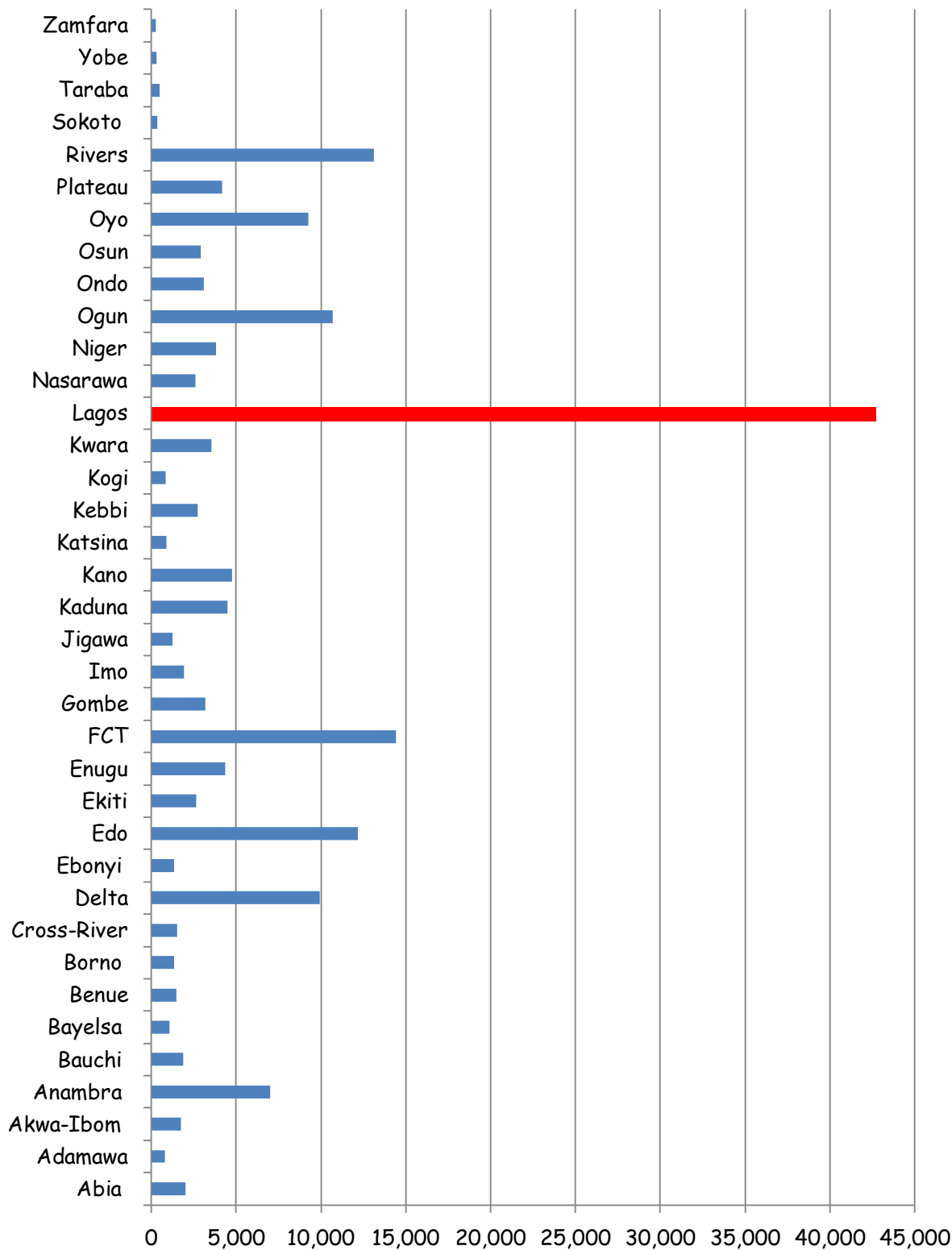

Chart 11: Number Plates Produced by Class

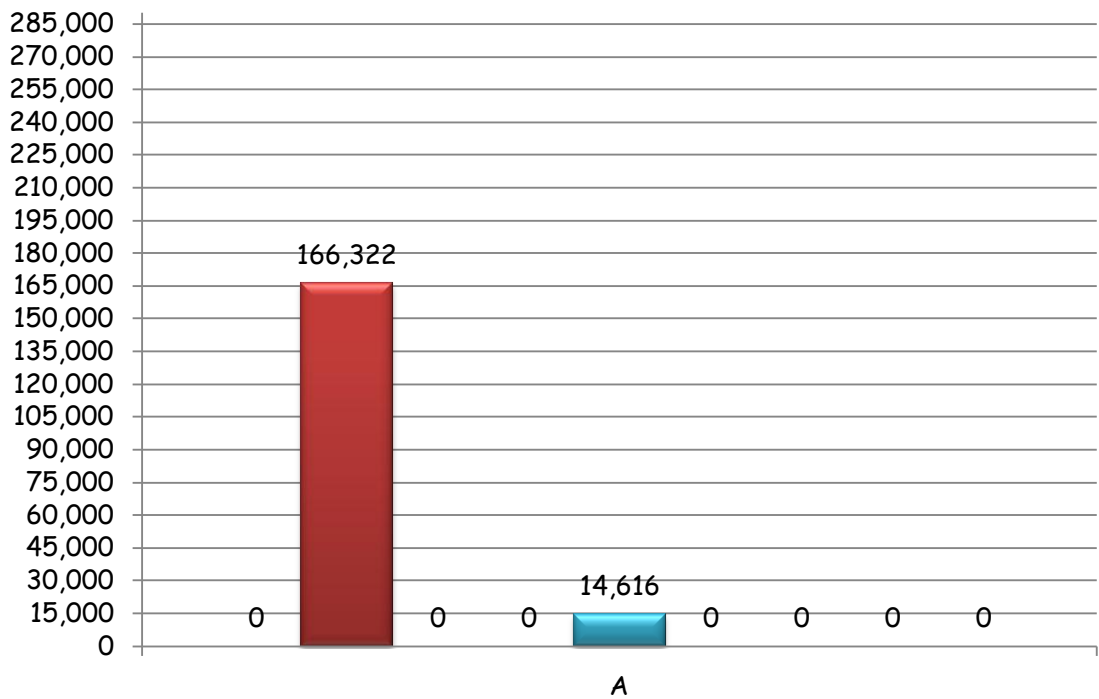


Chart 12: Pie Chart Number Plates Produced by Class

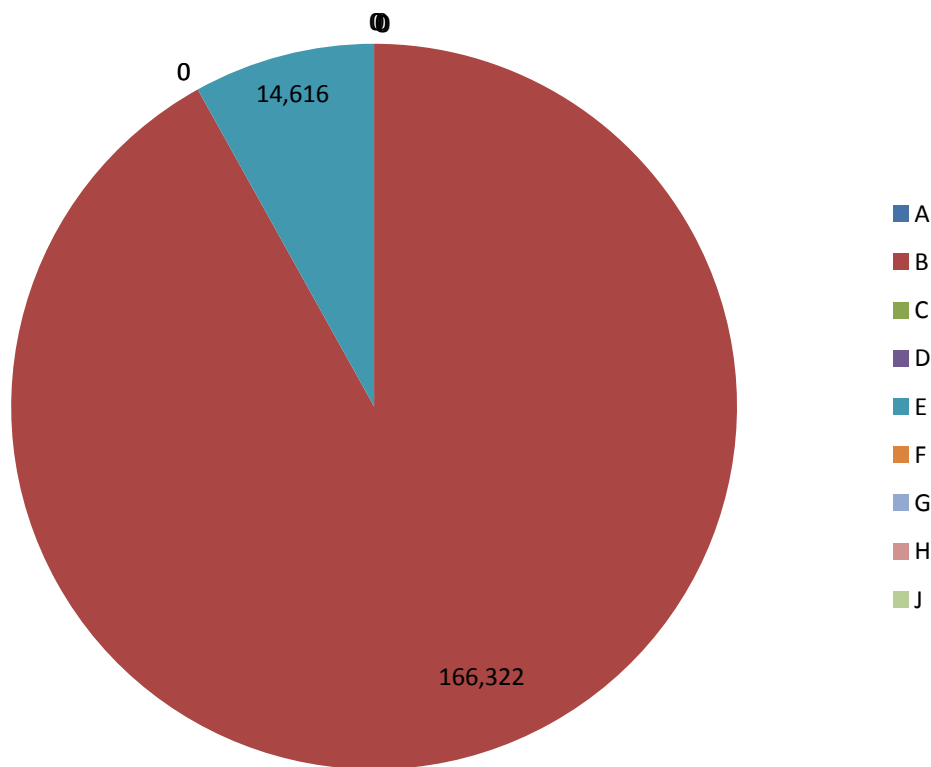

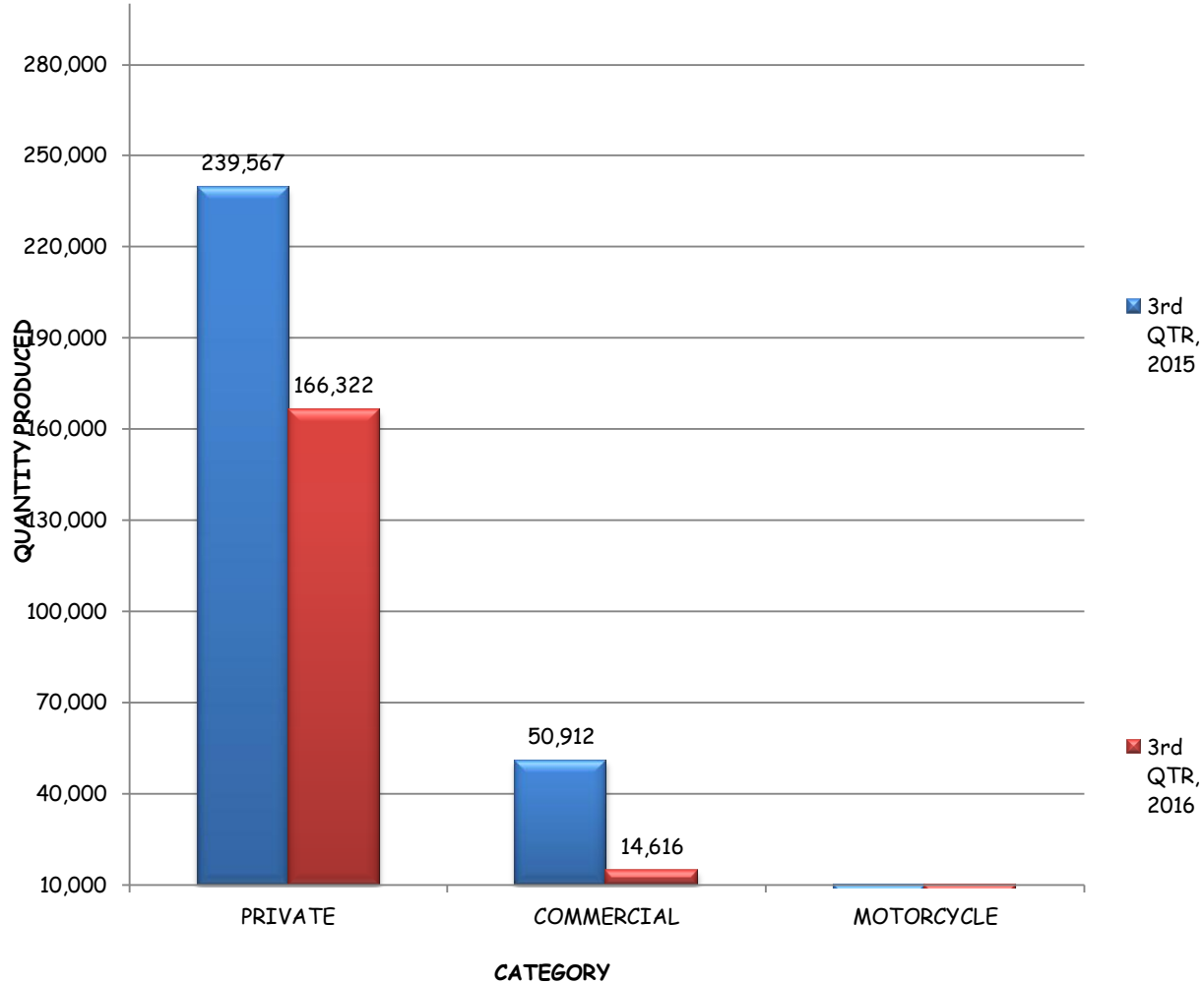




Chart 14: Showing Comparative Analysis of NDL production between 3rd Qtr 2015 and 3rd Qtr 2016

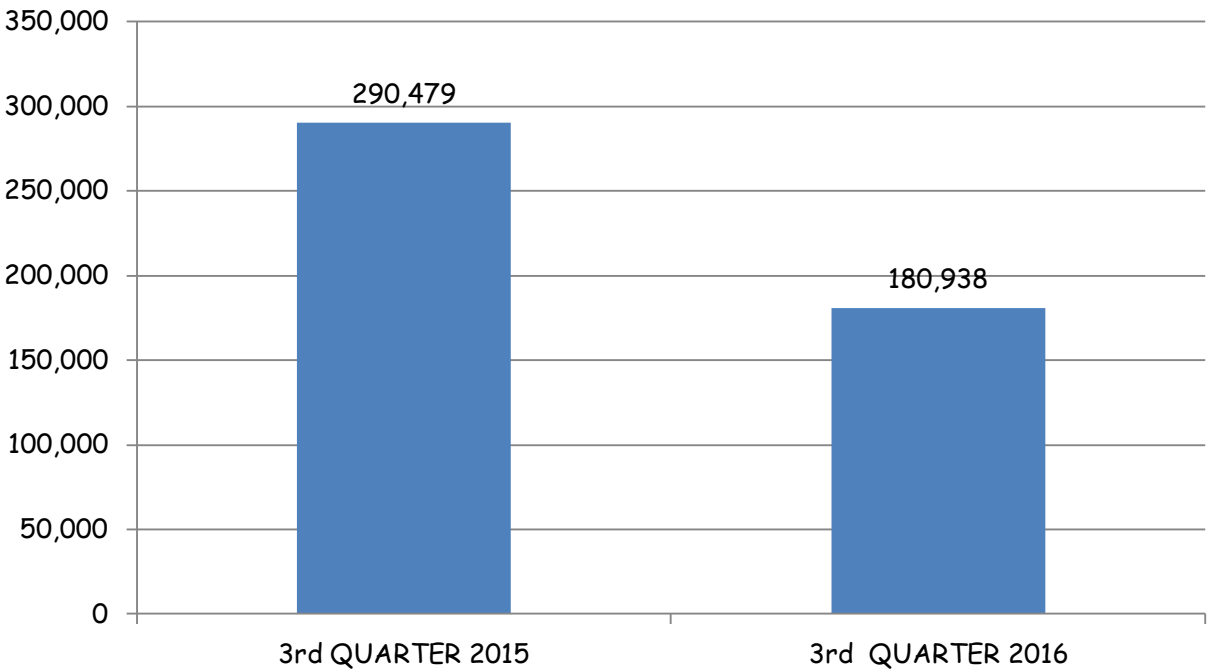


Chart 15: Comparative Analysis of NDL production between 3rd Q 2015 and 3rd Q 2016

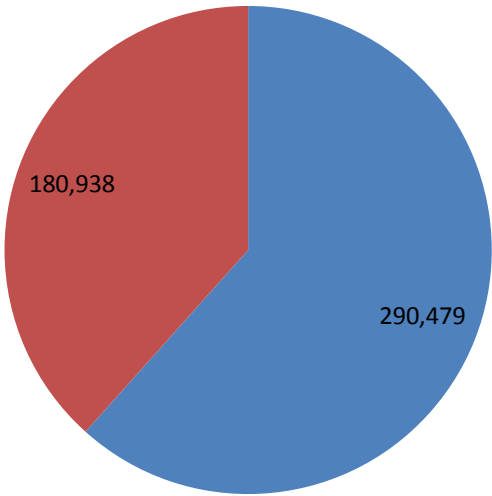

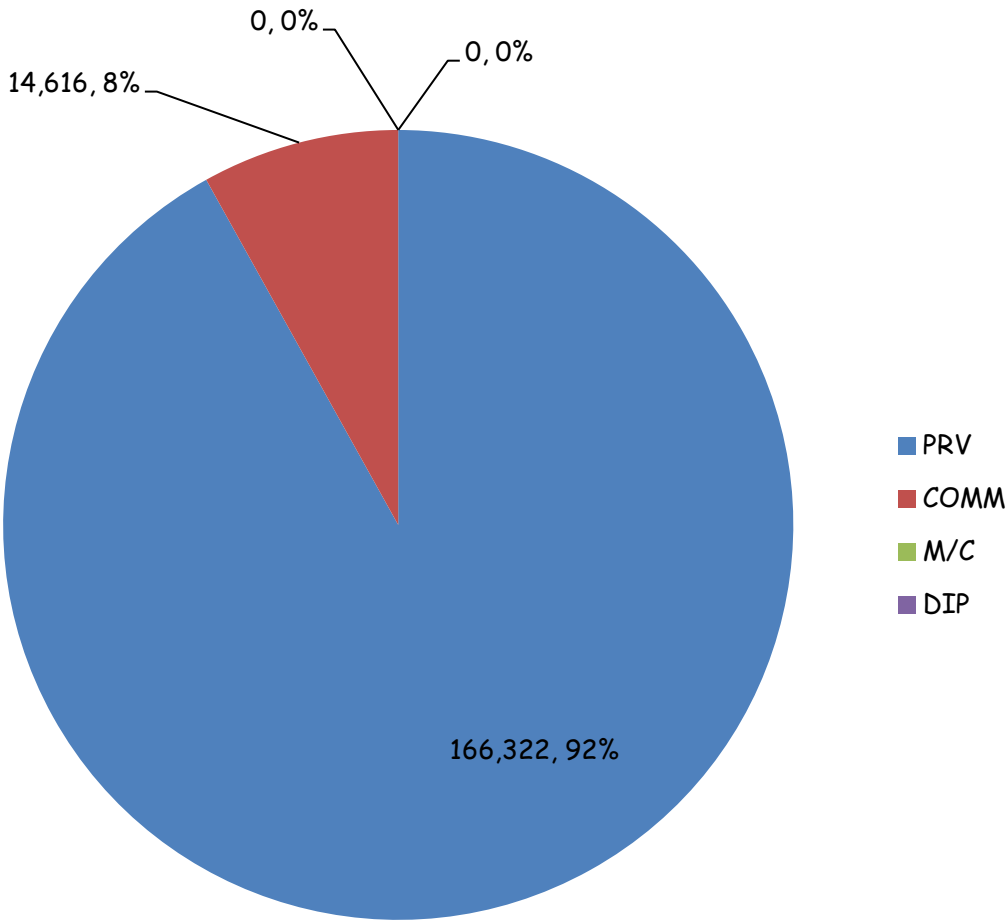

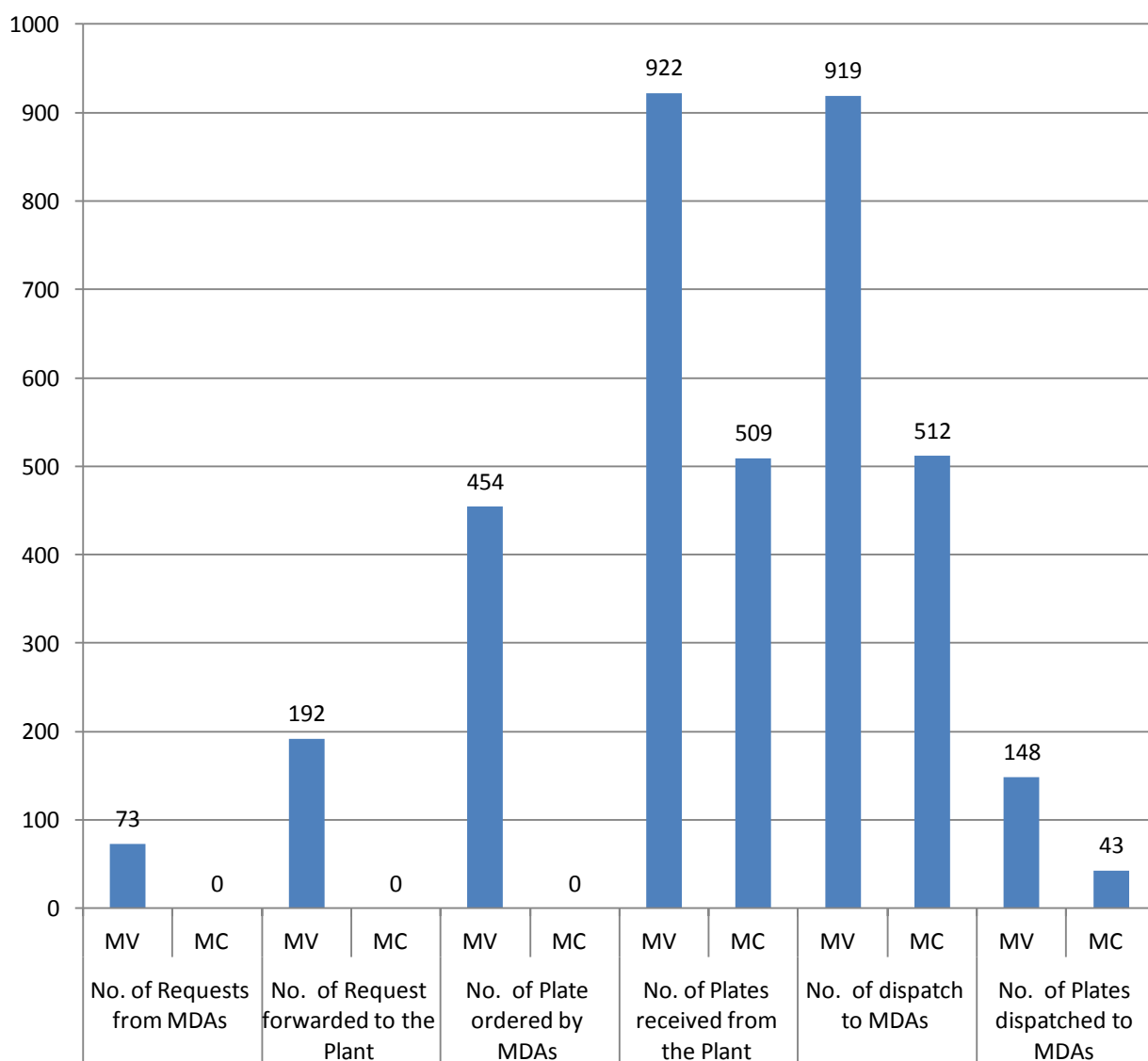

Chart 18: Number of Vehicle Registered

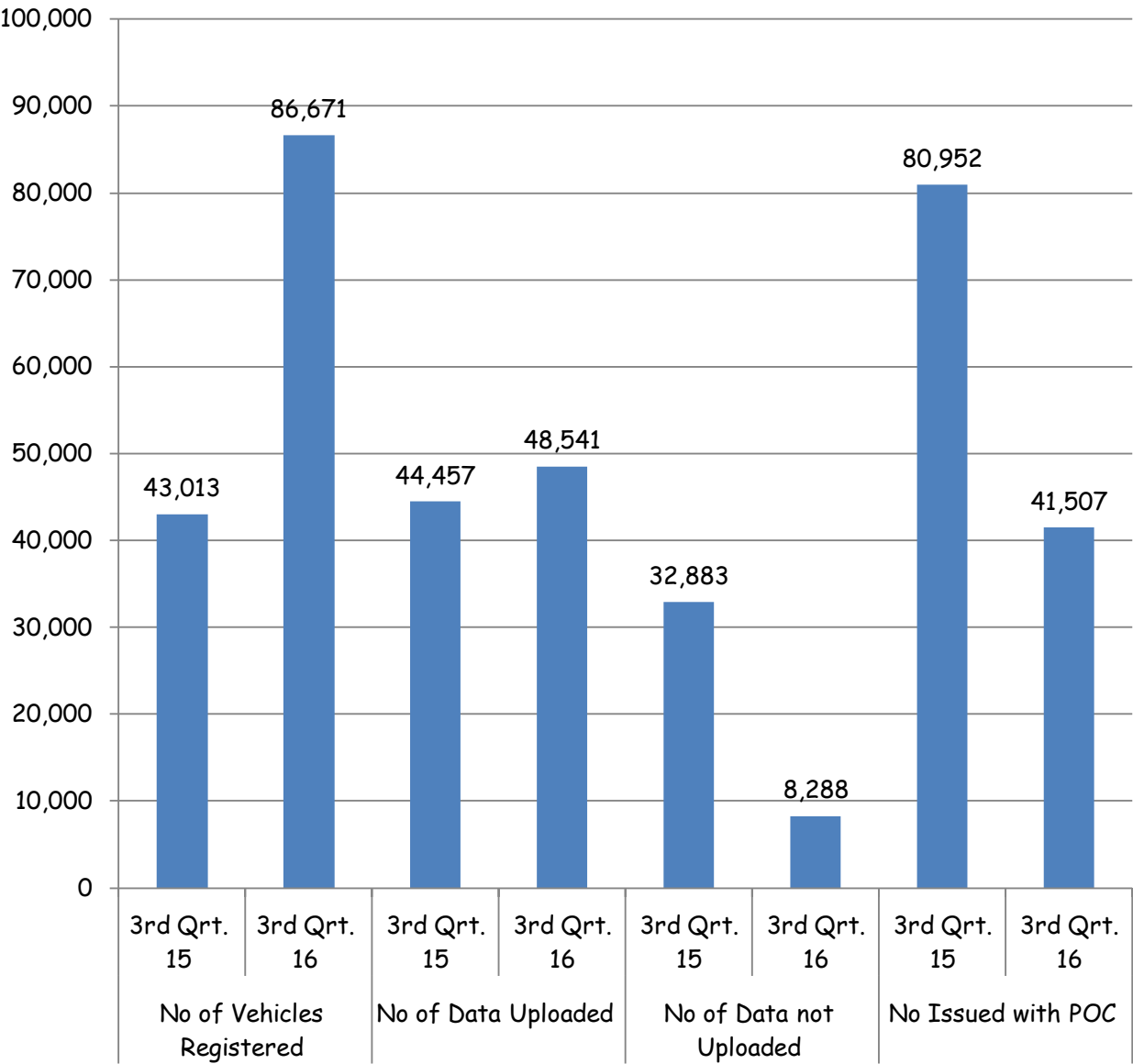
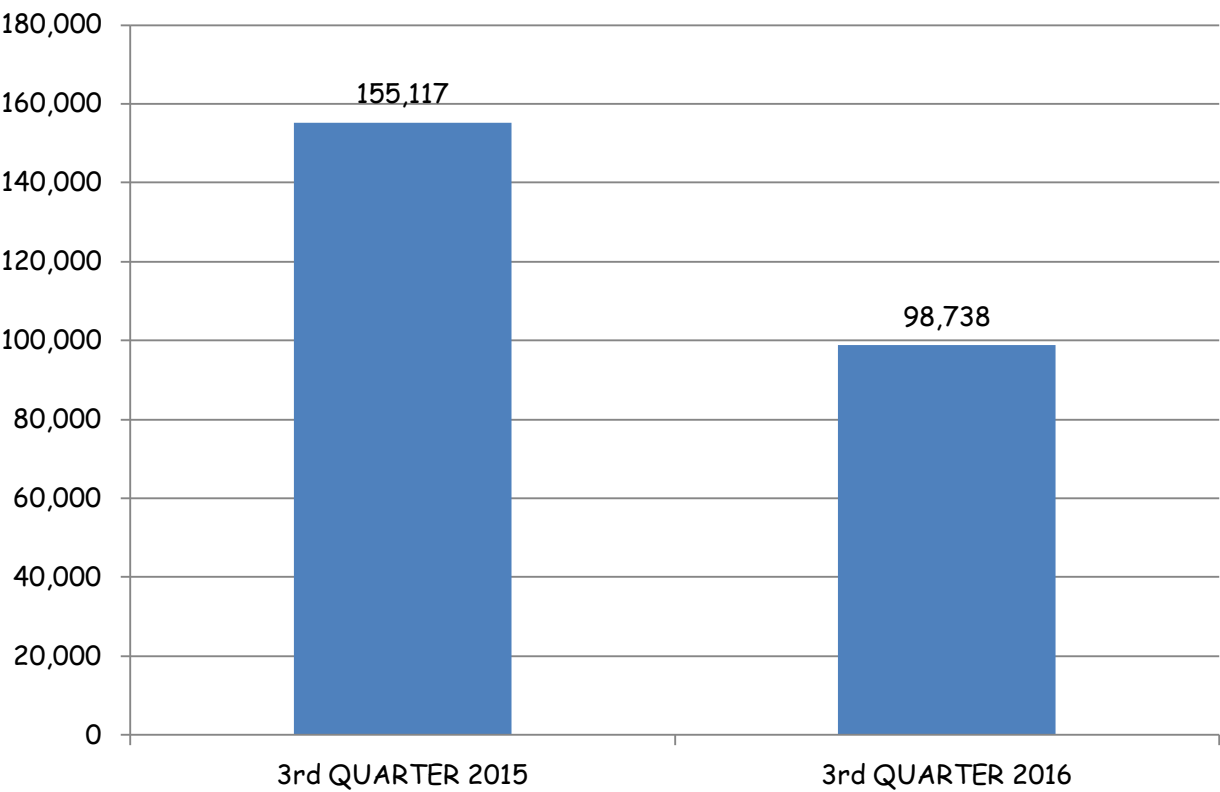

Chart 20: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to

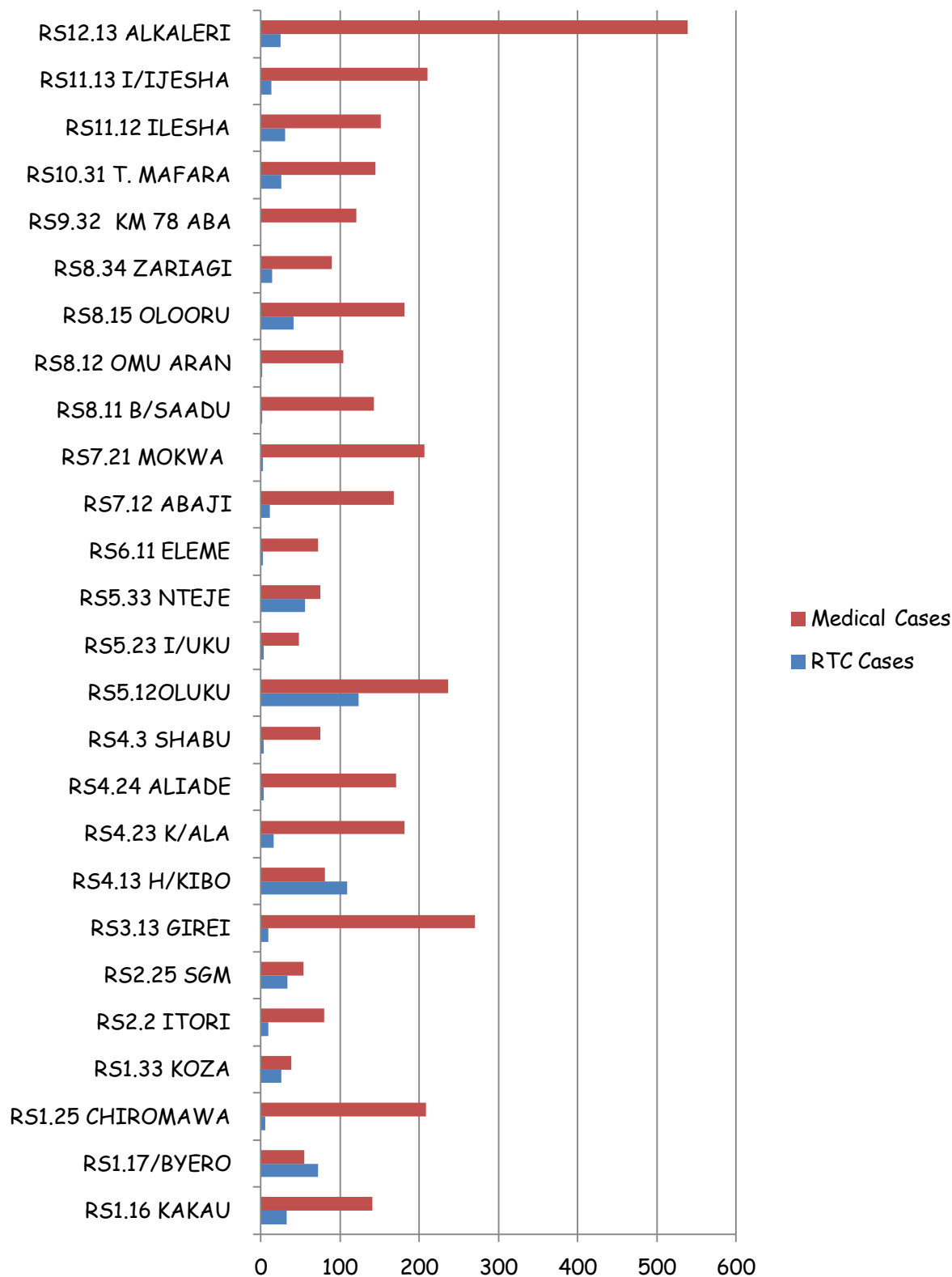

Chart 21: RTC Cases

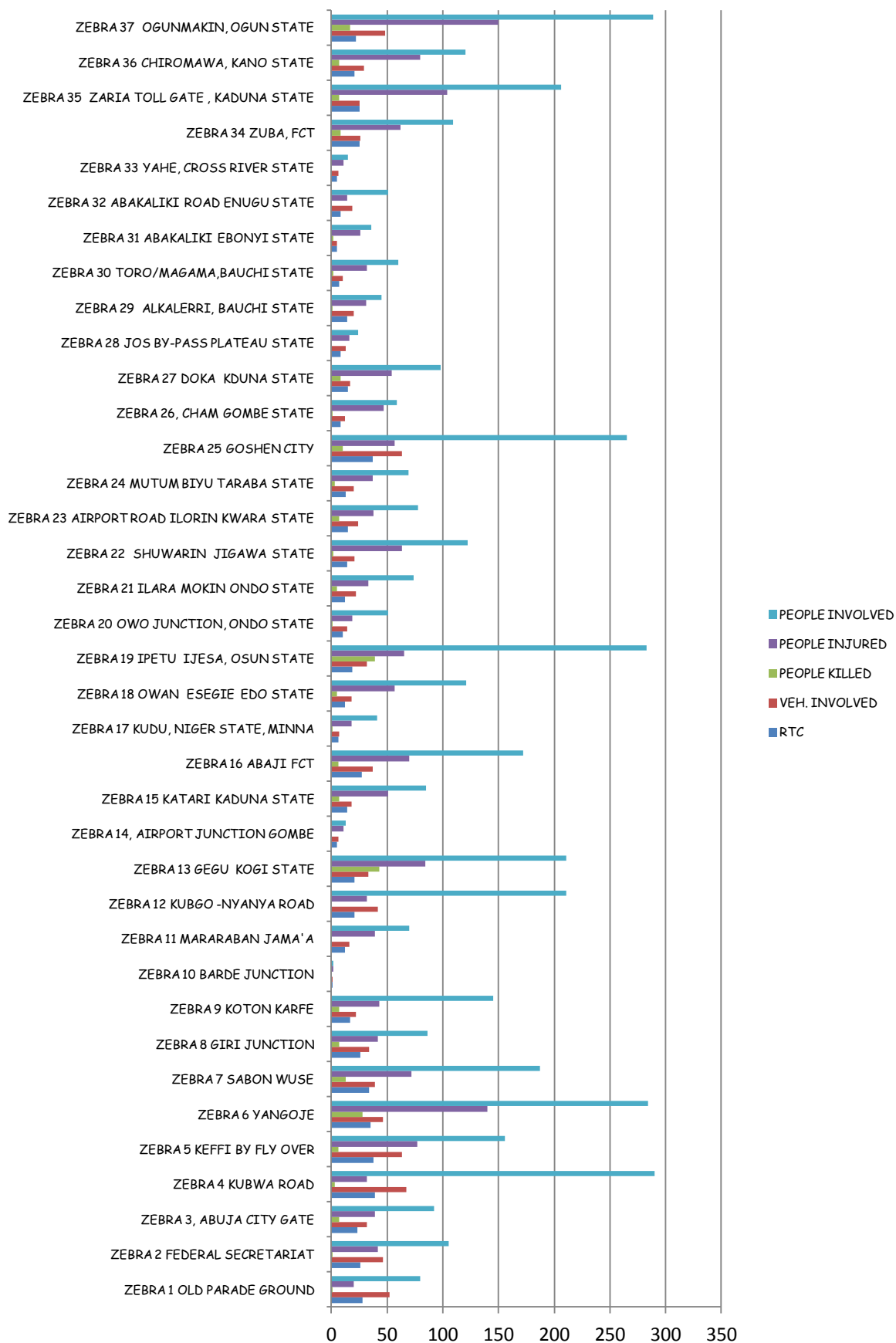

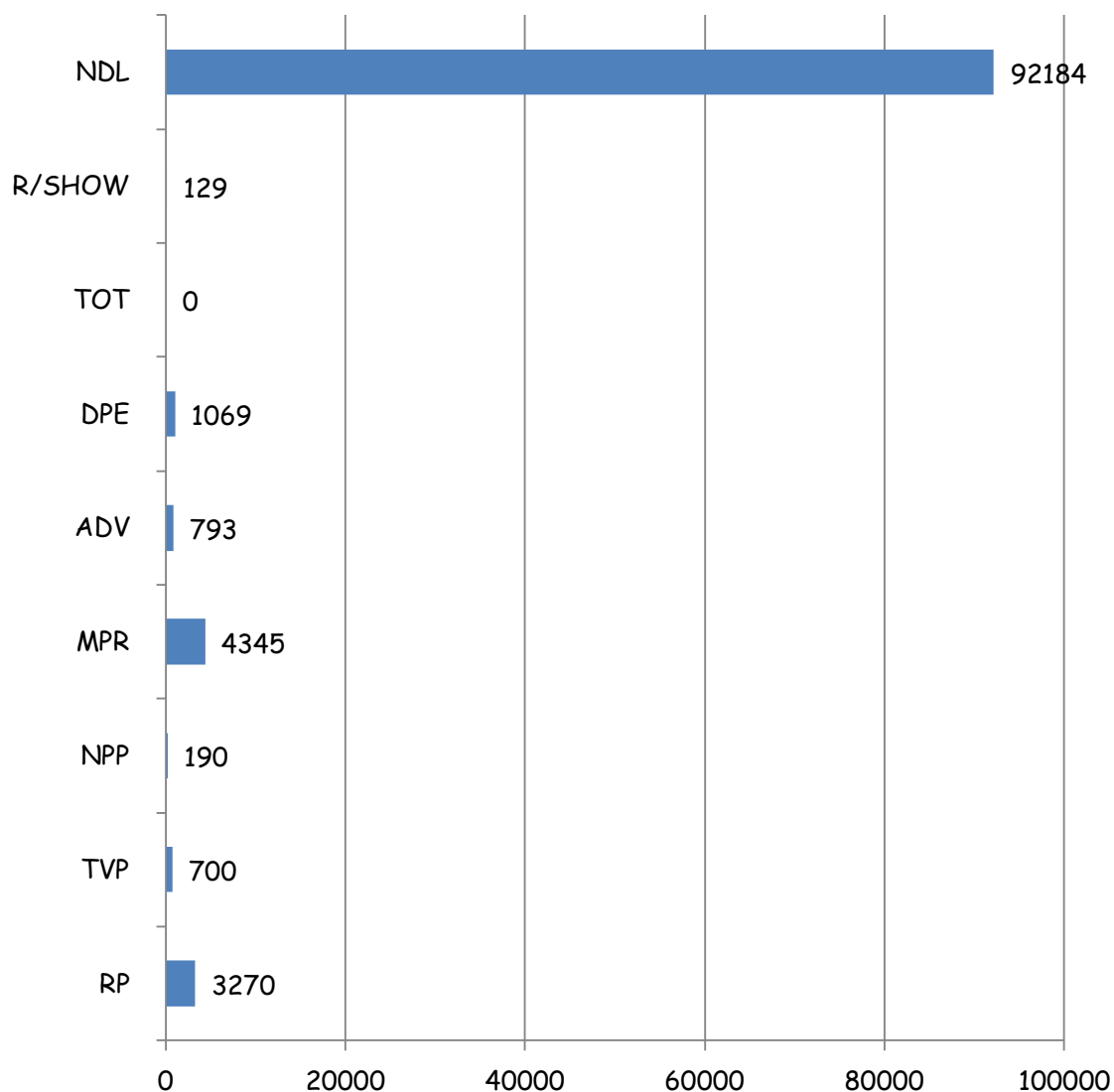

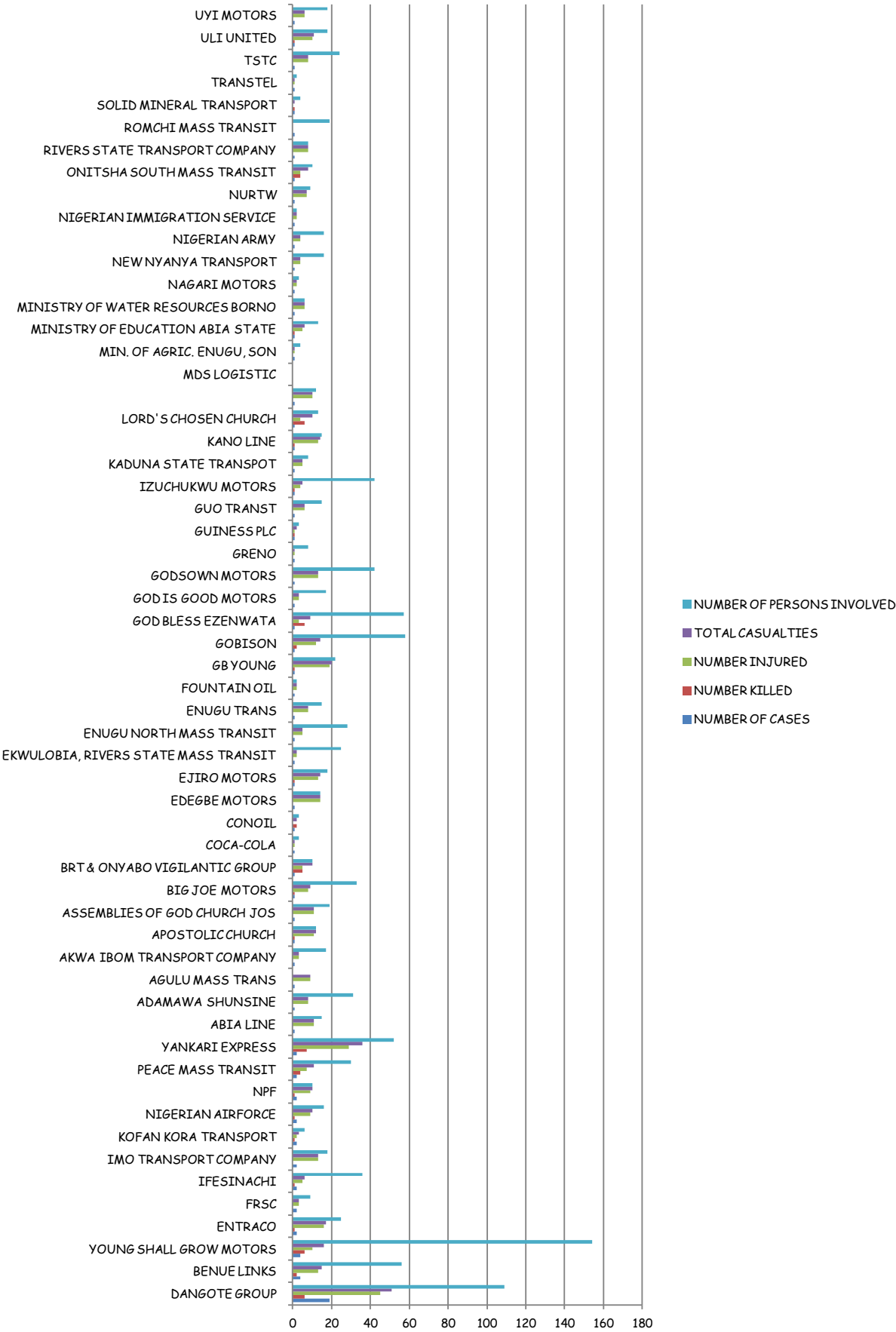
Chart 23: Comparative Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators

Chart 24: Summary Of RTC Involving Fleet Operators



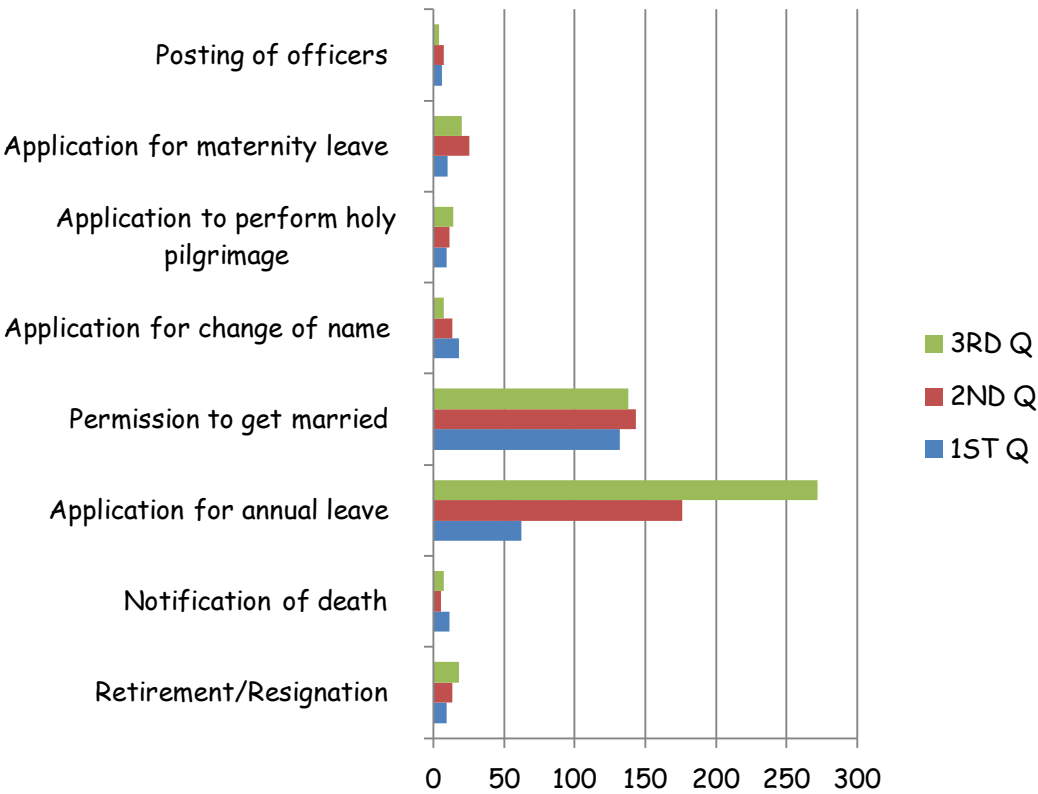

Chart 29: Number Injured

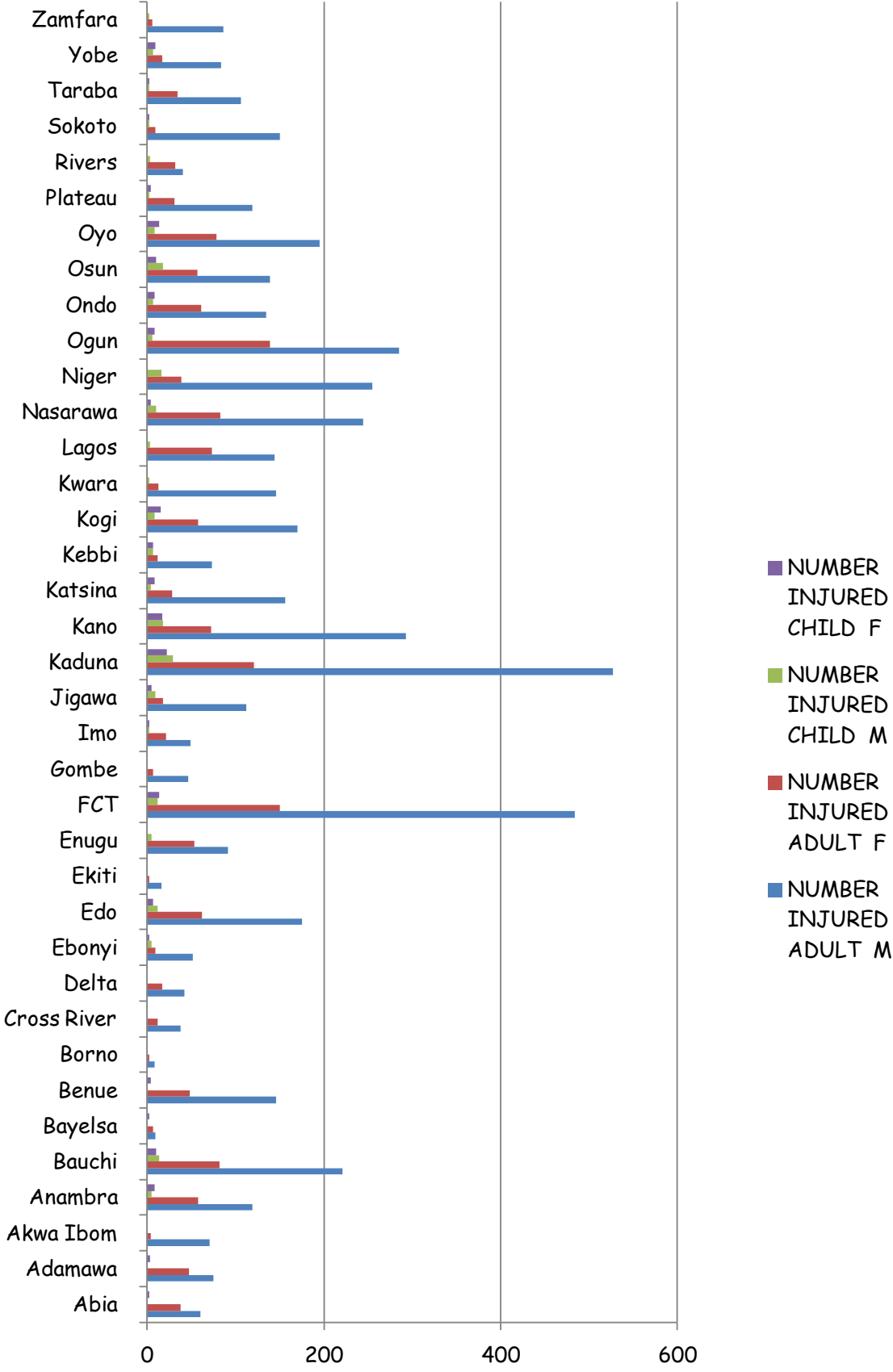

Chart 30: Number Killed on State Basis

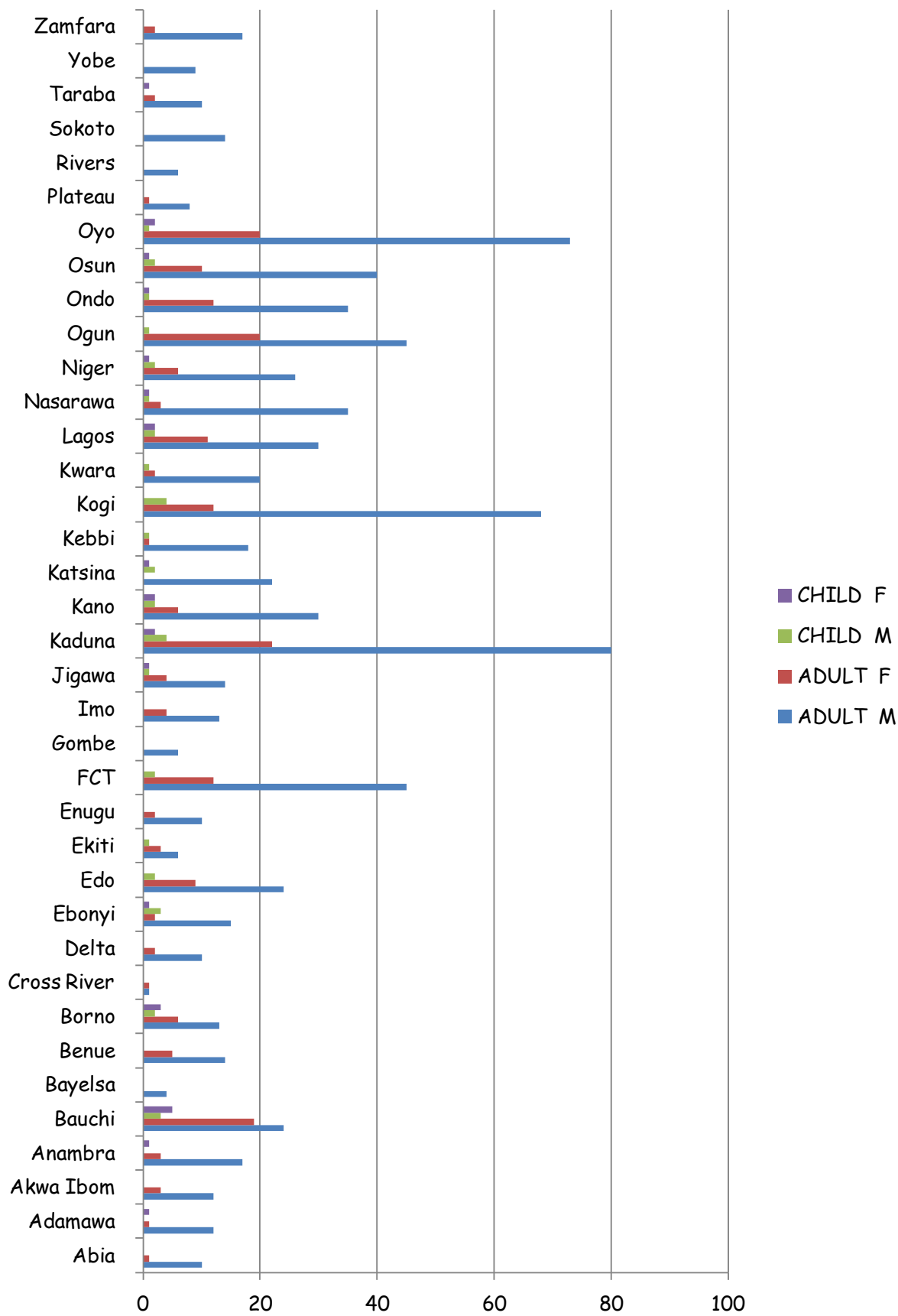

Chart 31: People Involved on State Basis

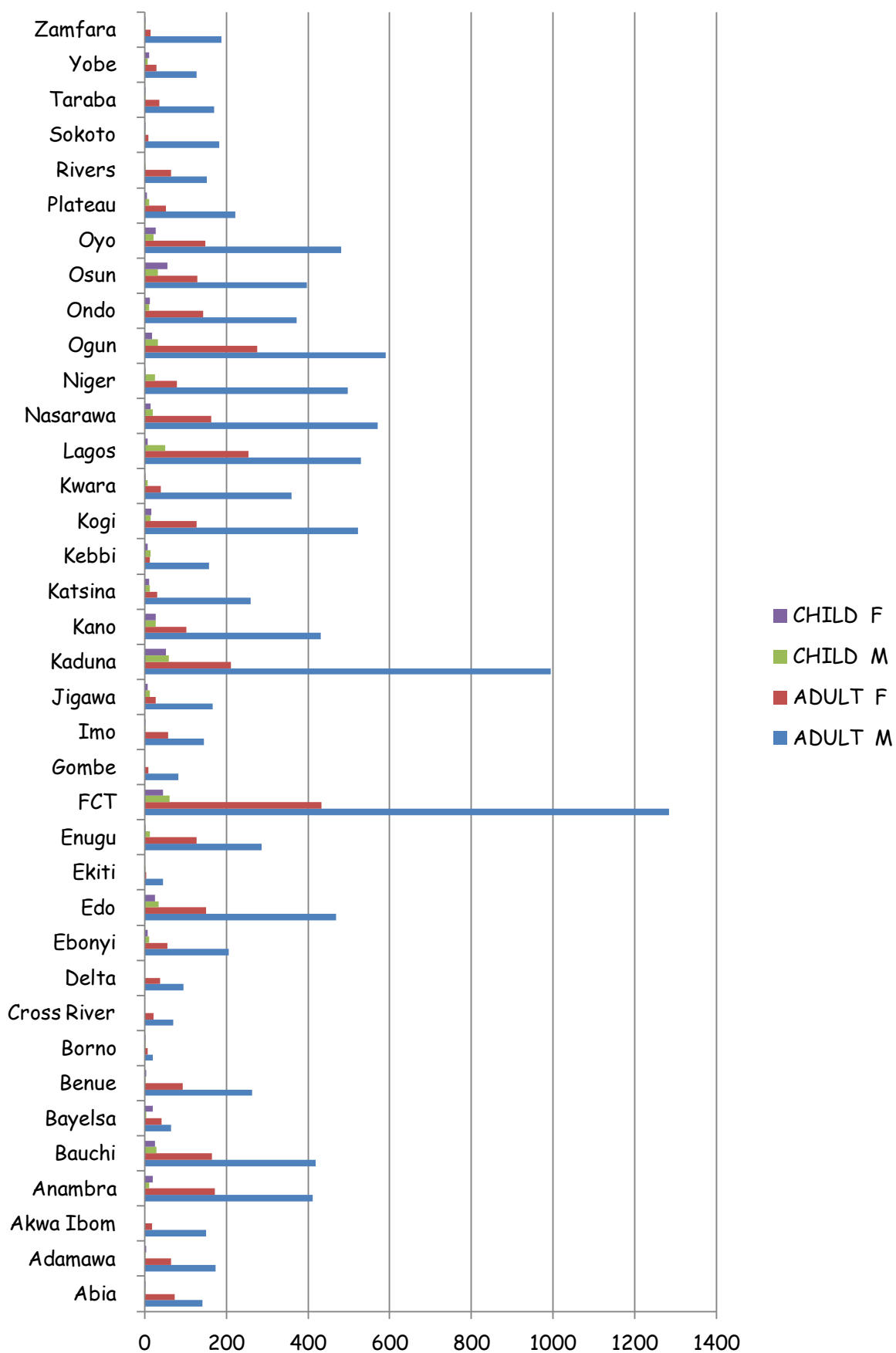
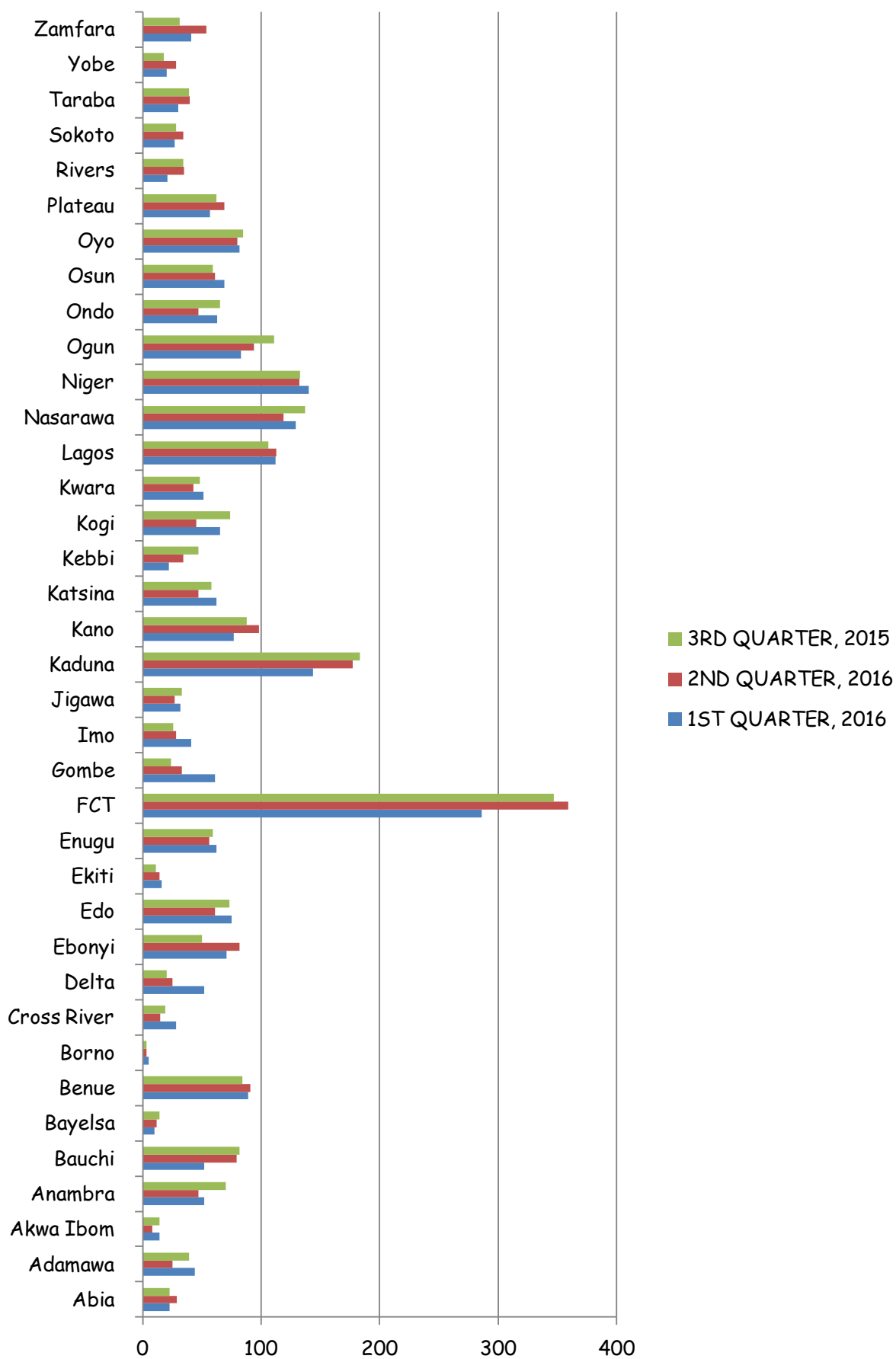


Chart 39: Comparison of Q1 2015 & Q1 2016 RTC Cases on State Basis

Chart 32: Comparison of Q1 2015 & Q1 2016 RTC Cases on State Basis



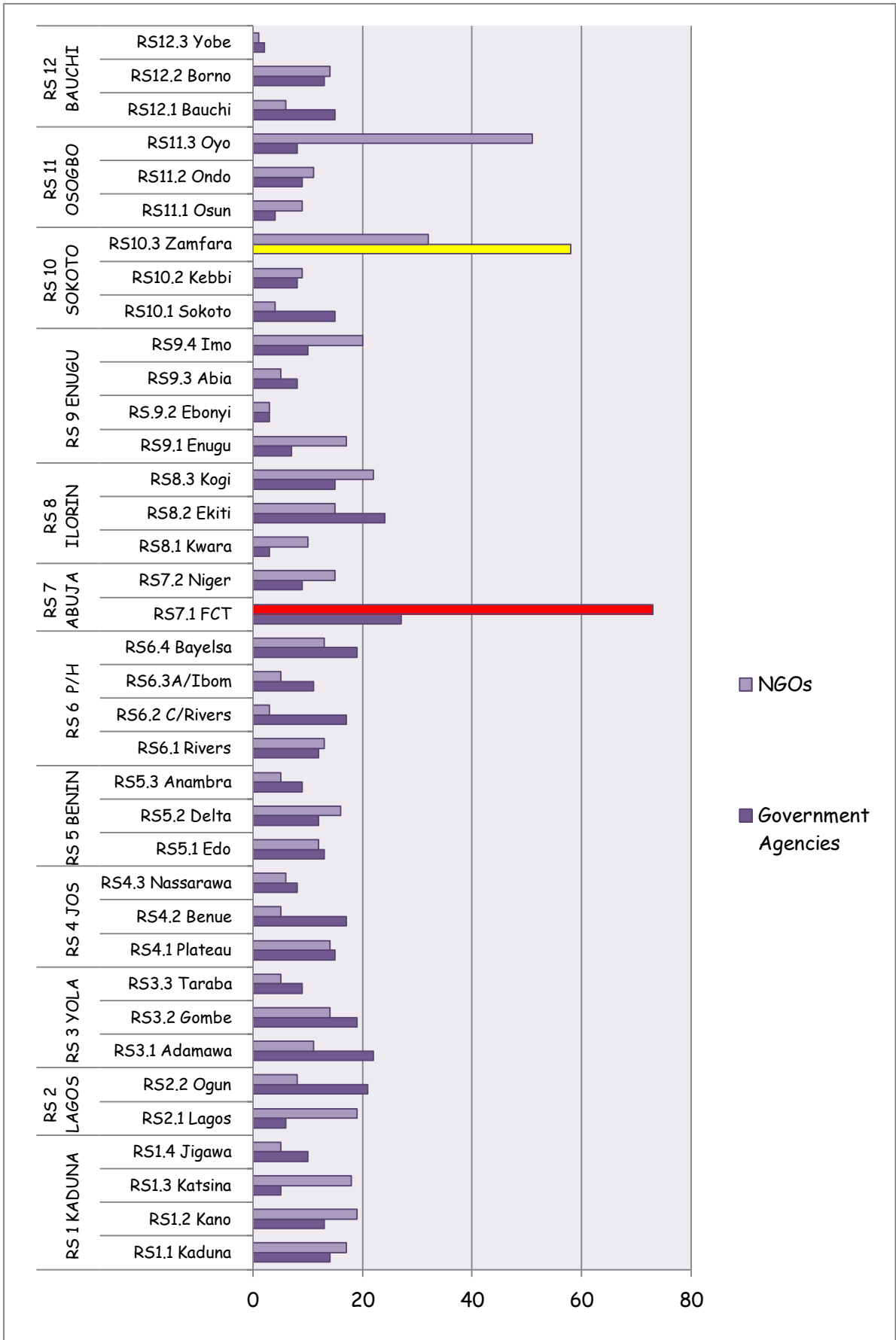

Chart 34: Special Marshals Activities

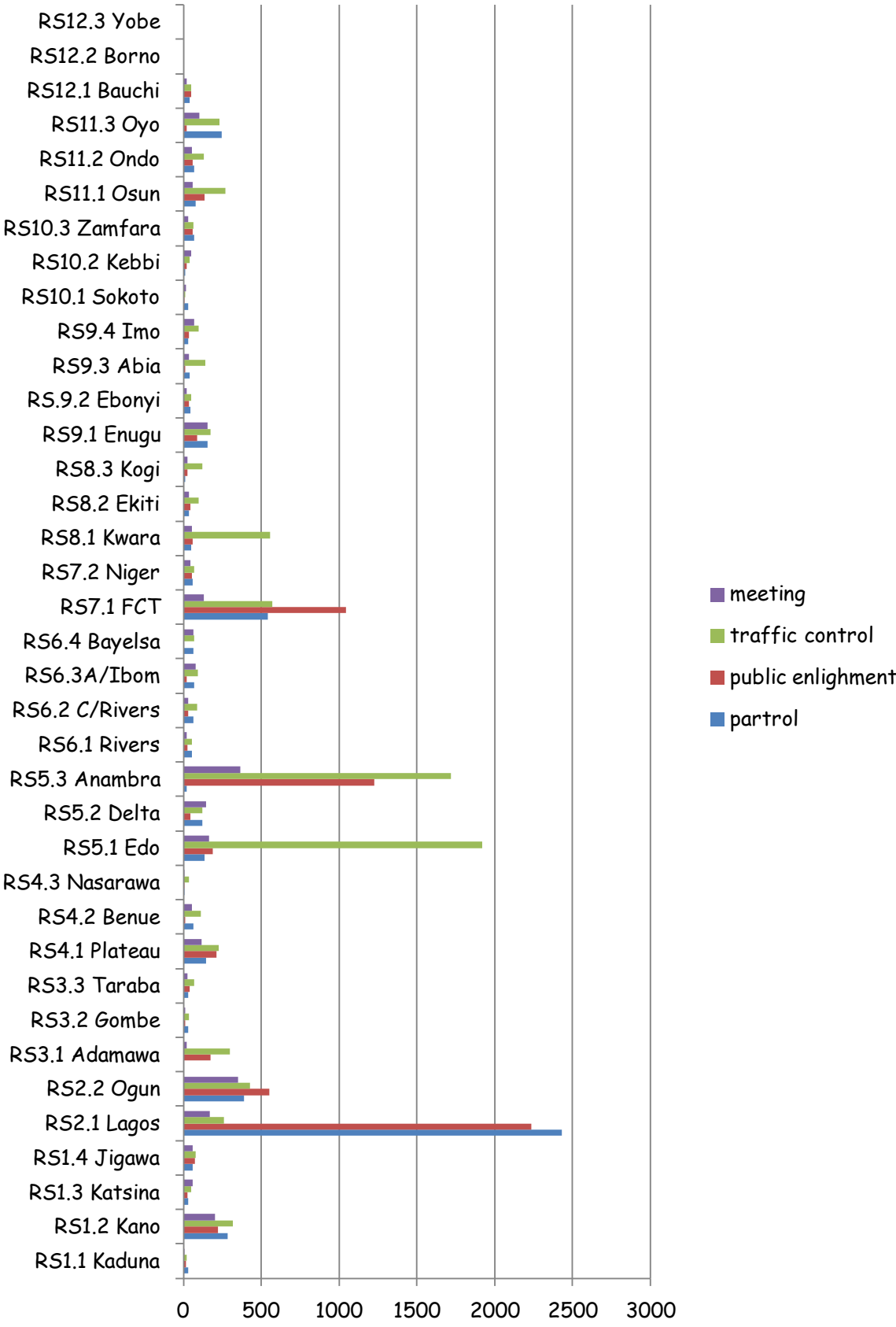

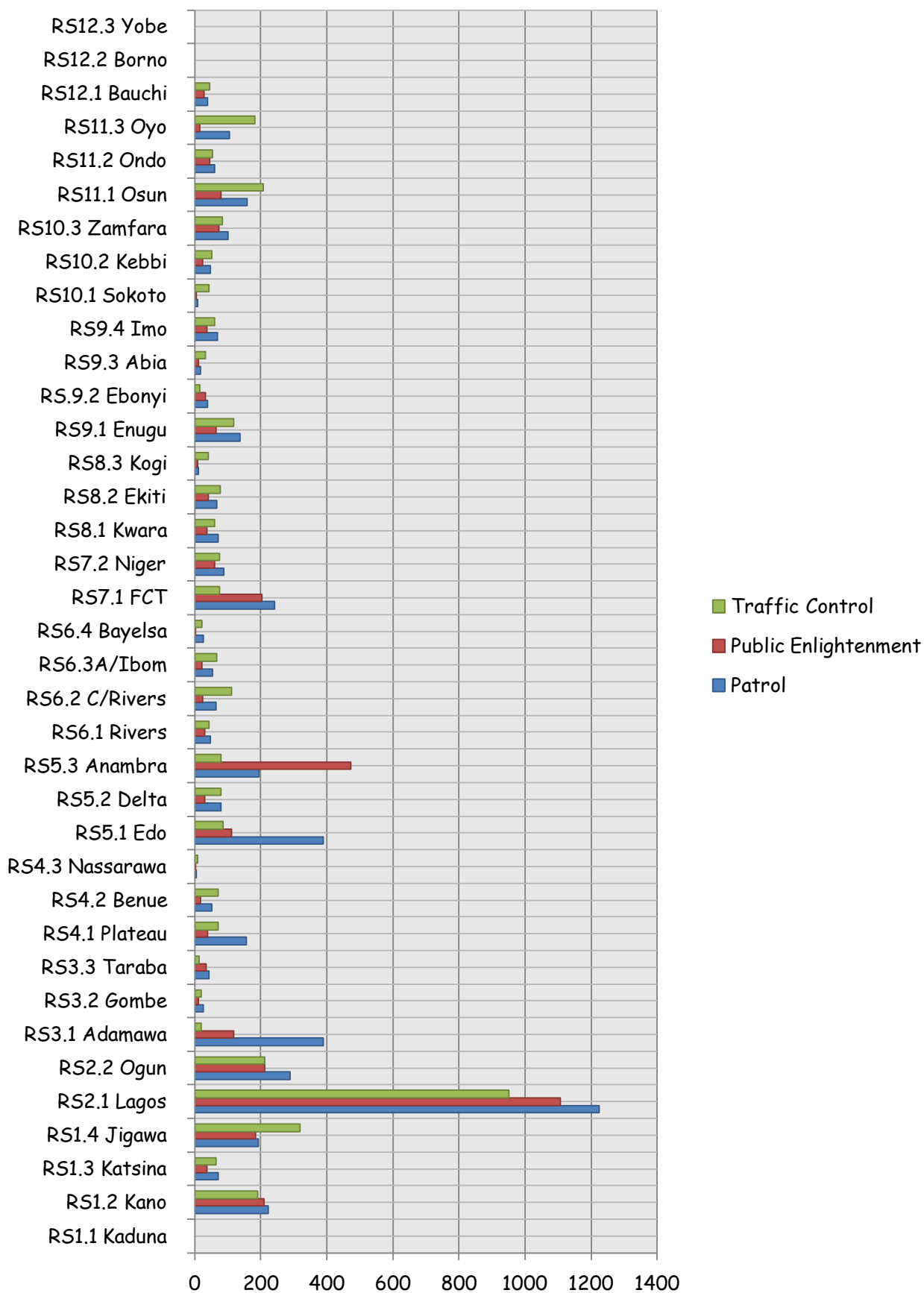

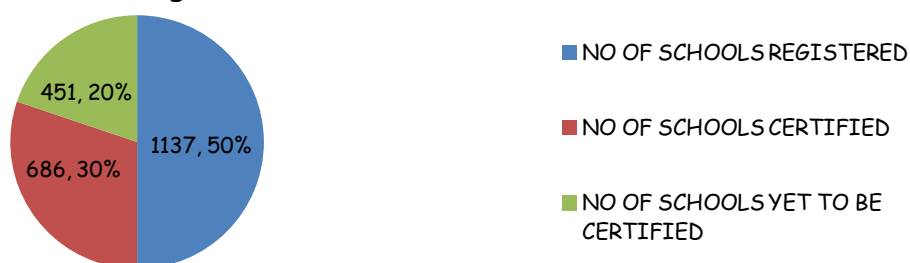

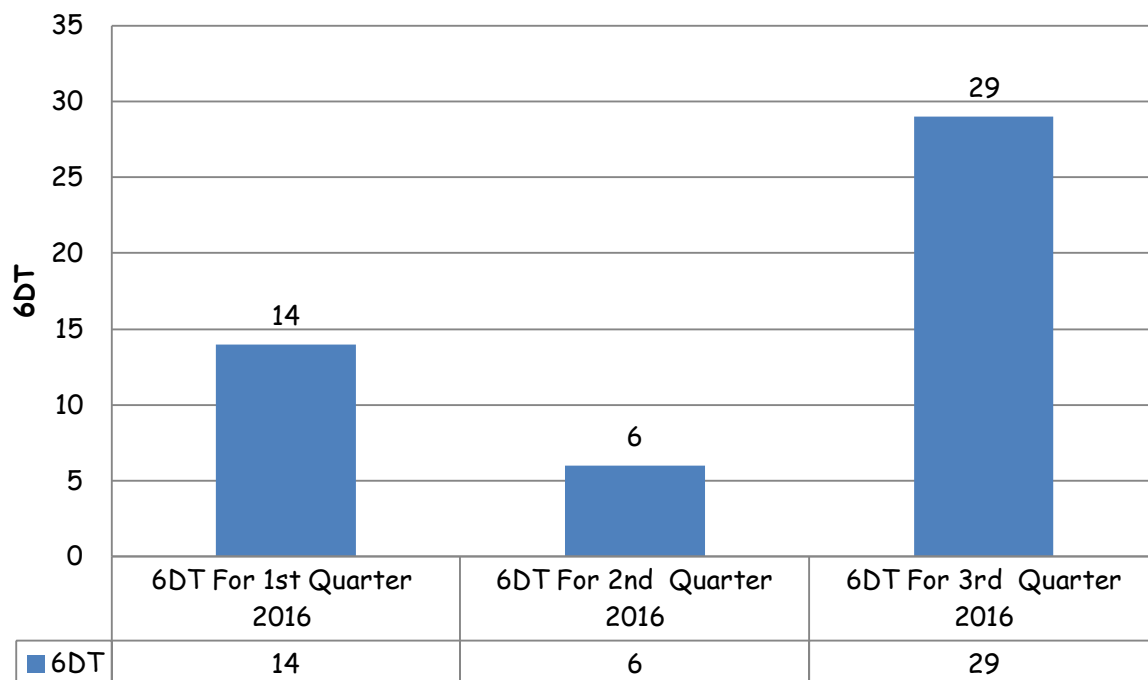
