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Editor's Salute

The Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) is the lead organization in the management of traffic on the public roads in Nigeria. Its mode of operations cut across the board. Hence, special and stringent strides are put in place to deliver its mandate to the general populace.

The Operations Department of FRSC is known as the nerve centre of the Corps; exploring all at its disposal to revamping the Corps' operational strategic goal. One of the cardinal plans is the robust data management which has become handy via FRSC Statistical Digest. The inputs of Total War on Overloading as contained in the 1st quarter, 2015 is a clear indication of the efforts put in by the department in curtailing the excesses of our motorists. Abuja, the seat of government and Lagos, the commercial centre are densely populated with varieties of people. Consequently, the level of enforcement is much higher in these areas than other Zones or States in the country. Bauchi Zone recorded the least due to the issue of insurgency and attended military interference, which has contributed in minimizing the traffic activities.

In other words, the comparative analysis of NDL Production depicted a downward trend in respect of Private Drivers having -19.92%, while the Commercial Drivers had 371.27% difference in upward glide in 1st quarter, 2015 unlike in the 4th quarter, 2014 where the reverse was the case. This could be attributed to the effectiveness of RTSSS' Fleet Operators' activities introduced in 2004 by the Federal Road Safety Corps, in accordance with section 115 of NRTR. Moreover, there is a notable occurrence that cannot be overemphasized; the category of motorcycle has a representation of 0%, meaning, not a single individual in that cycle obtained an NDL. Apart from checkmating the activities/behaviors of motorcyclists, the numerous and substantial benefits of the New NDL would have been defeated. Therefore, the exposition of this quarter's write up will help a great deal and go a long way in introducing action plans that will revive the consciousness in the people concerned.

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Overloading

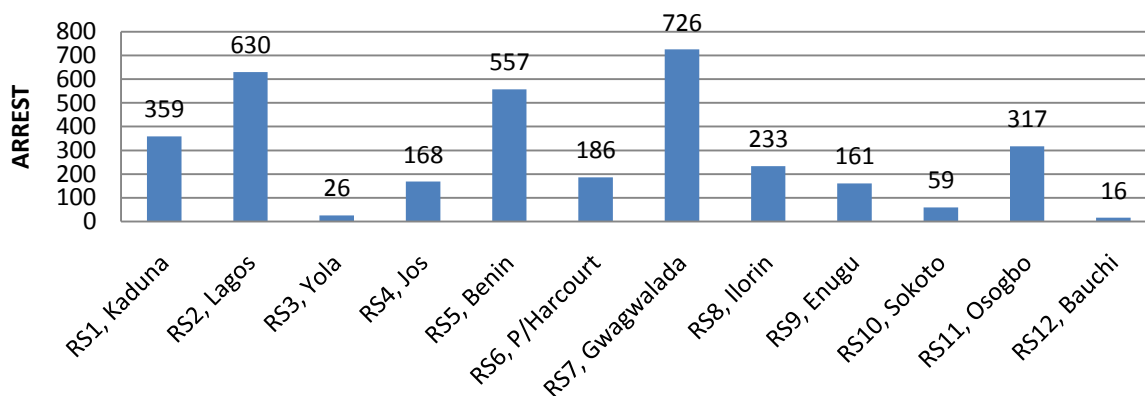

Chart 2: Chart Illustrating Offenders/Offences

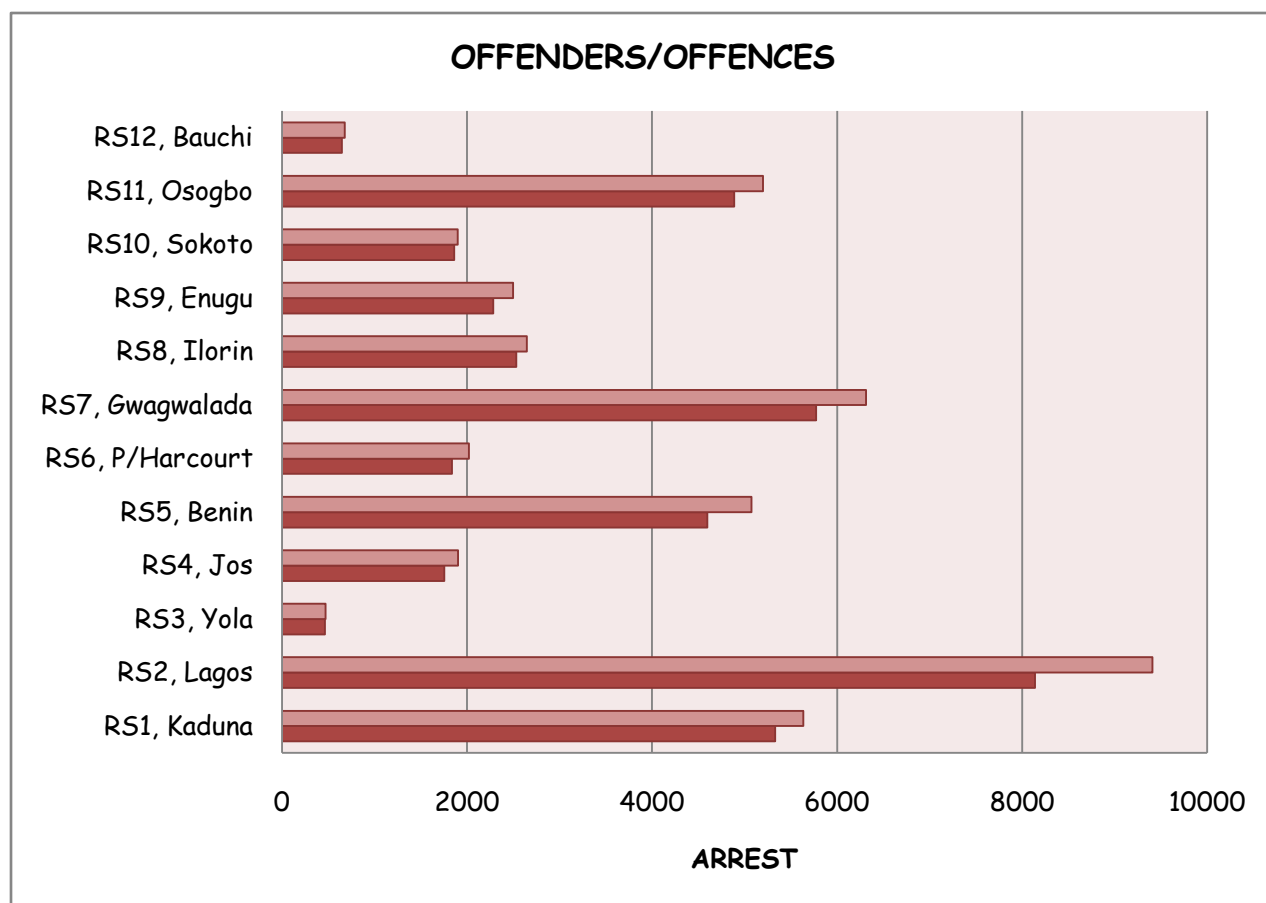
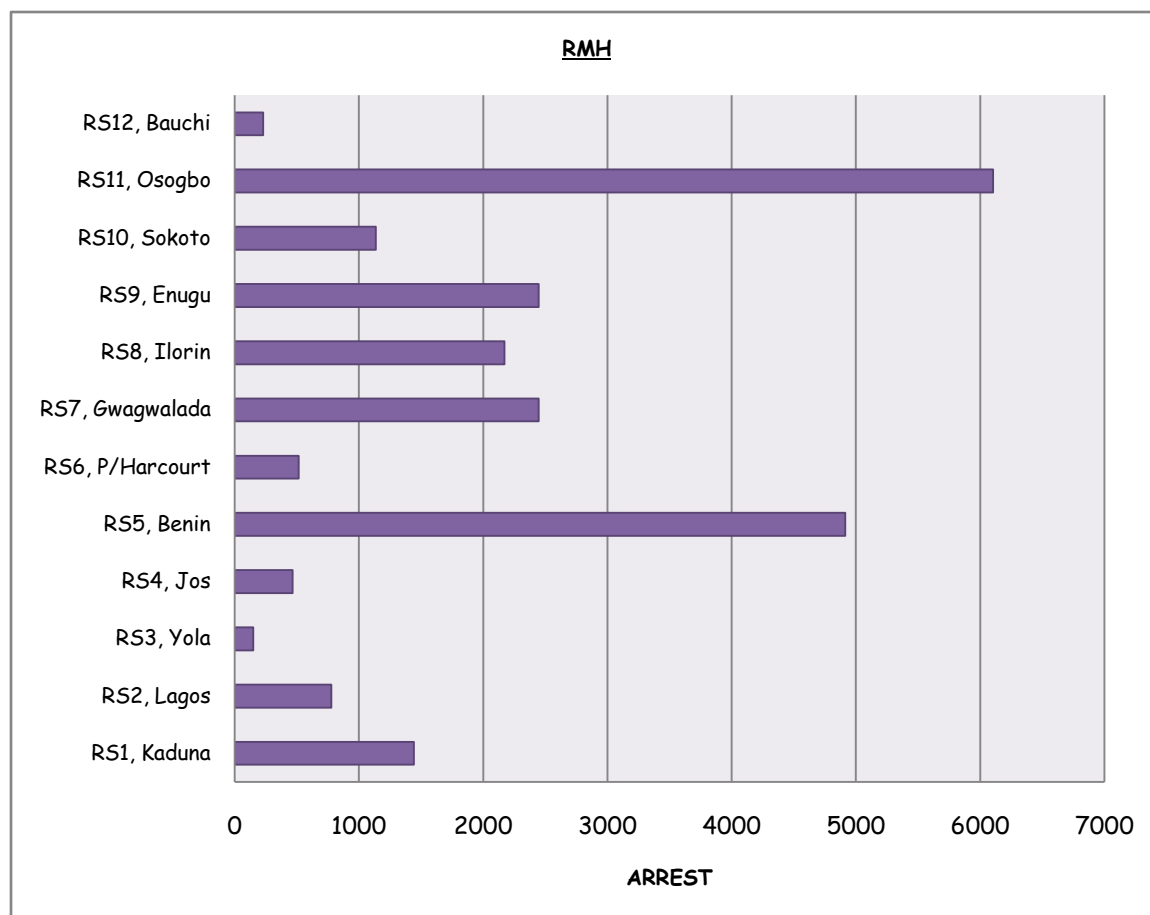

Chart 4: General Admin Activities

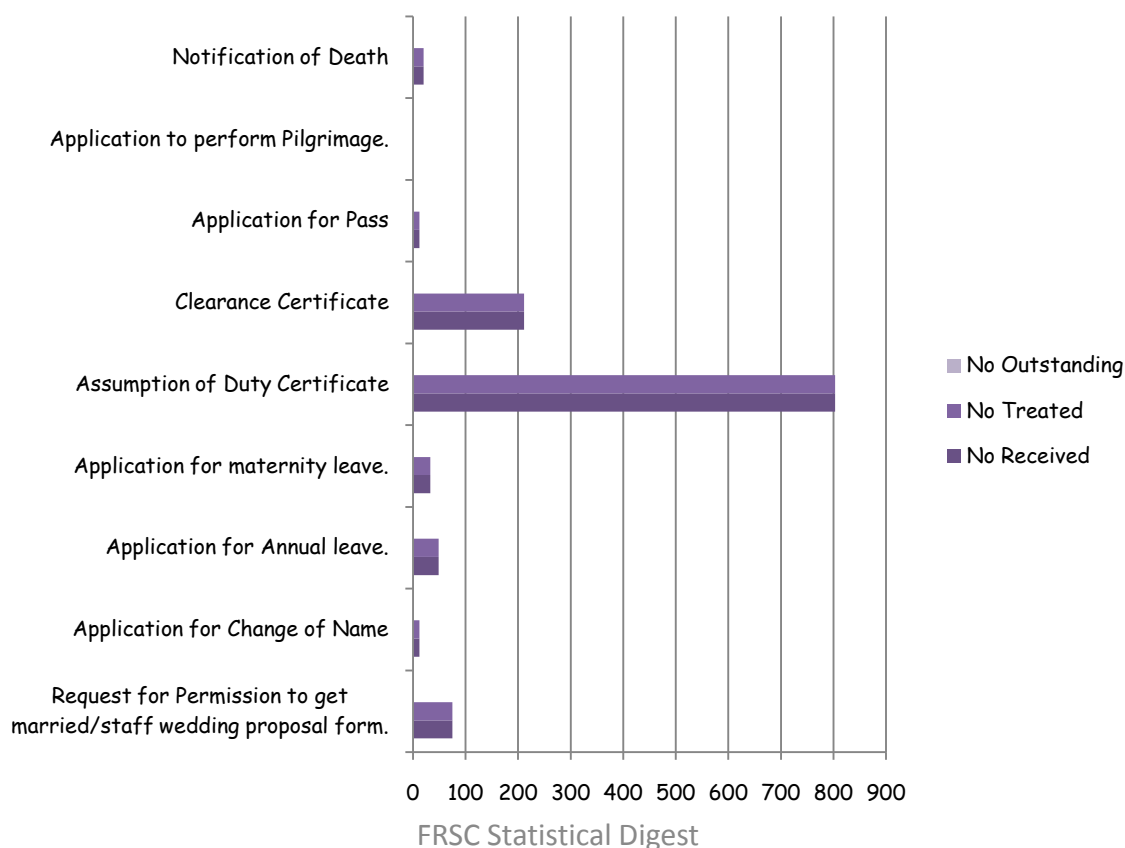

Chart 5: Mails Received

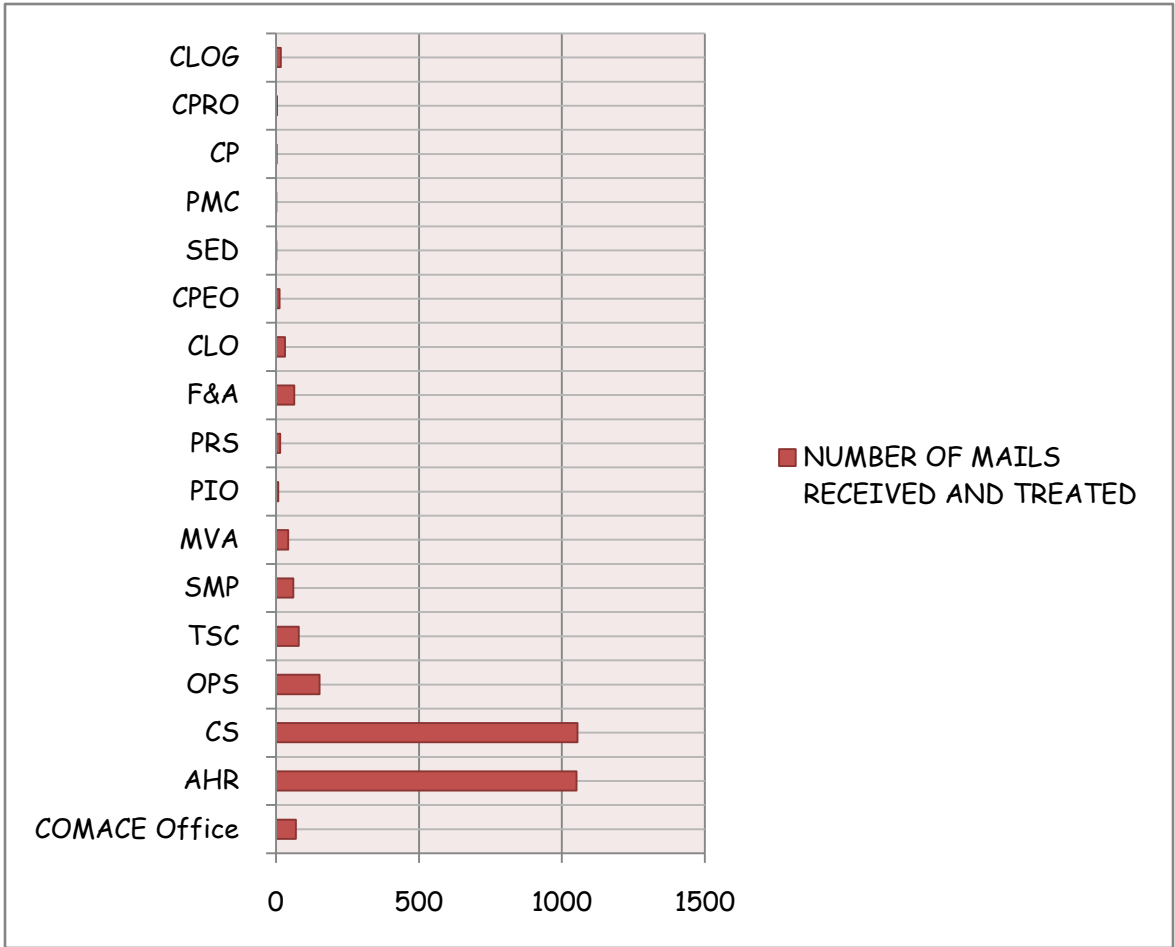

Chart 6: Chart Illustrating Disciplinary Cases Treated

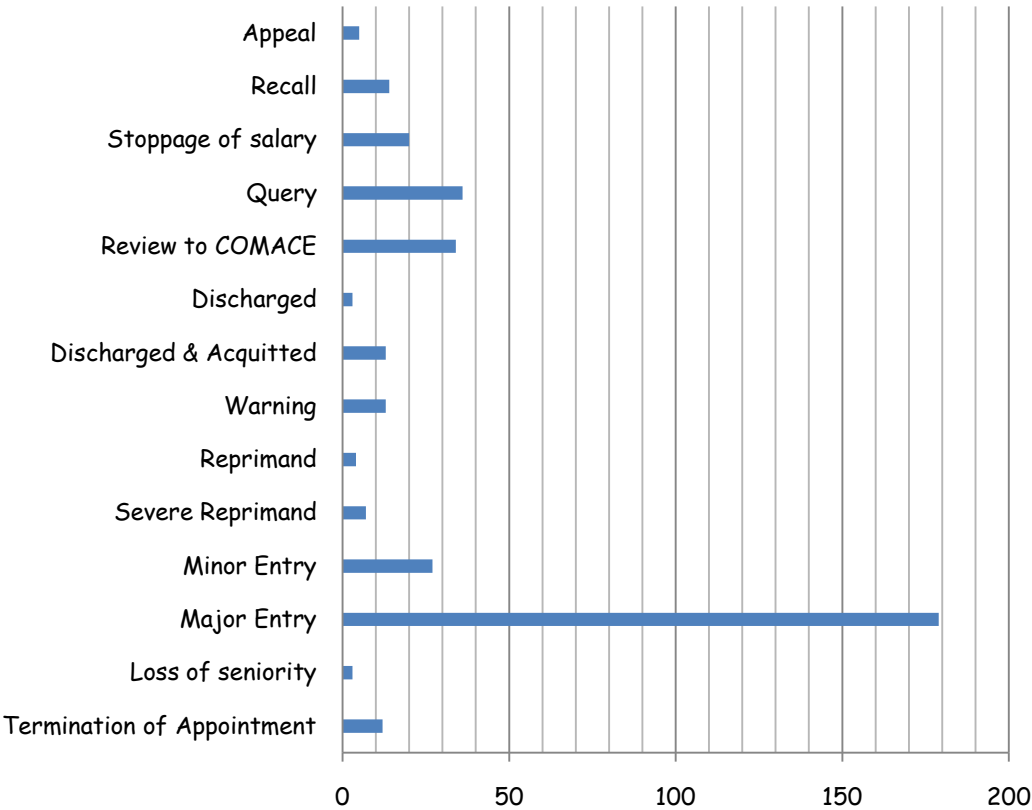




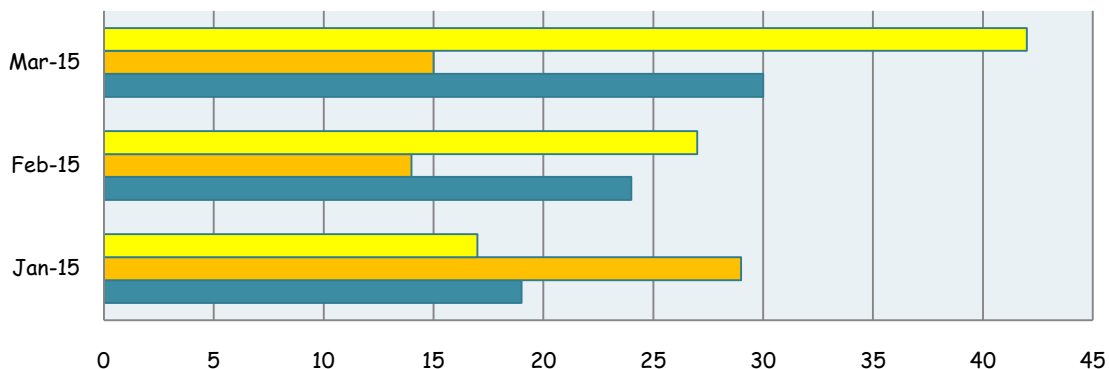

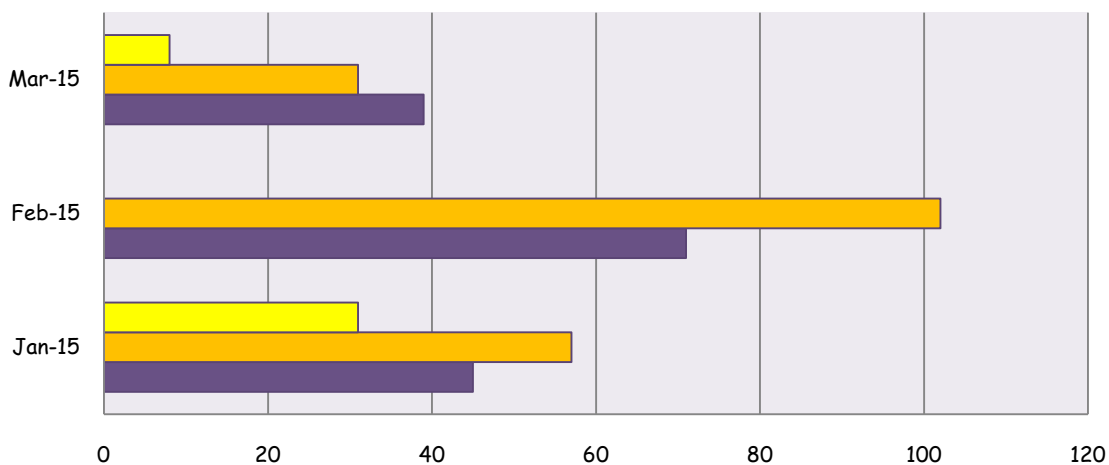
Chart 7: INCOMING REQUESTS FOR VARIATION OF STAFF SALARIES (Officers)

Chart 8: INCOMING REQUESTS FOR VARIATION OF STAFF SALARIES (Marshals)



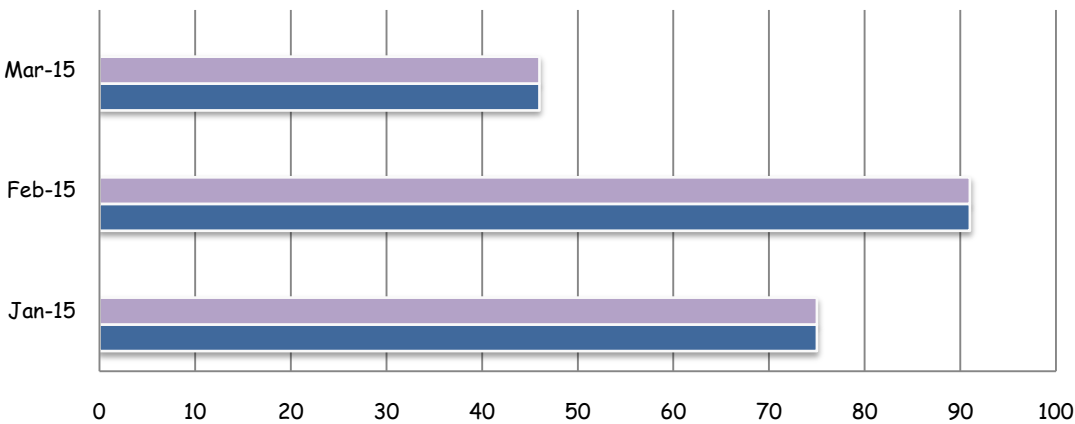

Chart 10: National Driver License production

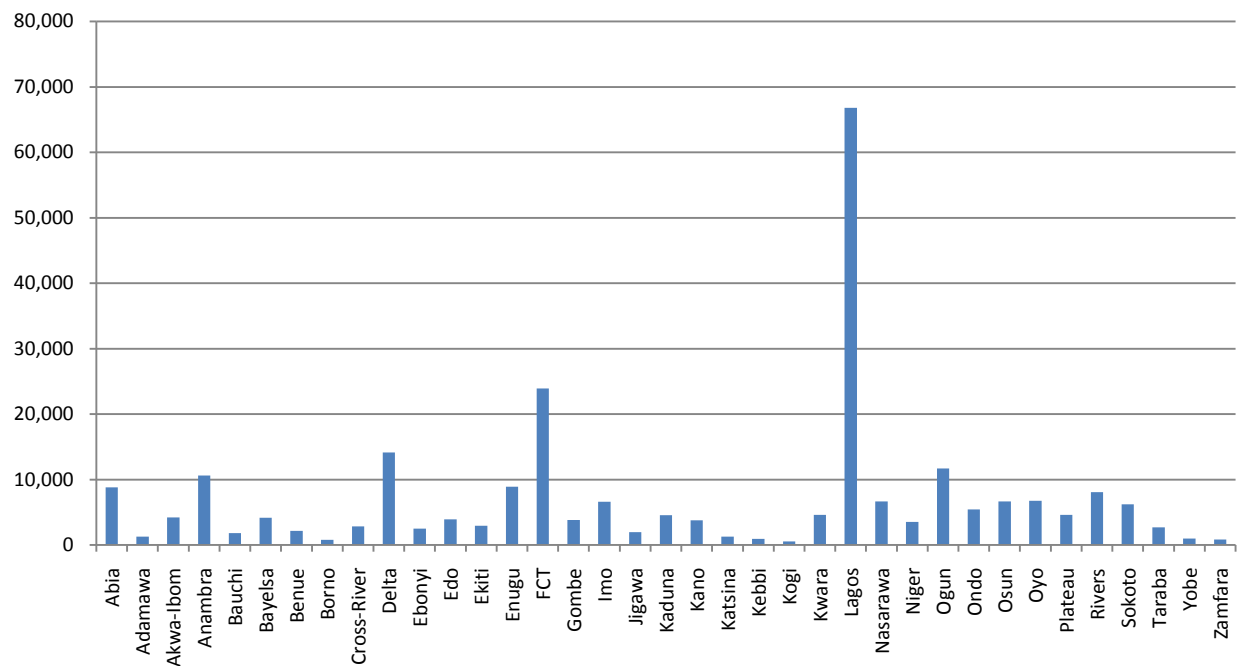


Chart 11: Chart showing total number of NDL production within 1st quarter 2015

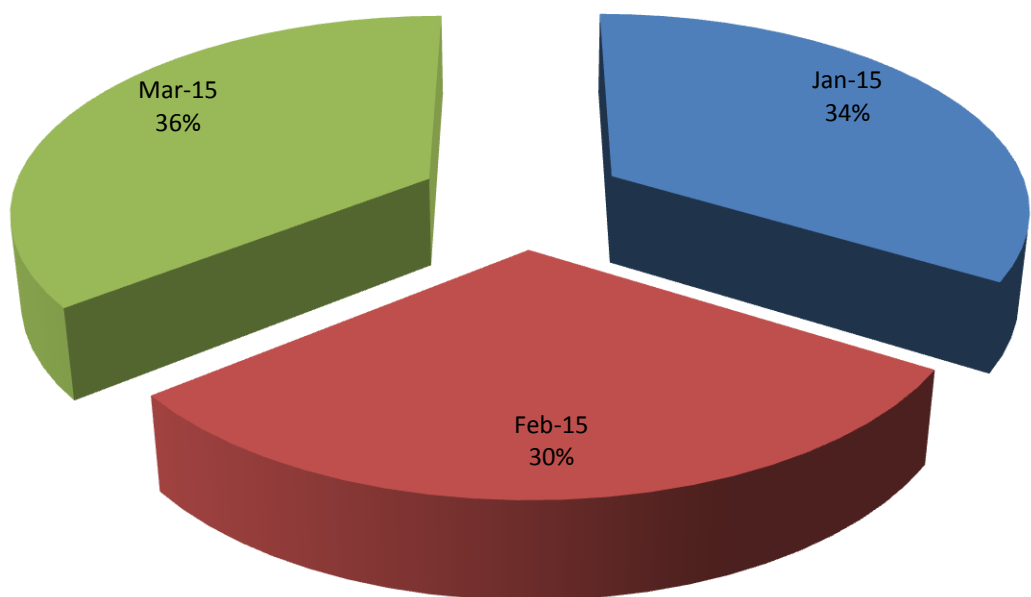
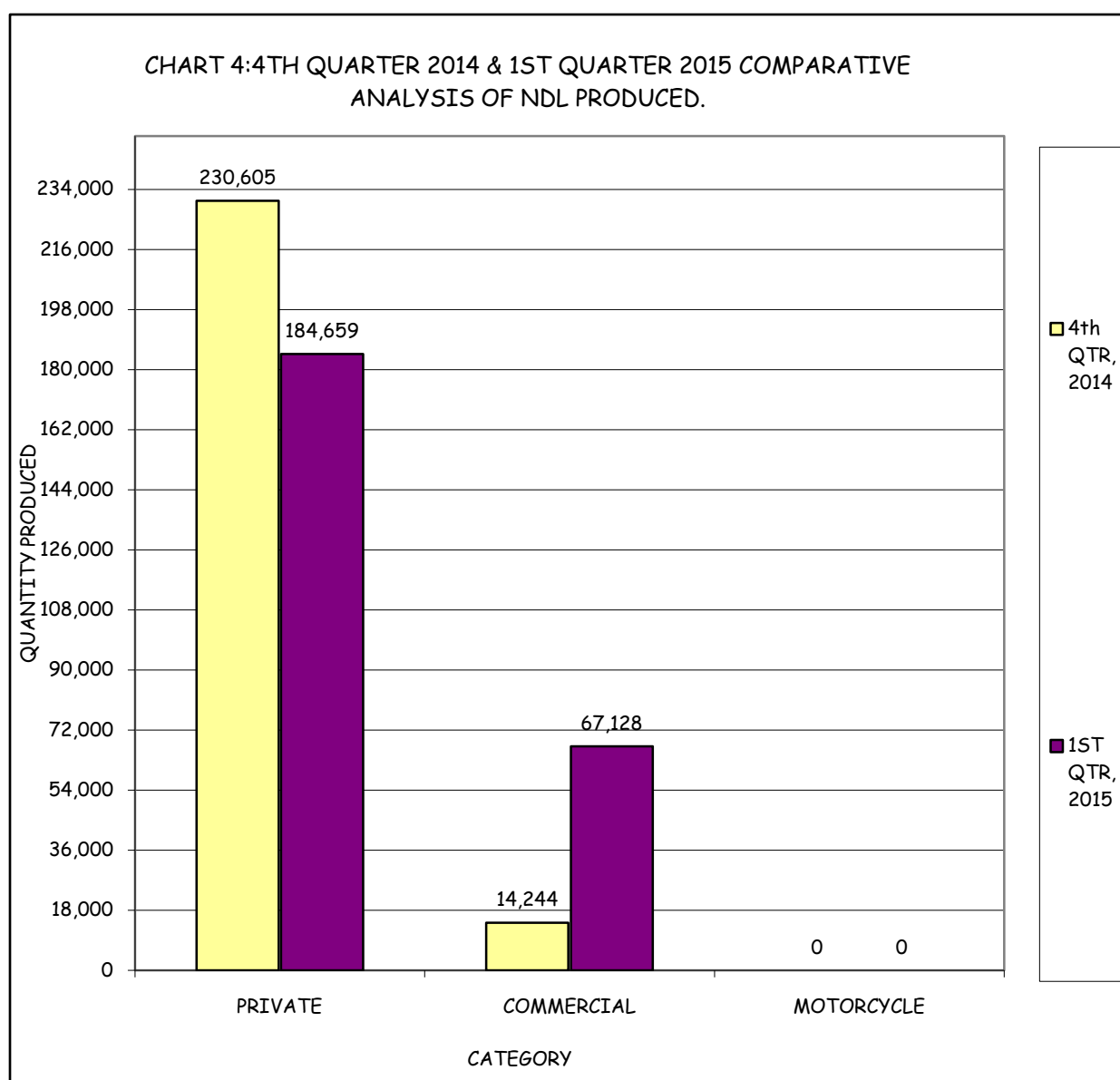

Chart 13: Number plates Produced

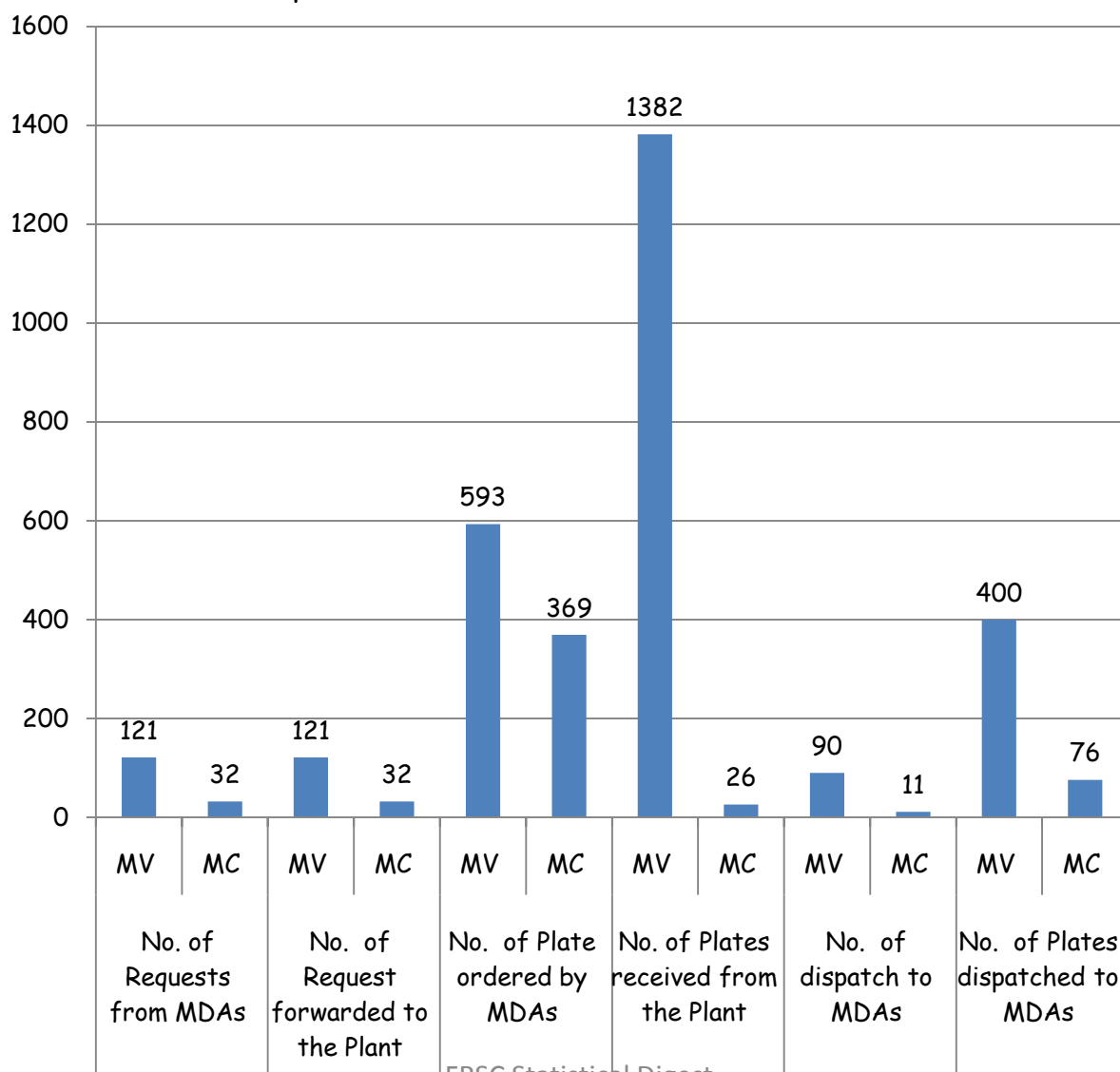

Chart 14: Number Plates Produced by Class

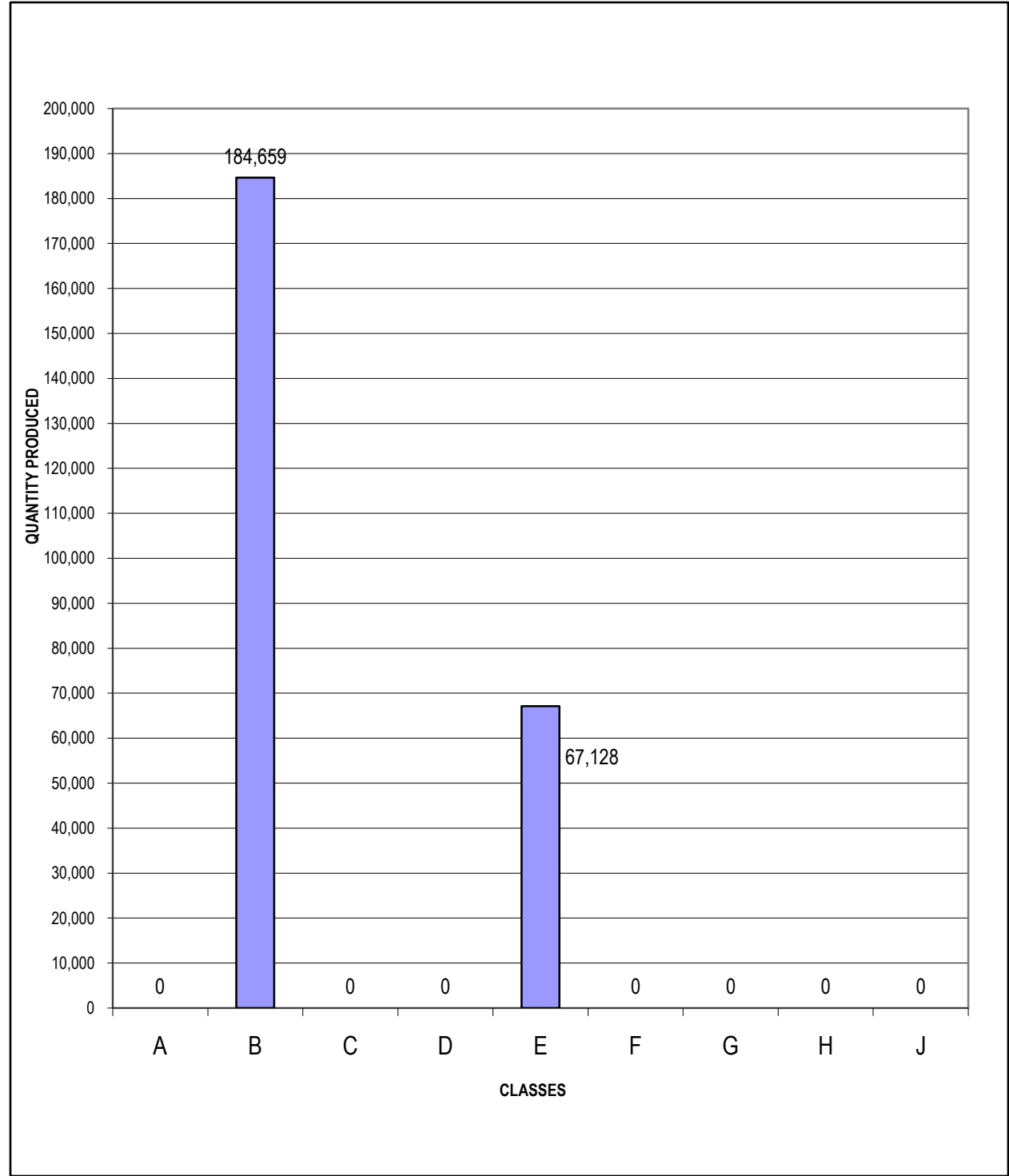

Chart 15: Number Plates Produced by Category

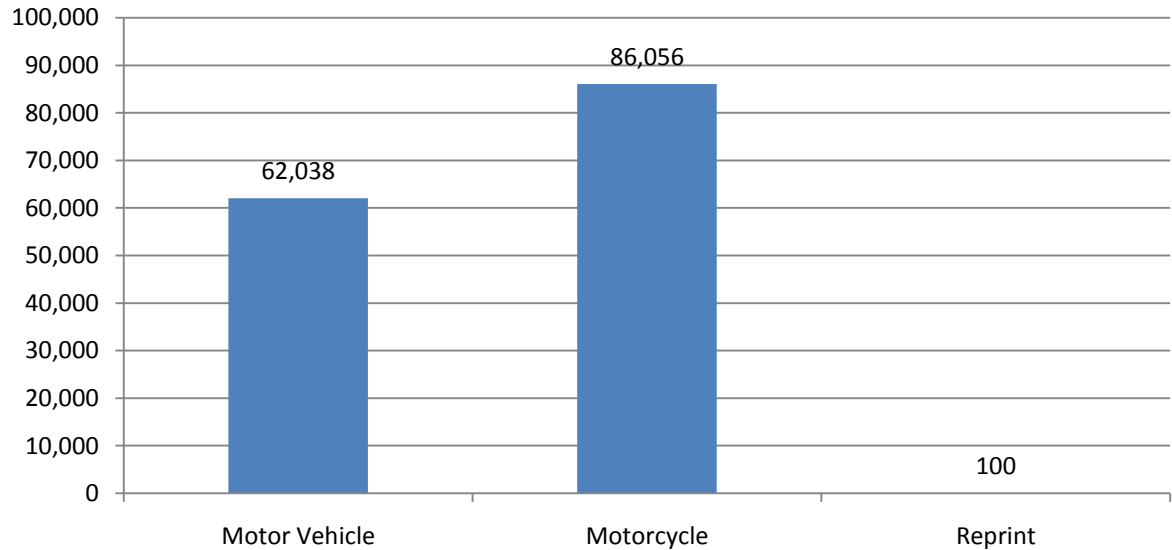

Chart 16: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients Attended to

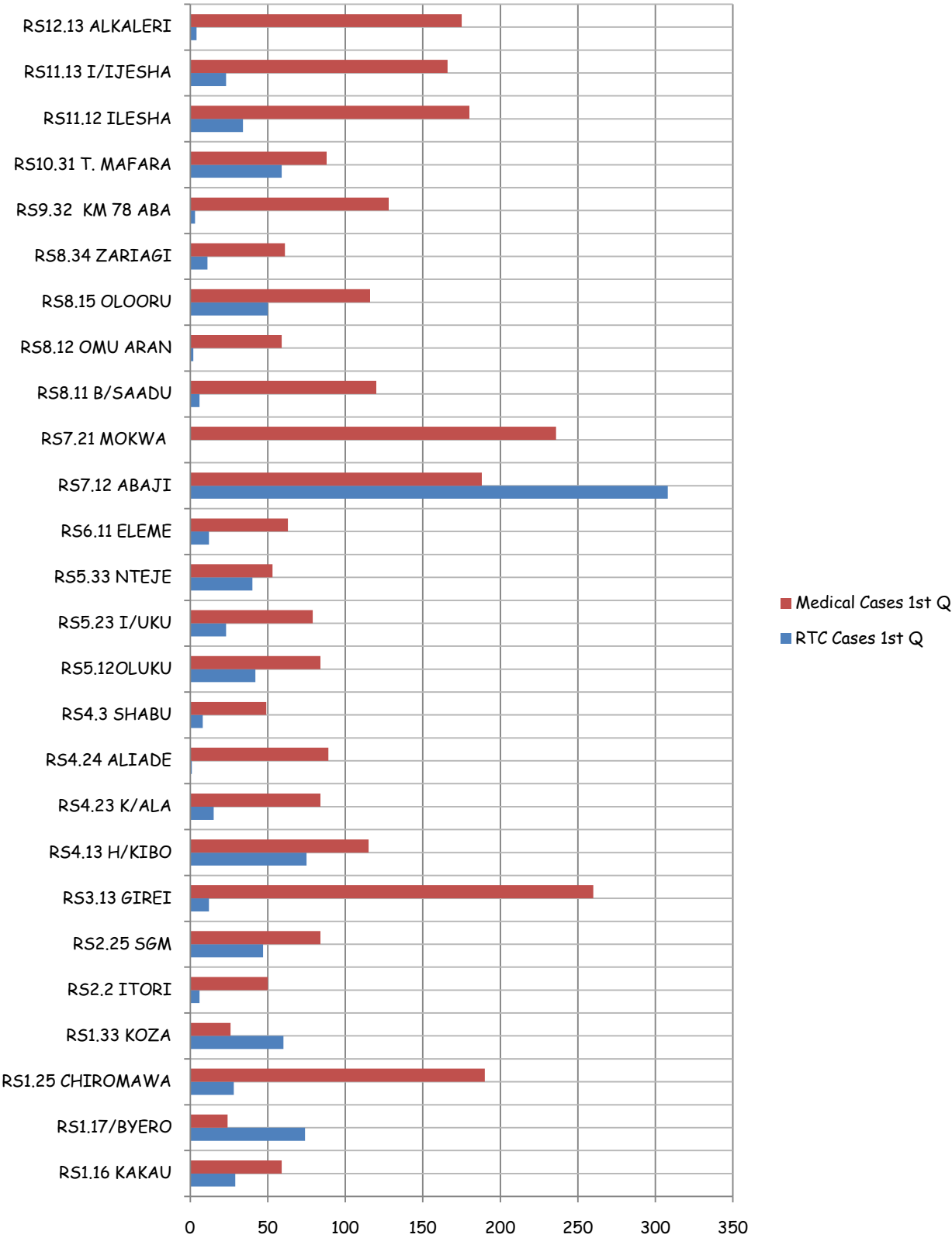

Chart 17: GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF COST ASSESSMENT OF RTC CASES TREATED

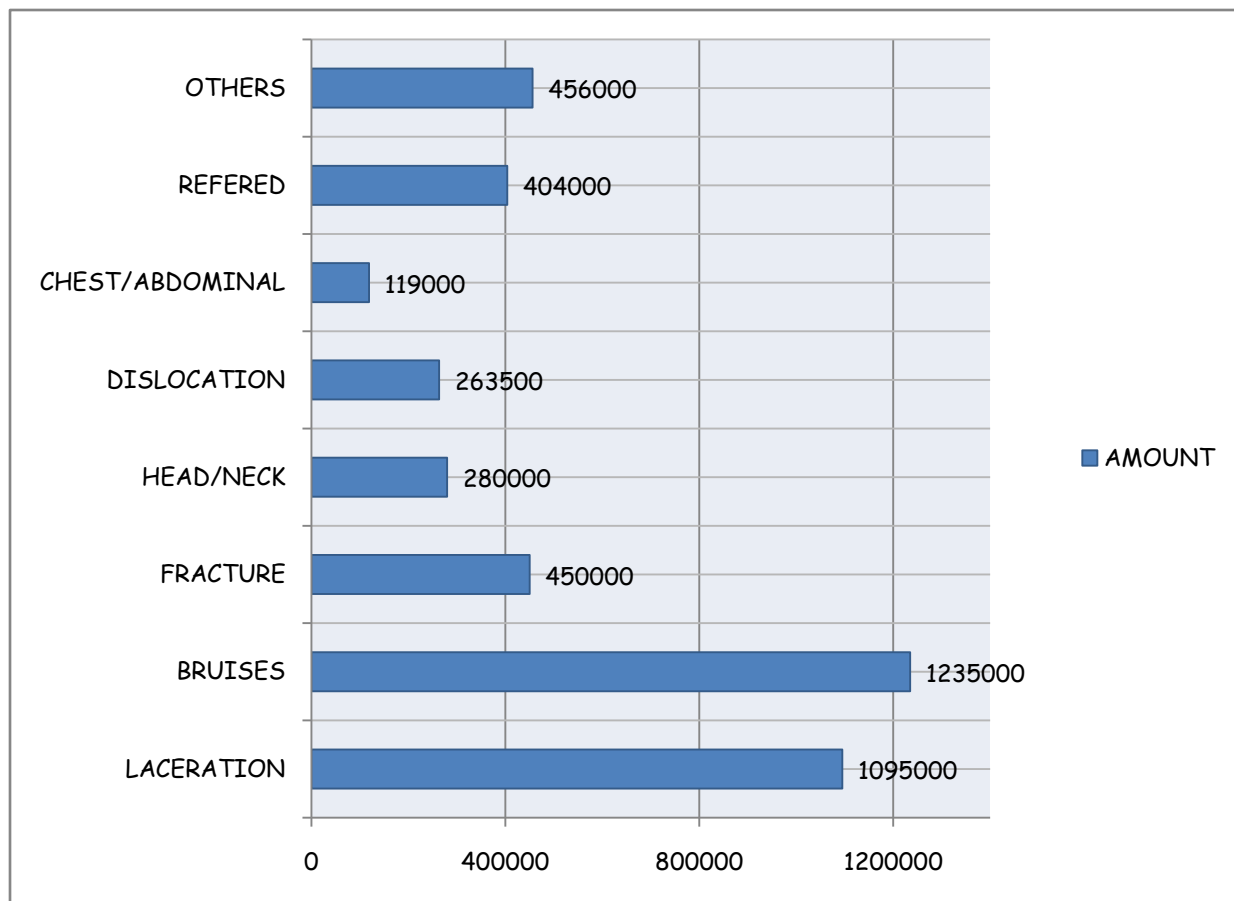

Chart 18: COST IMPACT ASSESSMENT OF MEDICAL CASES TREATED

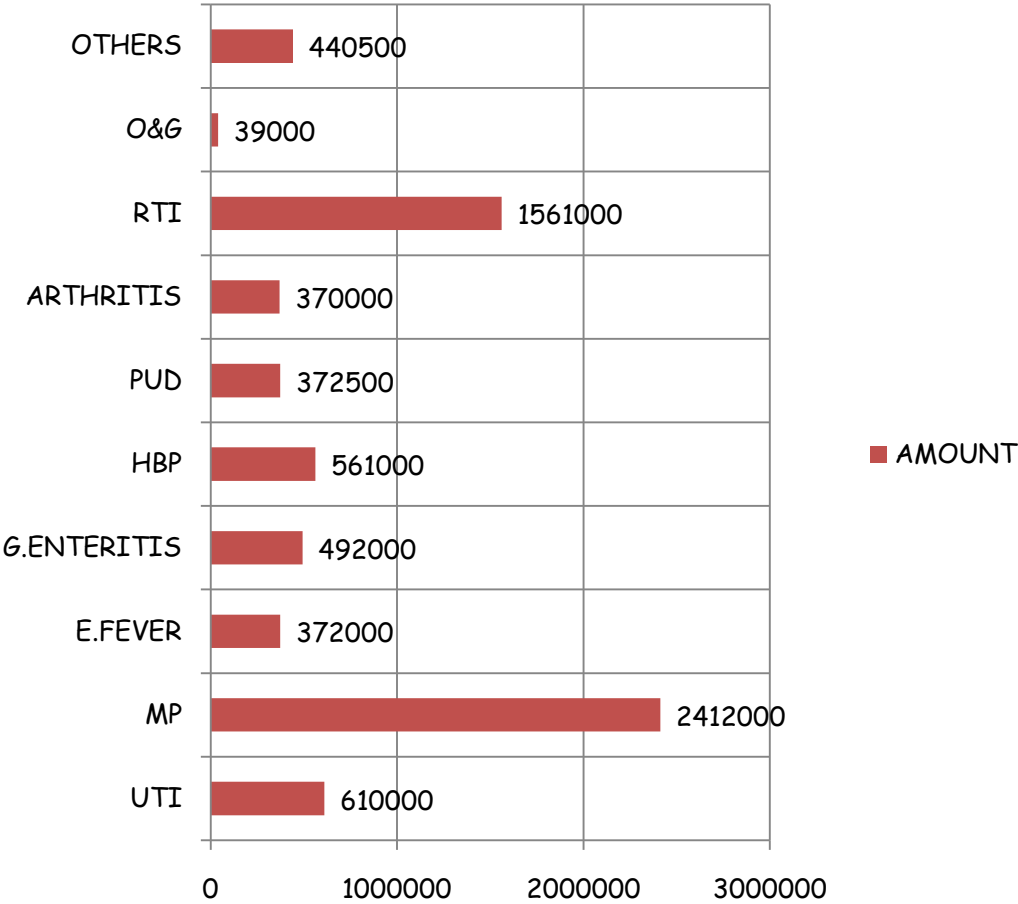

Chart 19: RTC Cases

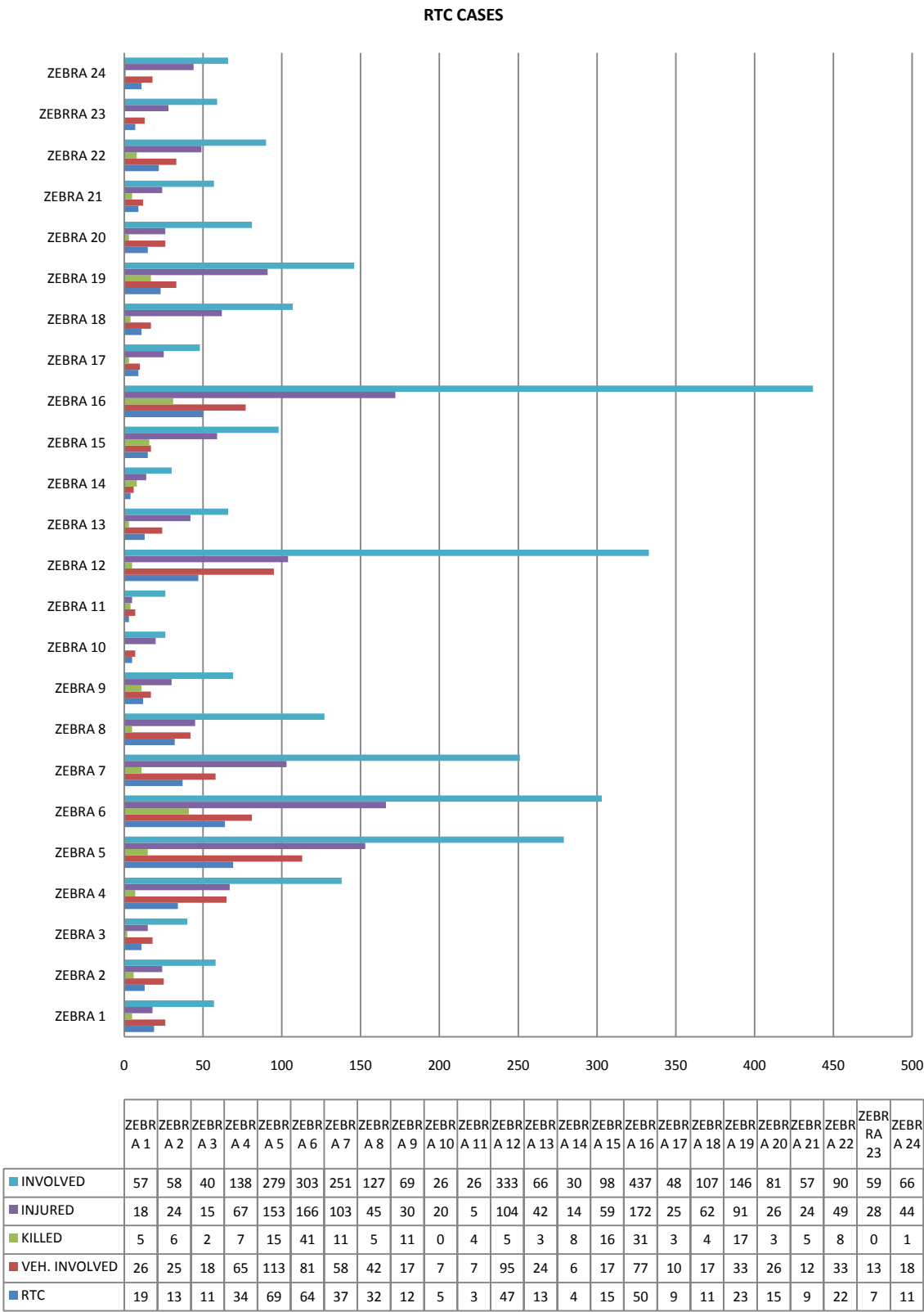

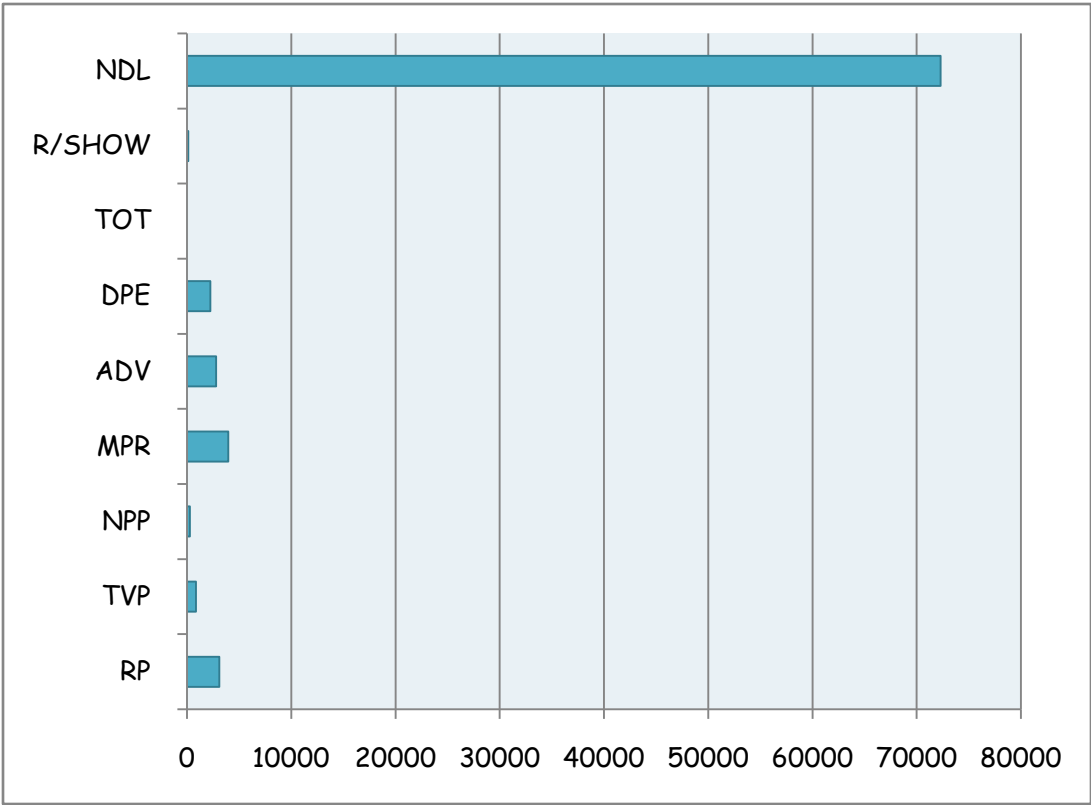

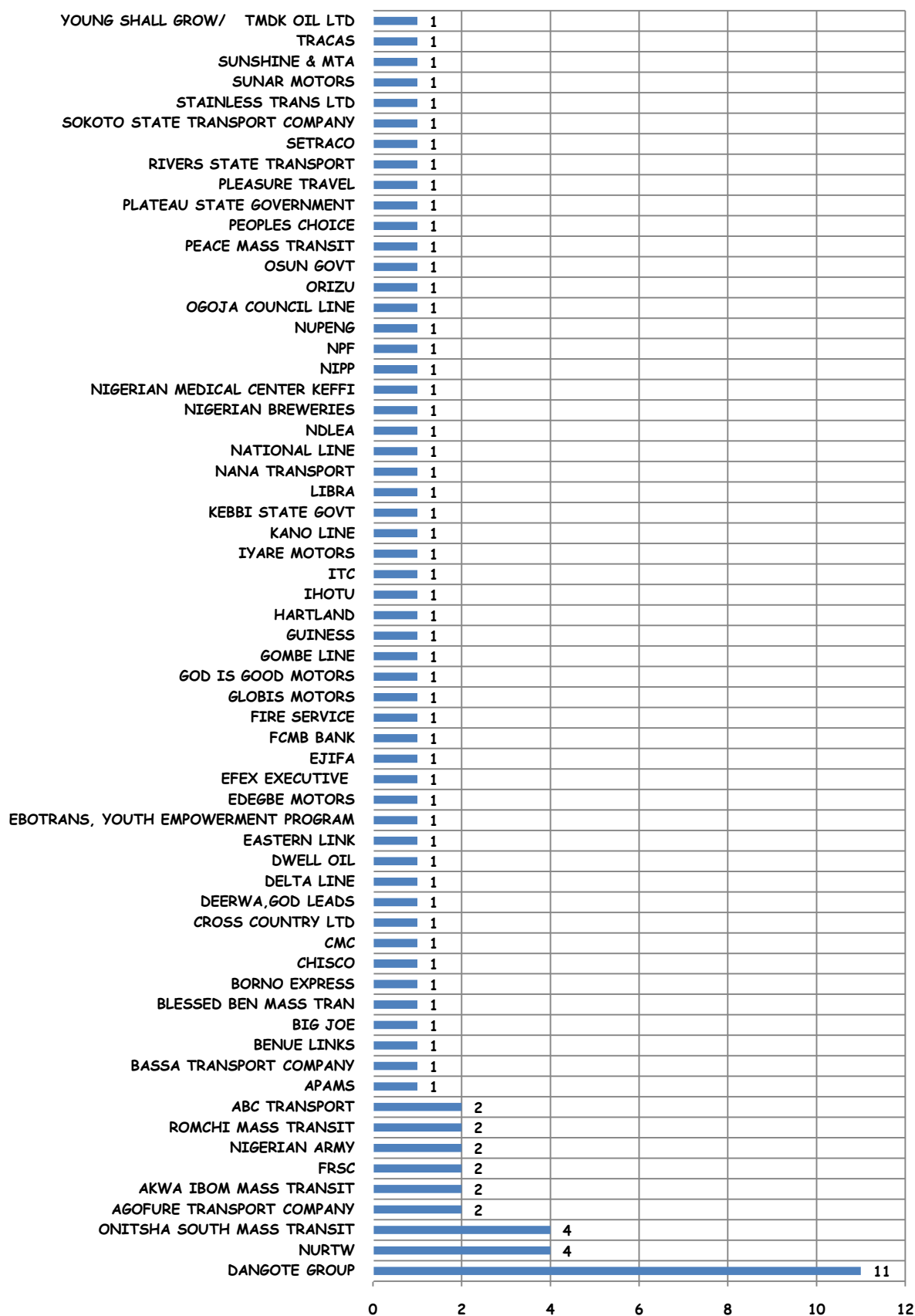

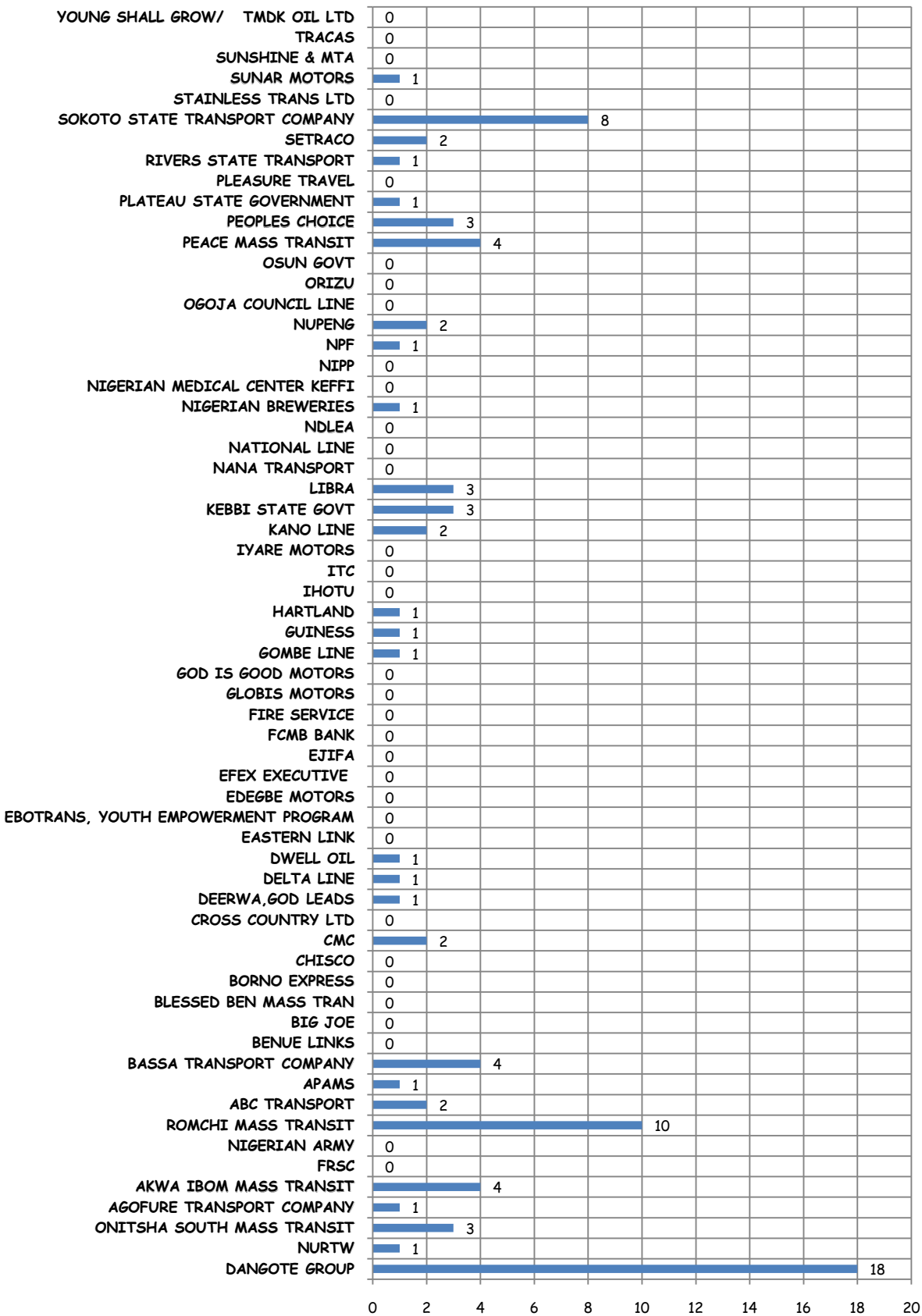




Chart 23: GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF THE NUMBER OF INJURED IN RTC INVOLVING FLEET OPERATORS

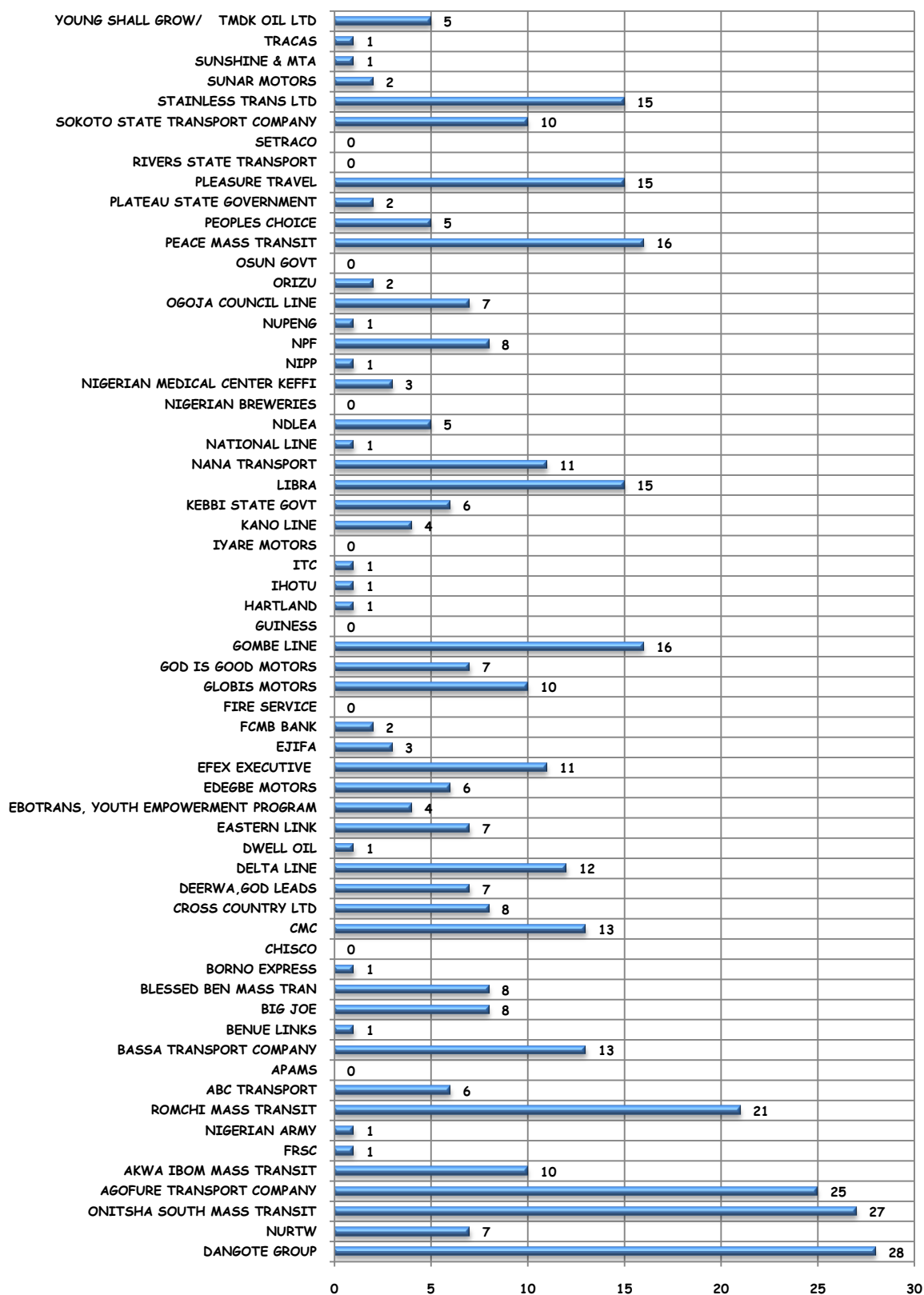

Chart 24: Corps Secretary Activities

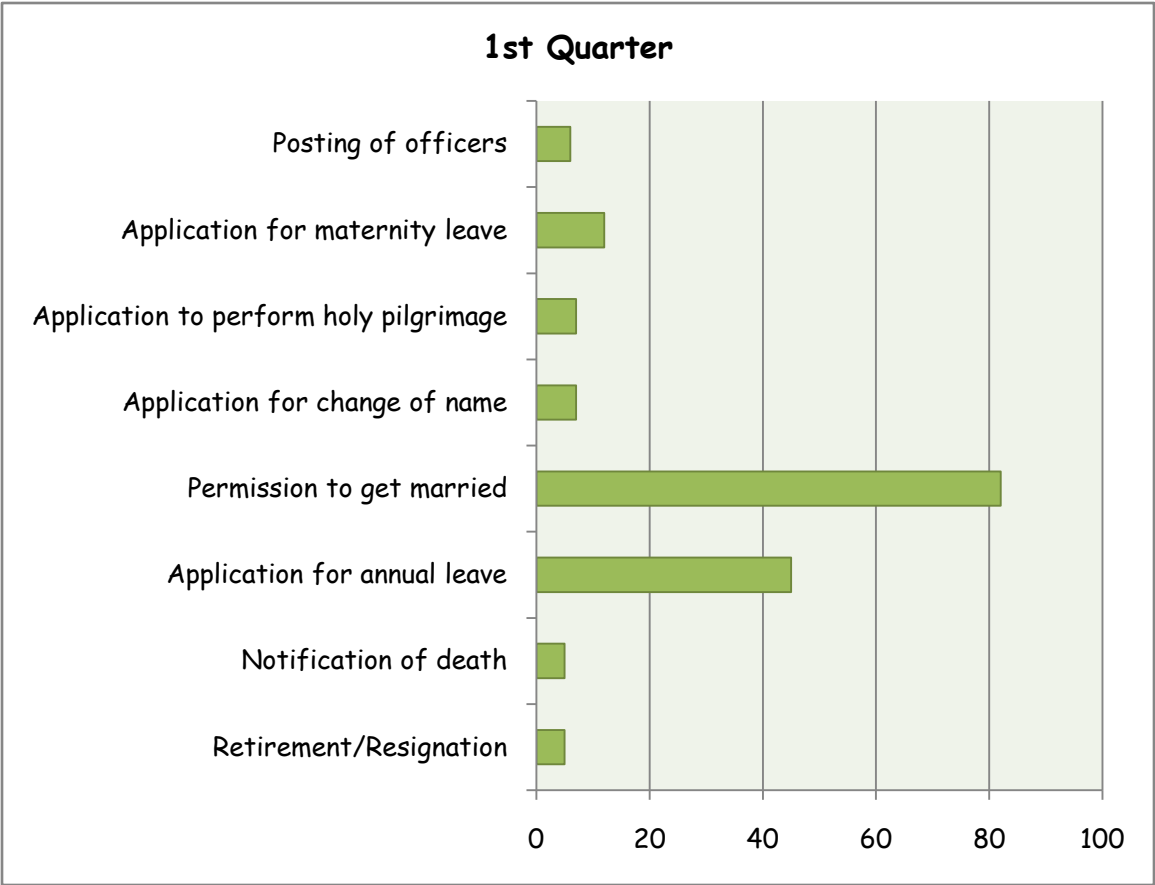

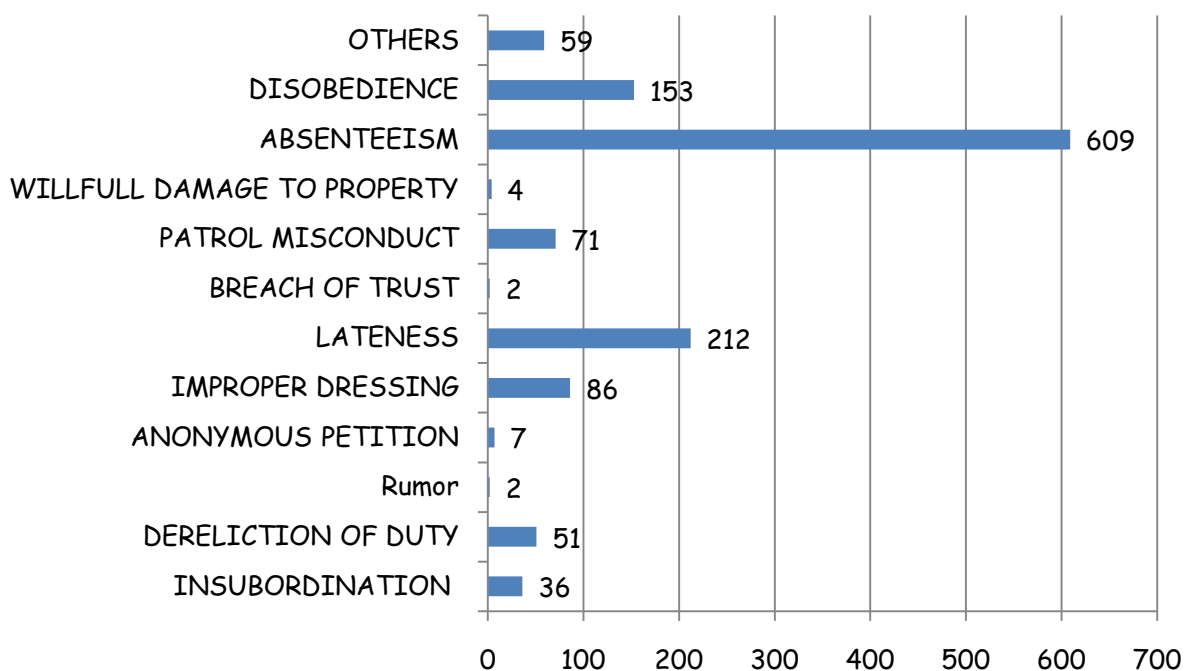
Chart 25: Misconduct

Chart 27: RTC Cases on State Basis

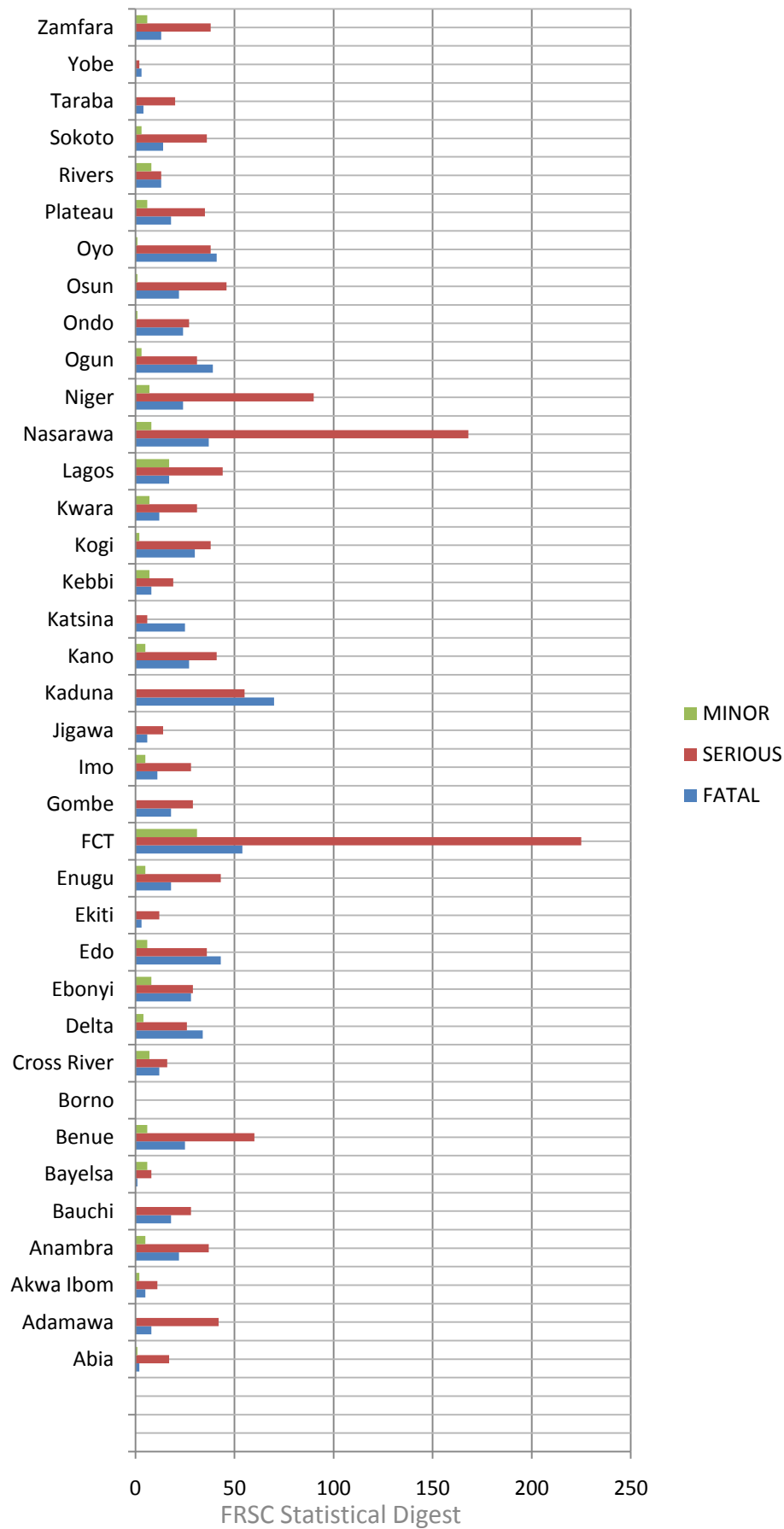

Chart 28: Number Injured

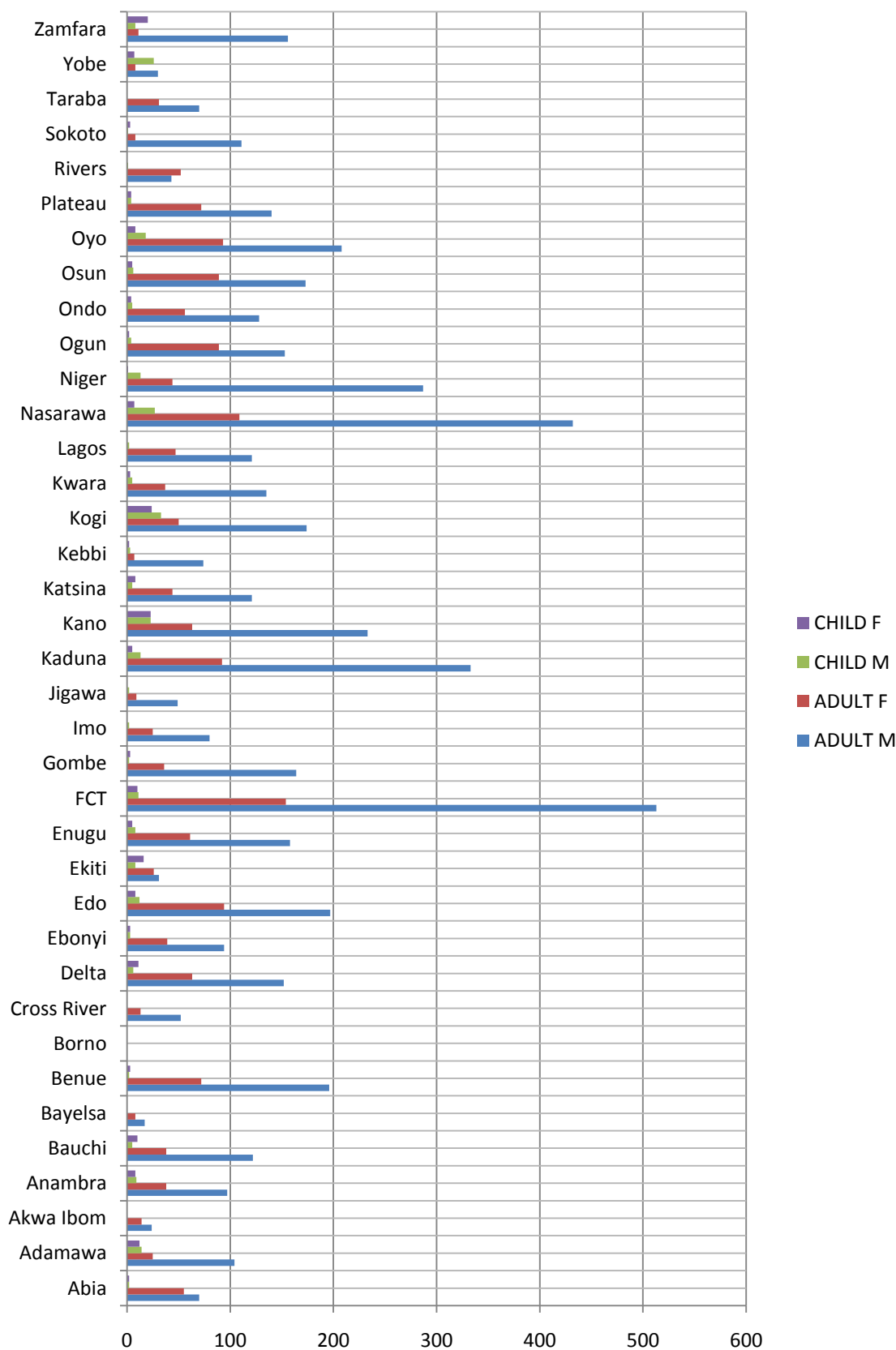

Chart 29: Number Killed on State Basis

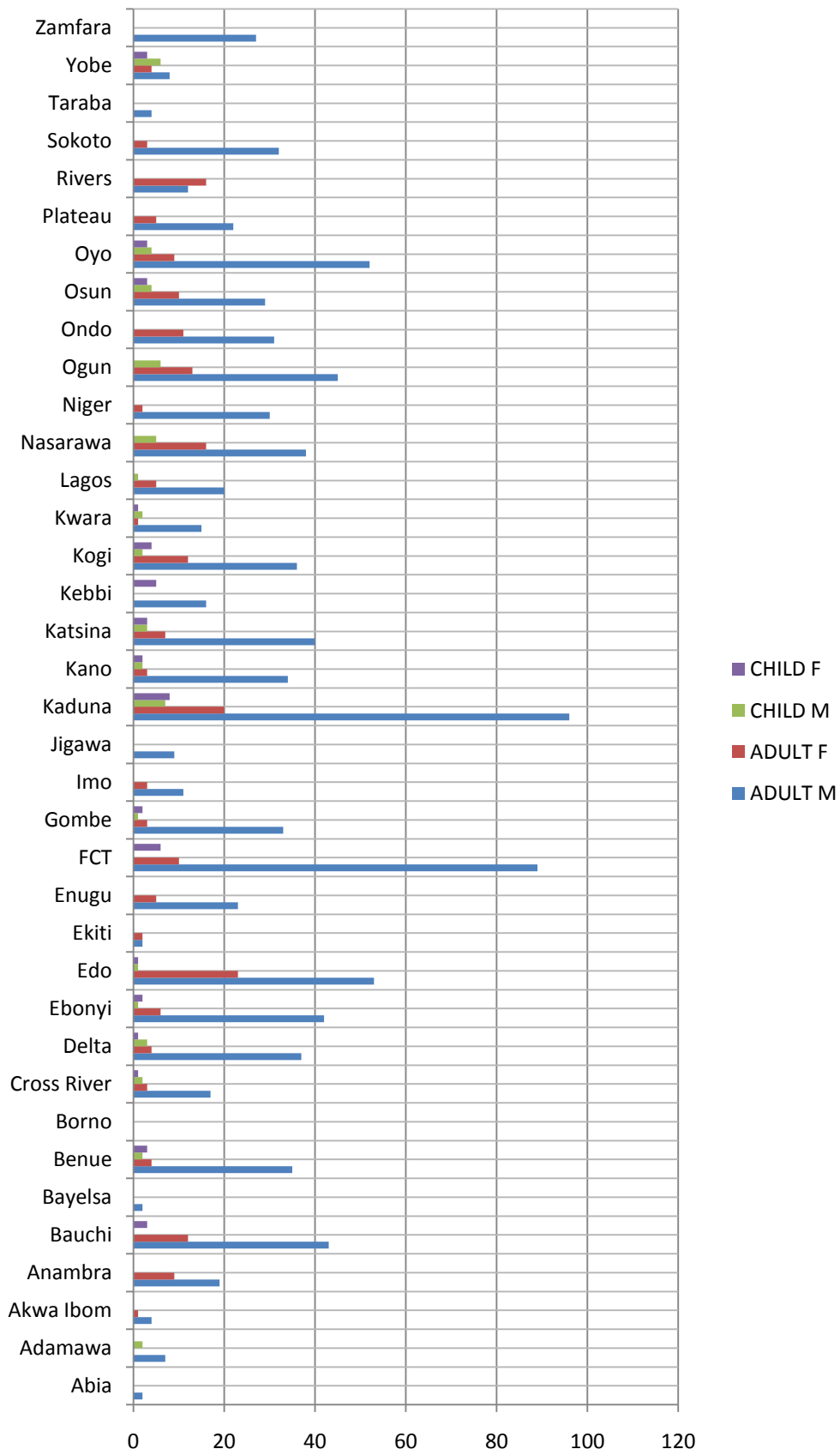

Chart 30: People Involved on State Basis

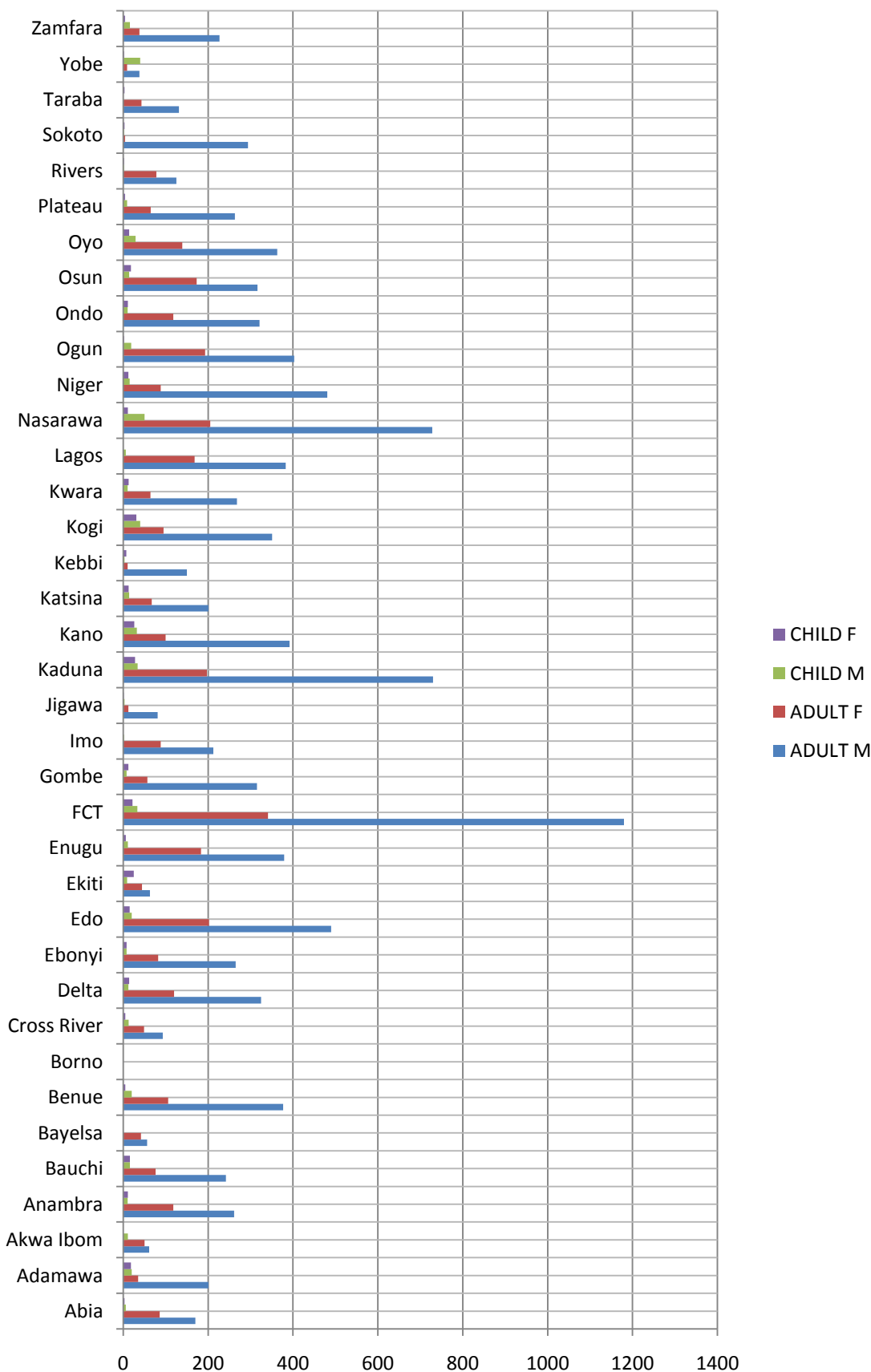

Chart 31: Vehicle Involved by Category on State Basis

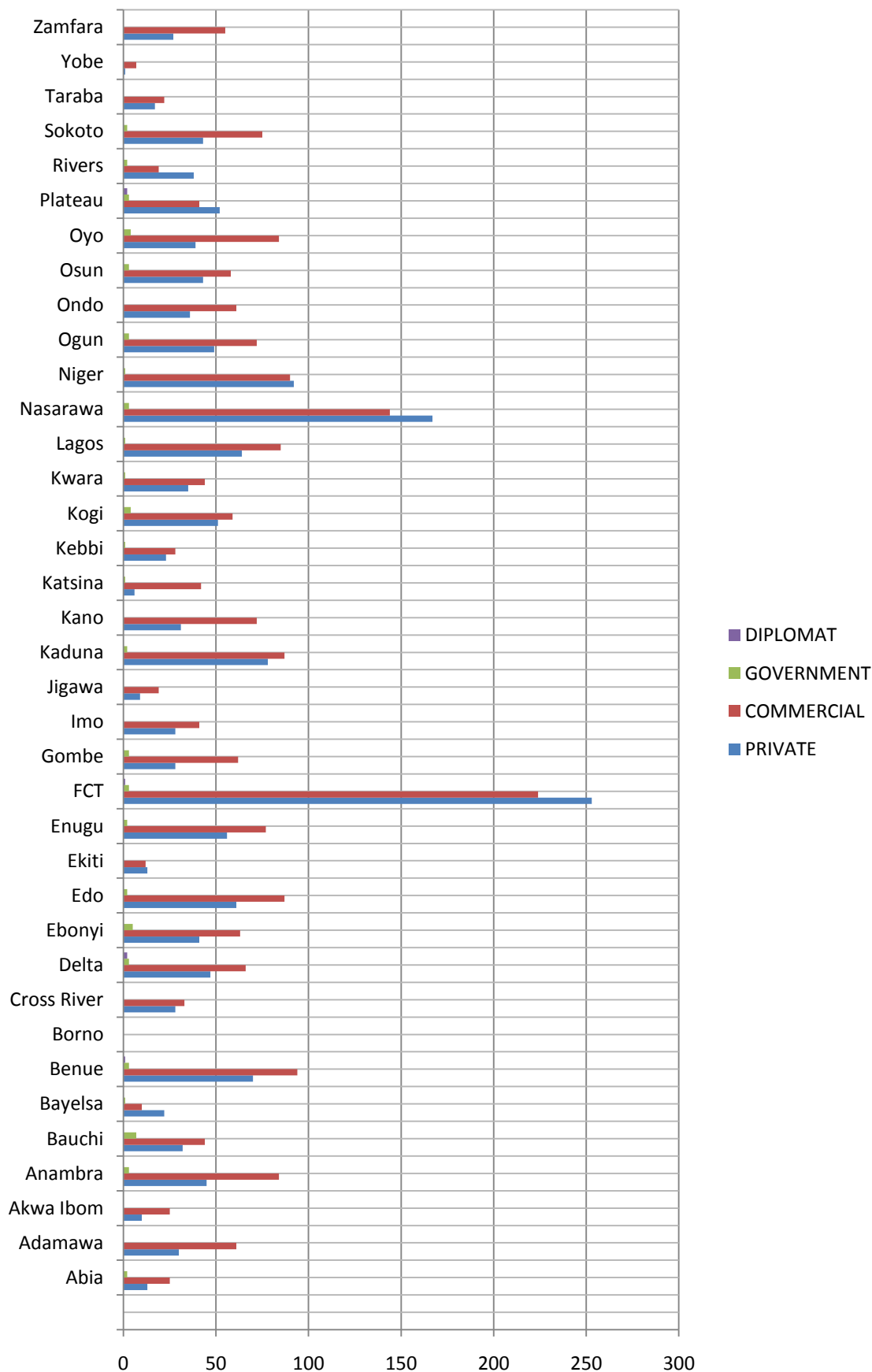

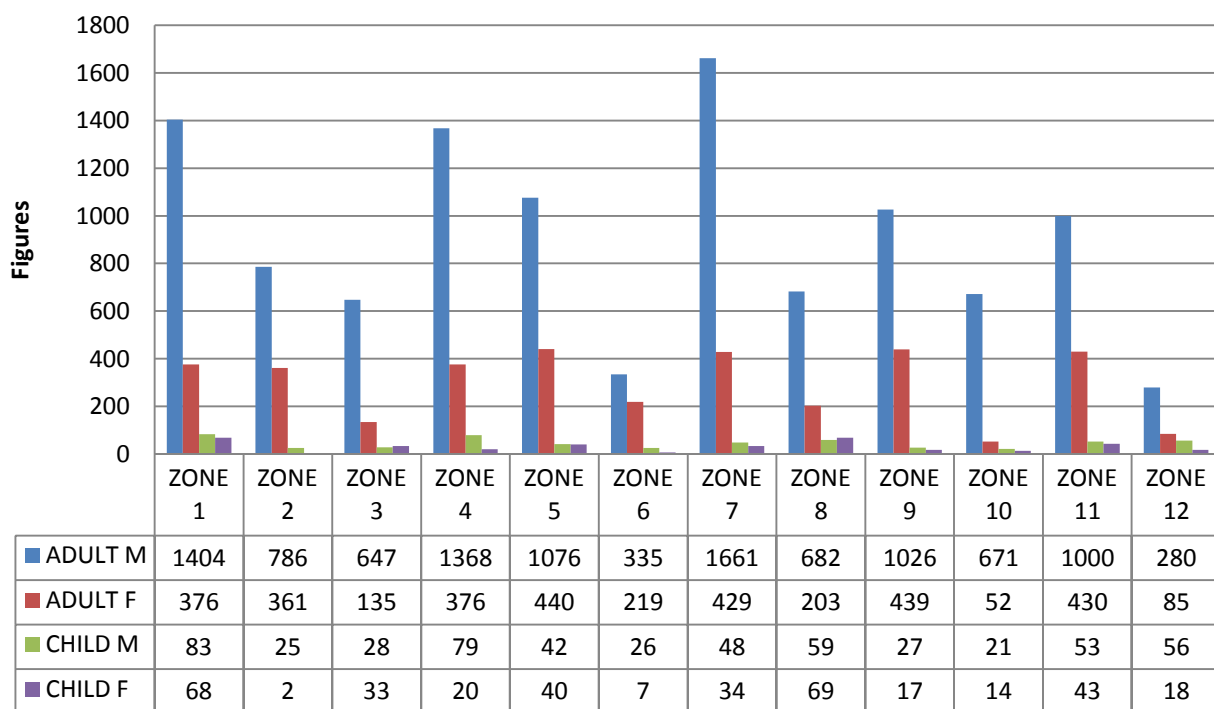
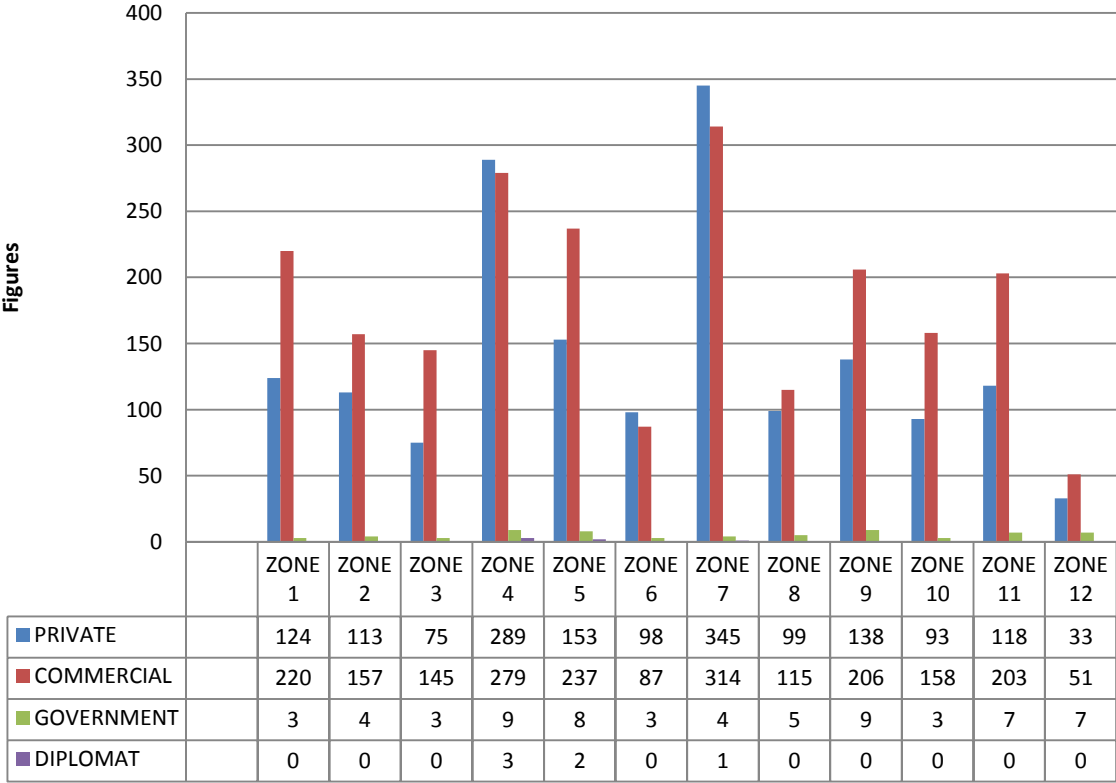

Chart 33: Vehicle Category on Zonal Basis



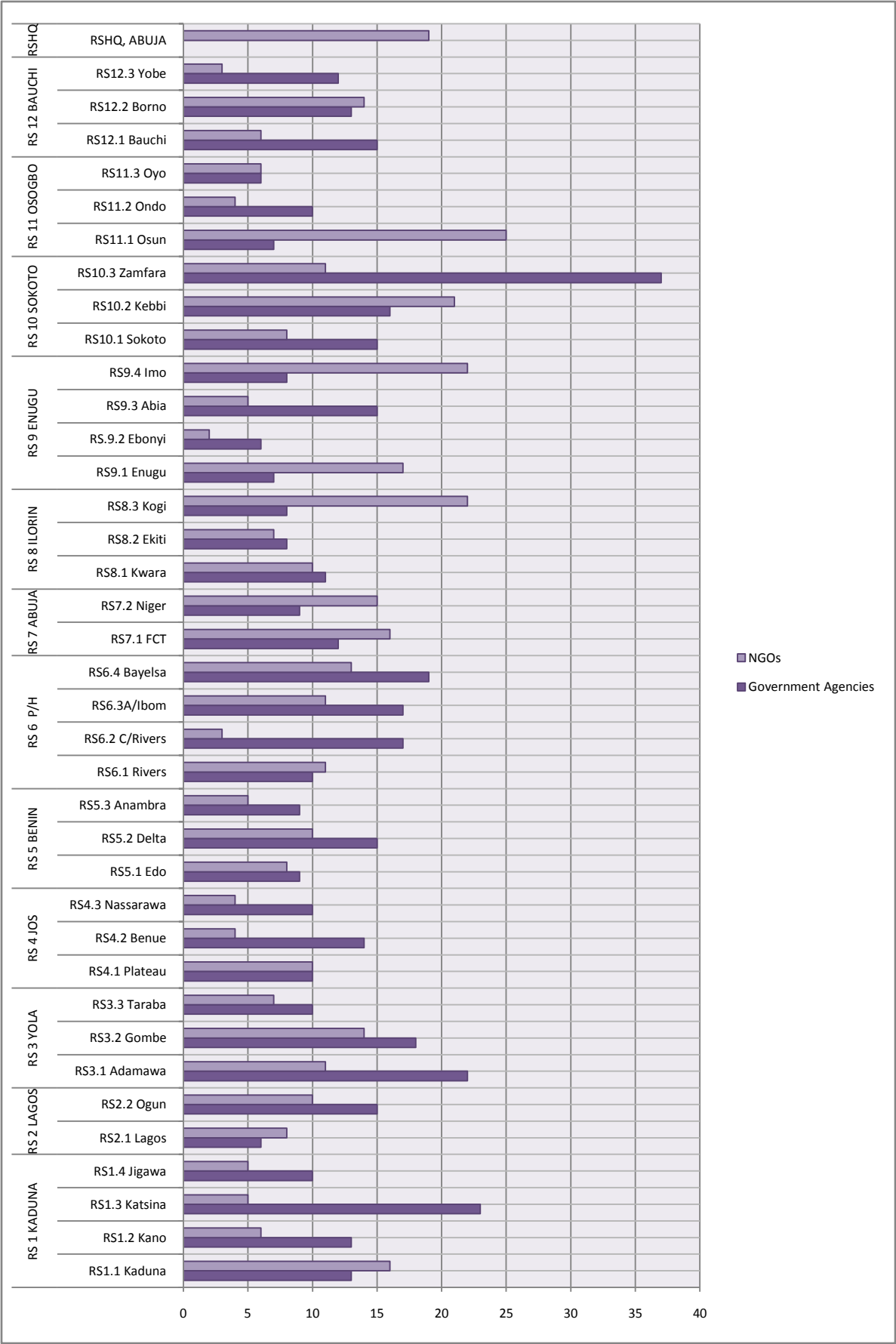

Chart 35: Special Marshals Activities

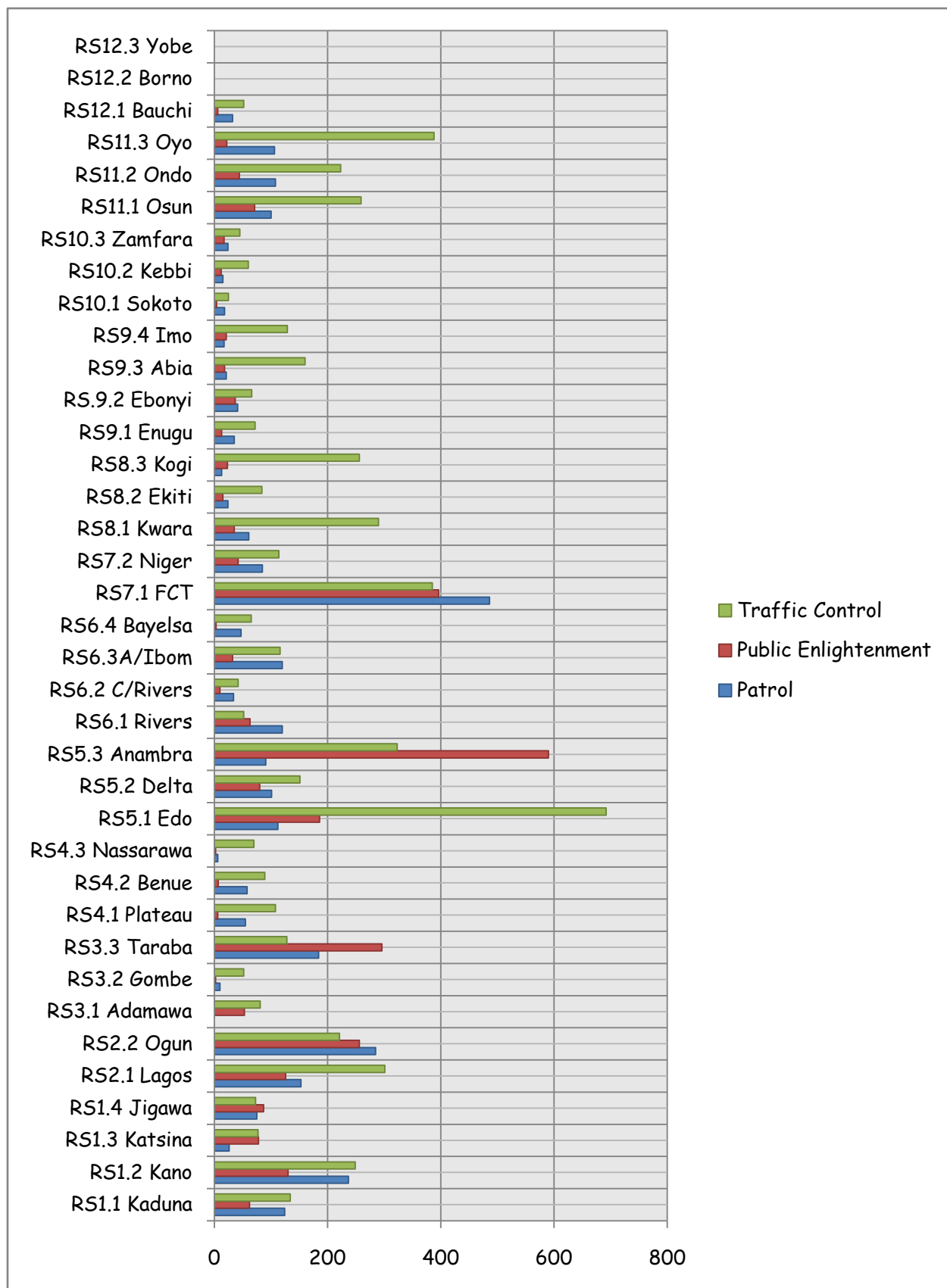

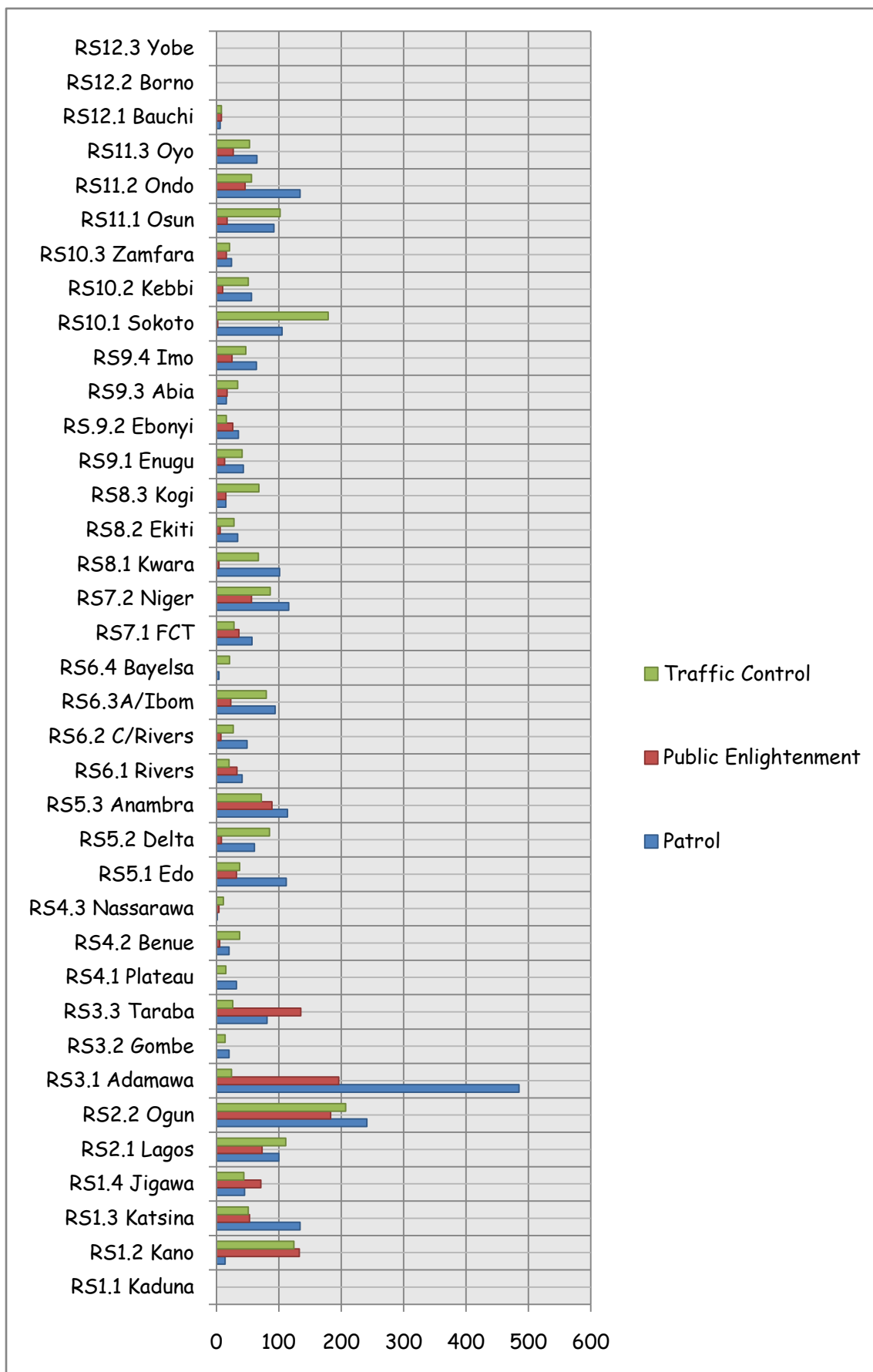
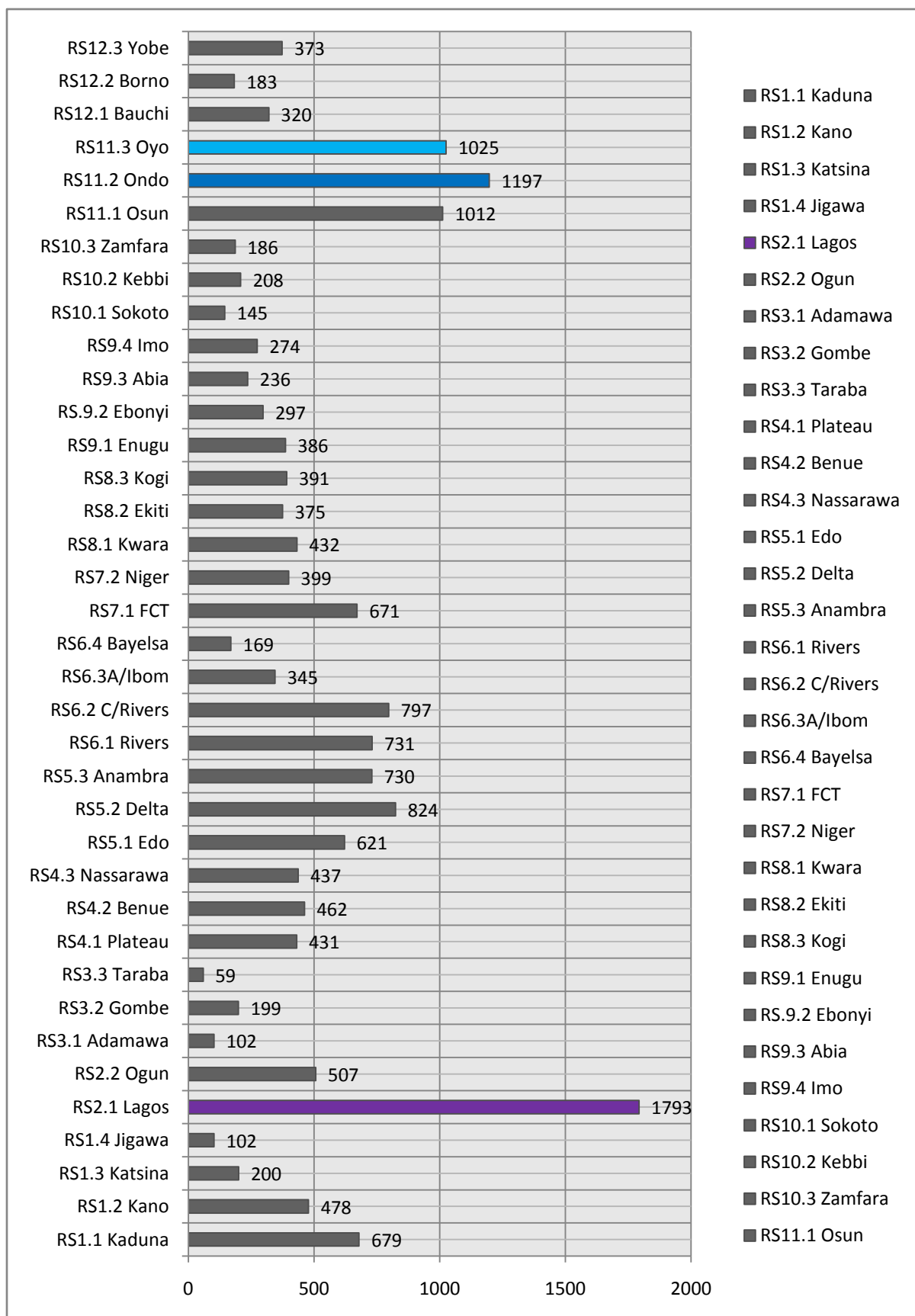
