ARRESTING THE MENACE OF FUEL TANKER CRASHES IN NIGERIA

For too long tanker and other articulated vehicle drivers have constituted themselves into terrors and menace on our roads. Acting as if they are above the law, these set of road users violate all traffic laws with impunity; they park in un-authorized places, some ply the roads with worn out tyres, drive without licenses, frequent brake failures, poorly maintained vehicles, and disregard and sometimes fight law enforcement officers. Fuel-laden tankers with such characters behind the wheels are like bomb-laden trucks driven by terrorists. This was what the nation woke up to some weeks ago. This harvest of deaths started in Onitsha on 31st May 2015 when a fully loaded fuel tanker rammed into a busy motor park claiming about 50 lives, including a pregnant woman and children. This seemed to open a flood gate of tanker crashes in Lagos, Ondo and other places in the country in quick successions with more lives and properties running into billions of naira gutted by fire.

Jolted by these disasters the Corps Marshal Boboye Oyeyemi swung into action by initiating series of meetings with all stakeholders (those in the petroleum industry, transportation business and other government agencies) to find solutions to this menace. The result of this rapprochement was the training and certification of tanker drivers, collaboration with bodies like Standard Organization of Nigeria to ensure maintenance of quality standards of vehicles and spare parts, drafting of FRSC officers to loading depots to ensure only roadworthy and certified tankers are allowed to load, enlightenment and subtle enforcement of traffic laws on violators code named "Operation Scorpion" which was kicked off by the Corps Marshal in Lagos, Ogun and Oyo states. This took place in July 2015 during which about 414 vehicles were impounded and drivers enlightened and warned to fix observed defects.

We believe that these proactive measures if sustained across the country will go a long way to not only stem the tide in this menace but drastically arrest it. We therefore solicit the support, understanding and encouragement of all stakeholders and indeed Nigerians in order to realize this laudable project.

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Overloading

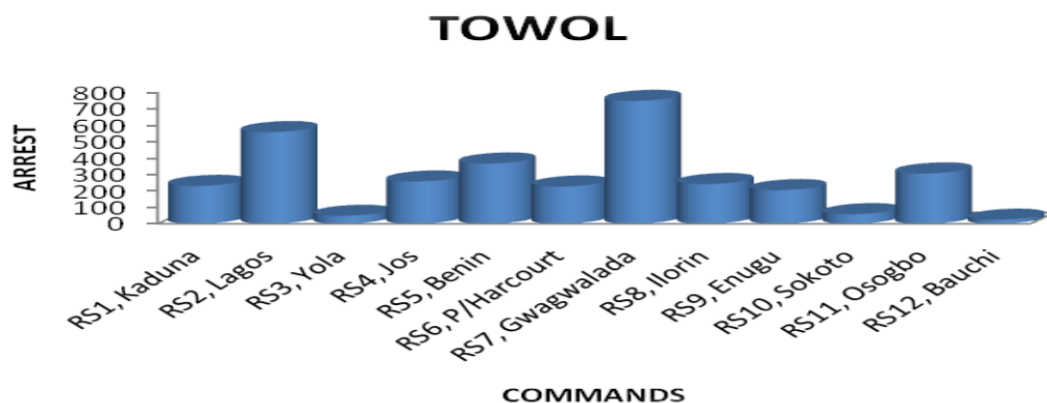

Chart 2: Chart Illustrating Offenders/Offences

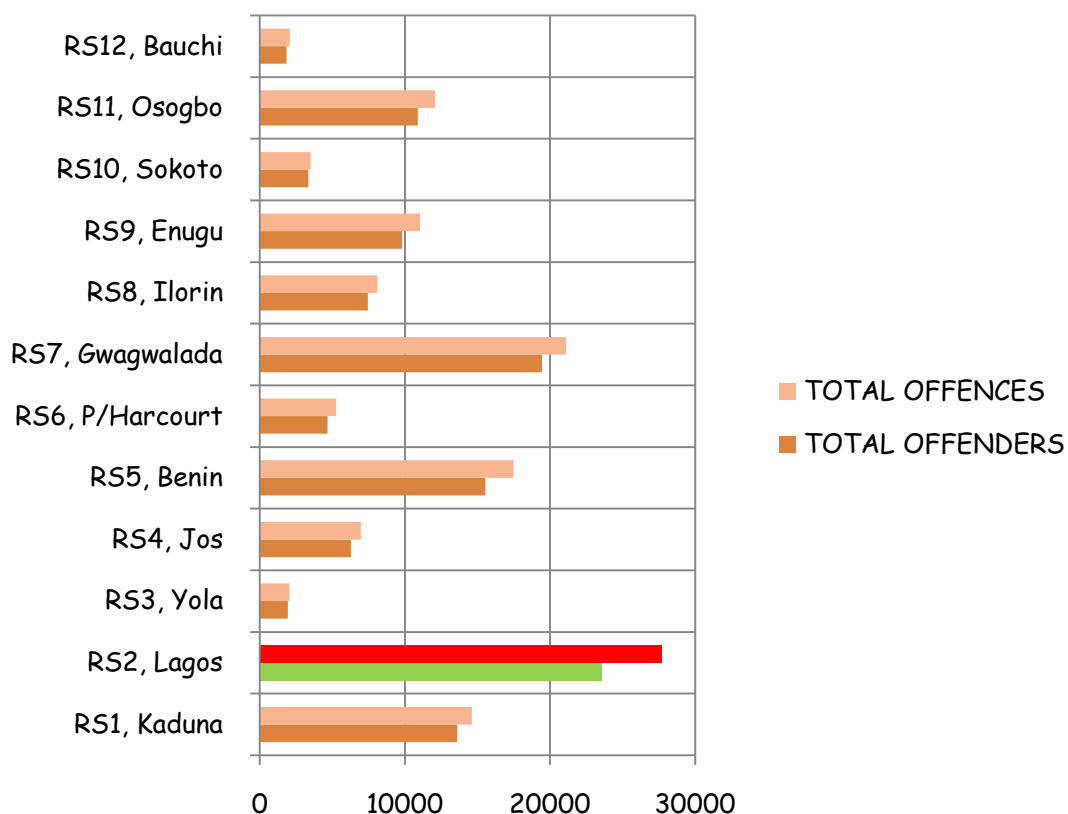
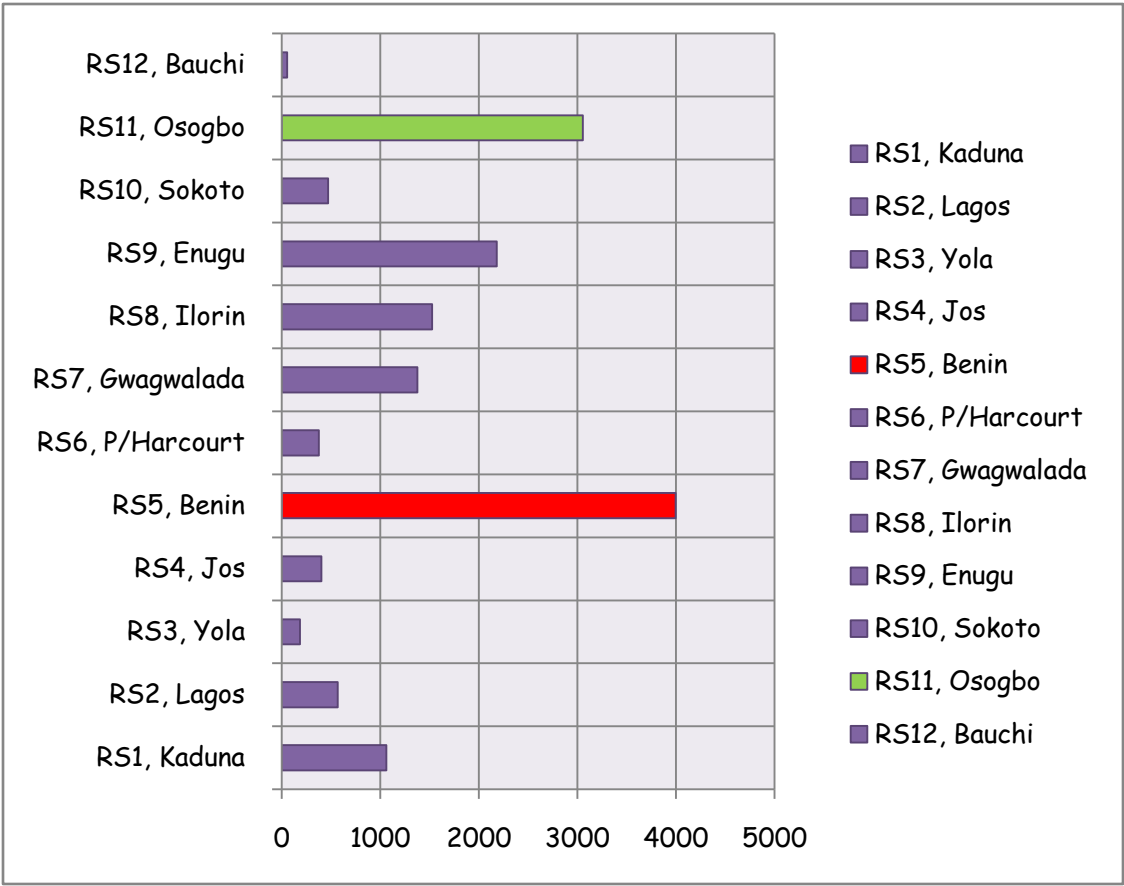

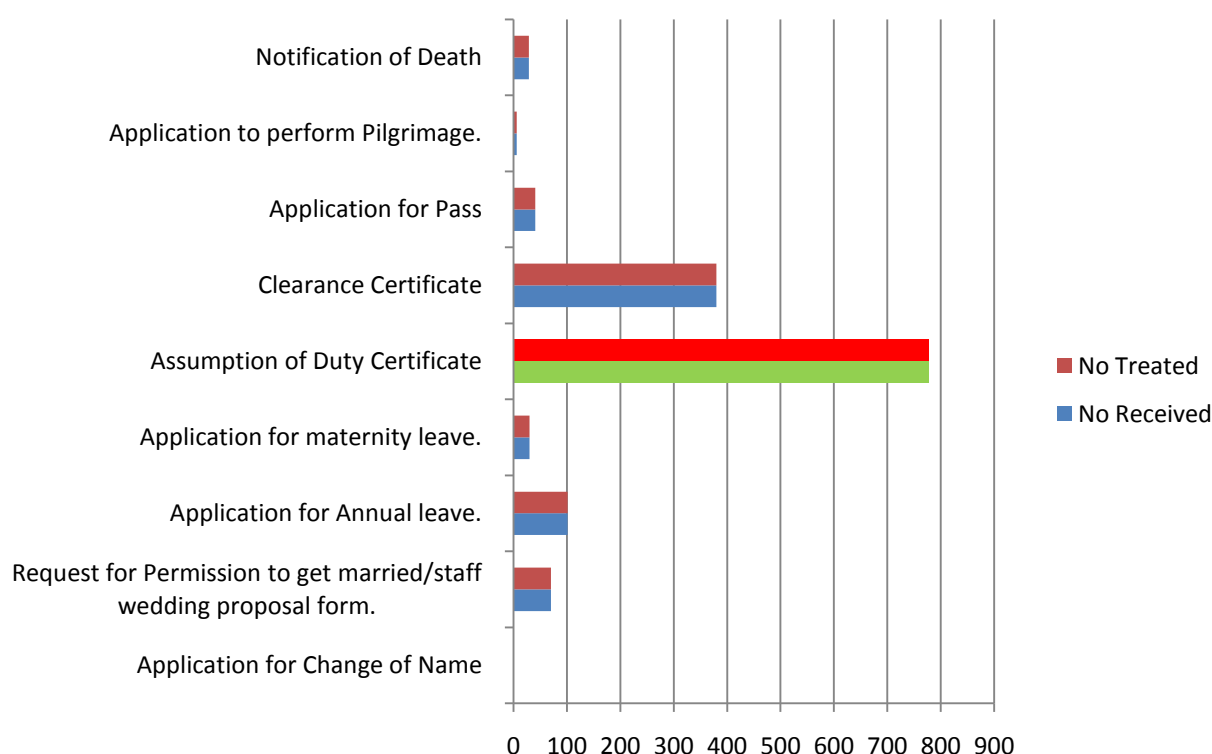

Chart 5: Chart Illustrating Disciplinary Cases Treated

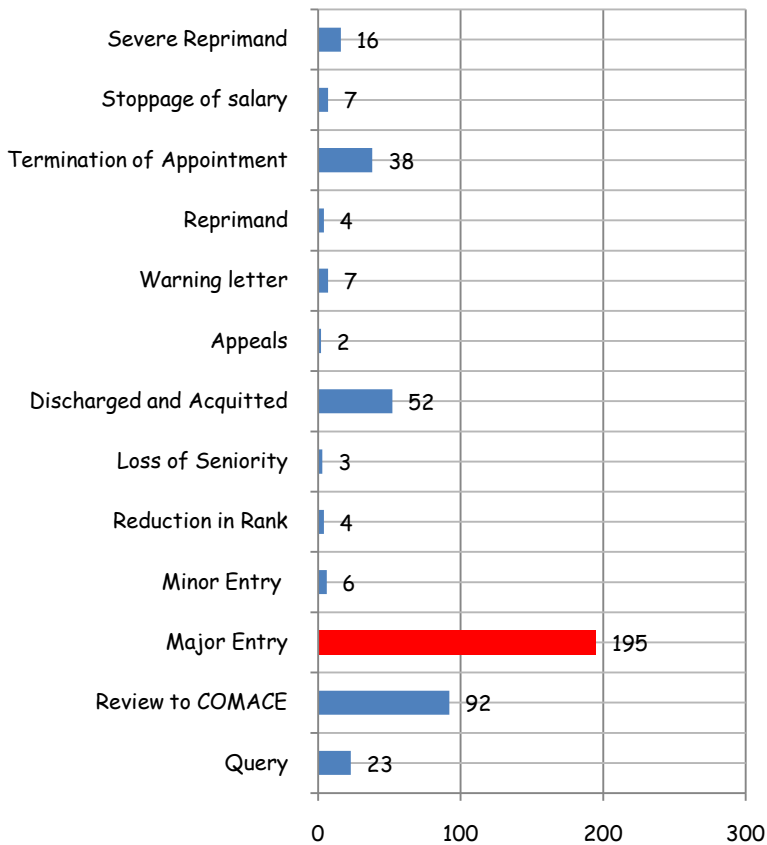

Chart 6: First Quarter and Second Quarter Comparison

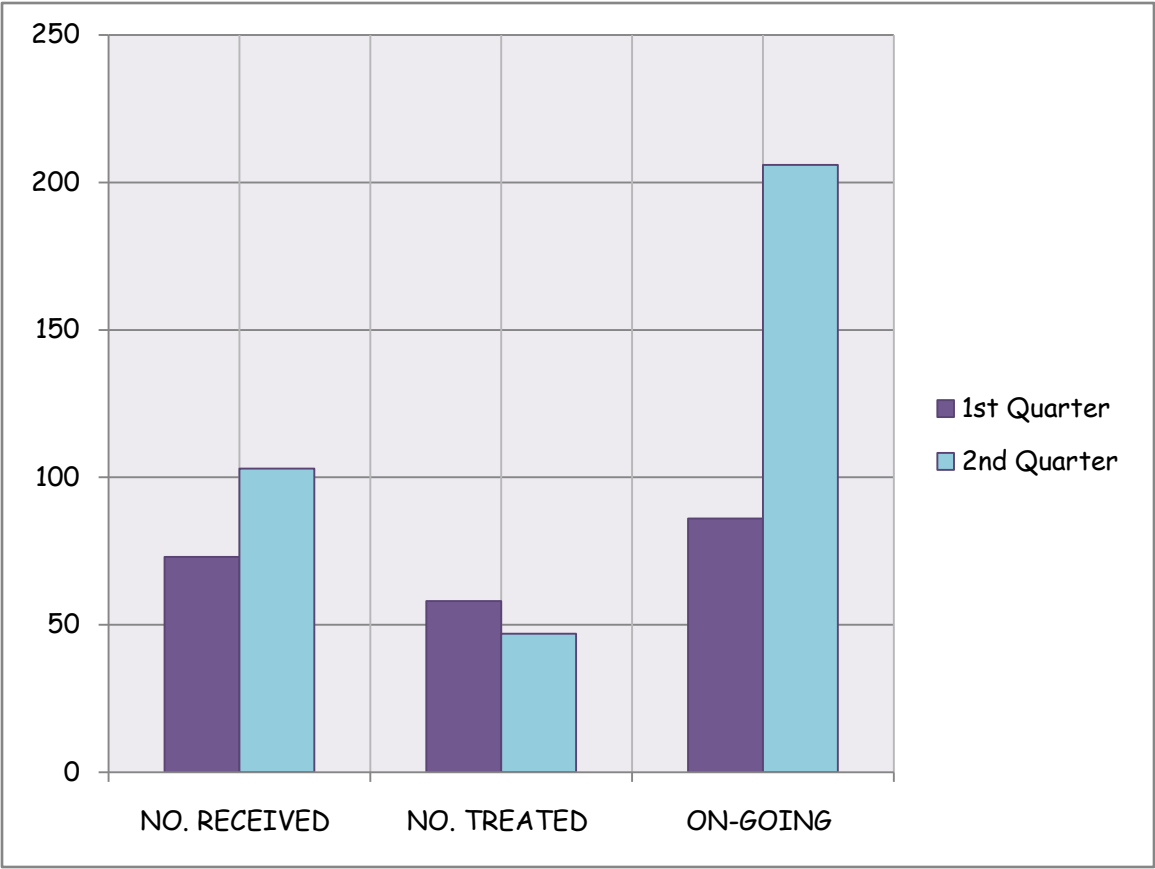

Chart 7: First Quarter and Second Quarter Comparison

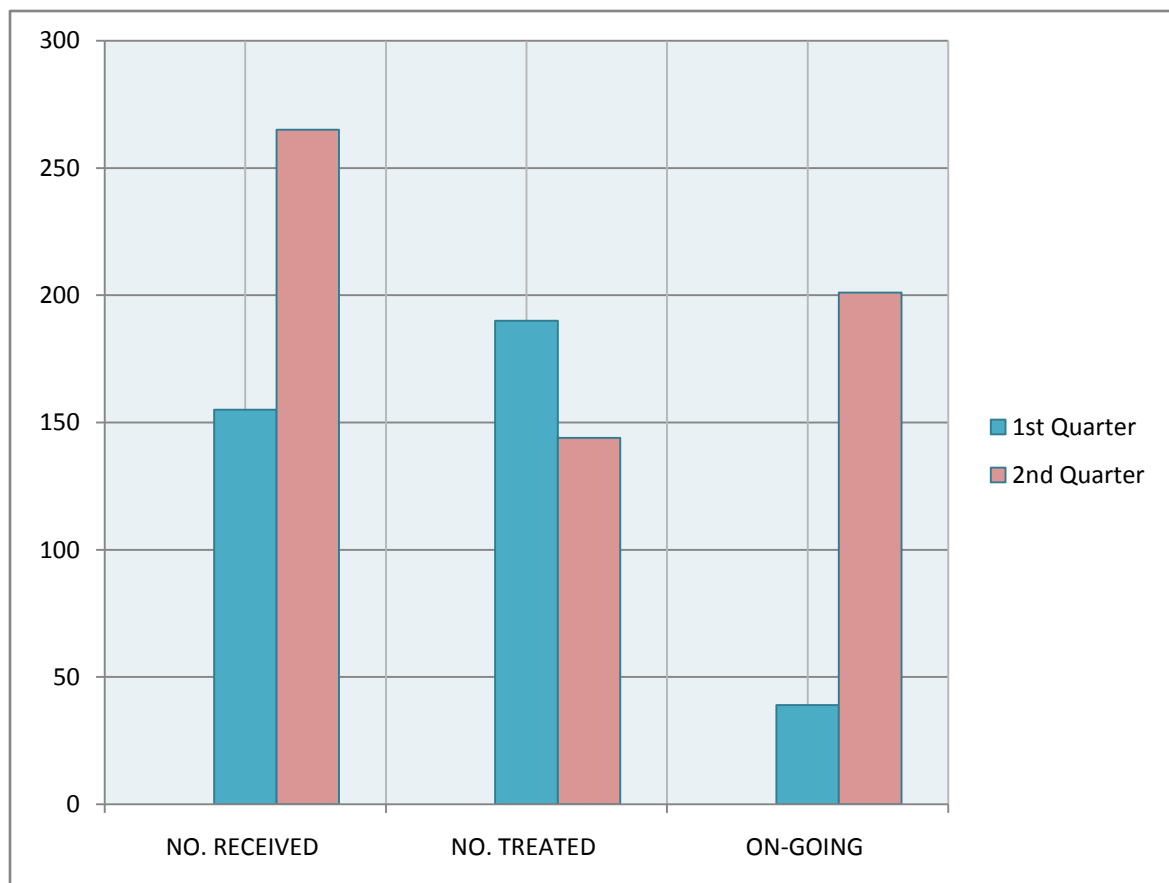

Chart 8: First Quarter and Second Quarter Comparison

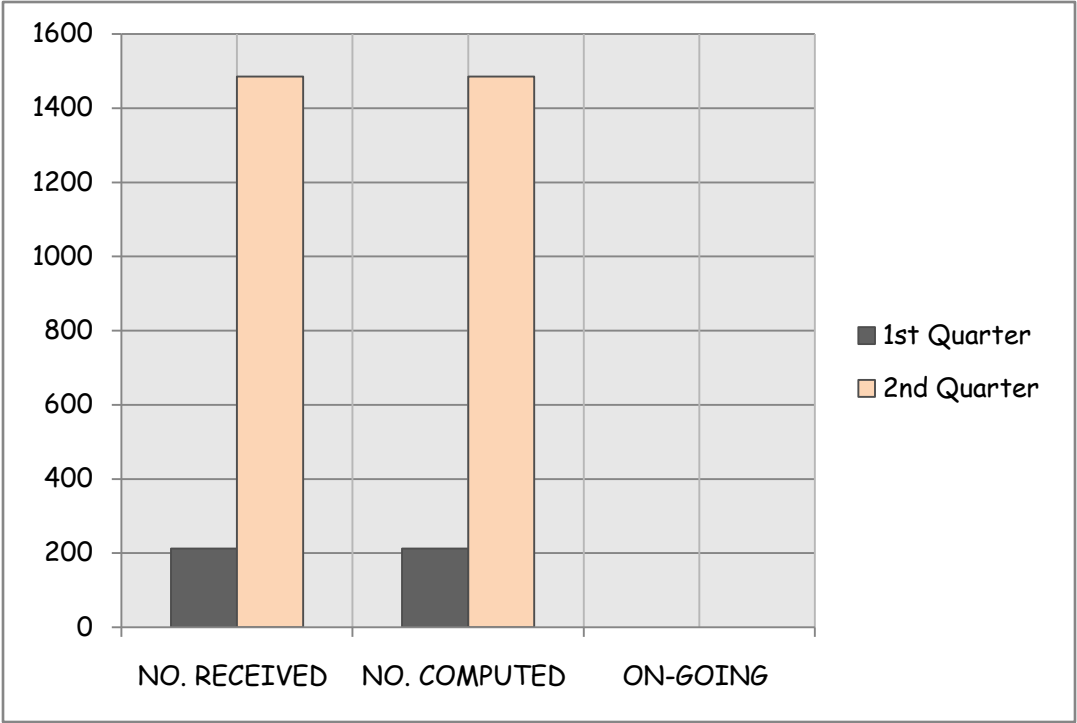

Chart 9: Chart For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Officers)

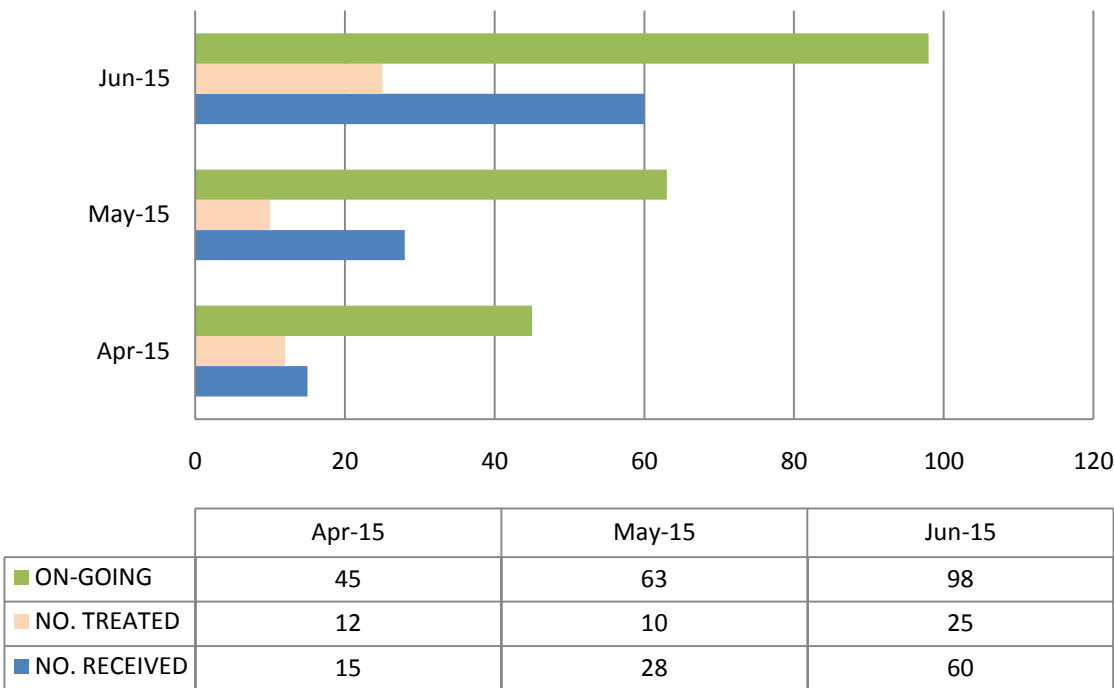


Table 11:Incoming Requests For Variation Of Staff Salaries (Marshals)

Chart 10: INCOMING REQUESTS FOR VARIATION OF STAFF SALARIES (Marshals)

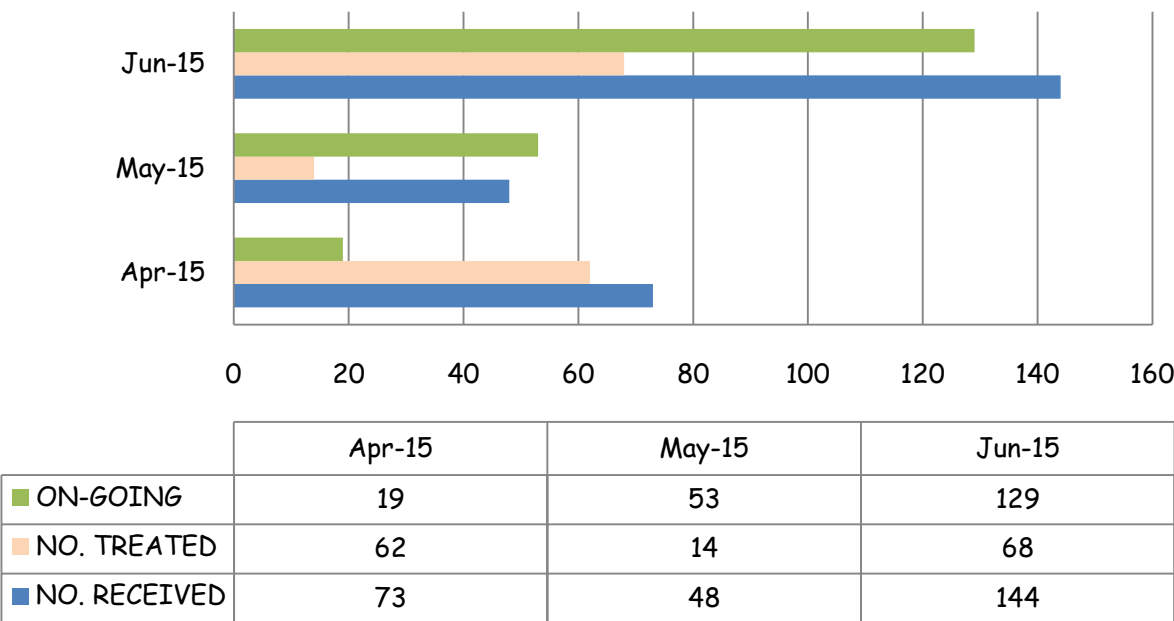
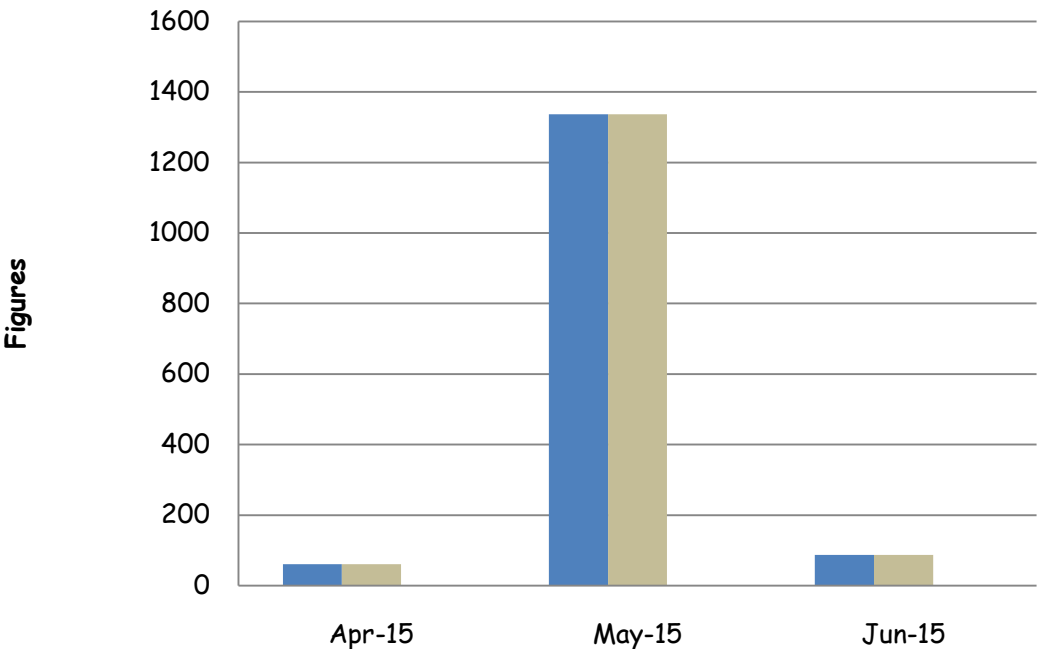

Chart 12: National Driver License production

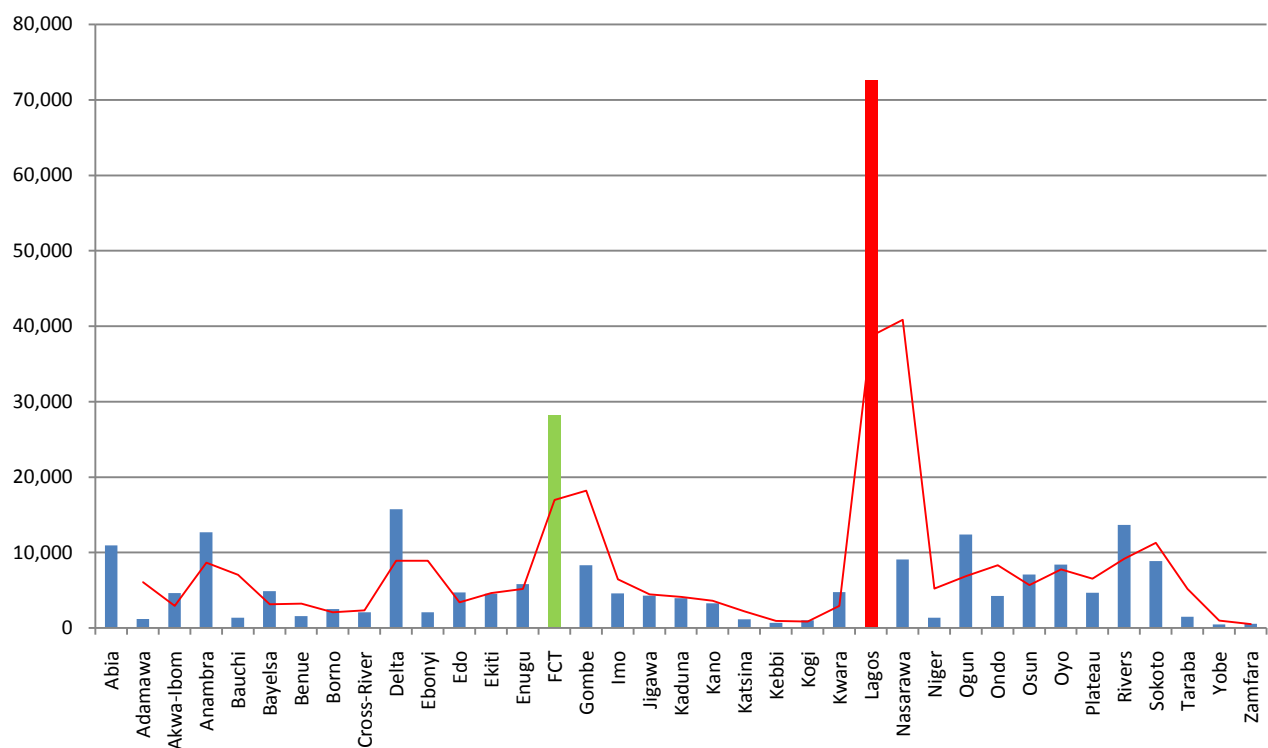


Chart 13: showing total number of NDL production within 2nd quarter 2015

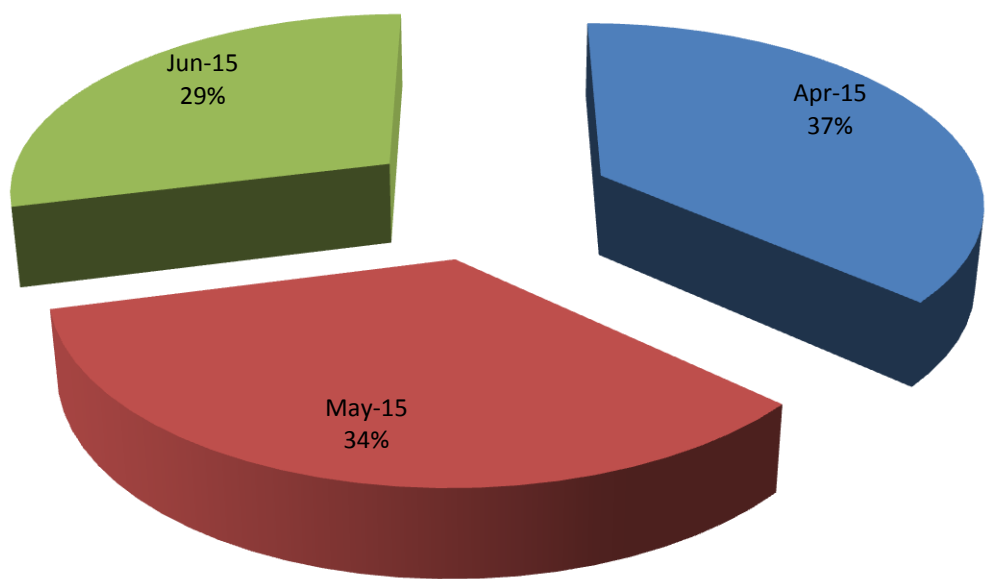

Chart 14: RTC Cases and Medical Cases Chart illustrating Summary of Patients, Attended to, in First Quarter compared to Second Quarter

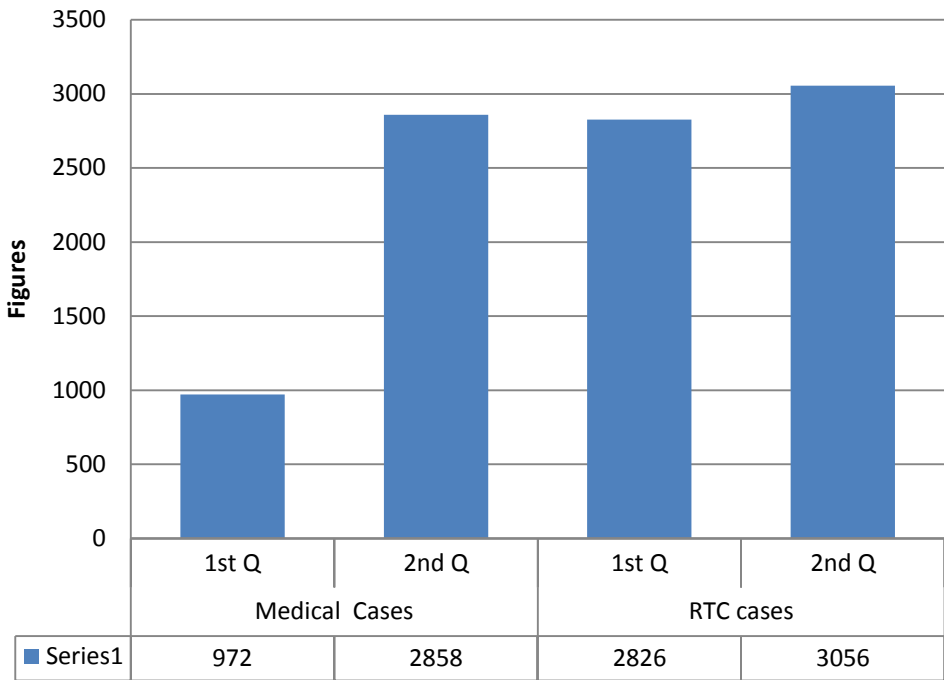

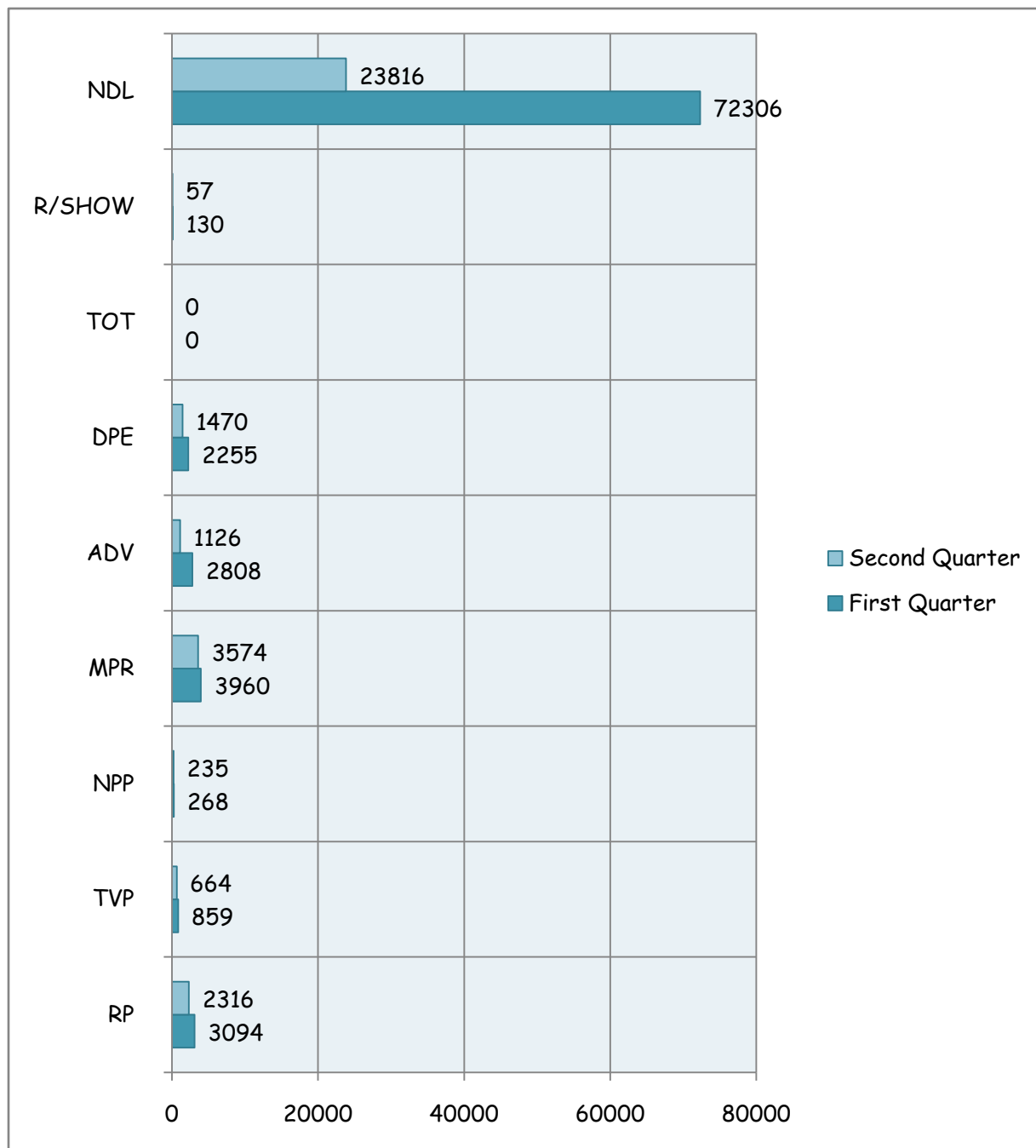

Chart 16: NUMBER OF CASES

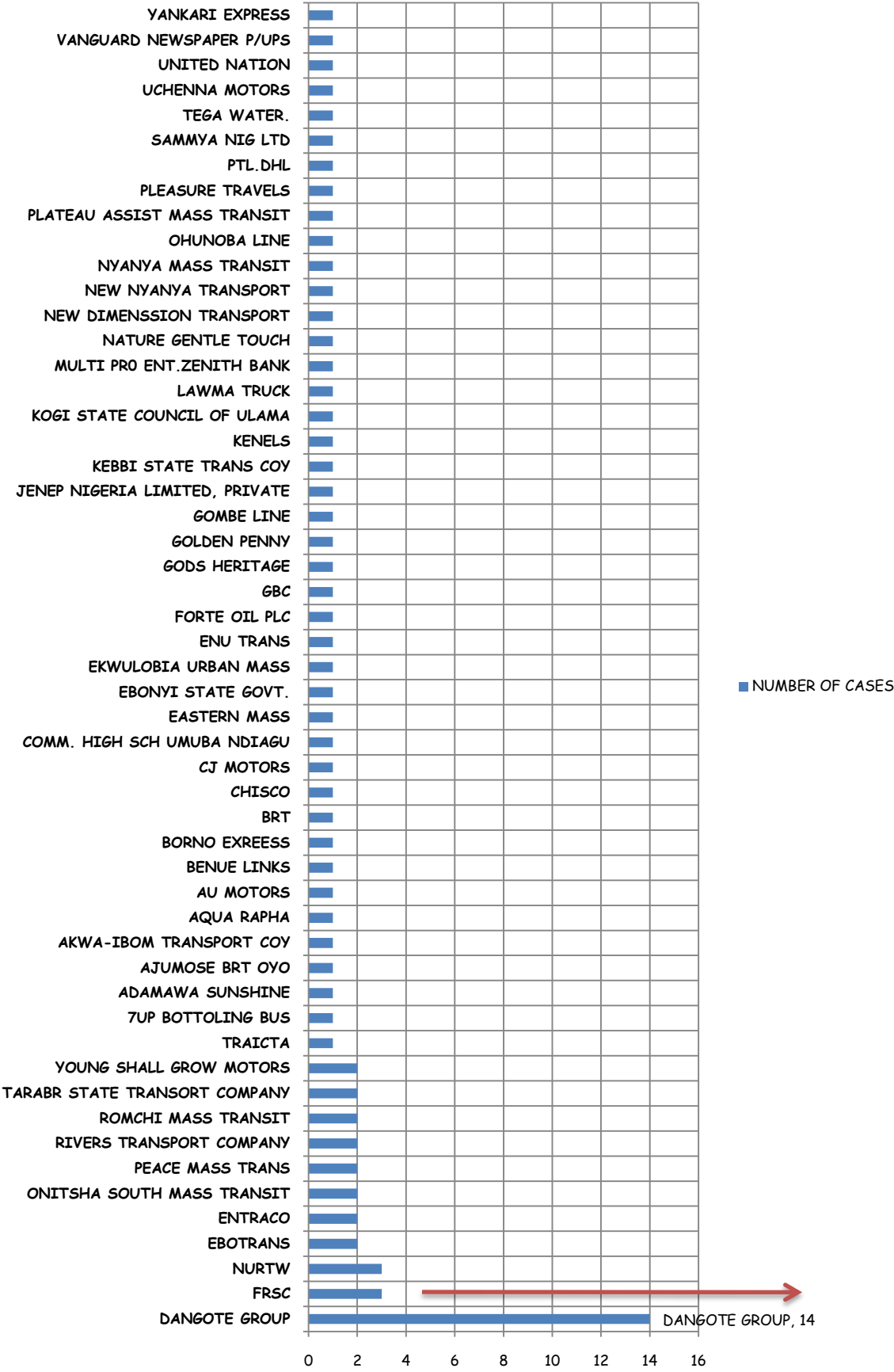


Chart 17: NUMBER KILLED

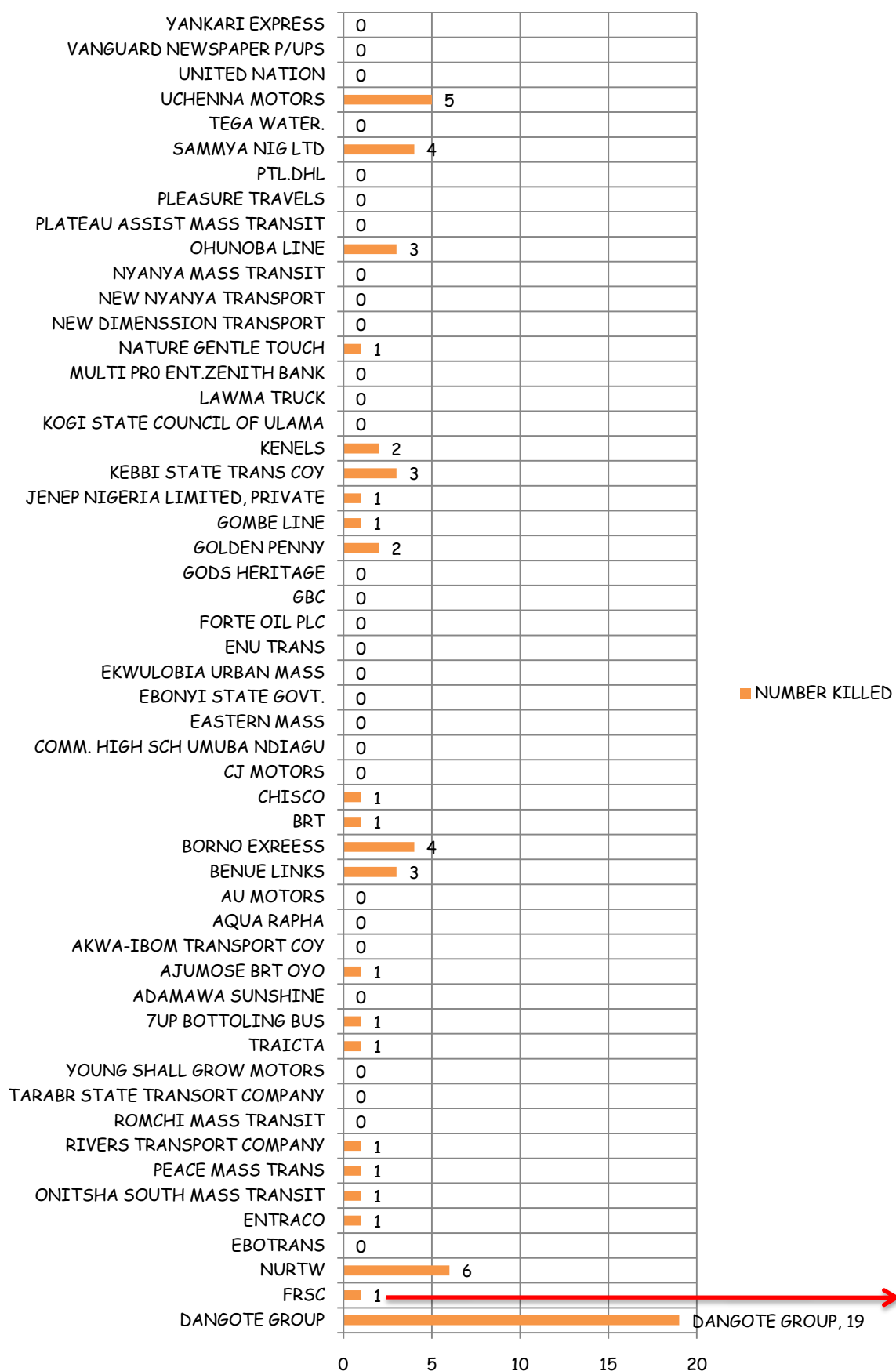




Chart 18: NUMBER INJURED

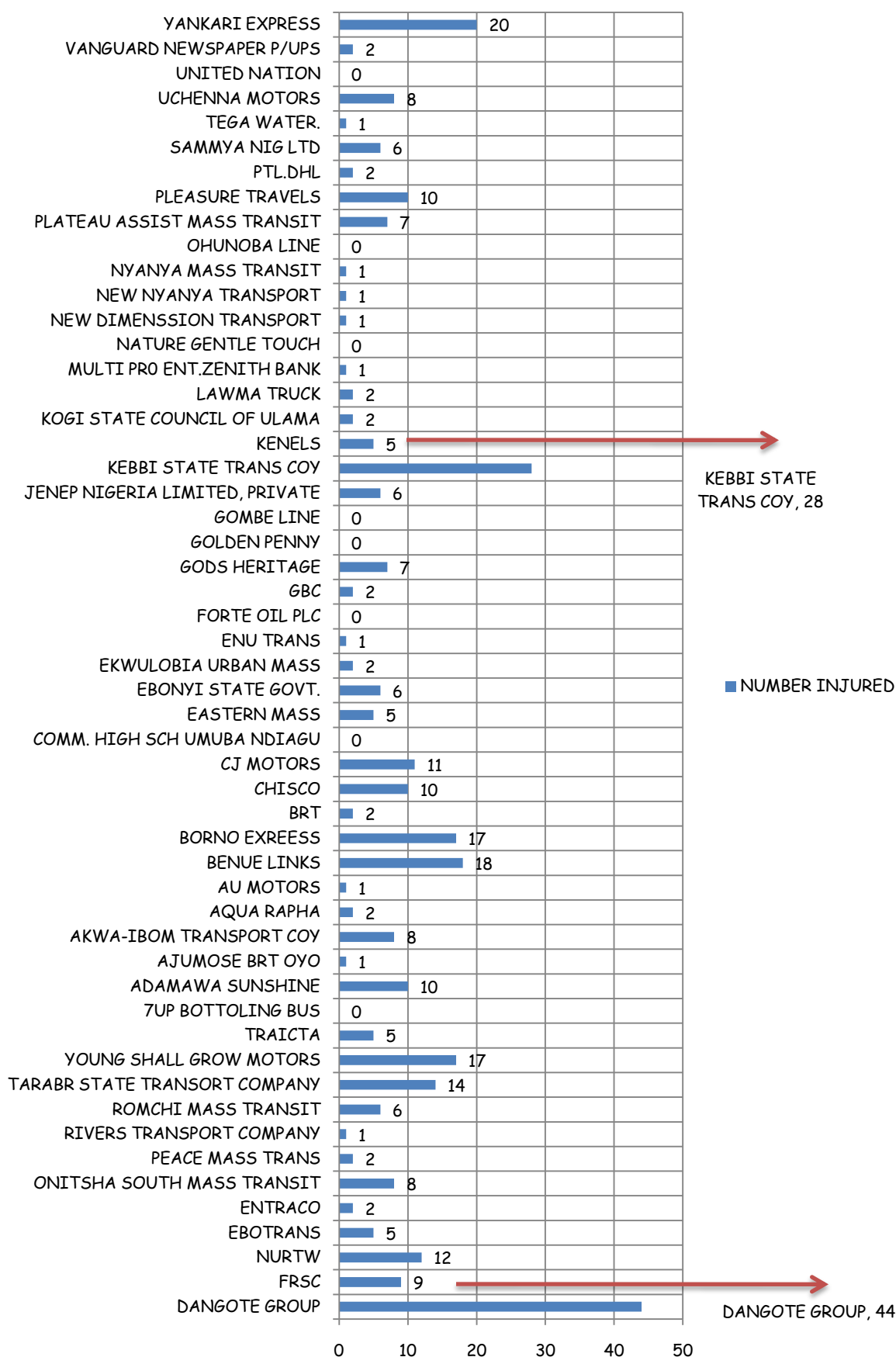

Chart 19 : Corps Secretary Activities

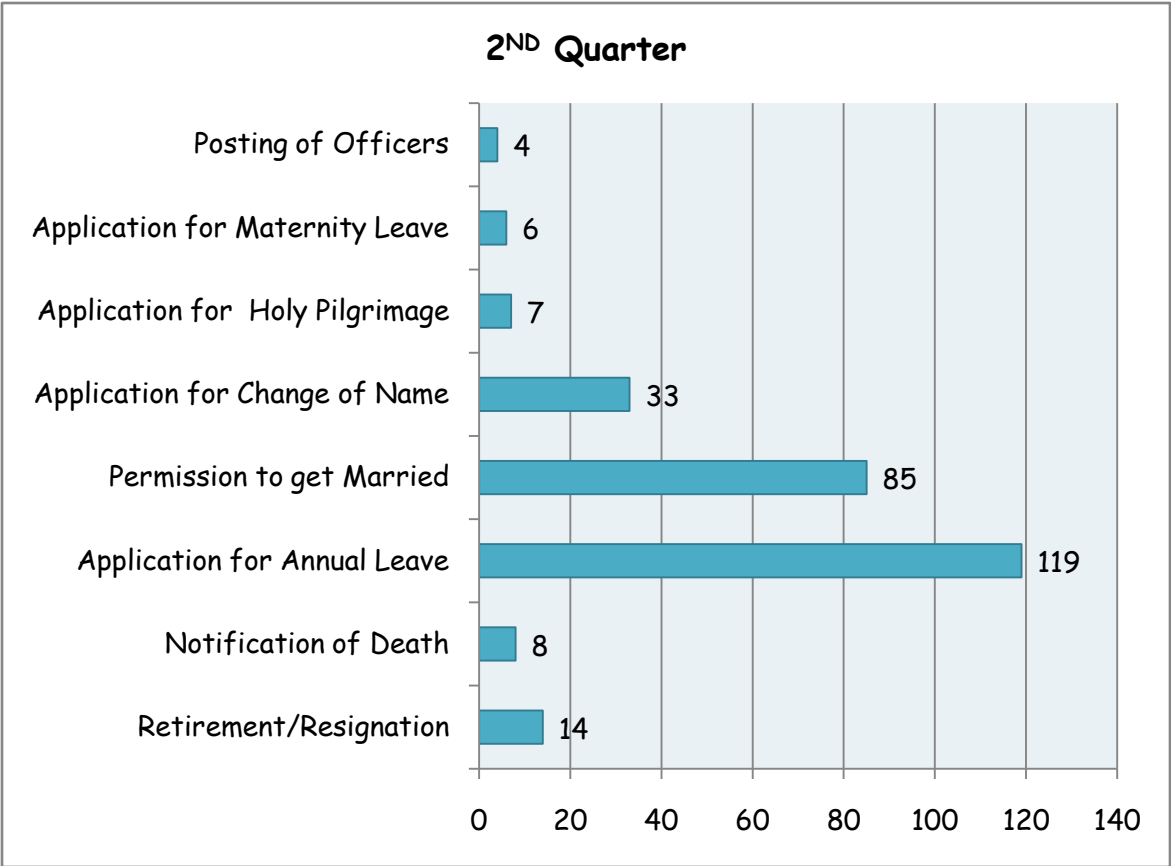

Chart 20: Comparative of Activities Between 1st Quarter and 2nd Quarter

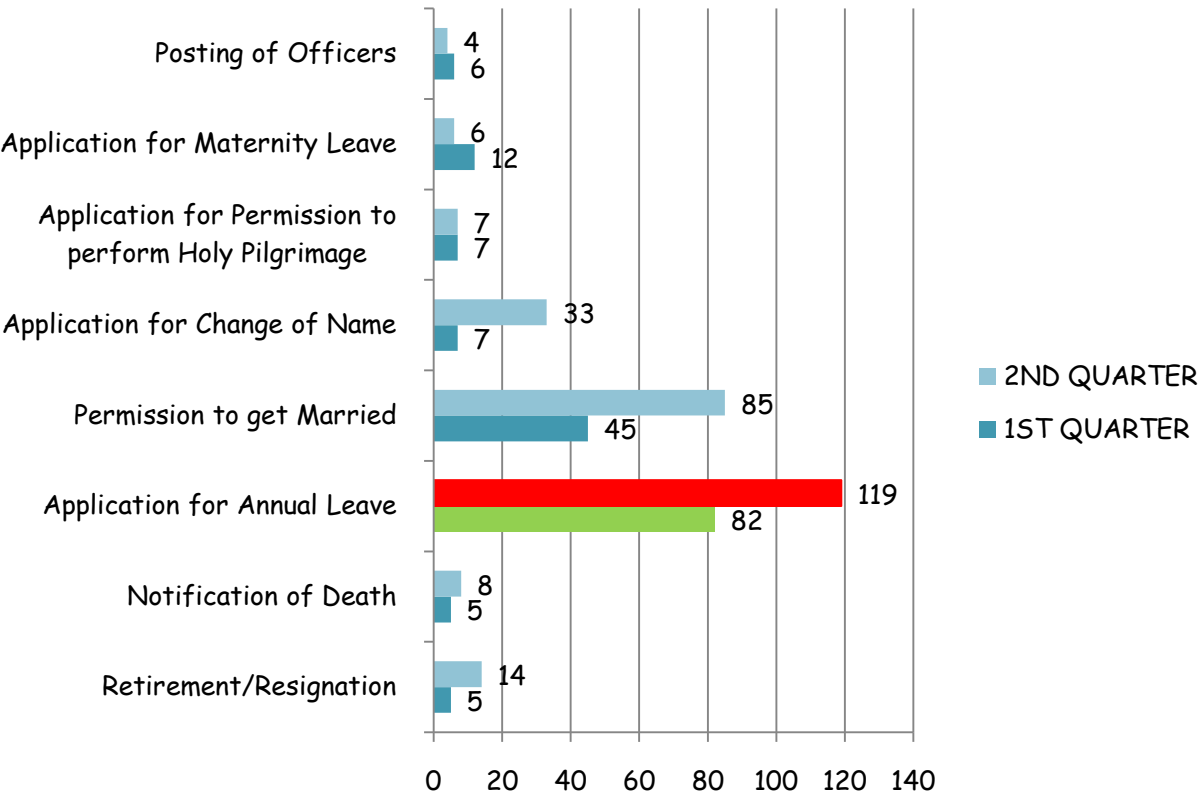

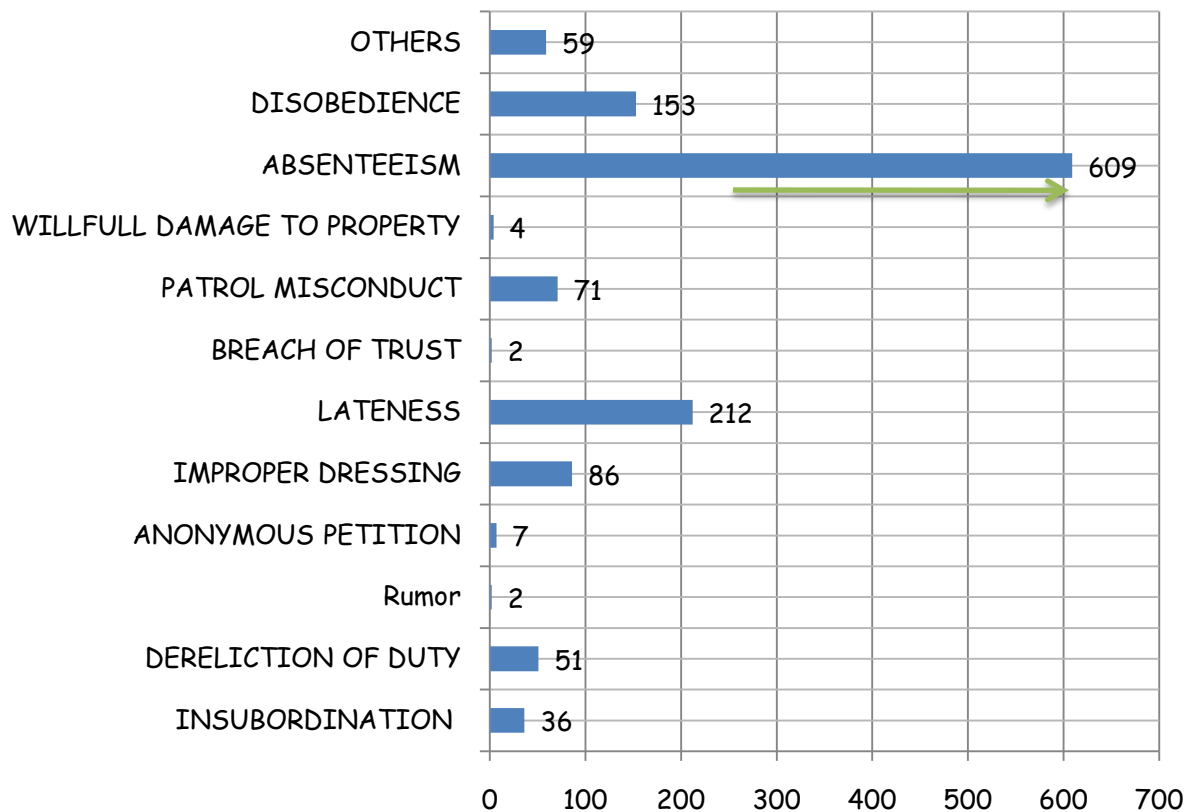

Chart 22: Misconduct

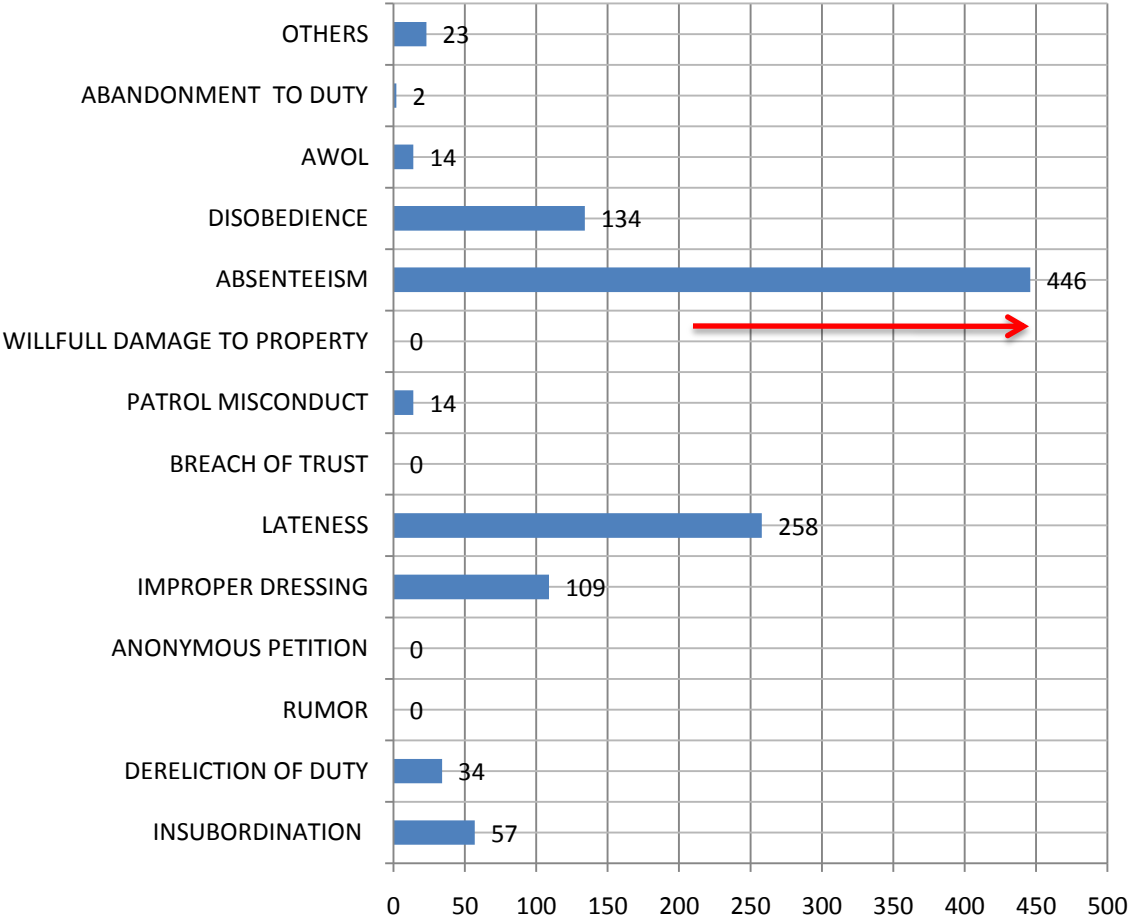

Chart 23: Chart Illustrating Complaints Received

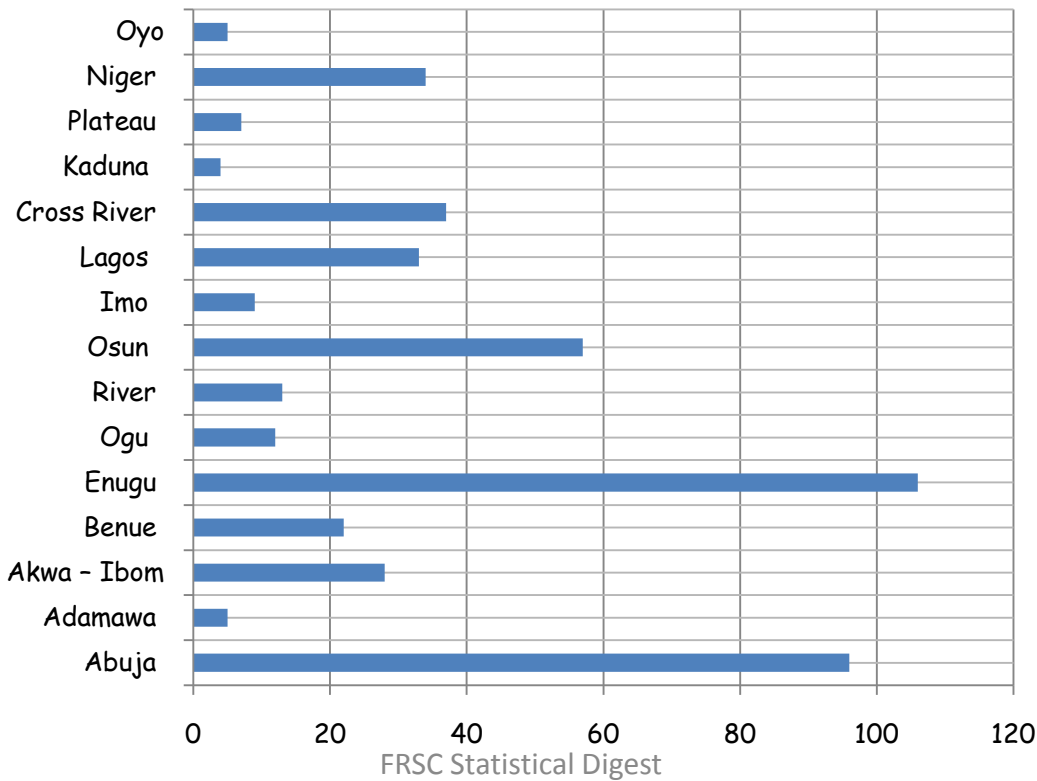

Chart 24: Chart illustrating Comparison Between First and Second Quarter

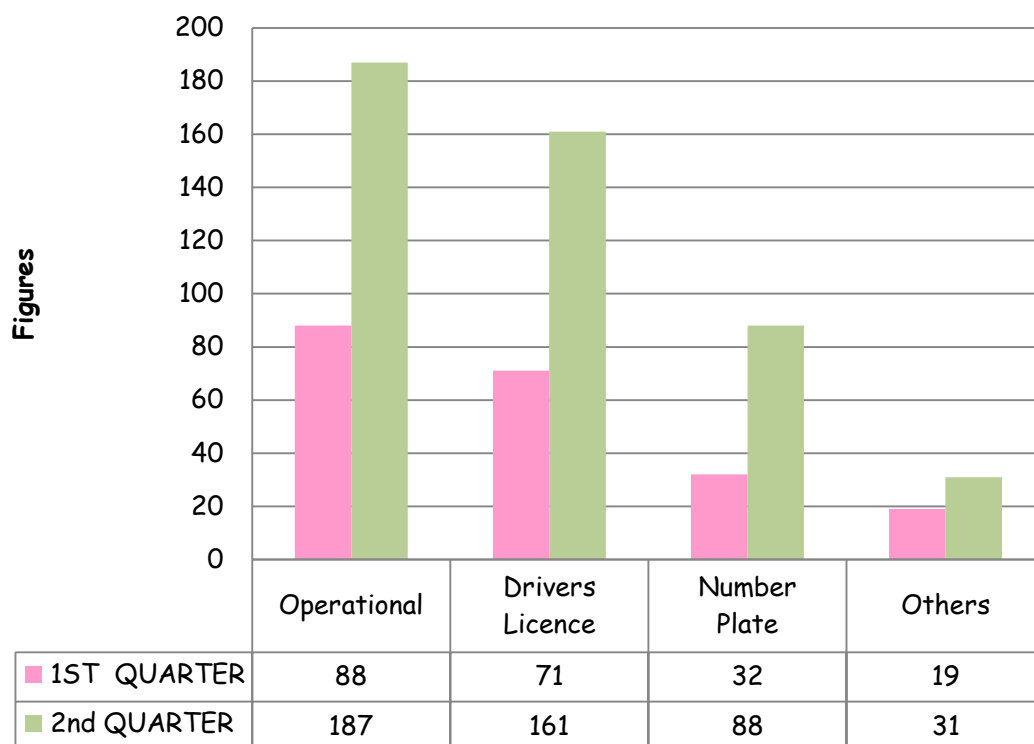

Chart 25: RTC Cases on State Basis

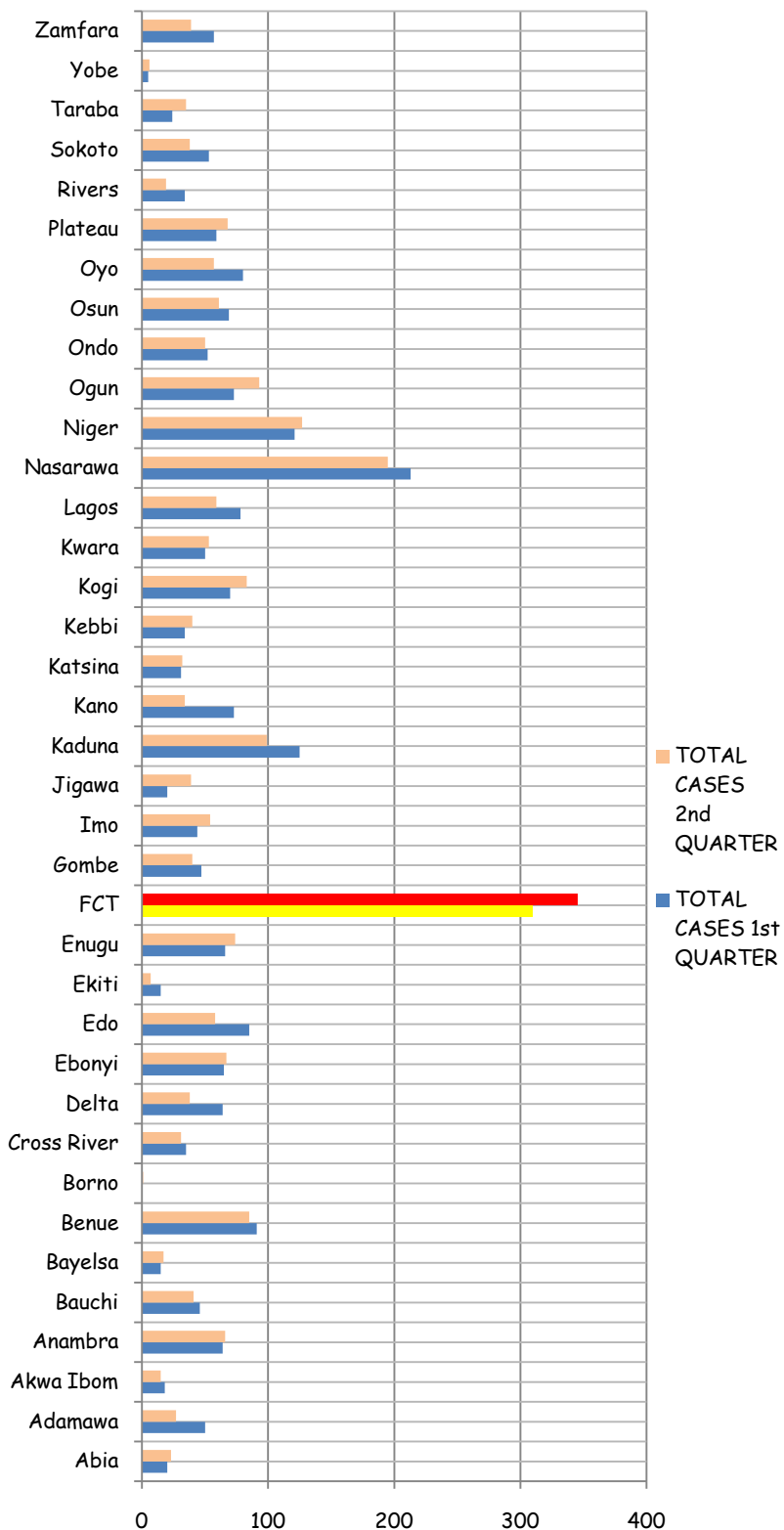

Chart 26: Person Injured on State Basis

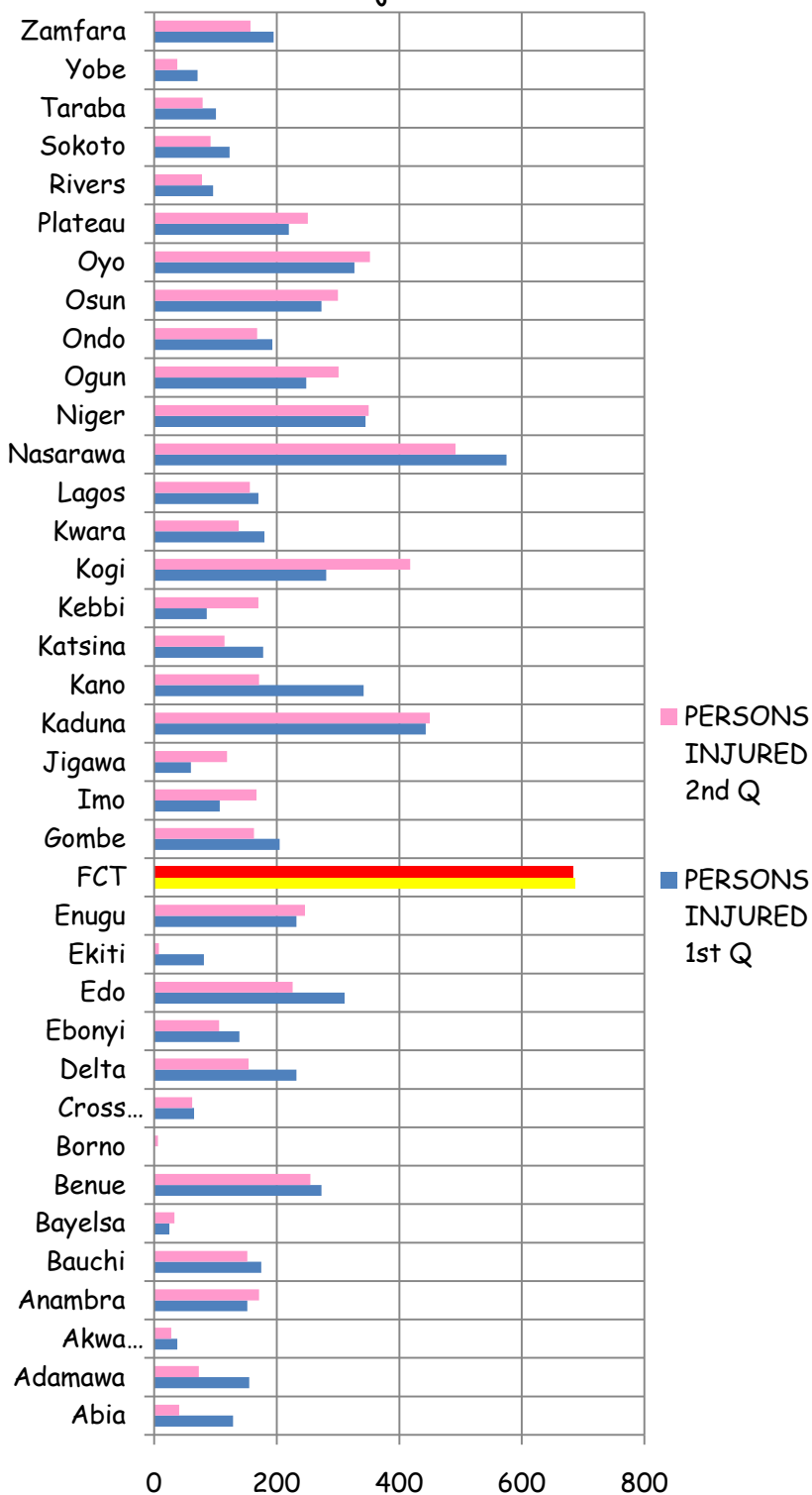

Chart 27: Person Killed on State Basis

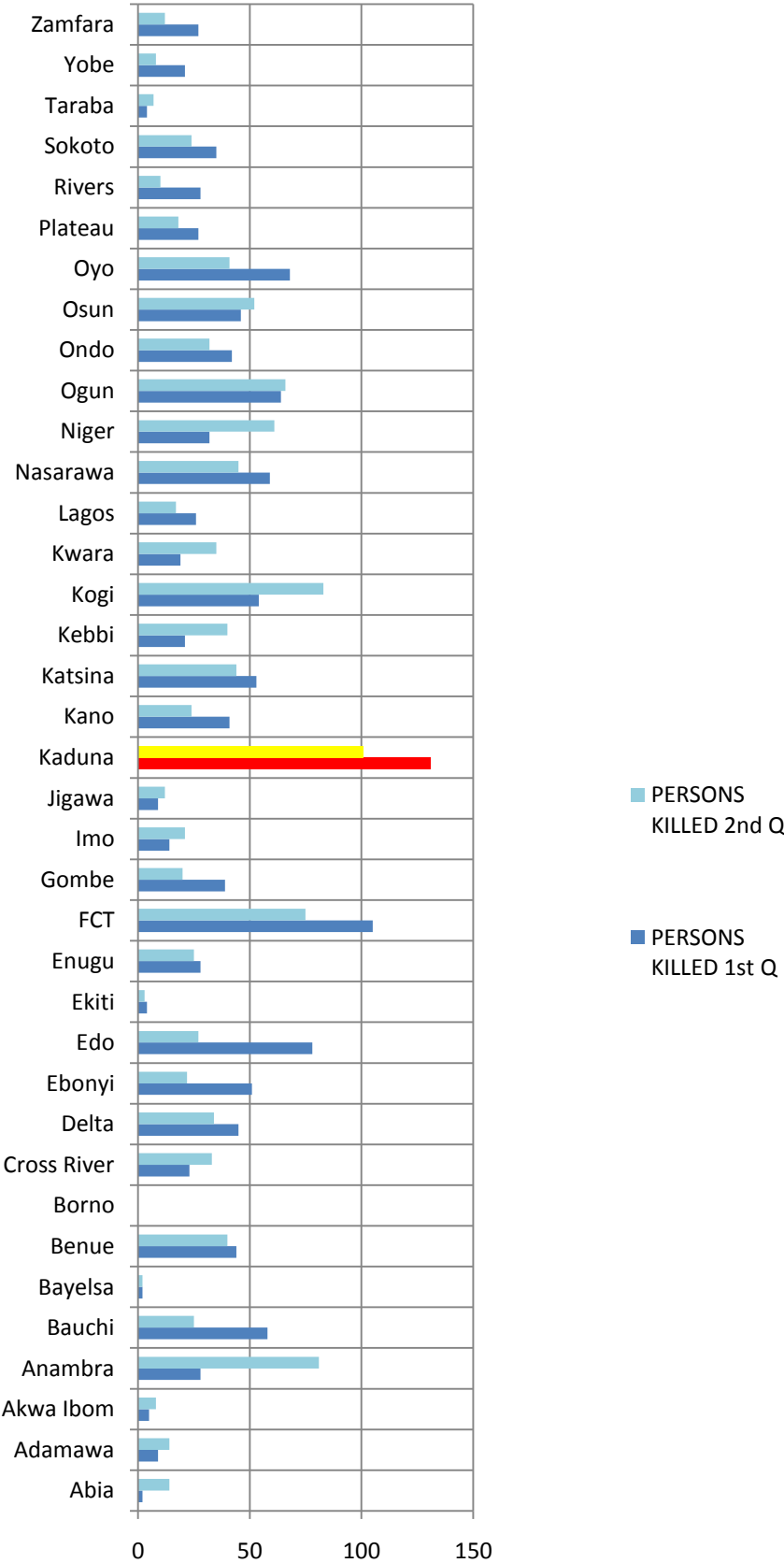

Chart 28: RTC Cases on State Basis

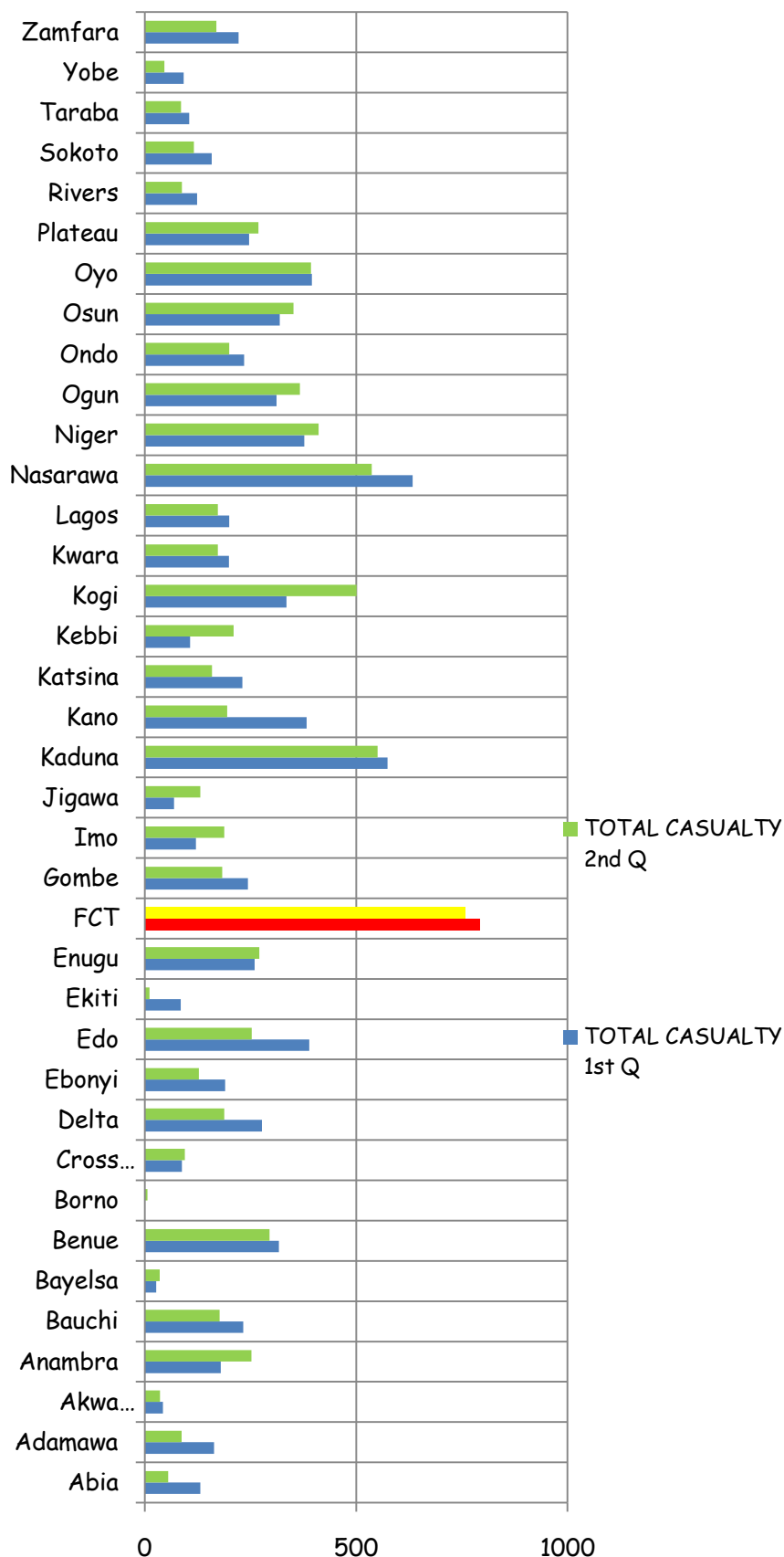
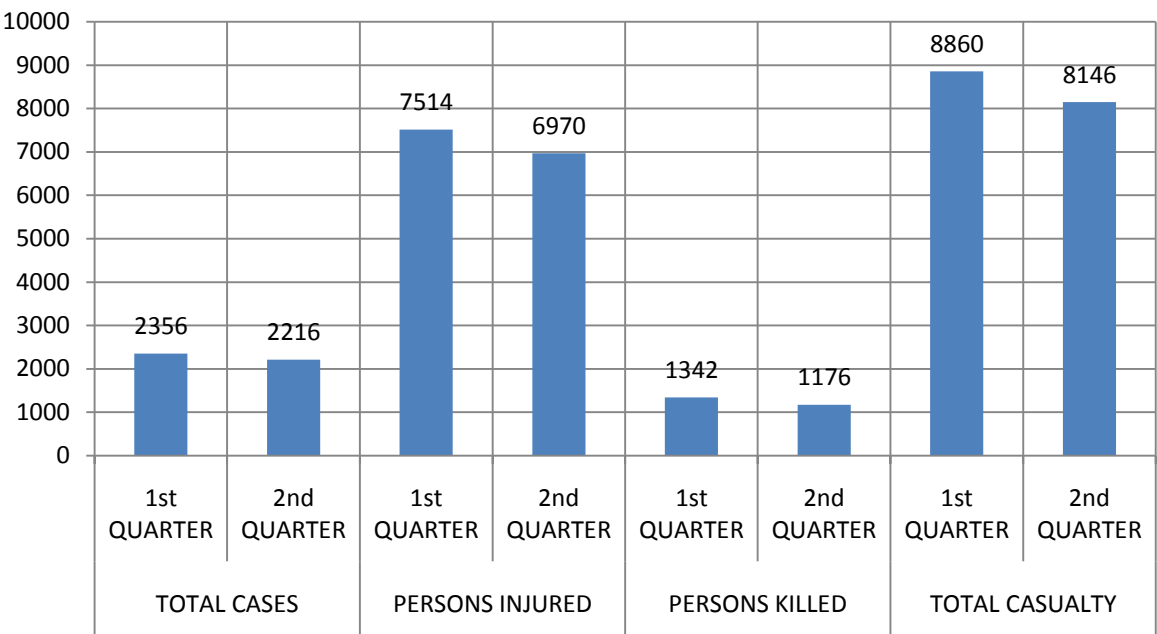

Chart 29: Comparison of RTC for First Quarter and Second Quarter



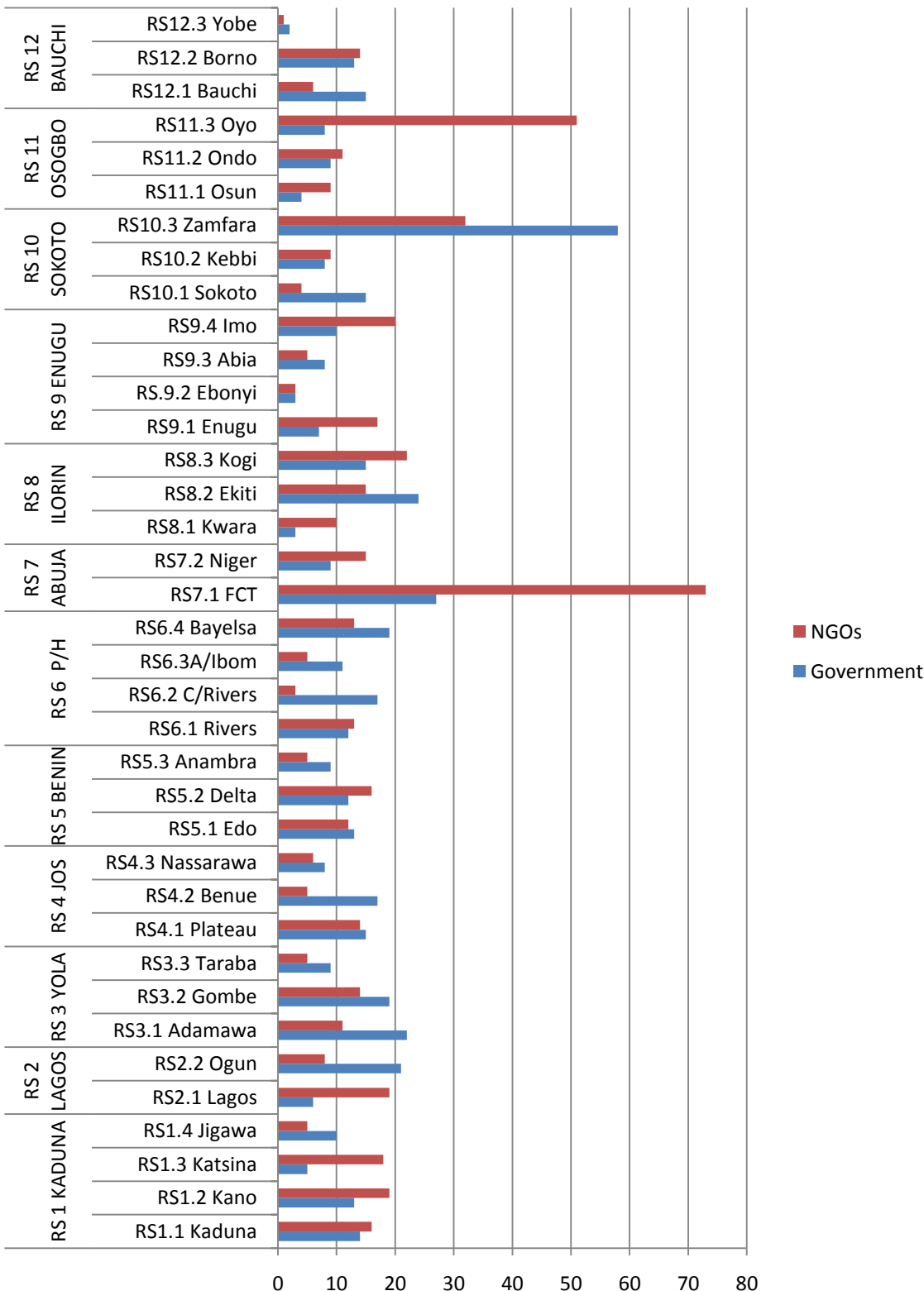

Chart 30: Partnership Analysis of Government Agencies and NGO

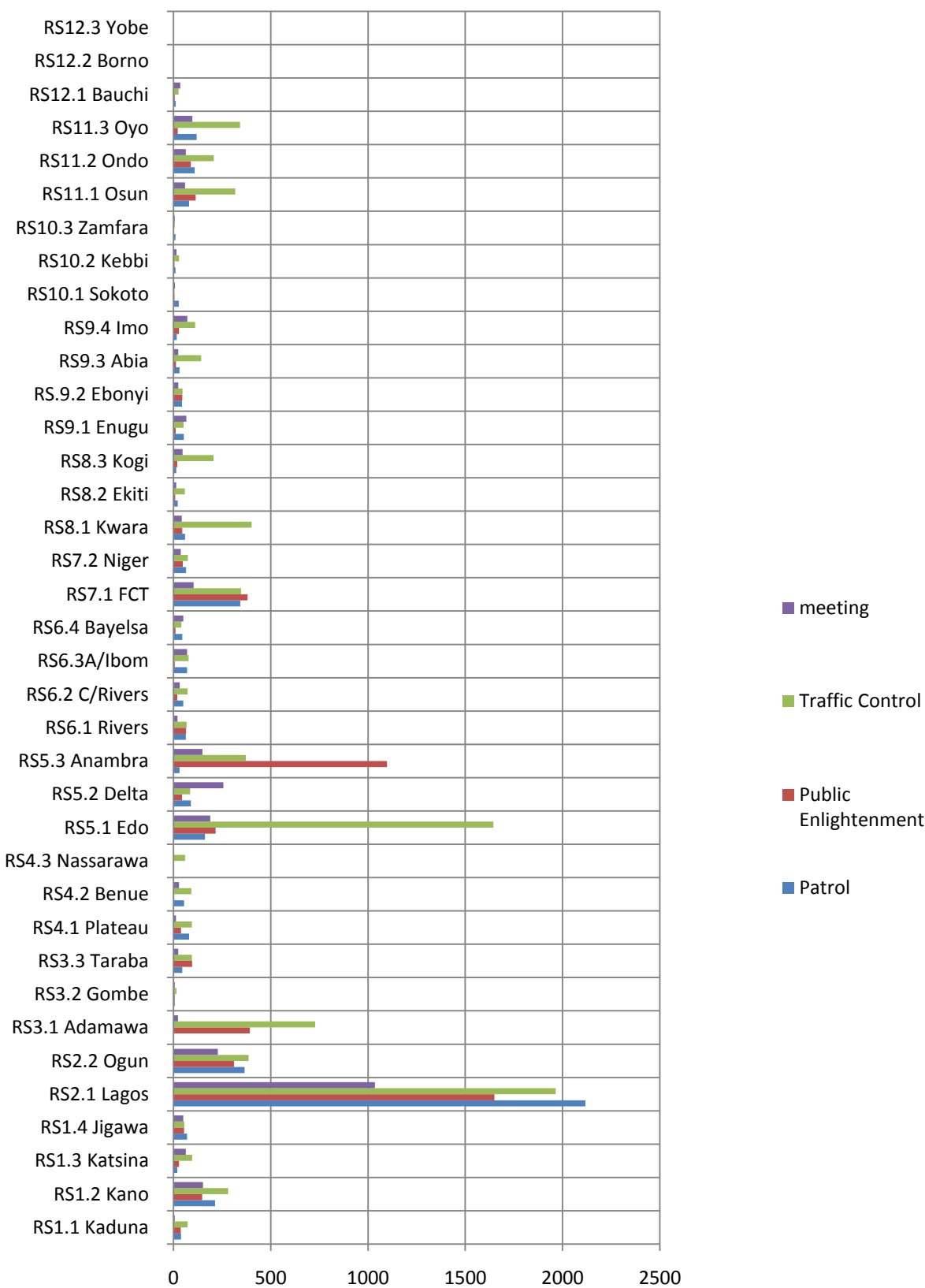

Chart 31: Special Marshals Activities



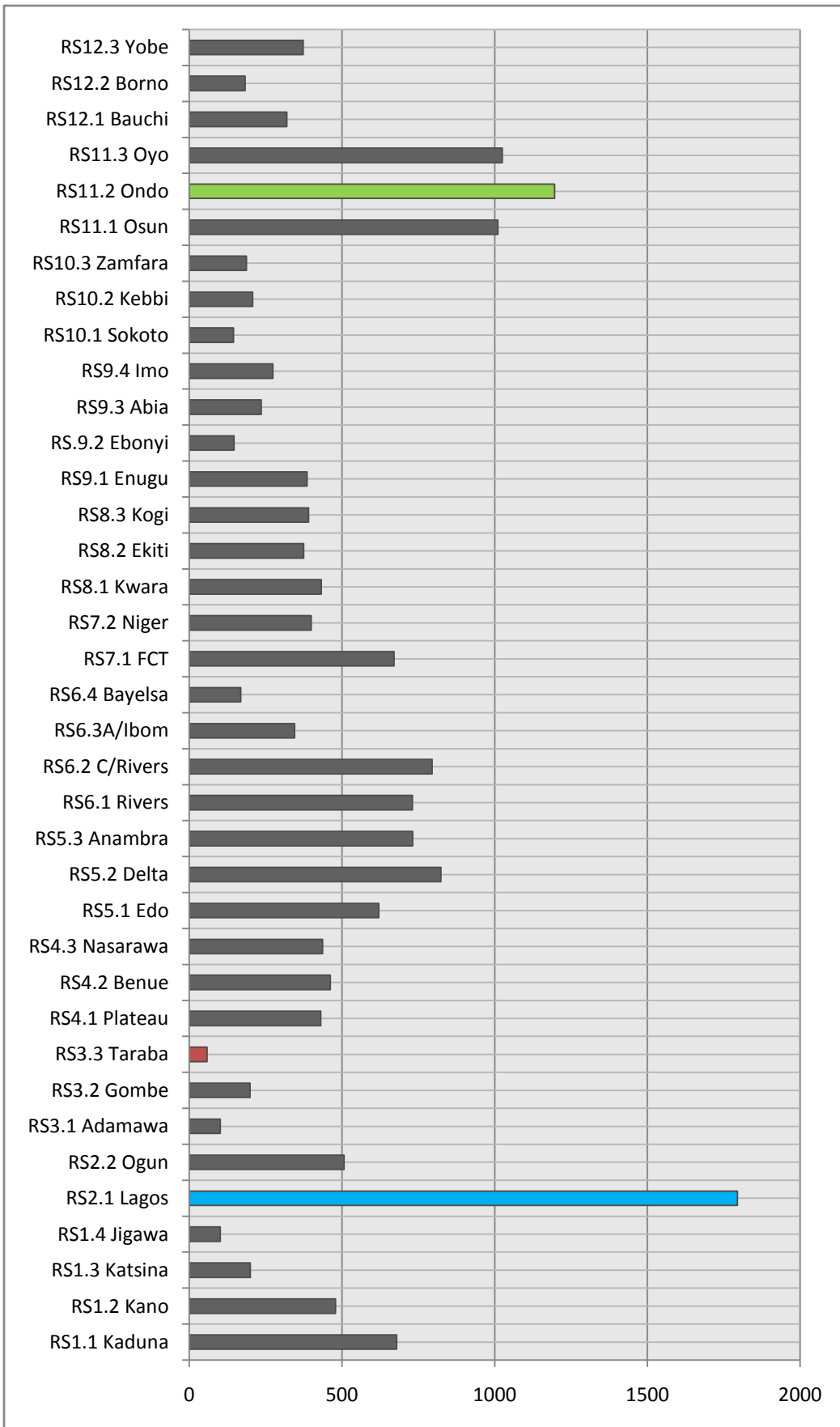
