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THE LEGAL FRAMEWORK OF THE CORPS

The Corps Legal Office in its giant strides to achieving FRSC operational mandate through legal representation, advice, prosecution and the use of Alternative Dispute Resolution Mechanism (ADR) keyed in to the one of the 2015 Corps' goals. The goal was designed to improve legal framework and regulatory capacity of the Corps having found that legal engineering is the hope and universal remedy to reducing road traffic crash in Nigeria. Hence the need to harmonize our laws to ensure proper and effective enforcement and synergy with sister agencies and stakeholder

The Corps in 2015 actualized this goal by embarking on a holistic review/ reform of her enabling laws in collaboration with relevant Agencies and stakeholder which include Federal Ministry of Justice, National Assembly, Ministry of Works, Power and Housing, Nigerian Law Reform Commission, etc. These laws include the Federal Road Safety Commission (Establishment) Act, 2007 and National Road Traffic Regulations, 2012.

Apart from the review of our legal instruments, the Corps had in the last quarter of 2015, intensified enforcement of traffic laws. Mobile Court held Corps-wide except the few States that were under serious scourge of insecurity. The Mobile Court was established in collaboration with the Chief Judges of the 36 States and the FCT for speedy dispensation of traffic related offenses. Over 24,570 traffic offenders were arrested and prosecuted at the Mobile Courts and Magistrate Courts in the last quarter of 2015 and over 19, 340 were convicted for various traffic offences.

On industrial related disputes between FRSC and ex-staff that claimed that their appointments were unlawfully determined, some of the cases had been dispensed with while some are pending at the regular courts. We make bold to say that in the quarter under review, ten (10) cases were won while one (1) was lost.



Editor's Suite Con'd...

The Corps embarked on free monthly drivers' training nationwide to educate drivers, and other members of the public on FRSC extant Laws and Regulations, the proper use of the highway, traffic signs and lane discipline. During training, the Lawyers in field Commands in collaboration with Training Standard and Certification Department worked assiduously to enlighten the drivers on the need to adhere strictly to traffic laws and regulations. This effort assisted in minimizing the number of RTCs recorded during the last quarter of 2015 and Operation Zero Tolerance.

The Corps equally carried out other operational activities aimed at reducing crashes. These activities include Operation Scorpion, Safe to Load and Operation Eagle Eye.

In view of the above, we urge you to relax and assimilate the contents of this publication as it simply showcased quarterly activities of FRSC at a glance.

Chart 1: Chart Illustrating War on Overloading

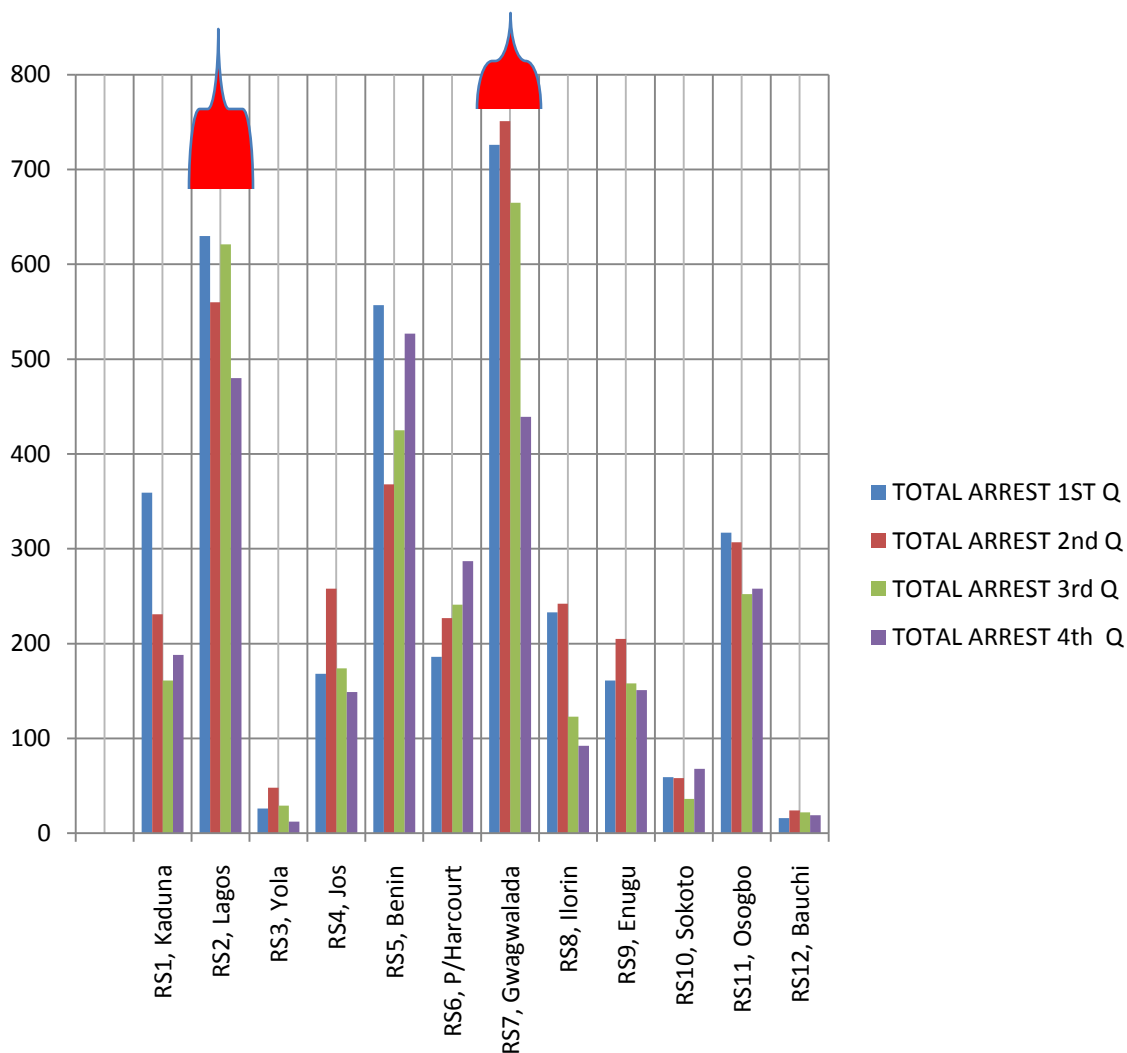

Chart 2: Chart Illustrating Offences

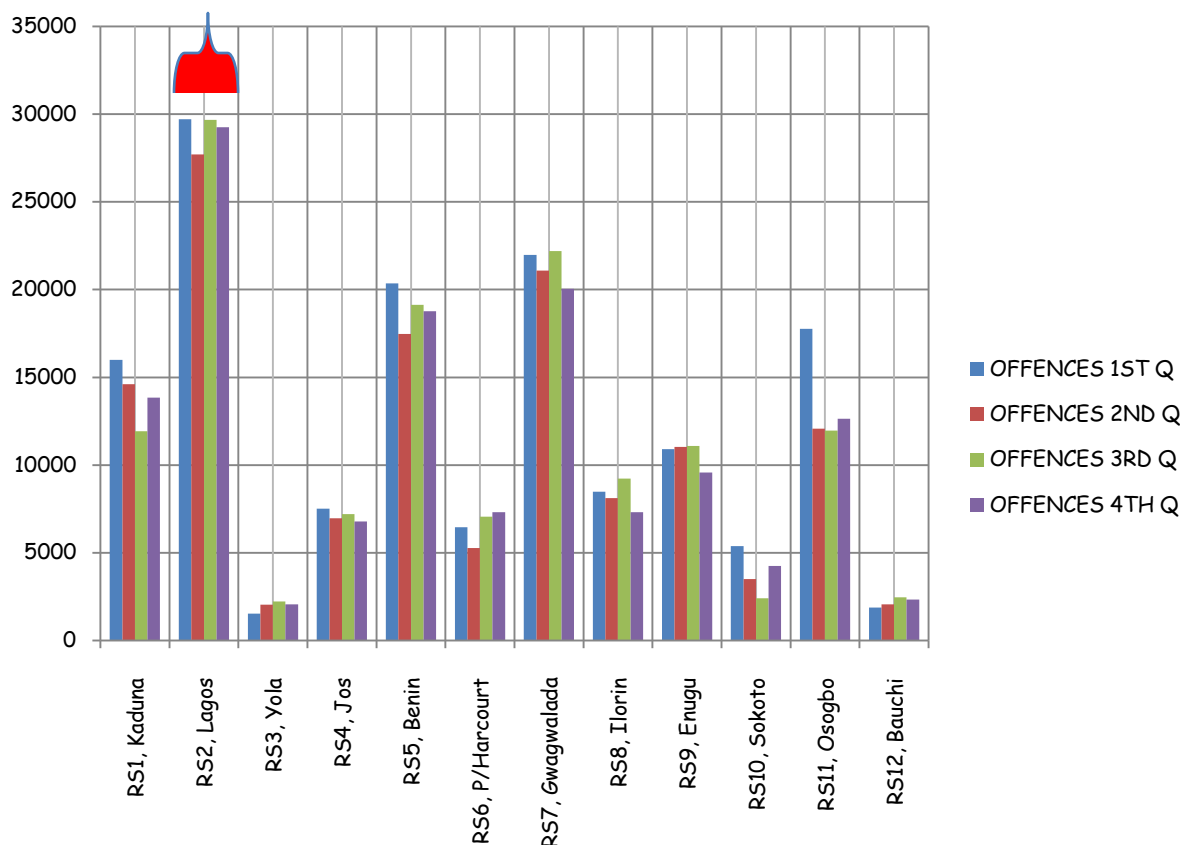
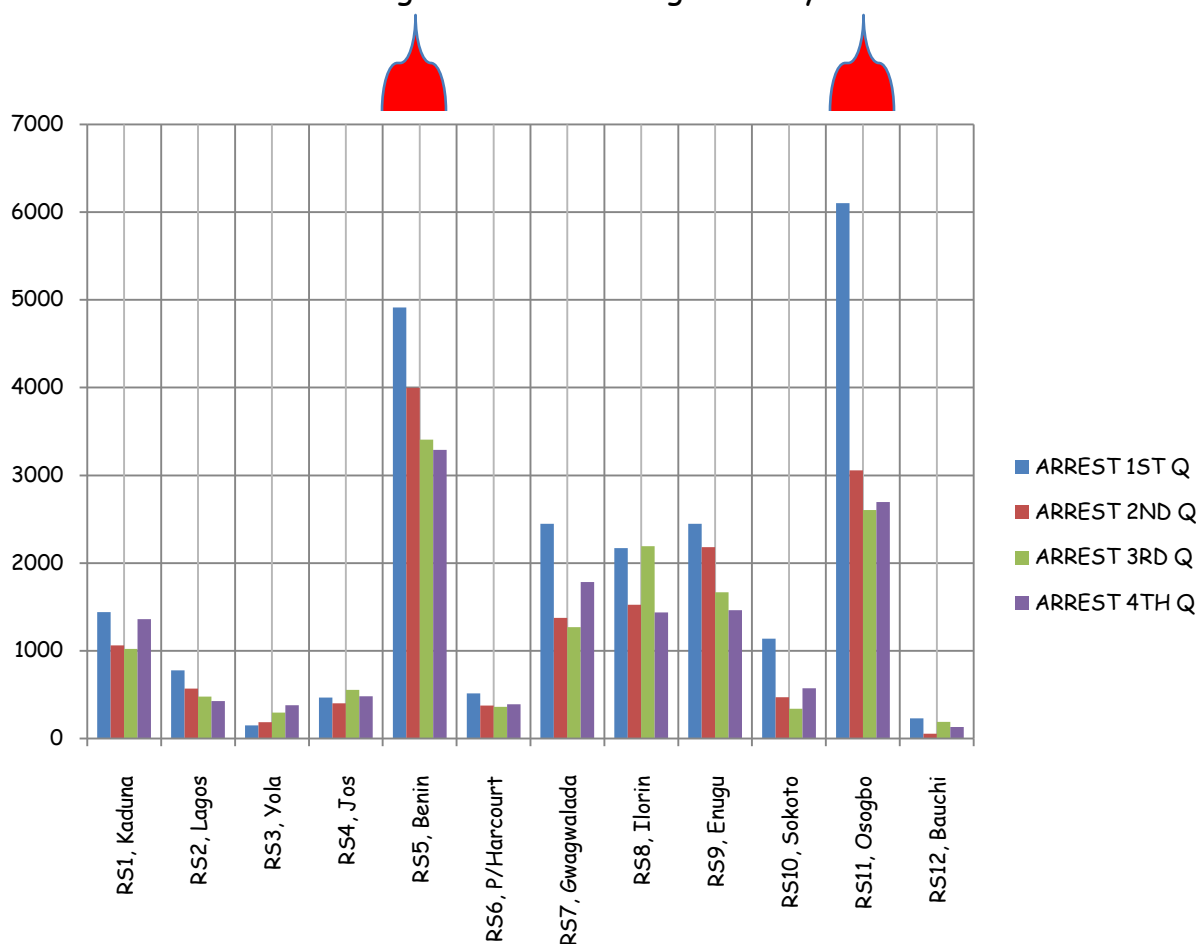

Chart 4: General Admin Activities

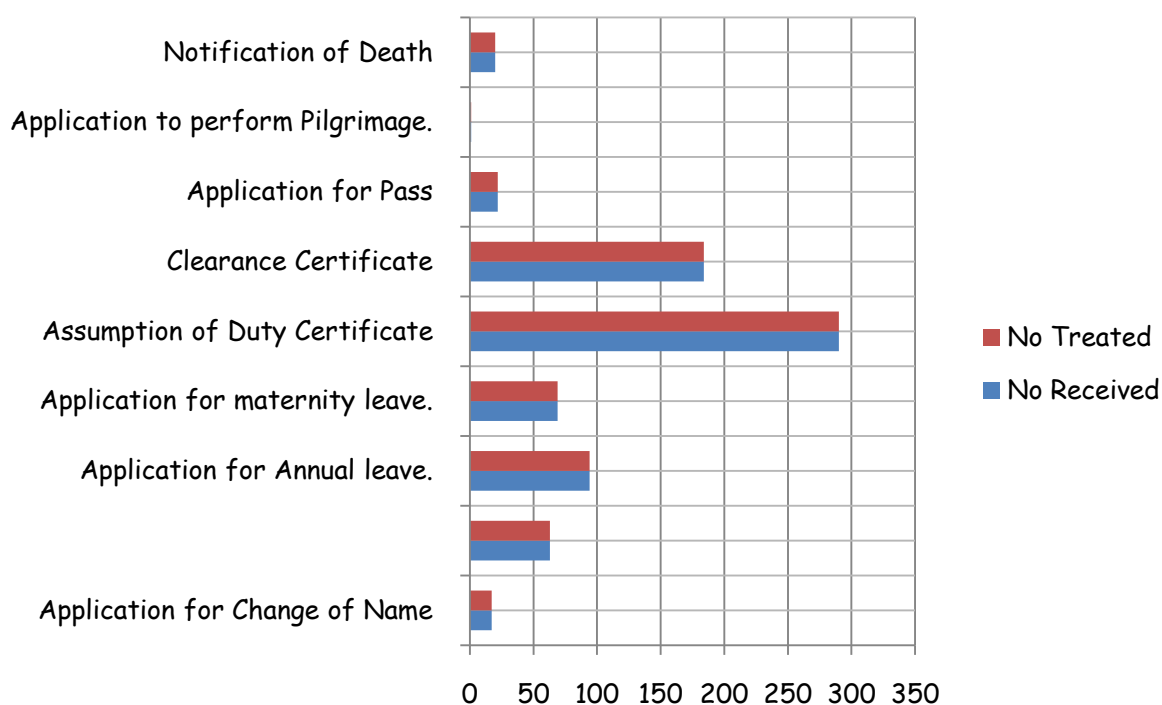

Chart 5: Chart Illustrating Disciplinary Cases Treated

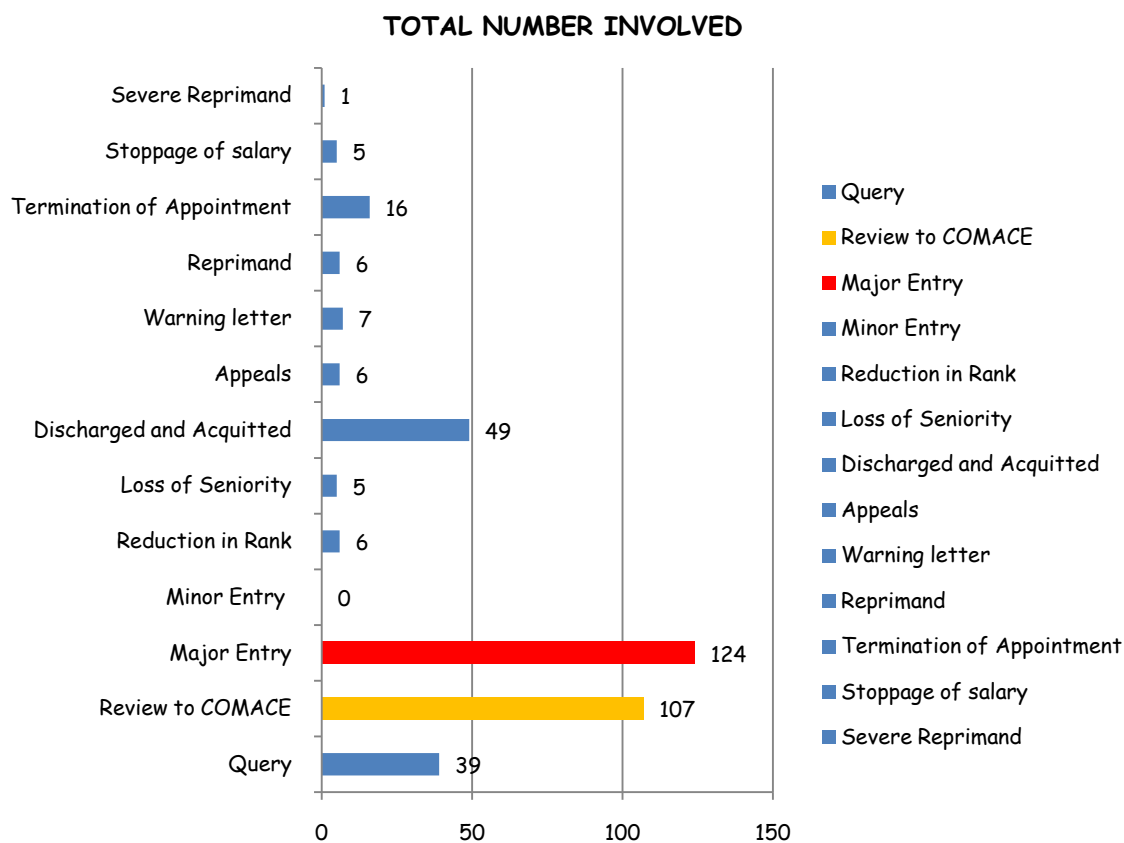

Chart 6: First, Second and Third Quarter Comparison

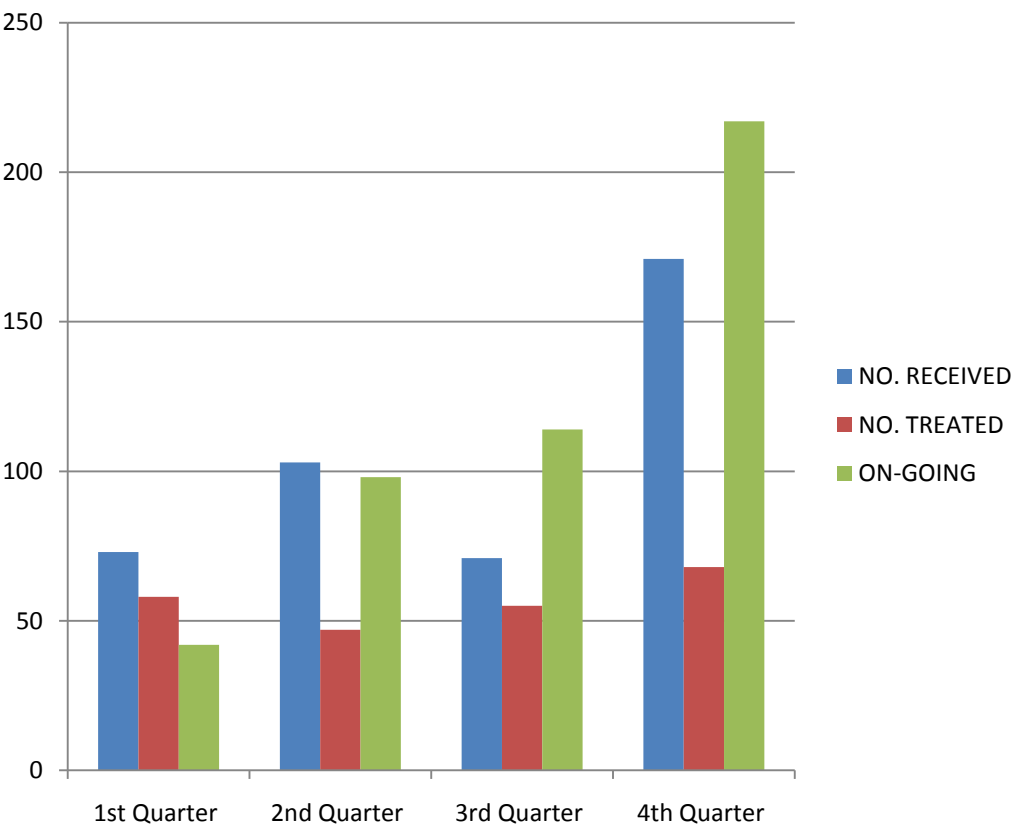

Chart 7: First, Second, Third and Fourth Quarter Comparison

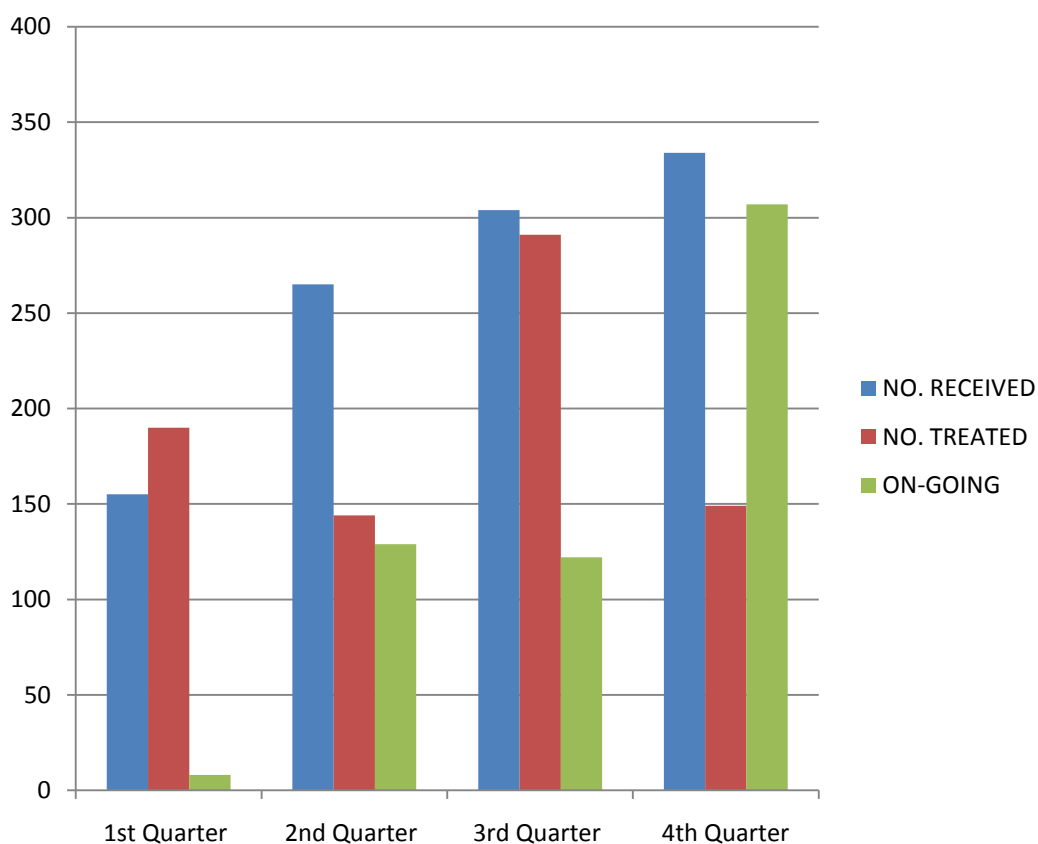

Chart 8: First, Second, Third and Fourth Quarter Comparison

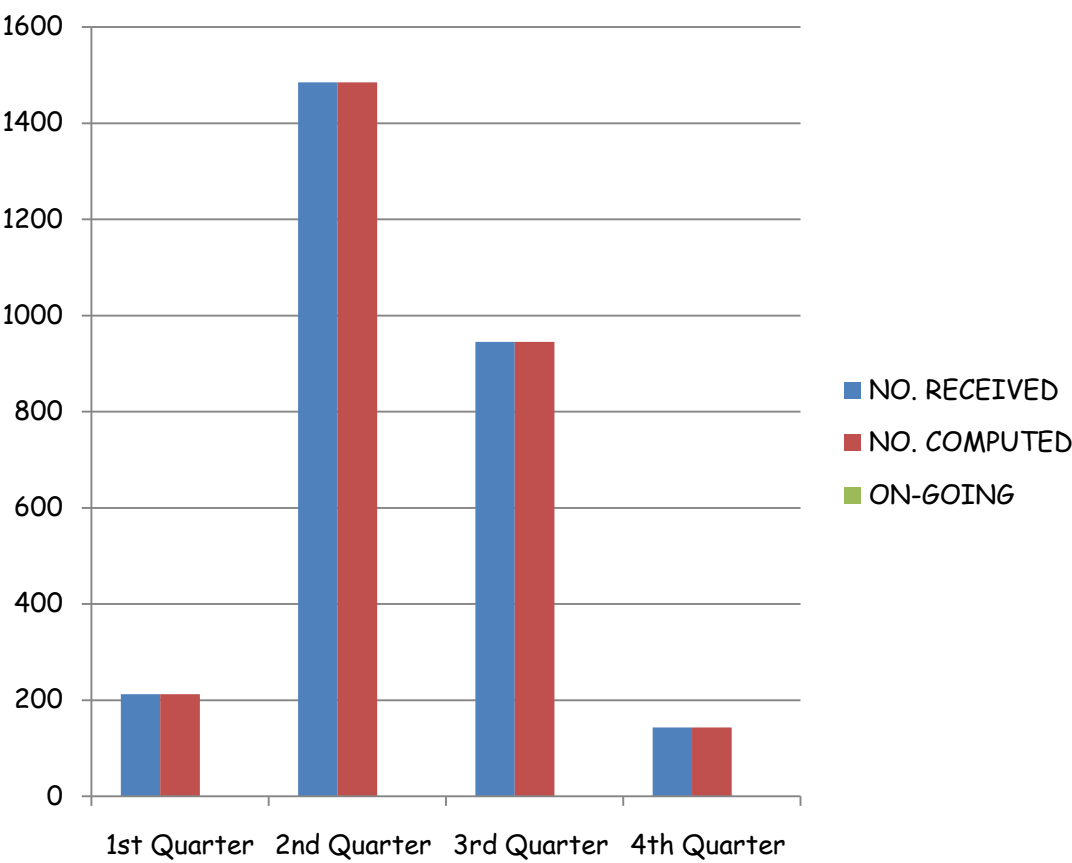
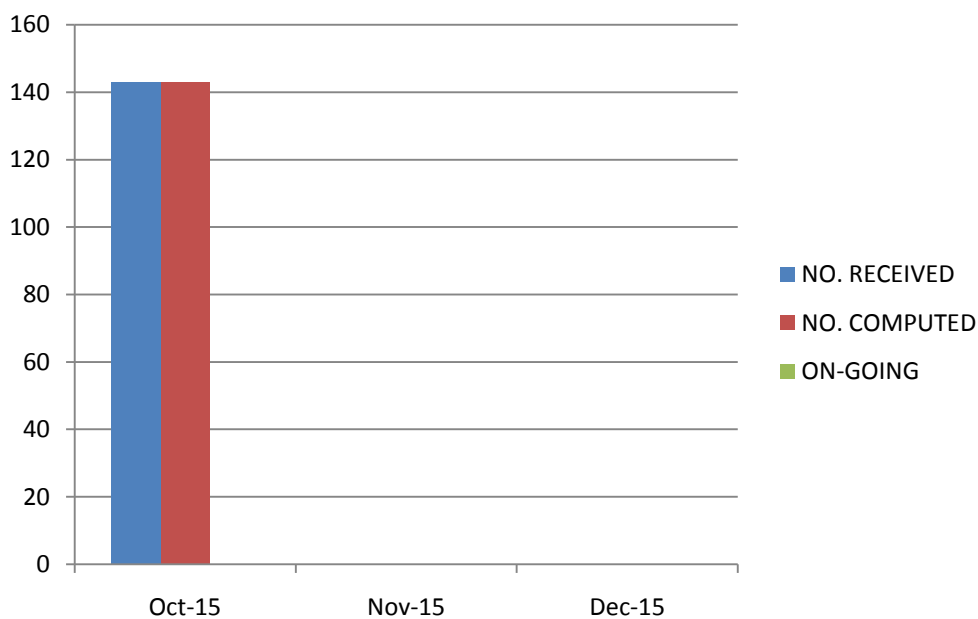

Chart 12: National Driver License production

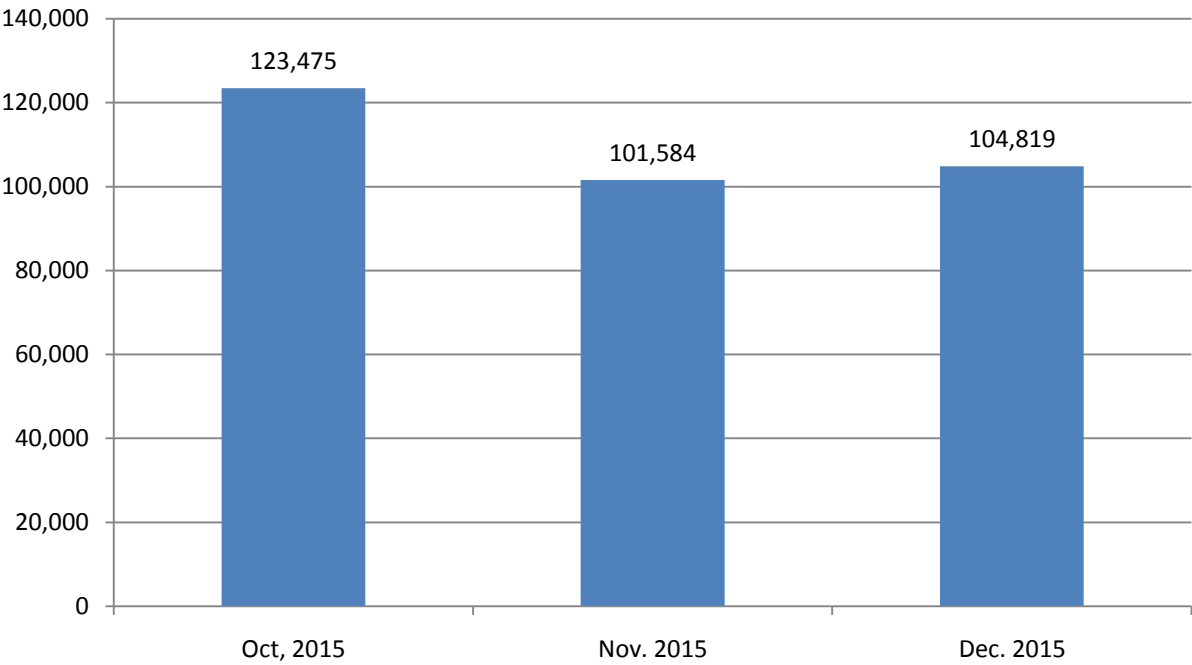


Chart 13: Showing Total Number Of NDL Production Within 4th Quarter

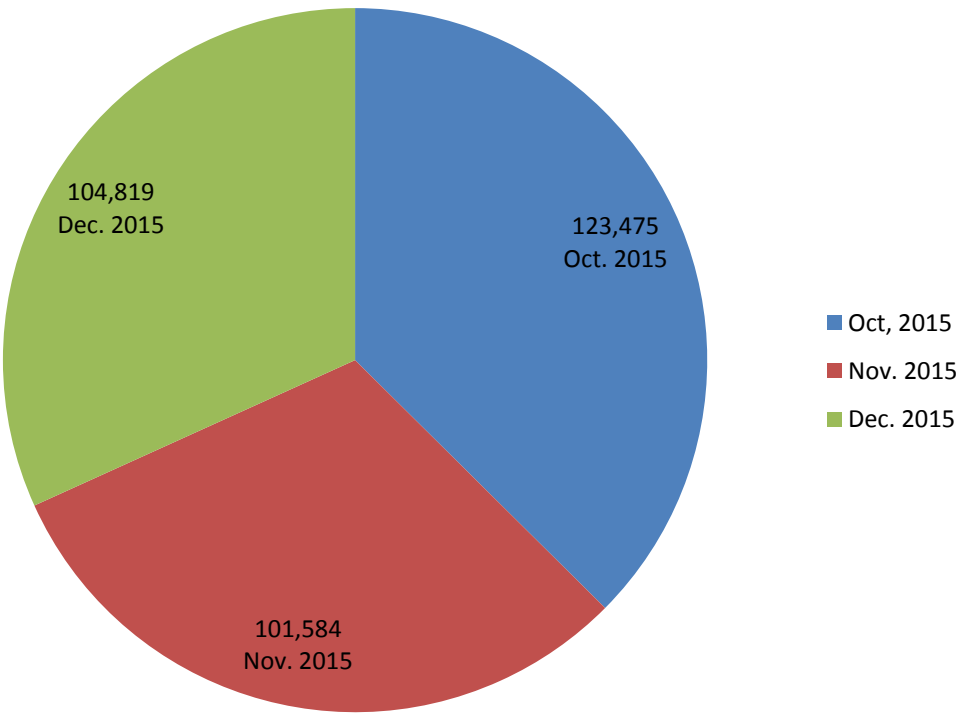

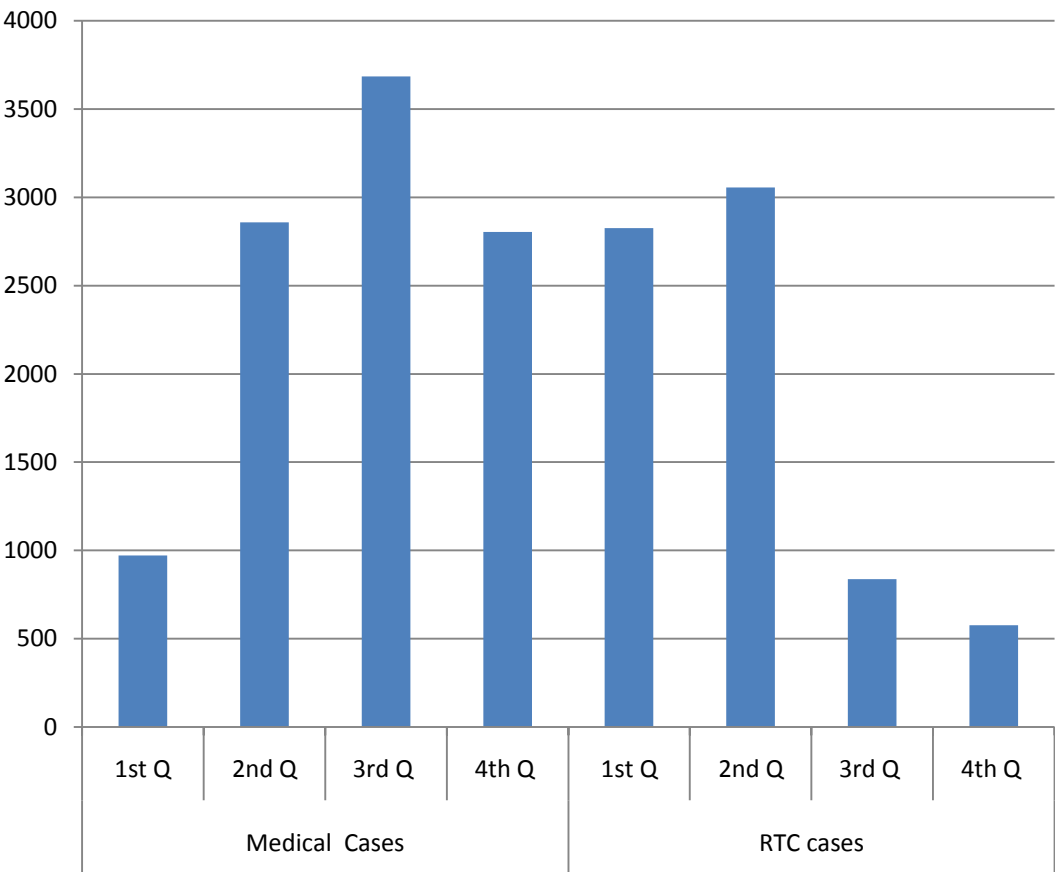

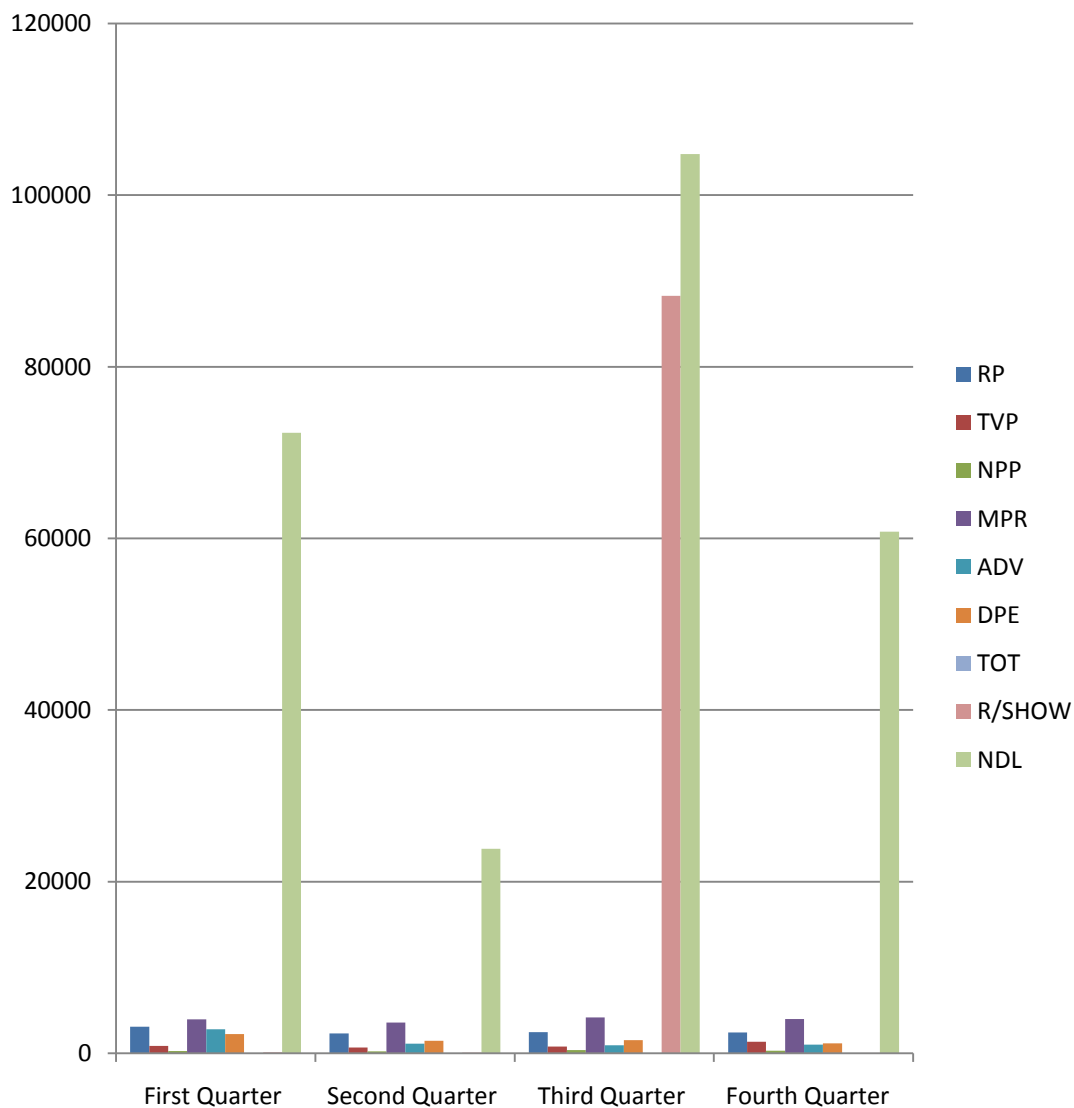

Chart 16: Chart Illustrating RTC Involving Fleet Operators

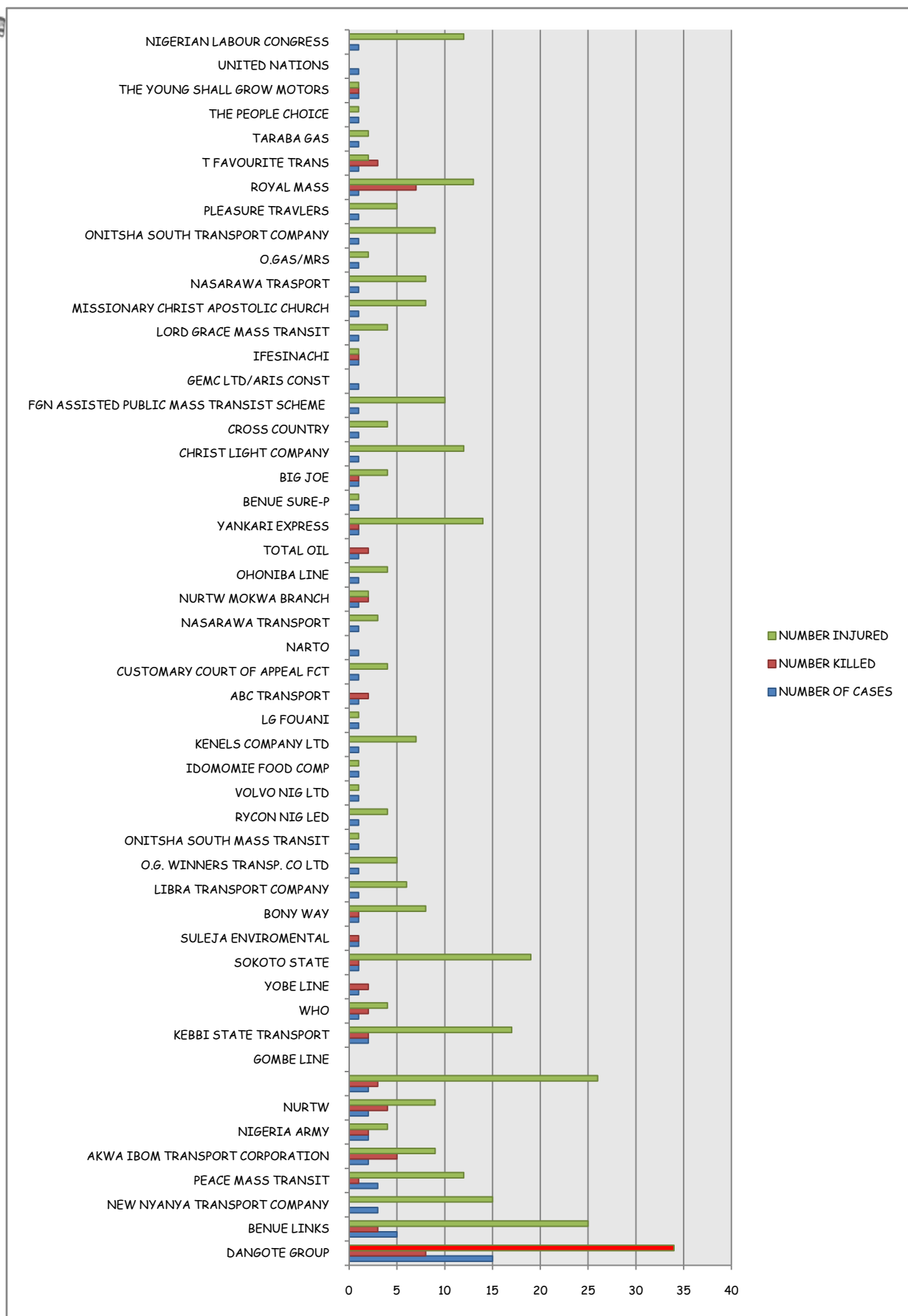

Chart 17 : Corps Secretary Activities

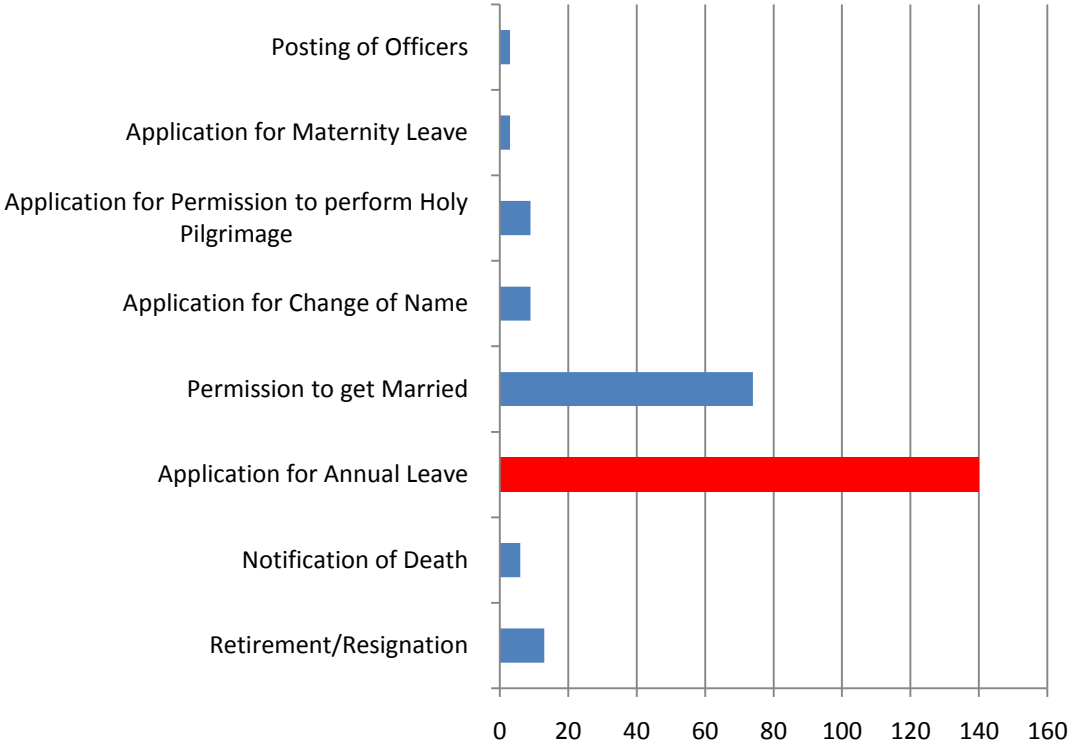

Chart 18: Comparison of Activities Between 1st Quarter, 2nd Quarter, 3rd Quarter and 4th Quarter

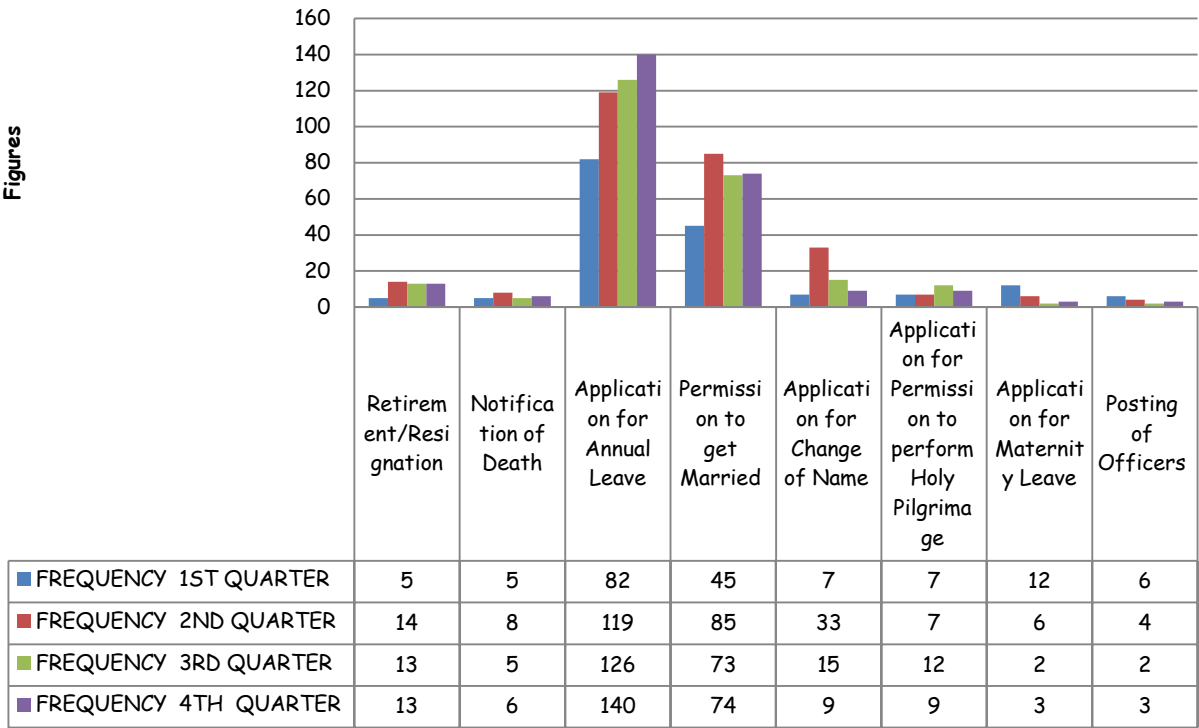

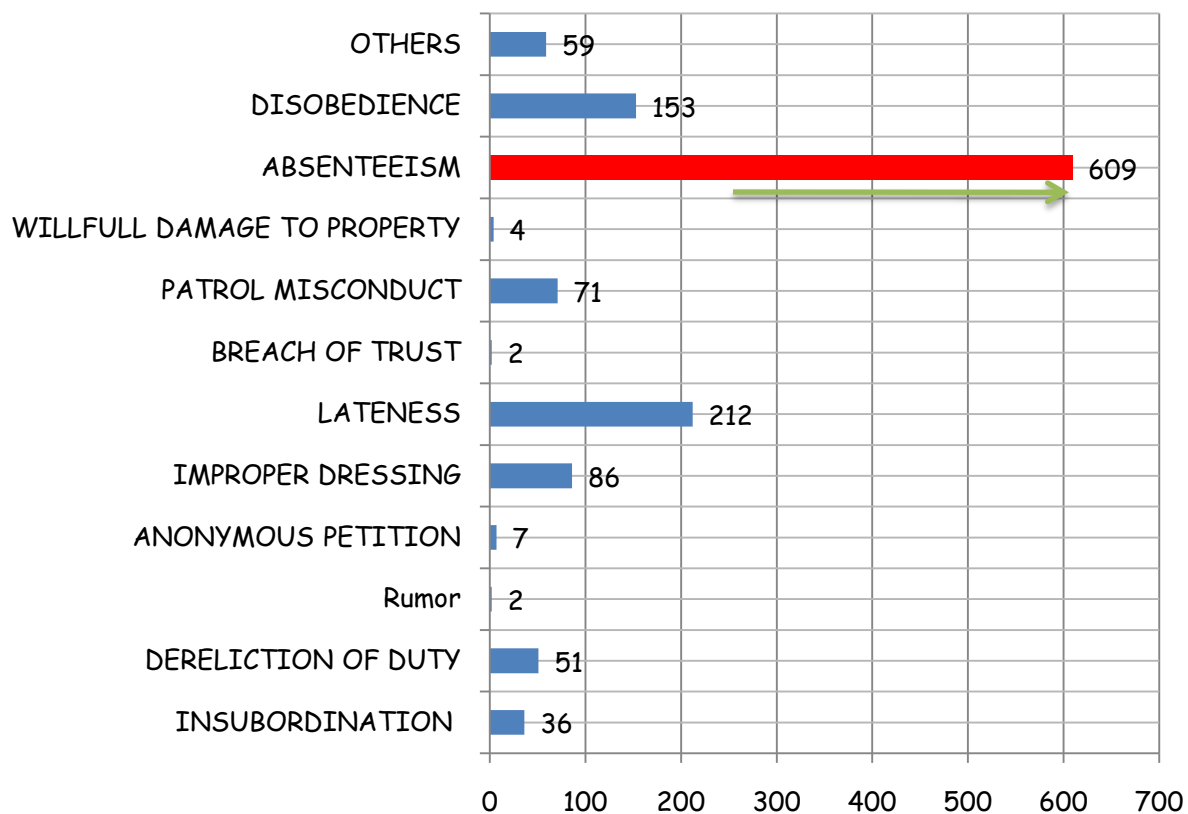

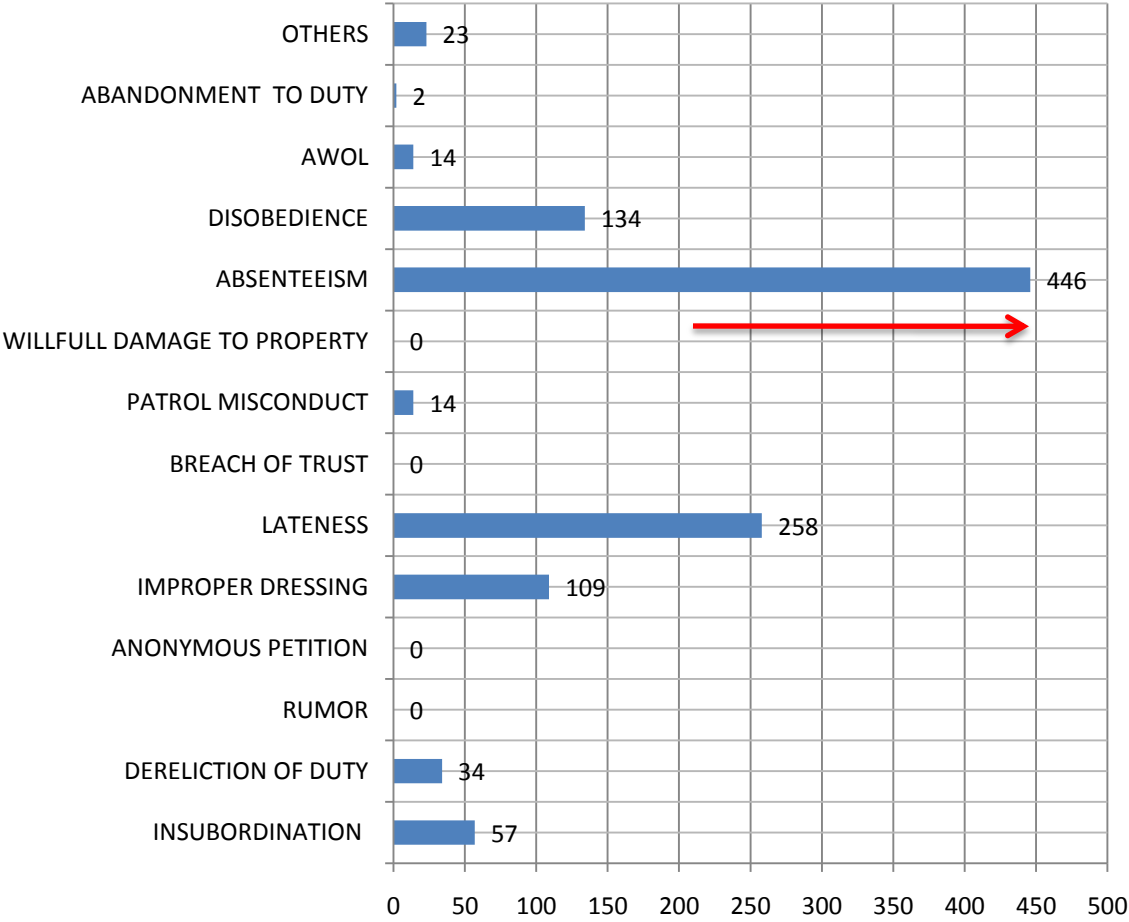

Chart 21: Misconduct

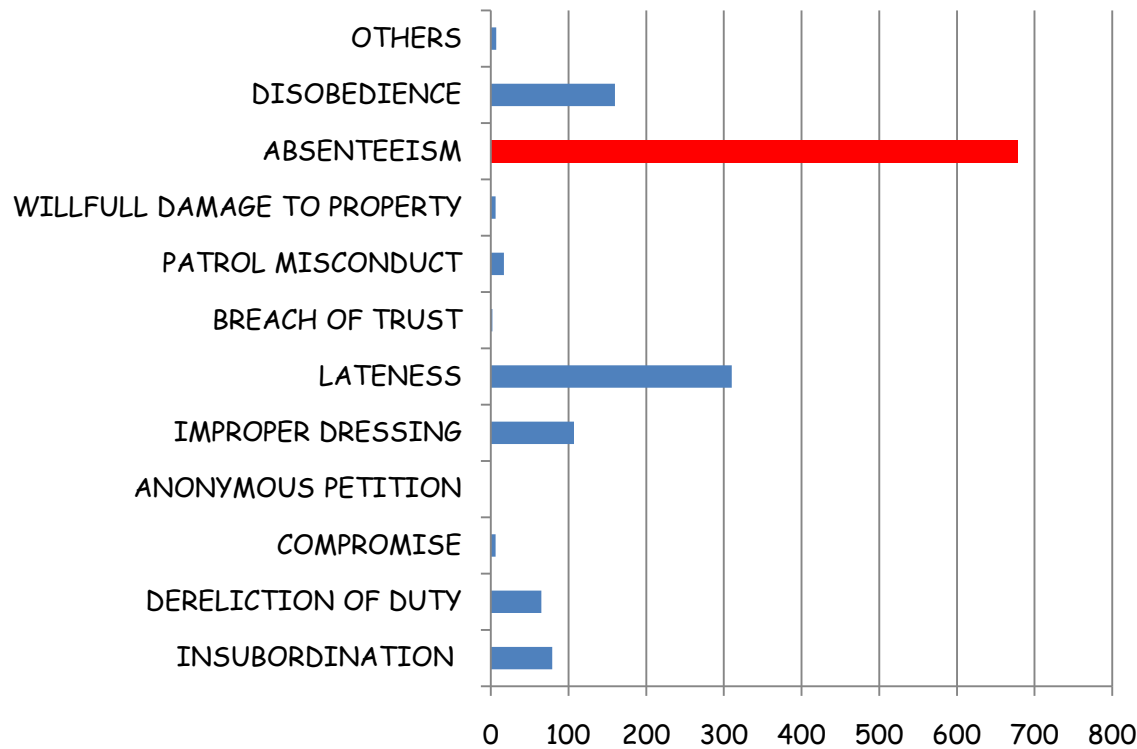

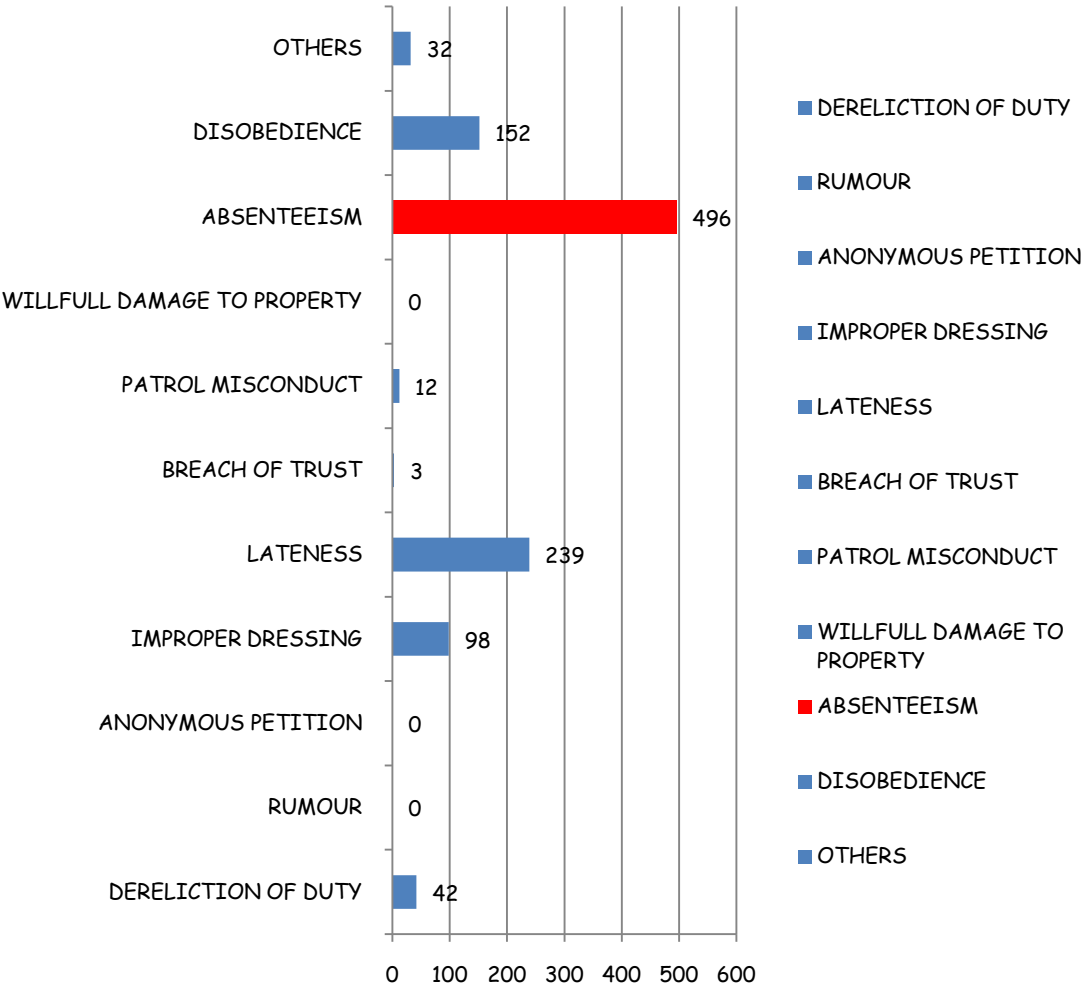

Chart 23: Chart illustrating Comparison of Complaint Between First, Second, Third and Fourth Quarter

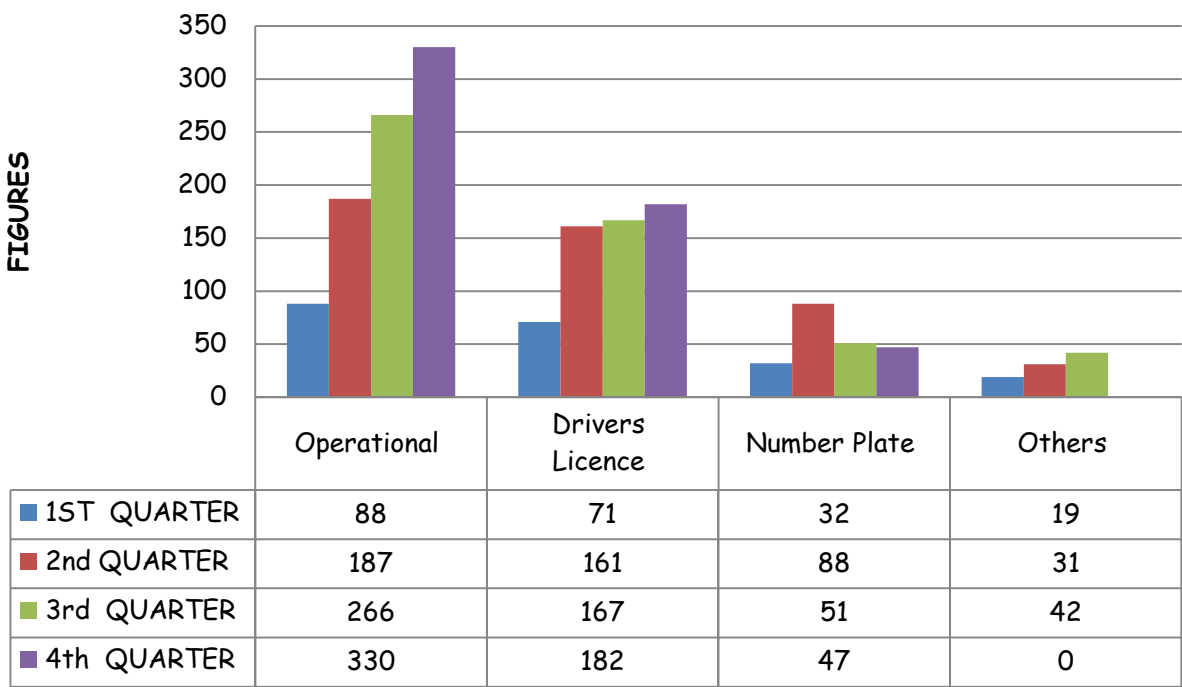

Chart 24: RTC Cases on State Basis

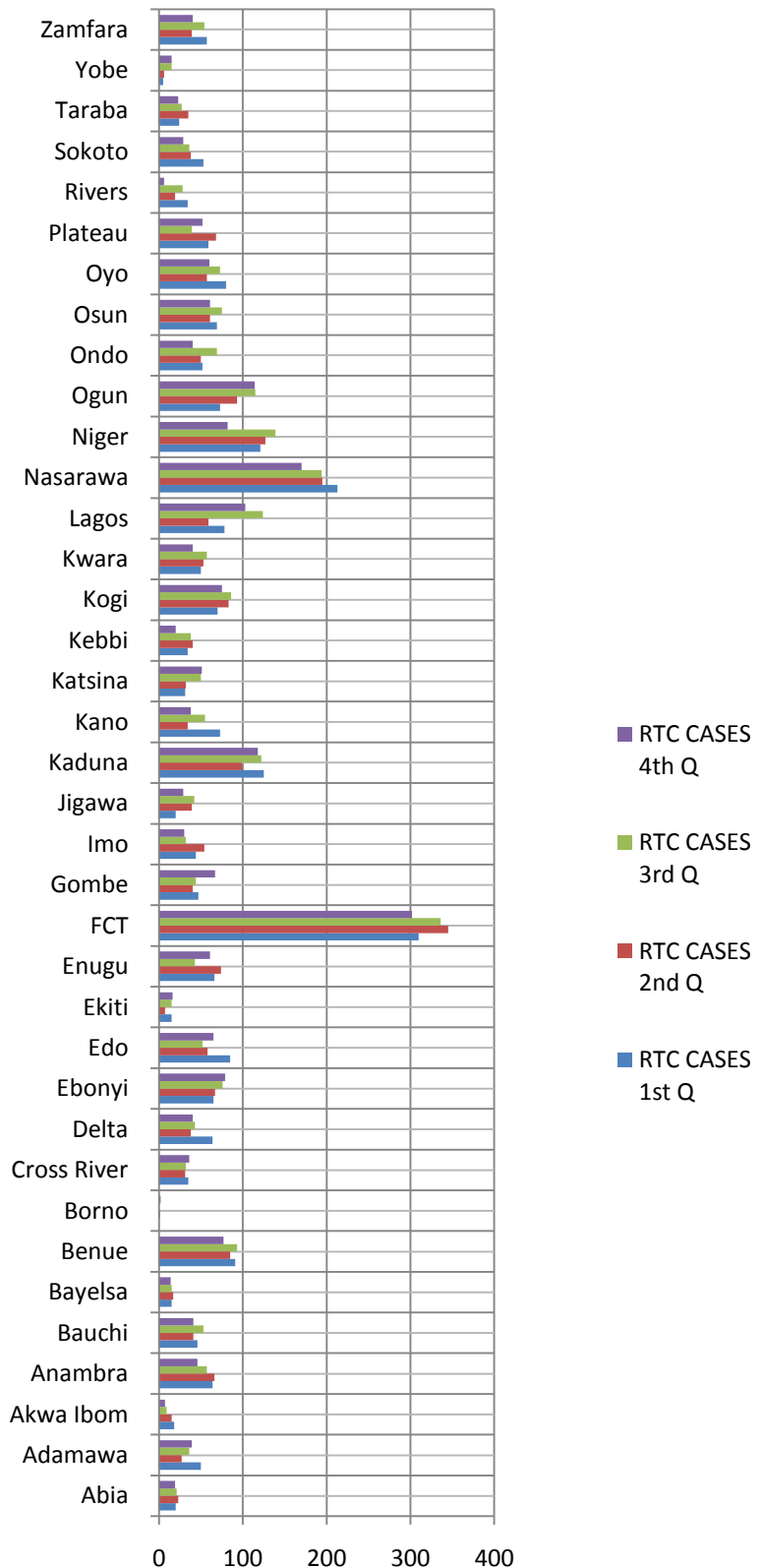

Chart 25: Person Injured on State Basis

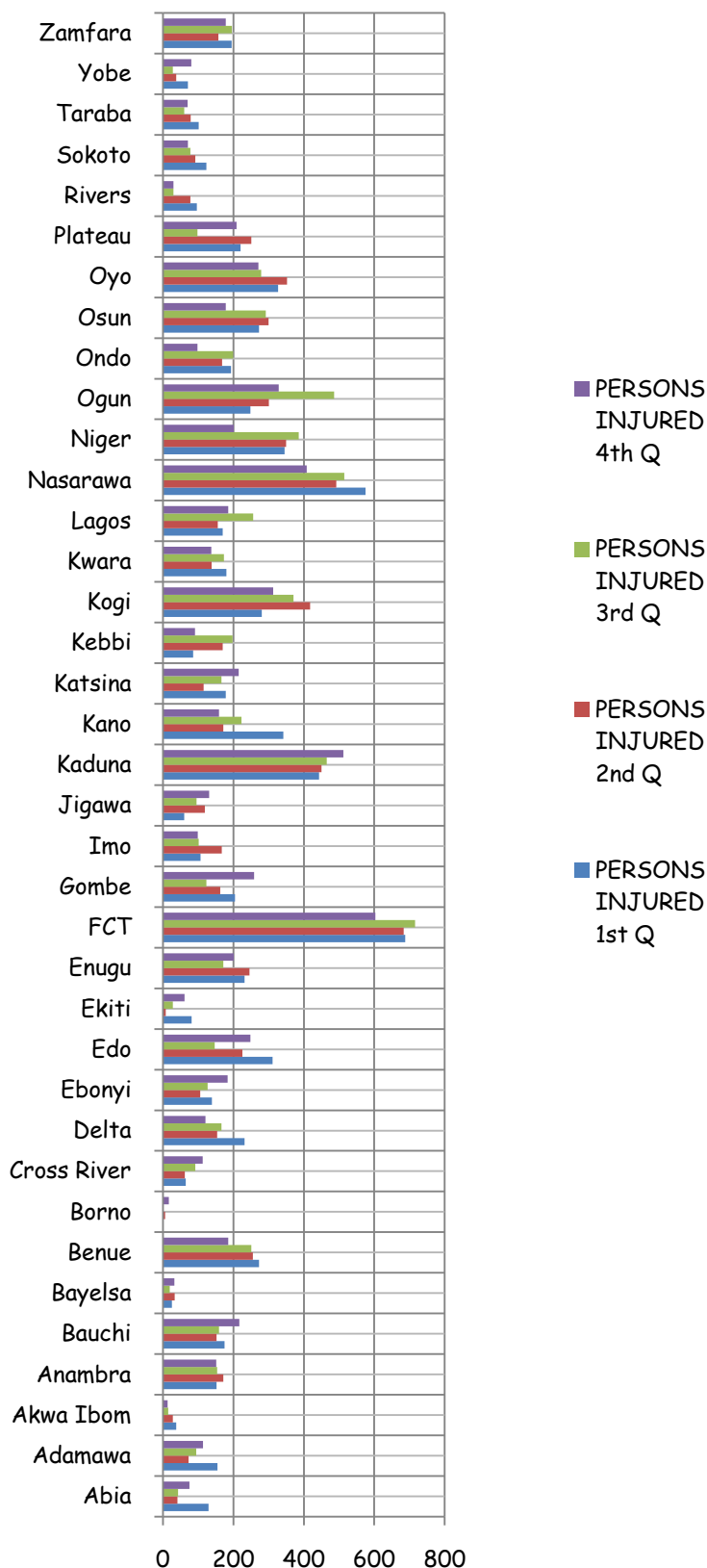

Chart 26: Person Killed on State Basis

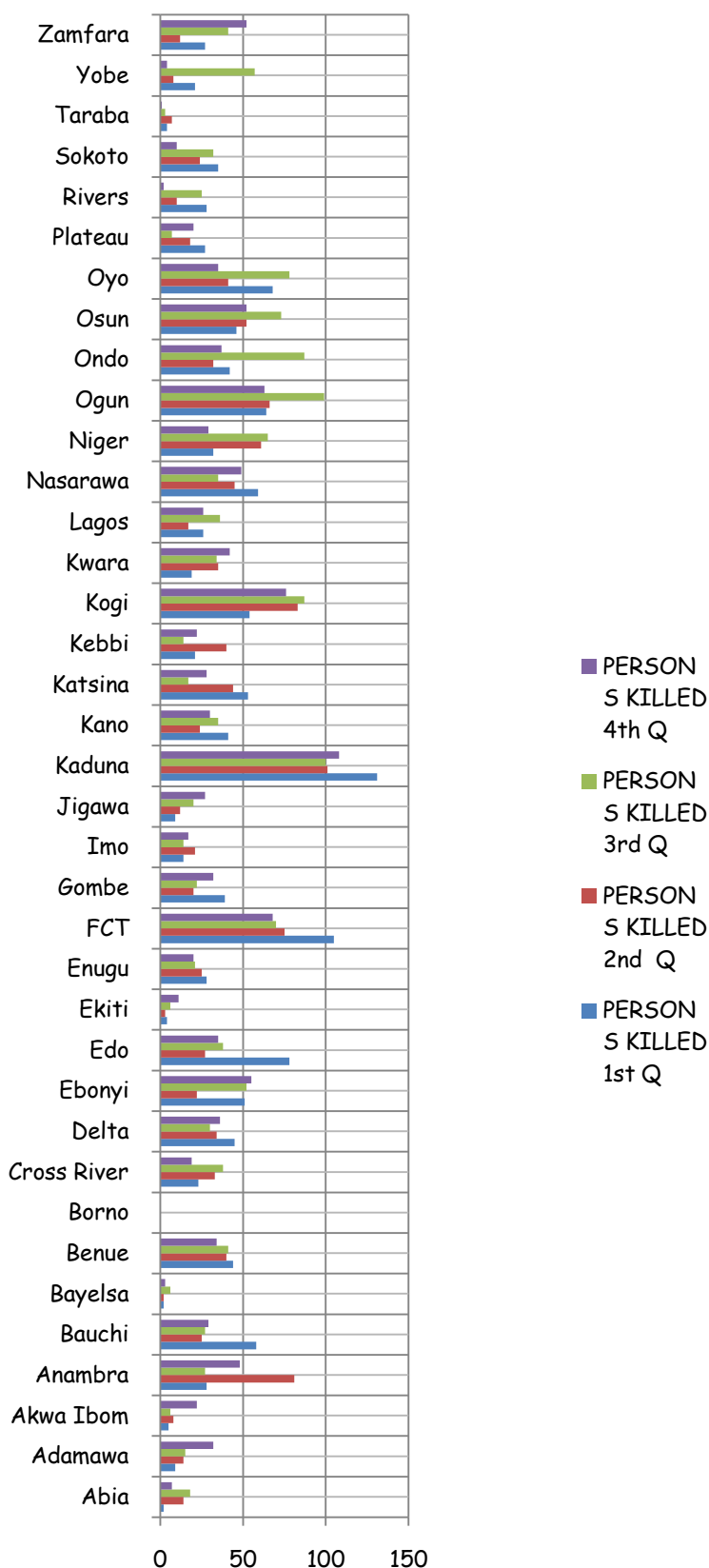

Chart 27: Casualties on State Basis

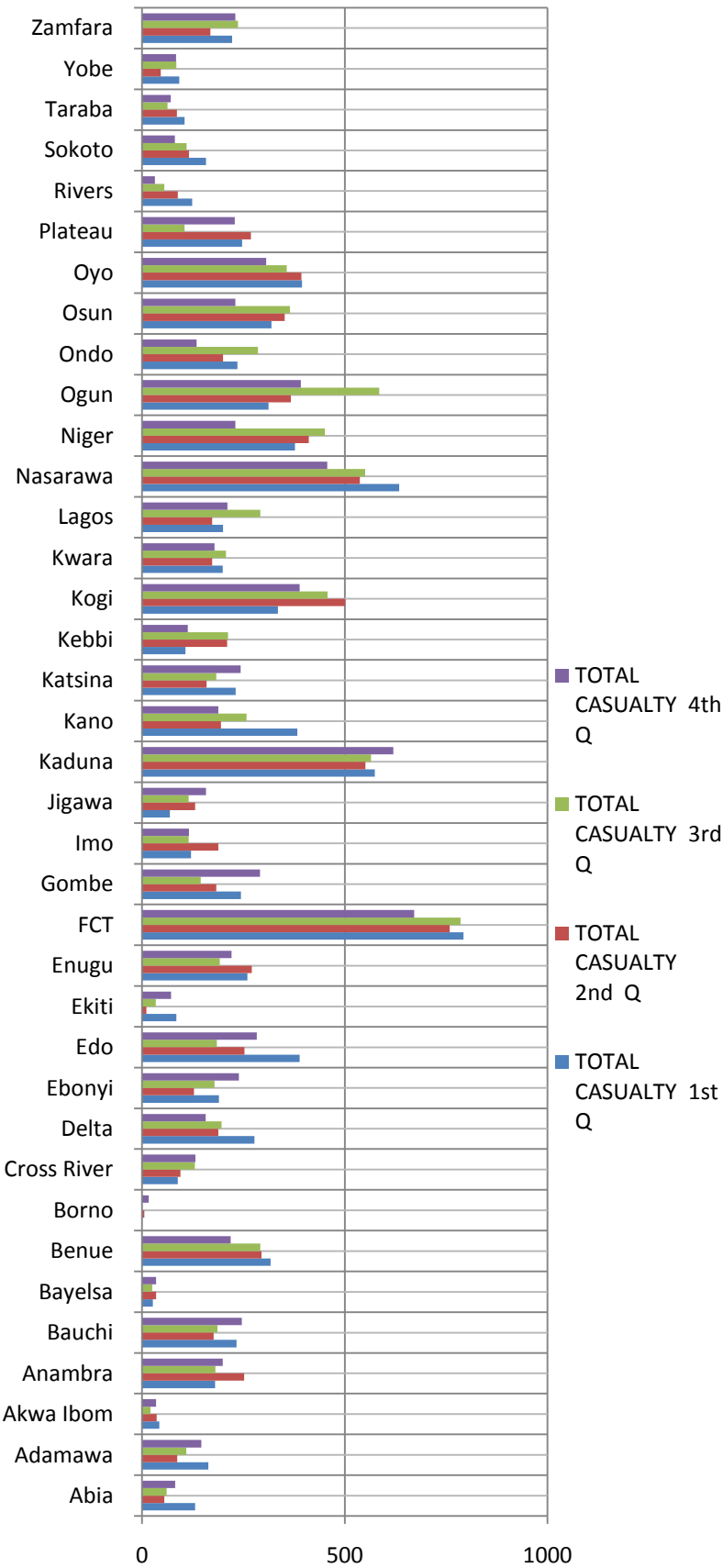
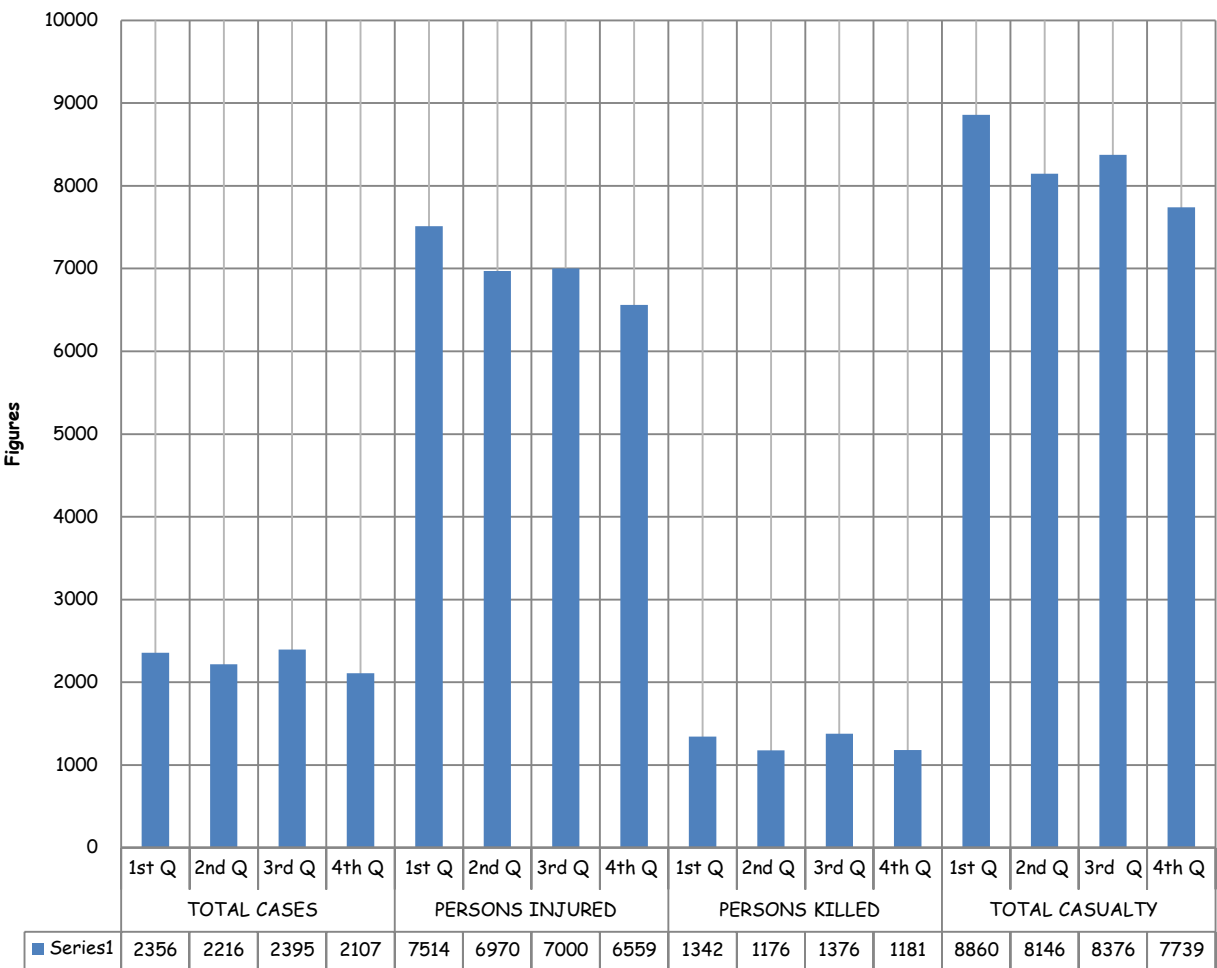

Chart 28: Comparison of RTC for First Quarter, Second Quarter, Third Quarter and Fourth Quarter



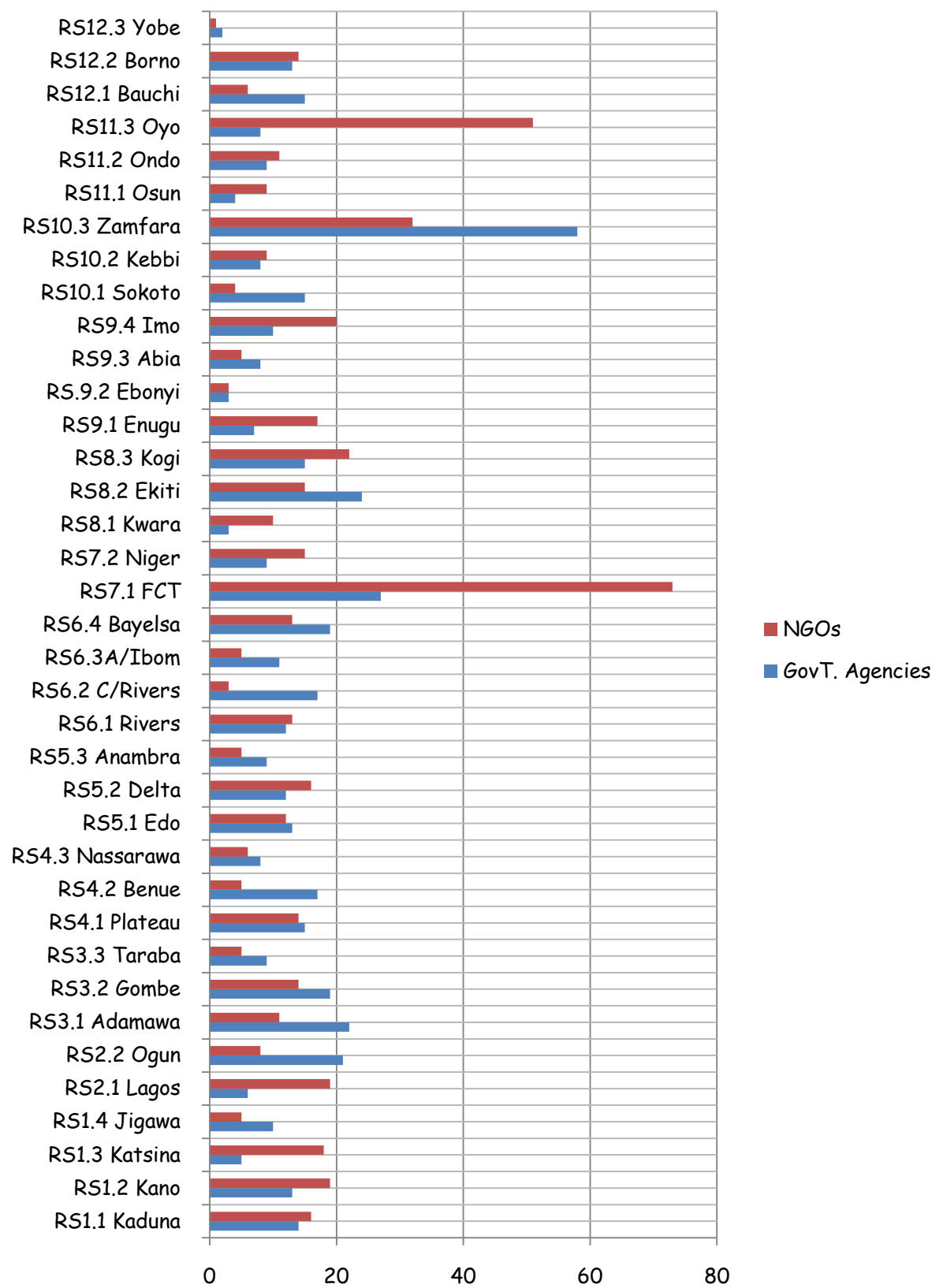

Chart 30: Special Marshals Activities

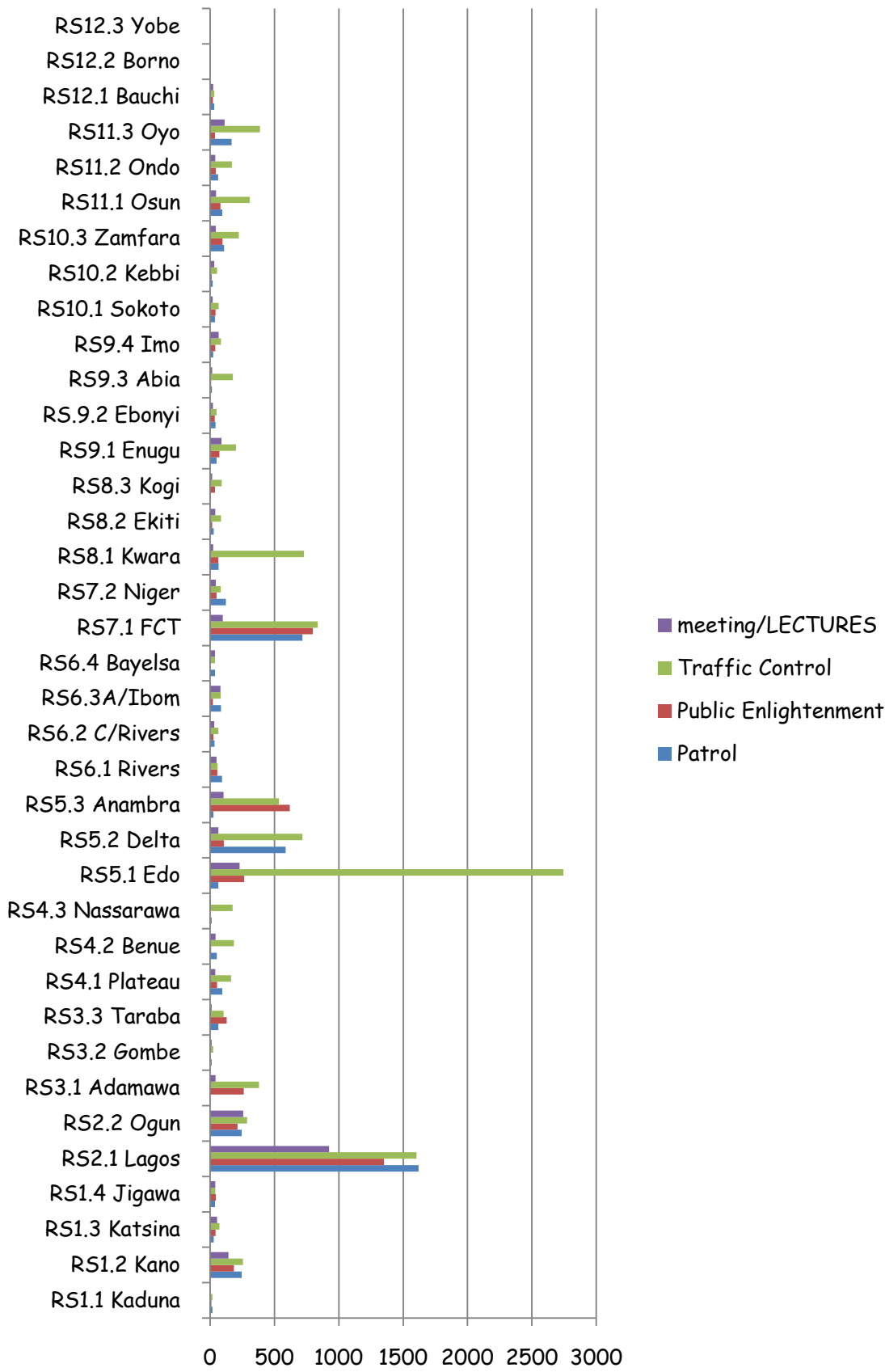

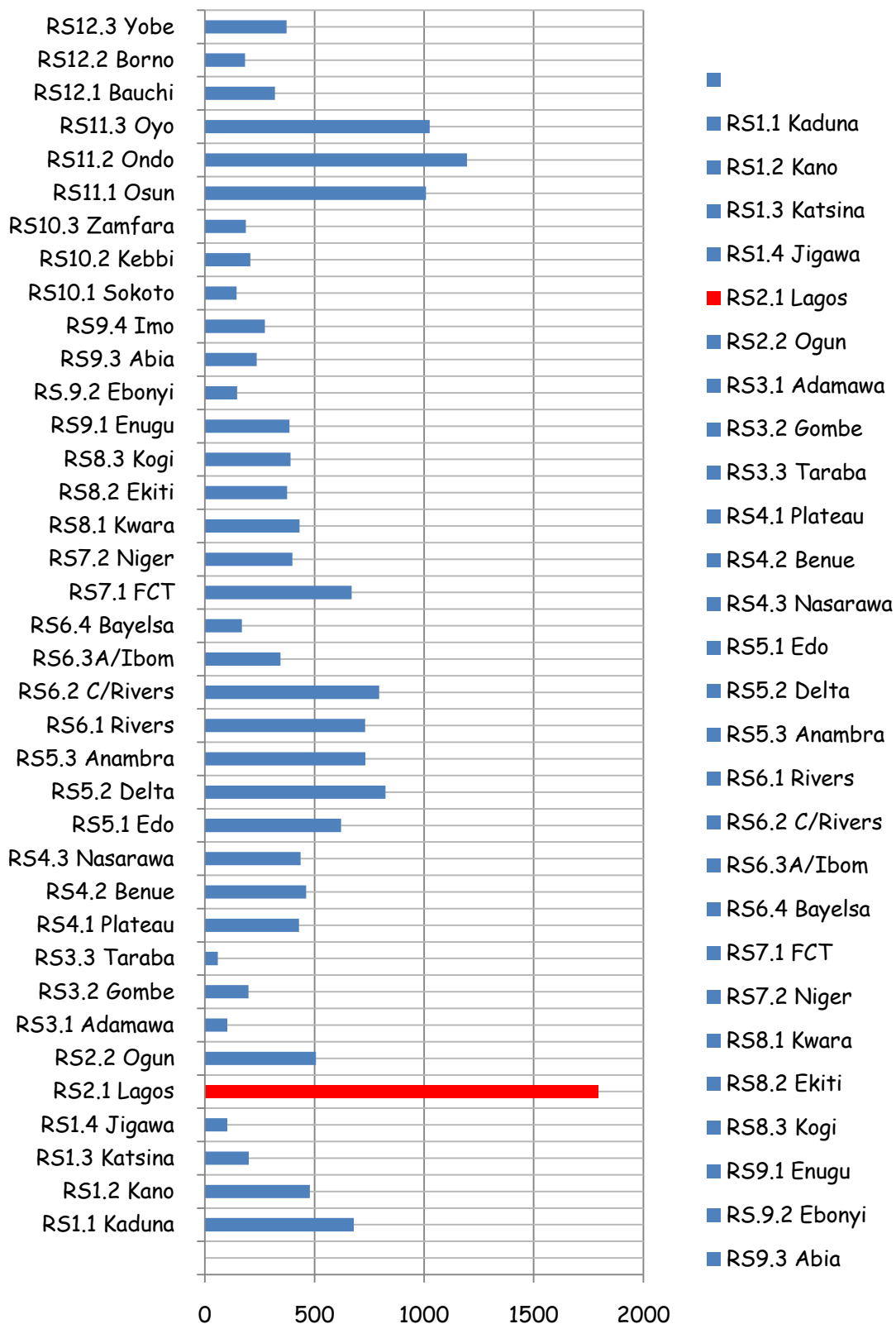

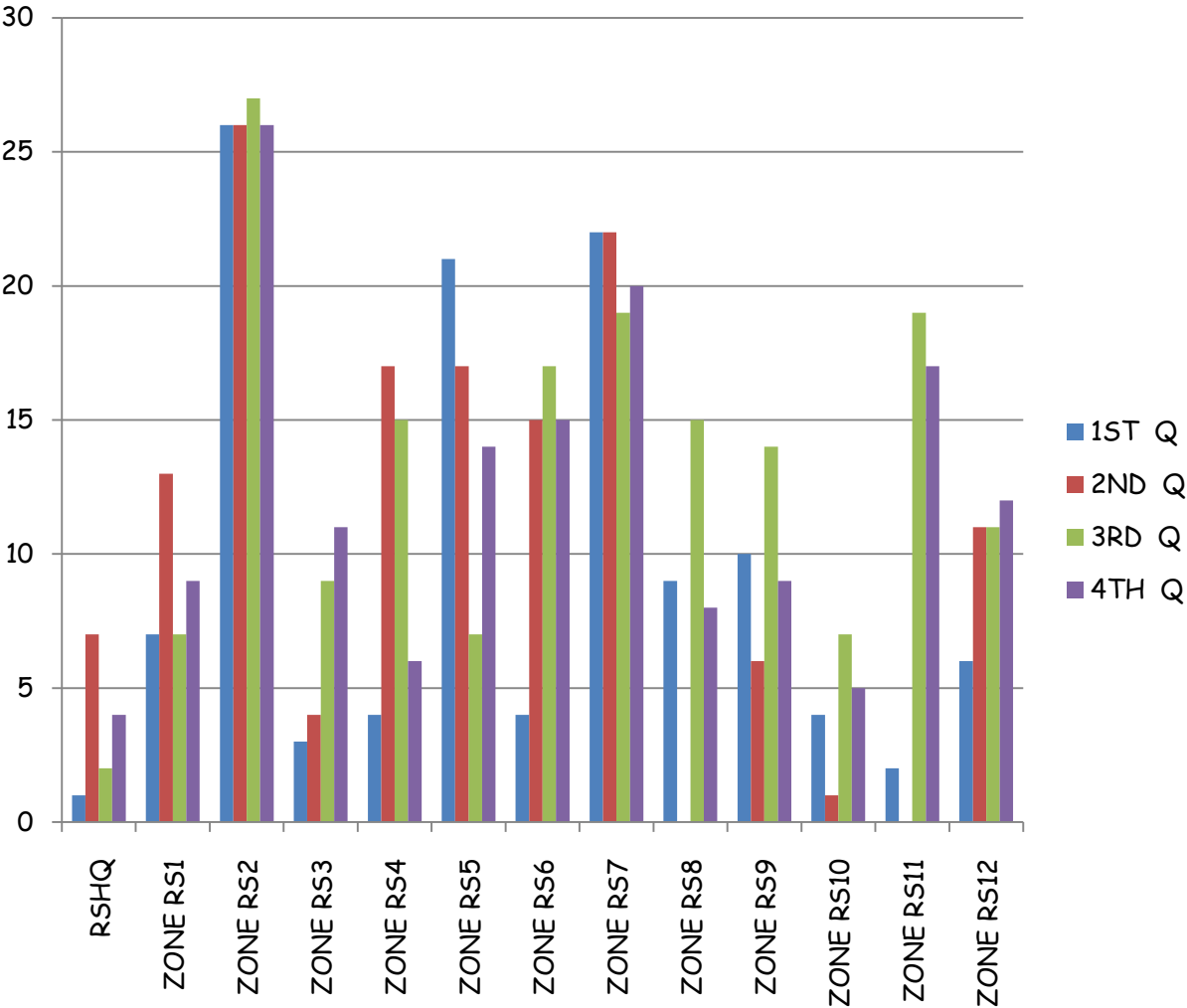
